THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 14-11 overall and is tied with Texas Tech for 10th place in the Big 12 at 3-9. The Buffs and Lady Raiders are just one game out of eighth, trailing Texas and Kansas who are each 4-7. The Buffaloes snapped a six-game losing streak with a 67-52 win over Texas before enjoying their Big 12 bye this past week. CU's six-game skid was its most since 2004-05 and combine that with its 11-game win streak earlier in the season, it's the first time in school history the Buffaloes have endured a six game winning streak and a six game losing streak in the same season. The Buffs have surpassed their win total from the 2006-07 season (13-17) and have their best record since 2003-04 when CU last made the NCAA Tournament.

Senior All-America candidate **Jackie McFarland** leads the Buffaloes at 17.6 points and 8.1 rebounds per game while shooting 57 percent from the field (146-of-258). Her numbers have remained solid during league play averaging 17.8 points and 8.1 rebounds while shooting 55 percent (69-of-126). She is second on the team in assists (2.7 apg) and third in blocks (1.2 bpg). McFarland is the fourth player in team history to reach 1,700 points and is one of only two players -- joining Lisa Van Goor -- to have 1,700 points and 900 rebounds. The All-Big 12 forward once again can be found among the leaders in most league statistical categories ranking second in field-goal percentage, and minutes, third in scoring, fifth in rebounding and free-throw percentage and 11th in blocked shots.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** is making a name for herself as well. Named the Big 12 Rookie of the Week for the second time this season on Feb. 11, her 341 points are the most by a freshman since 1993-94 when Erin Scholz scored 343. Her 13.6 points per game average is on pace to be the best by a CU freshman since Shelley Sheetz averaged 14.1 in 1991-92 and the best by any first-year player since Isabelle Fijalkowski averaged 16.1 in 1994-95, her lone season in Boulder. An all-around performer, she is only the second player in team history to record 40 blocks, 40 assists and 40 steals in the same season (Raegan Scott did it as a junior in 1995-96 and as a senior in 1996-97). Spears' numbers for rebounds (7.4 rpg), steals (1.9 spg) and blocks (1.7 bpg) are also on pace to be among the Top 5 performances by a CU freshman in team history, in fact her 42 blocks are already third on the Buffs' freshman list. She leads CU in free-throw percentage (.871, 54-of-62) and tops the Big 12 at 92 percent (33-of-36) during league only games. Her scoring, rebounding, and blocks per game top all freshmen in the Big 12 while she is also second in steals and free-throw percentage, and fourth in assists (1.7 apg).

In the backcourt, senior guard **Susie Powers** averages a team-best 3.8 assists per game. She's on pace to have the most assists by Buffs player since Mandy Nightingale had 161 (4.7 apg) during the 2001-02 season. Powers, who had a career-high 10 assists in the win over Pepperdine, is 25th in the nation (through games of Feb. 17) and is second in the Big 12 with a 2.0 assist-to-turnover ratio (95 assists-48 turnovers) and also ranks seventh in the Big 12 in assists.

Sophomore **Aija Putnina**, who has started the last 22 contests, is averaging 7.9 points, 7.3 rebounds and 1.4 blocks per game. Putnina, who registered her fourth double-double of the season with 14 points and 15 rebounds against Texas, is eighth in blocks and 11th in rebounding on the Big 12 charts. She owns two of CU's top three single-game rebounding performances this season, also nabbing 15 against Northern Colorado on Nov. 28.

Sophomore **Bianca Smith**, who entered the starting lineup for the first time this season against Oklahoma State, ranks third on the team in scoring at 10.4 points per game and leads the team in 3-pointers with 62. A formidable "Sixth-Woman" candidate in the Big

12 this season, Smith was named Big 12 Player of the Week on Dec. 10 after averaging 19.0 points and hitting 57 percent from the field in games against No. 22 (AP)/21 (WBCA) Wyoming and No. 20/17 Vanderbilt.

Junior **Hannah Skildum**, who has started 16 of the 25 games this season, provides a strong defensive presence to Colorado's back court and averages 3.3 points and 1.6 rebounds per game. **Whitney**

Houston and **Britney Blythe** have also seen extended minutes in the Colorado backcourt. Houston's minutes have increased over the past five games including a season-high 33 minutes at Kansas where she scored eight points with three steals and three assists. Blythe, played key minutes off the bench in Colorado's win over Kansas, scoring eight points and grabbing three rebounds.

Colorado has several front-court options off the bench. Junior **Caley Dow** is averaging 4.3 points, 3.8 rebounds and two assists over the last four games and is hitting 59 percent from the field (10-of-17) over the last six. Freshman **Courtney Dunn** had six points and five rebounds off the bench against No. 10 Oklahoma and has played double-digit minutes in four of her last six appearances. Junior **Kara Richards** has made 55 percent of her shots (24-of-44) and is coming off her two most productive Big 12 games this season averaging 4.5 points and 4.5 rebounds over the pair of contests.

Colorado is averaging 66.6 points per game while holding opponents to 60.8 per contest. CU held Texas to just 52 points in its last outing after having given up an average of 78.5 points over the previous four games. Overall CU is shooting 42 percent from the field and out rebounding opponents by nearly four boards per game. In Big 12 play, Colorado is scoring 63.1 points per game and shooting 40 percent from the field. Colorado has made just 29 percent from 3-point range during the league slate while opponents have connected on 37 percent from downtown.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: No. 15 (AP & WBCA) ranked Kansas State is 18-7 overall and tied with Baylor for the Big 12 lead at 10-2, although the Bears own the tiebreaker by virtue of their 63-49 win over the Wildcats on Feb. 2. Kansas State's only other Big 12 loss was in its last outing, a 65-68 setback to No. 11/10 Oklahoma on Feb. 20. KSU is a perfect 6-0 on the road in the Big 12 and has won its last seven away from home after dropping its first three road contests of the season. Kansas State is one of the better shooting teams in the Big 12, hitting nearly 45 percent from the field and is second on the league charts in 3-point field goal accuracy at 34.5 percent. Defensively, the Wildcats allow opponents just 36.3 percent shooting, second on the Big 12 charts.

Senior Kimberly Dietz, a native of Boulder, paces the Wildcats at 15.1 points per game and is the Wildcats' top deep threat, hitting 60 3-pointers. Junior Shalee Lehning leads the Big 12 in assists (6.4 apg) and is one of the top rebounding guards in the league with 7.1 per game. Forward Marlies Gipson tops the Wildcats in rebounding at 8.2 per game and is the team's second leading scorer at 12.0 per contest.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the 61st meeting between Colorado and Kansas State with the Buffaloes holding a 31-29 series lead. The Wildcats defeated then No. 25 ranked CU 67-60 in Manhattan on Jan. 19. The CU-Kansas State regular season series has ended in a sweep the last five seasons and seven of the last eight (2002 was the last split, each winning at home). Colorado swept the series in 2007, including a 66-55 win in Boulder which snapped a four-game streak for the Wildcats at the Coors Events Center. CU is 15-10 all-time at home against Kansas State. Kathy McConnell-Miller is 2-3 against Kansas State as a head coach, all with Colorado.

AWARDS PILING UP FOR McFARLAND: Jackie McFarland has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2008 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Additionally, McFarland earned a spot on *the ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District VII Women's Basketball first team for the third straight year. Both honors were announced Feb. 7.

McFarland was one of 30 original nominees for the Senior CLASS Award that was pared down to 10 finalists by a national media committee.

The award – presented annually to the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete of the Year in eight sports – focuses on the “Four C’s” of classroom, character, community and competition. An acronym for *Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School*, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who remain committed to their university and pursue the many rewards that a senior season and complete college education brings.

A native of Derby, Kan., McFarland is a two-time Academic All-American sporting a 3.86 GPA. She is working on a concurrent degree program which will allow her to earn her MBA while completing her undergraduate degree in accounting. McFarland won CU's Scholar-Athlete Award in the spring of 2007 for having the highest GPA in her class. McFarland is a three-year team captain and is actively involved in CU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. SAAC is the governing body for student-athletes at CU which assists in the development and implementation of programs that motivate student-athletes to strive for and be recognized for academic excellence and community involvement.

McFarland is a 2008 Naismith Award semifinalist and she was tabbed as a preseason first team All-Big 12 selection and one of the top five power forwards in the country by ESPN.com.

Fans nationwide can vote on the Senior CLASS Award finalists from now through March 21. Fan balloting, available on the award's official website www.seniorclassaward.com, will be combined with votes from coaches, media and sponsors to determine the recipient of the award. Winners will be announced during the NCAA Men's and Women's Final Four.

McFarland will also move onto the national ballot for the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America team voted on by the College Sports Information Director's of America (CoSIDA). McFarland earned second team Academic All-America status in 2006 and 2007. The 2008 Academic All-America team will be announced on Tuesday, Feb. 26. She will be looking to become Colorado's third three-time Academic All-American joining Jim Hansen (Football, 1990-92) and Kelly Smith (Cross Country/Track & Field (1996-98).

SMITH, SPEARS EARN BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS: Colorado has been recognized with Big 12 weekly honors three times this season. Sophomore guard **Bianca Smith** was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 10 and freshman forward **Brittany Spears** was named Rookie of the Week on Jan. 7 and again Feb. 11.

In her most recent honor, Spears averaged 19 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.0 blocks while hitting 48 percent from the field in games against Nebraska and No. 10 (AP & WBCA) Oklahoma. Her other honor came right before the beginning of the Big 12 season as she helped Colorado register its 10th straight win by scoring 16 points and grabbing seven rebounds in a 65-53 decision over Pepperdine on Jan. 4.

faloes to snap an eight-game Wildcats' win streak in the series. The 15-point halftime deficit to win was the second-largest margin achieved in team history. Colorado came back from 19 down against the University of Washington on Dec. 21, 1982, at the Guisti Tournament in Portland, Ore. CU trailed 35-16 at halftime before winning 67-65.

SMITH'S RECORD NIGHT FROM '3': Sophomore **Bianca Smith** tied three different school 3-point field goal records during CU's 67-52 win over Texas on Feb. 16. Smith tied school marks for 3-pointers made in one game with seven, and also 3-pointers made and attempted in one half by hitting 5-of-9 in the first 20 minutes. It's the fifth time a CU player has had seven 3-pointers in one game, done by four players (Kate Fagan did it twice). Veronica Johns-Richardson was the last to do it, against Northern Colorado on Dec. 29, 2004. Smith's five first half 3-pointers matched efforts by Shelley Sheetz at Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1993 and Fagan at Syracuse on Dec. 31, 2002. Her nine first half 3-point attempts matched Sheetz's nine at Tennessee.

Smith, who finished with a career-high 26 points, continues to move up the ladder on CU's single season and career 3-point charts. Her 62 3-pointers this season are eighth on CU's single-season list and she needs just seven more to enter the top five. She has 94 career 3-pointers ranking ninth on CU's all-time list and needs just six more to become the eighth player in school history to reach 100. Smith's 167 3-point attempts this season is seventh most in team history while her 259 career attempts rank eighth.

Smith averaged 19 points, two assists and two rebounds off the bench while leading Colorado to wins over No. 22 (AP)/21 (WBCA) Wyoming and at No. 20/17 Vanderbilt. Colorado broke a 23-game losing streak against ranked teams with its 69-55 win over Wyoming on Dec. 5. The Buffaloes then made it wins in back-to-back games over ranked teams for the first time since the 2002 NCAA Tournament with a 62-51 triumph at Vanderbilt on Dec. 9.

Against Wyoming, Smith scored 16 points on 5-of-8 from the floor with three assists as Colorado broke a three-game losing streak against the Cowgirls. Smith had an even bigger game against Vanderbilt. She had a career-high 22 points on 7-of-14 from the field with three rebounds, one steal and one assist as the Buffs handed the Commodores just their second loss in 23 home games.

BLOCK PARTY: Colorado is blocking shots at a record pace. The Buffaloes rank third in the Big 12 at 5.5 blocks per game and second during conference only games at 5.7 per contest. CU's 5.5 average puts them on pace to break the school single-season record of 162

set in 2000-01 and its 138 blocks on in 2007-08 already ranks fourth on the team's single-season list. Freshman **Brittany Spears** leads the way with 42 blocks while sophomore **Aija Putnina** is second with 34. It's the first time since the 2001-02 season the Buffaloes have two players with 30 or more blocks in one year. Britt Hartshorn led the 2001-02 team with 46 while Tera Bjorklund had 37. Of course we can't forget about senior **Jackie McFarland** who happens to rank fourth on CU's all-time blocks list with 129. She has 29 this season which means one more block would give the Buffaloes three players with 30 or more blocks for the first time in team history.

CU's high for a game this season was 13 against Dartmouth, the second highest single-game total in team history, trailing only the school record 16 set against Sam Houston in a 99-60 win on Dec. 14, 2000. CU followed up that performance with 12 against Iowa State on Jan. 13. The Buffaloes, who have three games this season with 10 or more blocks, ranked 12th in the NCAA in blocked shots through games of Feb. 17.

3-POINTERS FALLING: Colorado's 3-point shooting has cooled off during the Big 12 schedule as the Buffs have made just 29 percent and average 5.5 made per game. However, the Buffaloes are still on pace to have their most prolific season from 3-point range in team history. Colorado's 177 3-point field goals rank second on the team single-season list and the Buffs are just 20 away from breaking the 2001-02 team record of 196. CU's 558 3-point field goal attempts are a school record, breaking the old mark of 501 set in 2001-02.

Colorado is second in the Big 12 Conference and ranks 16th in the nation in 3-point field goals per game. The Buffaloes have a school single-season record seven games with 10 or more 3-point field goals. The previous season high was five in the 34-game 2001-02 season. CU had a season-high 14 against Colorado State, its second best single-game total (CU had 16 against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004). That came during a string of netting 10 or more 3-pointers in four straight games for the first time. The Buffs had 10 3-pointers against Wyoming and Northern Colorado and 13 against Rice. Against UNC, the Buffs set a school record for 3-point field goal attempts in one half with 21 in the first stanza and finished the game with 36 attempts, just one shy of the school record of 37 set against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004.

Individually, it hasn't been one player doing the damage. For the first time in school history, CU has six different players with 10 or more 3-pointers. Sophomore Bianca Smith leads the team with 62, **Brittany Spears** is second with 39 followed by **Susie Powers** (21), **Jackie McFarland** (13), **Hannah Skildum** (11) and **Whitney Houston** (10).

NUMBERS FOR MCFARLAND: Jackie McFarland has had seven double-doubles this season which is tied for third in the Big 12. She ranks second in CU history in career double-doubles with 44 and has tied Erin Scholz (1993-97) for second in career double-digit rebounding games with 46 after her 10-point, 10-rebound effort against Texas on Feb. 13.

McFarland became the fourth player in school history to reach 1,700 points against Oklahoma State and joins all-time scoring leader Lisa Van Goor as the only two players to record 1,700 points and 900 rebounds in a career. She needs 17 points to pass CU Athletic Hall of Famer and All-American Shelley Sheetz (1991-95) for third place on CU's all-time scoring list, entering the Kansas State game with 1,759. She is just 28 rebounds away from becoming the third player in team history to reach 1,000 career boards.

McFarland is CU's all-time leader in free-throws made with 517, and ranks second in free-throw attempts (674), fourth in blocked shots (129), tied for fifth in field-goals made (608) and sixth in minutes (3,590).

1,000th GAME: Colorado's 80-71 loss to Nebraska on Feb. 6 marked the 1,000th game in team history. In their 34th season, the Buffaloes sport an all-time record of 622-381 heading into Saturday's game. CU's 621 wins rank fifth among Big 12 teams -- with Kansas and Kansas State having played six more seasons than the Buffs -- and its .620 winning percentage ranks fourth trailing only Texas, Texas Tech and Kansas State.

DEFENSE IN THE KANSAS GAME: Colorado's 59-41 win over Kansas was won, in large part thanks to its defense. The 41 points allowed to the Jayhawks tied for the third lowest against a Big 12 opponent during the regular season. Three of the four lowest totals have come against the Jayhawks:

The 18-point margin of victory was also the highest by a **Kathy McConnell-Miller** led team in a Big 12 game, beating the previous margin of 14 against Iowa State on Jan. 10, 2007 (81-67).

YOUTH SERVED: Colorado's freshman class was key in the Buffaloes win over Kansas combining for 31 points, the most by a freshman class since the trio of Whitney Houston (25), Candace Rucker (6) and Aija Putnina (3) combined for 34 in a 70-68 overtime loss at Kansas last season. **Brittany Spears** led the way with 14 points while **Courtney Dunn** pitched in a career-high nine points and **Britney Blythe** had eight off the bench.

DOUBLE OT: Colorado went double-overtime for just the fifth time in school history and the first time at the Coors Events Center with its 84-77 loss to Iowa State on Jan. 13. It was the first double-overtime for CU since the Buffaloes defeated the Cyclones 68-66 at Iowa State on Jan. 18, 1997, and the Buffs fell to 16-20 all-time in overtime and 2-3 in double-overtime. Seniors Jackie McFarland and Susie Powers each played 48 minutes in the game, tying a school record initially set by Tracy Tripp against Oklahoma State on March 6, 1989.

BIG 12 OPENERS: Colorado evened its record in Big 12 Conference openers at 6-6 by defeating Missouri 70-58 on Jan. 9. It was Colorado's first season-opening Big 12 win on the road since the Buffs beat Baylor to begin the 2004 league slate. The 12-point margin was also the Buffs highest in a conference road opener since a 67-53 win at Missouri to open the 1993 Big Eight schedule. Colorado, now 20-14 in all-time conference openers, are 16-9 in home league openers since 1983 and 6-5 in the Big 12 era.

OPENING NIGHT STAR: Colorado freshman **Brittany Spears** joined some elite company in her Big 12 debut. Her 24 points were the second-most in team history for a freshman in her first league game. Only CU Athletic Hall of Fame member and 1995 All-American Shelley Sheetz had more points in a conference debut as she scored 25 during a 75-69 loss at Nebraska on Jan. 15, 1992. Her seven rebounds tie current teammate **Jackie McFarland** for the most by a freshman in a road opener since 1994. McFarland had seven in an 84-62 setback at Nebraska on Jan. 5, 2005.

NUMBERS ON 11 STRAIGHT: Colorado saw its 11-game win streak end against Iowa State, but the run was the seventh longest

in team history and the most consecutive victories since the 1994-95 team matched a CU All-Sports record 25 straight wins (shared with the 1939-41 baseball team). Here are the Buffs' all-time best win streaks:

PERFECT DECEMBER: Colorado registered a perfect 7-0 record for the month of December for the first time since 2003-04, and for just the sixth time in team history. The Buffaloes matched the 1980-81 and 1981-82 teams which were both 7-0 in December. The 1992-93 team had a program best December mark of 9-0, while the 2002-03 squad was 6-0 and 5-0 in 2003-04. CU is 118-54 (.686) all-time in the month of December.

DEFENSE WINS: Colorado has enjoyed some impressive defensive numbers at times this season.

The Buffaloes have held six opponents under 50 points in 2007; 29-vs. Texas Southern, 38-vs. Southern Utah, 41-vs. Kansas, 43-vs. Dartmouth, 47-at Colorado State and 48-at San Francisco. CU had held their opponent under 50 points just three times total in the previous three seasons.

CU yielded less than 50 points in three-straight games -- Texas Southern, Dartmouth and Southern Utah -- the first such streak since 2003-04. The Buffs' six sub-50 point defensive performances are the most in one season since the 2002-03 squad registered nine.

Colorado had a historic performance from a defensive perspective against Texas Southern. The Buffaloes held the Lady Tigers to just 29 points, which ties for the fourth-lowest total in team history (equals a 79-29 win over Iowa State on Feb. 19, 1993). It was just the fifth time in CU history the Buffs have held an opponent under 30 points (the ISU game in 1993 being the last). CU allowed just 13 second-half points, tying for the second-lowest second-half total in team history (also done in the ISU game and against Utah State on Jan. 28, 1981). The Buffaloes forced Texas Southern into 32 turnovers, the most since forcing 35 against Detroit Mercy on Nov. 24, 2002.

Colorado's season-long defensive efforts are on pace to rank among some of the best in team history. The Buffs have allowed opponents just 37.8 percent shooting from the field, which would rank third in the CU record book behind the 1980-81 (.358) and 1981-82 (.375) teams. CU has allowed just 60.4 points per contest and holds a 3.8 per game rebounding advantage. Both numbers would rank eighth on CU's all-time list if the season had ended.

RANK STREAK IS OVER: Colorado had its biggest week in early December in several years in terms of success against ranked teams.

Colorado's 69-55 win over No. 21/22 Wyoming snapped a 23-game Buffs' losing streak to ranked teams. The Buffaloes last win

over a ranked opponent had been a 69-59 decision at No. 24 Baylor on Jan. 7, 2004 where CU was ranked No. 14 at the time. The win was Colorado's first against a ranked team while being unranked since knocking off No. 12 North Carolina 86-67 in the second round of the 2003 NCAA Tournament.

The Buffaloes kept the momentum going four days later with a 62-51 win at No. 20/17 Vanderbilt. The win gave CU's its first two-game win streak against ranked teams since knocking off No. 23 Washington and No. 24 Baylor in 2003-04. It's the first pair of wins over two ranked teams in back-to-back games since the 2002 NCAA Tournament when the Buffs defeated No. 22/24 LSU in the second round and No. 5 Stanford in the Sweet 16. It was Colorado's first win on the road over a ranked opponent since defeating No. 24 Baylor 69-59 in Waco, Texas, on Jan. 7, 2004. It was CU's first win over a ranked opponent as an unranked team since defeating No. 12 Texas in Austin, 60-56, on Feb. 26, 1997.

RANKING OF OUR OWN: With its recent slide, Colorado did not receive votes in either the AP or WBCA Top 25 polls released this week. CU had at least received votes for six-straight weeks from Dec. 10 through Jan. 22. The Buffaloes were ranked in four straight AP polls, peaking at No. 23 on Jan. 1 and Jan. 8. The Buffaloes debuted in the 2007 AP poll at No. 25 on Dec. 24 for their first national ranking since finishing No. 17 (AP)/No. 24 (WBCA) in the final 2003-04 polls. Colorado has a rich tradition in the AP poll, making 158 appearances since 1980. The Buffs were ranked in 75 straight polls from Mar. 15, 1992 to Dec. 9, 1996 and 30 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 to Mar. 22, 2002.

With Colorado's early-season AP ranking, Buffs head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller became the 22nd person in NCAA Division I women's history to play for and coach an AP ranked team. McConnell-Miller was a four-year letterwinner at Virginia (1986-90) where she played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight.

CAPTAINS NAMED: Seniors **Jackie McFarland** and **Susie Powers** and junior **Caley Dow** will serve as team captains for the 2007-08 season. McFarland is a captain for a third straight season, Powers is in her second year as captain and Dow is a captain for the first time. CU team captains are voted on by players prior to the first regular season contest each year.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 317-97 all-time record at the Coors Events/Conference Center (.766). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CECC in 20 of the previous 30 years including this season, after notching win No. 10 this season against Texas on Feb. 16. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CECC.

ON THE ROAD: Colorado is 4-6 on the road this season and had won three straight for the first time since 2003-04 before falling at Kansas State on Jan. 19. The four wins doubles the team road win total from the previous two seasons combined (1-10 in 2006-07 and 1-9 in 2004-05) and one more would match CU's win total from the previous three seasons (5-28). CU's 82-47 win over Colorado State was significant on several fronts. The 35-point margin was the Buffs' highest on the road since a 70-35 win over Kansas on Jan. 16, 2002 and it was also their largest win over Colorado State (regardless of venue) since a 112-48 win on Nov. 16, 1979. The 82 points were the most CU has scored on an opponents home court since the Buffs' last trip to Moby Arena, an 86-83 loss to the Rams on Nov. 30, 2005. Colorado broke Vanderbilt's 10-game home winning streak and handed the Commodores just their second

loss in 23 home games, the other coming last season against eventual national champion Tennessee.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Colorado once again faces a tough schedule with no less than 16 games against 2007 NCAA or WNIT tournament teams. The Buffaloes will travel to perennial NCAA women's powers Southern California and Vanderbilt during the non-conference season as well as region rival Colorado State. Colorado will host 2007 WNIT Champion Wyoming and will also see Rice, Clemson and Pepperdine at the Coors Events Center. Texas A&M, Oklahoma State and Texas come to Boulder this year out of the Big 12 South along with the Buffs' usual Big 12 North opponents.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's schedule features 10 games that will be televised either regionally or nationally, nine of which will be carried by Fox Sports Net. Two games are part of the Big 12's national package with FSN: Sunday, Jan. 13 against Iowa State at home and Saturday, Jan. 26, at Texas Tech. FSN Rocky Mountain is televising seven CU home games which began with Wyoming on Dec. 5. CU's game at Colorado State on Dec. 1 was televised by The Mtn. Network.

McFARLAND PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12; BUFFS PICKED 11TH: Senior forward **Jackie McFarland** has been named to the 2007-08 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball team by a vote of league coaches.

McFarland is CU's second preseason All-Big 12 honoree as former Buffaloes standout Erin Scholz was named to the 1996-97 squad. She joins Nebraska forward Kelsey Griffin, Oklahoma center Courtney Paris and Texas A&M guards A'Quonesia Franklin and Takia Starks on the five-member preseason team. All five players were first team All-Big 12 picks last winter.

McFarland topped the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation in field-goal accuracy in 2006-07 at 61 percent. She was second in the Big 12 in scoring (17.8 ppg) and rebounding (10.8 rpg) and led the league in minutes at 36.4 per game.

Despite returning eight players from a team that finished tied for seventh last season, the Buffaloes were picked to finish 11th in the Big 12 in 2007-08 in annual preseason coaches poll.

Defending co-champion Texas A&M was picked to win the 2008 title with seven first place votes and 117 points overall, just edging out the league's other co-champion, Oklahoma who had the other five first place votes and 115 points. The Big South held down the top five spots in the poll as Baylor was third with 97 points followed by Texas (86) and Oklahoma State (66). Iowa State was the top North school (64) followed by Nebraska (56), Kansas State and Texas Tech (54 each), Kansas (43), Colorado (29) and Missouri (11).

Kathy McConnell-Miller
Head Coach
Third Season

When **Kathy McConnell-Miller** took over the University of Colorado program just over two years ago, there's no question the Buffaloes were rebuilding and the team was a work in progress.

In two seasons at Colorado, progress is certainly a valid term for McConnell-Miller's Buffaloes.

McConnell-Miller, 40, sports a 22-38 record in her two seasons at Colorado and is 113-126 overall in eight seasons as an NCAA Division I head coach.

She led Colorado to a 13-17 mark in 2006-07, the team's best record since the 2003-04 Buffaloes went 22-8 and advanced to the program's last NCAA Tournament. Colorado also enjoyed its best Big 12 Conference showing in three years, tying Texas and Texas Tech for seventh in the league standings at 6-10. The Buffaloes' six conference wins in 2006-07 were more than the previous two years combined (3-13 in 2005-06 and 2-14 in 2004-05).

McConnell-Miller, who officially became the sixth head coach in the history of CU women's basketball on April 27, 2005, has overseen the development of Jackie McFarland, who has emerged as one of the top players in the Big 12. McFarland has earned All-Big 12 honors in both her seasons under McConnell-Miller including first team acclaim this past season. All-league selections are nothing new to McConnell-Miller as she has had at least one first or second team all-conference performer in each of her eight seasons as a collegiate head coach.

The Buffaloes have also had academic success in the McConnell-Miller era. In her two seasons, McConnell-Miller has coached seven Academic All-Big 12 Women's Basketball team members and has helped guide McFarland two a pair of Academic All-America second team honors.

She has done well with the players inherited from legendary CU head coach Ceal Barry, but she has also excelled in bringing in her own players.

McConnell-Miller, who from day one has established a family type atmosphere in the lockerroom and a fighting spirit in her players, and her staff have landed back-to-back Top 40 recruiting classes, including the No. 29 class in 2006 according to the All-Star Girls Report. What was remarkable about the class of 2006 is McConnell-Miller and her staff didn't even have the chance to start on the recruiting trail until April when they arrived in Boulder. Despite that late start, McConnell-Miller and her staff managed to sign five top 150 players, including Whitney Houston and Aija Putnina who made significant contributions as first-year players.

Before arriving at CU, McConnell-Miller spent six seasons as head coach at the University of Tulsa where she constructed an impressive turnaround of the Golden Hurricane program. Before her arrival in 1999-2000, Tulsa had just one winning season in its 14-year history, an overall record of 81-250 (.324), and was actually dropped as a varsity sport for nine years following the 1986-87 campaign. In her six seasons at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller recorded a program-best 91 wins (15.2 wins per year), winning seasons in three of the last four years and two postseason appearances.

She left as Tulsa's all-time leader for coaching victories with a record of 91-88 and owns the longest tenure in school history by a women's basketball coach. McConnell-Miller, who earned WAC Coach of the Year honors in her rookie season as a collegiate head coach in 1999-00, led Tulsa to 14 or more wins in five of her six campaigns.

Under the direction of McConnell-Miller, Tulsa placed at least one player on either the All-WAC first or second team, each of her six seasons. McConnell-Miller also had the Golden Hurricane excelling in the classroom sporting four *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District first and second team performers. Tulsa players also earned 23 All-WAC Academic Team honors. One of McConnell-Miller's prize players was Allison Curtin who was an

Associated Press honorable mention All-American for the Golden Hurricane and was drafted by the Houston Comets in the first round of the 2003 WNBA Draft.

Prior to her appointment at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller spent four seasons on Theresa Grentz's staff at the University of Illinois (1995-99). She was an assistant coach for her first three years before being promoted to associate head coach for her final season. The Fighting Illini posted an overall record of 76-45 and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments with McConnell-Miller on the bench. Illinois won the Big Ten Conference Championship in 1997 and twice advanced to the Sweet 16. While at Illinois, McConnell-Miller was vital in the signing of a pair of recruiting classes that ranked among the top five in the nation.

McConnell-Miller coached with Grentz for a total of six years as she went with Grentz to Illinois from Rutgers University in 1995. McConnell-Miller was a Rutgers assistant for two seasons (1993-95), helping the Lady Knights post a pair of winning campaigns, the 1994 Atlantic 10 Championship and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Her recruiting expertise was well documented at Rutgers as her last class was rated as the 14th-best nationally, giving McConnell-Miller back-to-back Top 15 classes.

Her first collegiate assistant coaching job came at her hometown school, the University of Pittsburgh. She joined the Panthers in 1991 and served as the recruiting coordinator. She was also an assistant coach for the 1993 Big East All-Star Team which played in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

She is a member of the Western Pennsylvania Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, and was inducted into the Seton LaSalle High School Hall of Fame in October of 2006.

McConnell-Miller enjoyed a four-year playing career at guard for the University of Virginia (1986-90). She played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight. McConnell-Miller earned her bachelor's degree in rhetoric and communications from Virginia in 1989.

One of eight children, she is one of six McConnell siblings who attended college on a basketball scholarship.

Three McConnell's are presently in the coaching ranks, two at the college level and one at the high school level. Her older sister, Suzie McConnell Serio was the head coach of the Minnesota Lynx of the WNBA for three seasons (2003-06).

Born on Sept. 24, 1967, McConnell-Miller and her husband, Brad Miller, have three children: Brice (7), Mackenzie (5) and Macie (3).

- Tied school records for 3-pointers made in one game with seven and 3-pointers made and attempted in one half by hitting 5-of-9 in the win over Texas on Feb. 16. It's the fifth time a CU player has hit seven 3-pointers in one game, done by four different players (Kate Fagan did it twice).
- Ended the Texas game with a career-high 26 points.
- Her 62 3-pointers this season are eighth on CU's single-season list and needs just seven more to enter the top five. Her 167 attempts this season is seventh on the single-season charts.
- Named Big 12 Player of the Week on Dec. 10 after averaging 19.0 points on 57 percent shooting in wins over #22/21 Wyoming and #20/17 Vanderbilt.
- On the Big 12 charts is third in 3-point field goals made (2.5 mpg) and 3-point percentage (.371).
- After hitting just 4 of the first 11 free-throw attempts of her career (.364) she has hit 44 of her last 50 (.888) dating back to last season.

- Has made 16-of-35 (.457) 3-pointers in the last four games after making just 3-of-19 (.158) in the previous three.

- Ranks ninth on CU's all-time list for 3-point field goals with 94.

Career:

- Had the sixth most 3-point field goals among freshmen in the Big 12 last season with 32 and ranked 14th on the Big 12 charts in 3-point field-goal percentage (.348).
- Her 32 3-point field goals were the most by a CU freshman since Emily Waner had 51 in 2003-04.
- Sat out the 2005-06 season as a redshirt in the Colorado basketball program.

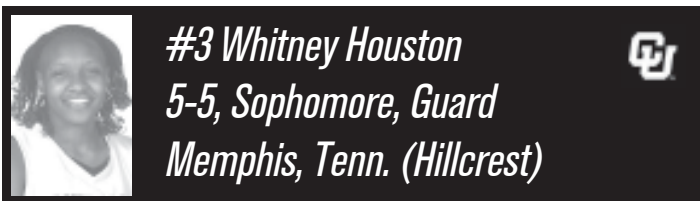

- Had a career-high 10 assists against Pepperdine. It's the most assists in one game for the Buffaloes since Whitney Law had her school-record 15 against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 18, 2005.

This Season:

- Registered her fourth double-double of the season, the sixth of her career, by scoring 14 points and tying a personal best with 15 rebounds in the win over Texas. She has two of the top three single-game rebounding performances on the team this season.
- Tied career highs with three steals and three assists against Texas.
- Scored a career-high 20 points on 8-of-9 from the field against Jacksonville State.
- Was 4-of-4 from 3-point range against JSU. Only Jenny Roulrier who hit 5-of-5 from downtown against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2002, had more 3-pointers in a game without a miss. She had just four 3-pointers in 37 career games prior to the JSU game.
- Eighth in the Big 12 in blocks (1.4 bpg) and 11th in rebounding (7.0 rpg).
- Her 34 blocks this season are the fifth most by a sophomore in team history.

Career:

- Already 12th on CU's all-time list for blocked shots with 53.
- Ranked fifth in rebounds among freshmen in the Big 12 in 2006-07.

- Averaged 16.6 points, 11 rebounds and 1.5 blocks per game in helping the Latvia National team to a 12th place finish at the 2007 U20 European Championship for Women. Led the tournament field with five double-doubles in eight games.
- Her Latvia National team experience also includes the 2006 U18 European Championships where her 16.9 points and 10 rebounds per game helped Latvia to a fourth place finish. Also played in the 2005 U18 and 2004 U16 European Championships.
- A 2006 graduate of Regis Jesuit High School in Aurora, Colo. An exchange student from Riga, Latvia, she could play only one season of varsity high school basketball in Colorado. As a senior she averaged 12 points, seven rebounds and two blocks per game helping the Raiders to a 24-4 overall record and a second place finish in the Colorado State Class 4A Tournament.
- Earned All-Continental Conference first team recognition and received honorable mention to the *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Class 4A All-State teams.
- She aspires to own her own business and to become a basketball coach.
- She lists the biggest moment of her high school career as going to the state championship game.

This Season:

- Averaging 4.5 points and 4.5 rebounds over the last two games.
- Registered five points, five rebounds and two blocks at Kansas. Had scored just six points and had just two rebounds in the previous 10 Big 12 games.
- Had a season-high 11 points on 5-of-5 from the field and seven rebounds in the win over Dartmouth. It was her first double-digit scoring effort since the Kansas game on Feb. 24, 2007.

This Season:

- The fourth player in team history to reach 1,700 points and joins only Lisa Van Goor as CU players with 1,700 points and 900 rebounds.
- Needs 17 points to pass Shelley Sheetz (1991-95) for third on CU's career scoring list and 28 rebounds to become the third player with 1,000.
- CU's all-time leader in free-throws made with 517 and ranks second on the all-time list for free-throw attempts (674).
- Has seven double-doubles this season, tied for third in the Big 12, and has reached 20 or more points nine times this season. Nearly had the CU's first triple double by scoring 21 points, grabbing a season-high 16 rebounds and dishing out a personal-best eight assists against Oklahoma State.
- Second on CU's career list with 44 double-doubles has tied Erin Scholz (1993-97) for second in career double-digit rebounding games with 46 after her 10-point, 10-rebound effort against Texas.
- Tied a school record, along with teammate Susie Powers, by playing 48 minutes against Iowa State. Tracy Tripp set the initial mark with 48 against Oklahoma State in a double-overtime game on March 6, 1989.
- Named to the Coors Classic All-Tournament team for the third straight season as she paced the Buffaloes by averaging 18 points, 11 rebounds and 6.5 assists over the two games.

- On the Big 12 charts ranks second in field-goal percentage and minutes, third in scoring, fifth in rebounding and free-throw percentage, and 11th in blocks.

- Named one of 10 nation-wide finalists for the 2008 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Also one of 31 mid-season candidates for the 2008 Naismith Award.

- Named to the Academic All-District first team for the third-straight year.

- A 2007 preseason All-Big 12 first team selection and named one of the top 5 power forwards in the nation by ESPN.com.

Career:

- 2007 *Associated Press* honorable mention All-American and All-Big 12.
- Member of the 2007 U.S. Jones Cup Team that won a bronze medal in Taipei, Taiwan this summer. Led Team USA in field-goal percentage during the six-game event at 57.1 percent (20-35)

BOULDER — Senior **Jackie McFarland** and sophomore **Aija Putnina** each tallied double-doubles as Colorado defeated Rice, 72-55, in the consolation game of the 21st Annual Coors Class Saturday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Clemson won the Coors Classic with a 77-67 win over Siena in the championship game.

Putnina, making her first start since a game at Cal State Fullerton on Dec. 7, 2006, led the Buffaloes with a career-high 15 points to go along with 12 rebounds. It's her third career double-double, all three of which have come when she's in the starting lineup. Putnina also added three steals and two blocked shots.

She has a way to go to catch McFarland's numbers, as the All-Big 12 forward registered career double-double No. 39 and her second-straight as she earned All-Tournament honors for the third time. McFarland had 12 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high seven assists. She's actually been closer to a triple-double has she had a school-record eight blocks to go along with a traditional points-rebound double-double in 2005 against South Dakota State.

Colorado shot an overall season-high 47 percent from the field and spread the wealth around as four players scored in double-digits and two others had seven or more. Senior **Susie Powers**, held scoreless for the first three games of the season, had 11 while freshman **Brittany Spears** had 10 points to go with seven rebounds and six assists.

Junior **Hannah Skildum** had eight points and four rebounds off the bench and **Kara Richards** pitched in seven on a perfect 3-of-3 from the field.

"Last night our look was a result of our shots not going down, and we were also struggling on the defensive end," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "But they were excited about this game and the tournament, and they went into this game with good energy. We knew that things were going to change and I thought they responded well from a very tough loss last night."

Colorado found itself down 13-4 right out of the gate. The Buffaloes, which shot just under 40 percent last night against Siena, made just 2-of-10 to start the game.

Colorado finally found its rhythm by embarking on a 13-0 run capped off by back-to-back 3-point field goals by McFarland and Spears to take a 17-13 lead with 9:18.

The good fortunes continued for the Buffaloes after their initial struggle. Colorado made 11-of-16 to close the half (69 percent) and at one point outscored the Owls 21-2 and led by as many 10 in the first 20 minutes.

Colorado pulled away quickly, beginning the second half on an 8-2 run to take a 47-33 lead and never let the advantage dip below 11.

Rice was led by guard Kadie Riverin who had 14 points, four rebounds and three assists en route to All-Tournament team honors.

BOULDER — When Colorado needed a shot in the arm to get going against Northern Colorado, the Buffs looked to their seniors to step it up, and they answered.

Forward **Jackie McFarland** scored a game-high 26 points and point guard **Susie Powers** had 12 points, eight assists and seven rebounds to lead Colorado to a 69-60 win over Northern Colorado Wednesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Colorado improves to 3-2 overall while the Bears fall to 3-3.

McFarland, who became the ninth player in team history to reach 1,400 career points (1,424), sparked a 23-4 first-half run to overcome a slow start by the Buffaloes. UNC hit its first four 3-point field goal attempts and built a 19-11 lead in the first 8:56 of the game.

Coming out of a media timeout with 10:56 remaining in the first half, McFarland took over. The All-Big 12 Conference performer scored 10 straight points capped off by a 3-pointer to give CU a 21-19 lead. After Kate Kevorken tied the game at 21, CU sophomore guard **Bianca Smith** kept the momentum by in the home team's favor by hitting three 3-pointers in a span of 2:17. **Caley Dow** and **Whitney Houston** finished off the run with back-to-back buckets to give the Buffs a 34-23 advantage.

Powers had six of her career-high eight assists in the first 20 minutes, two of which went to McFarland during her 10-0 run. Powers, whose 16 assists against only three turnovers this season leads the Big 12, scored nine of her career-best tying 12 points in the second half.

CU built its lead to 55-41 early in the second half as McFarland and Powers each hit a pair of 3-pointers during the run. UNC answered with six straight to cut CU's lead to eight, but Powers' third 3-pointer of the half sparked a 7-0 run to give the Buffs their largest lead of the game at 62-47.

The 3-pointer was a big weapon for the Buffs against UNC. CU made 13 from downtown, its most since a similar baker's dozen against Iowa State on Jan. 10, 2007. Colorado was 8-of-21 in the first half alone, with the 21 attempts breaking the school record of 20 attempts in one half set against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004. Colorado ended up at 13-of-36, with the 36 attempts just one short of the school record for a game which is 37 against Buffalo. CU, which had 10 3-pointers against Rice on Saturday, has hit double-digits in 3-pointers in back-to-back games for the first time in school history.

Sophomore **Aija Putnina** had a career-high 15 rebounds and tied a personal best with four blocked shots for Colorado, which held UNC to just 34 percent from the field. McFarland finished with eight rebounds and three blocks while shooting 8-of-11 from the field.

Whitley Cox led Northern Colorado with 21 points and five assists. Courtney Stoermer had 13 points and nine rebounds while Danielle Hagen had a team-high 12 rebounds.

BOULDER — Jackie McFarland scored 21 points, Brittany Spears matched her career high with 19 and Colorado upset No. 21 Wyoming 69-55 on Wednesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Colorado (5-2) snapped a 23-game losing streak against ranked opponents and ended a three-game series skid against the Cowgirls. CU's last win against a ranked opponent was a 69-59 win over then-No. 24 Baylor on Jan. 7, 2004. The Buffaloes were ranked 14th at the time. In ending that streak, the Buffs prevented Wyoming (6-1) from its first 7-0 start in nearly 30 years. Overall, CU has won four straight for the first time since winning five in a row in December of 2004.

Wyoming built a 14-7 lead as the Buffaloes made just three of their first 19 shots from the field. The Buffaloes then heated up as a pair of Bianca Smith 3-pointers and one by Spears capped off an 11-2 run to knot the game at 18-18. CU eventually held a 27-26 lead at the break.

Colorado opened it up early in the second half as Spears had eight points in a 10-0 run that gave CU a 50-38 lead with 10:54 remaining. Spears, who had 14 second-half points, capped the streak by hitting all three free throws after being fouled by Megan McGuffey on a 3-point attempt.

Wyoming responded to that surge with a 14-3 run that cut the Colorado lead to one at 53-52 with 5:11 left in the game. Smith answered for the Buffaloes with two consecutive 3-pointers that led to a 12-0 run, allowing CU to pull away.

McFarland had 15 points in the second half, including eight in the final 4 minutes. Smith ended with a season-high 16 points and also dished out three assists.

"I thought tonight's game came at a very pivotal time for us," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "I thought that we were coming off our best performance of the year (against CSU). To host a nationally ranked Wyoming team with such experience, was very pivotal. With this game we could have gone either way and I thought the timing of the game was good. Wyoming is a great team."

Susie Powers had another solid game for Colorado finishing with a career high nine assists and tying a personal best seven rebounds. The Buffaloes, who had averaged more than 20 turnovers in their first six games, committed a season-low 13. The Buffaloes had 21 assists on their 23 baskets and have 20-plus assists in three straight games for the first time since the 2001-02 season.

"This was a huge game for us for a lot of different reasons," McFarland said. "Wyoming is just as much as an instate rival as Colorado State is. To play them for three years and have not (defeated) them, is definitely the best win of my career. How this team plays when we have a ranked team in here, and to get a win is a sign that we are definitely moving up."

Colorado shot 61 percent in the second half and outscored Wyoming 42-29 in the final 20 minutes. Justyna Podziemska led the Cowgirls with 19 points, and Hanna Zavec scored 16.

McFarland had 15 points in the second half, including eight in the final 4 minutes.

Wyoming was off to its best start since going 8-0 to open the 1978-79 season. Colorado also handed the Cowgirls their first loss that season, too, 81-66.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Sophomore guard **Bianca Smith** scored a career-high 22 points off the bench, and Colorado held off No. 20 (AP)/17 (WBCA) Vanderbilt for a 62-51 win Sunday.

Colorado (6-2) has won five straight for the first time since the 2004-05 season and has wins over ranked teams in back-to-back games for the first time since the 2002 NCAA Tournament. CU defeated No. 22/21 Wyoming at home on Wednesday 69-55. Smith had 16 points off the bench in the win over the Cowgirls.

"(This week) has been a great confidence booster for me and the the whole team heading into the rest of the preseason," Smith said. "It's also motivating for us to continue to work hard, being able to see what we can do (against a ranked team)."

Much like the Wyoming game, Colorado built a sizeable second half lead, had it almost vanish, but recover and pull away at the end. The Buffaloes led 52-32 with 7:07 to play before the Commodores went on a 17-0 run to cut the lead to 52-49 with 3:01 remaining. But Colorado made 10 consecutive free throws in the final 1:47 to secure the victory.

"We are playing with a lot of confidence right now and that shows in our execution and the way in which we have prepared," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "Most importantly we've got five players on the floor that can make plays."

Jackie McFarland scored 12 points in a 27-5 run in the second half that helped the Buffaloes build a 20-point lead.

McFarland had 16 points for Colorado. Liz Sherwood led Vanderbilt (8-3) with 22 points. Redshirt freshman center **Courtney Dunn**, whose 6-4 size provided a key defensive match up against Sherwood, had five points and five rebounds.

Brittany Spears had eight points, a team-high seven rebounds and three steals.

Both teams struggled offensively in the first half, with Vanderbilt shooting 40.9 percent from the floor and Colorado 38.9, and the Buffaloes couldn't have imagined a worse start committing eight turnovers and missing two field goals on their first 10 possessions. Despite the turnovers, Vanderbilt could only build an 8-0 lead before the Buffaloes fought back.

Smith gave CU its first points with a long two with 13:54 remaining in the half and just kept on going. Smith scored 13 of CU's first 17 points on 5-of-7 shooting and her 3-pointer at the 7:57 mark gave the Buffaloes their first lead at 17-14.

Colorado struggled with turnovers early, but so did the Commodores. The Buffaloes had 15 in the first half, but Vandy nearly countered with 14. The Commodores were held scoreless for nearly nine minutes before Sherwood and Jennifer Rispe scored consecutive baskets as Vanderbilt retook the lead at 18-17.

The Buffaloes were able to get to the free-throw line in the final minutes of the half as McFarland and **Hannah Skildum** hit four straight to give CU a 21-18 halftime lead. Later in the half, Vanderbilt went 8-34 without scoring. Colorado took advantage, as Smith scored 13 of the team's first 17 points, capped by back-to-back 3-pointers, to give the Buffaloes a 17-14 advantage.

BOULDER - Three players scored in double-digits and a solid defensive effort propelled Colorado to its seventh-straight win with a 57-43 decision over Dartmouth Friday night at the Coors Events Center.

Colorado (8-2) has its best record to begin a season and longest winning streak since its 2003-04 NCAA Tournament team won nine-straight during a 12-2 start.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** had a game-high 13 points and senior **Jackie McFarland** recorded her 41st career double-double by netting 12 points and 11 rebounds. Junior **Kara Richards** had season-highs with 11 points and seven rebounds while hitting a perfect 5-of-5 from the field.

The Buffaloes won their second-straight game with defense. Colorado shot just 39 percent and equaled its lowest offensive output of the season, but the Buffs defense held its own holding the Big Green 23 percent shooting. Colorado blocked 13 Dartmouth shots, the second-highest single-game total in team history trailing only a 16-block effort against Sam Houston on Dec. 14, 2000. Spears and McFarland led the way with four blocks apiece.

CU, which gave up just 29 points against Texas Southern in its last game, held an opponent under 50 points for the fourth time this season.

Dartmouth started off on the right foot as Koren Schram's third 3-point field goal of the first half gave the Big Green a 20-15 with 10 minutes left in the period.

Colorado started to come alive immediately after thanks to its bench. Sophomore Bianca Smith answered Schram just under a minute later with a 3-pointer of her own to begin a 20-4 Buffs run over the final 9:15 of the half. Richards had four of her seven first-half points during the run, but more importantly countered Dartmouth's ability to crash the boards.

After Dartmouth held a 14-8 rebounding edge early, seven of which came on the offensive end, Richards 6-4 size allowed the Buffaloes to even out the rebounding total by halftime and would eventually claim a 43-40 edge for the game.

Spears narrowly missed a double-double by corraling nine rebounds. Freshman Courtney Dunn had five.

Dartmouth scored the first five points of the second half to narrow the gap to six at 35-29, but Smith once again answered a Big Green run hitting a 3-point field goal. CU never allowed the lead to dip below seven after that, but cold shooting on both sides prevented either team from making any type of move. Colorado was 30 percent from the field in the second half while Dartmouth shot just 23 percent.

Schram and Kristen Craft each had 11 points to lead the Big Green.

BOULDER - Jackie McFarland scored 22 points and Brittany Spears added 17, guiding No. 25 Colorado to an 81-38 win over Southern Utah on Friday night.

The Buffaloes (9-2) have won eight straight games. The streak has helped vault the team into the top 25 for the first time in three years.

Southern Utah (2-9) lost its 30th straight road contest, including seven straight this season. The Thunderbirds haven't won on the road since a win over St. Mary's on Dec. 10, 2005.

With her 22-point outing, McFarland moved into eighth place on the Buffaloes' all-time scoring list. She now has 1,510 career points.

Bianca Smith came off the bench to score 12, including three 3-pointers. Ajla Putnina had six points and Susie Powers dished out seven assists.

Spears entered the game as the leading scorer among freshmen in the Big 12 Conference, averaging 13.3 points. She also had five rebounds and two steals.

Kaila Goff led Southern Utah in scoring with seven points. Anne Westwood, the Thunderbirds' leading scorer, finished with six points, and didn't score her first basket until early in the second half. She also had eight rebounds.

The Buffaloes closed the first half on a 13-0 run to take a 44-20 lead into the break. It's the third straight game the Buffaloes have closed the opening half on a big spurt, going on a 20-4 run in a win over Dartmouth and a 15-0 burst against Texas Southern.

Colorado started the second half where it left off, going on a 12-0 run to up the lead to 36 points. The Buffaloes led by as many as 43 points. The Thunderbirds finished with 21 turnovers, which is one below their season average.

BOULDER - Jackie McFarland had 19 points and eight rebounds to help No. 23 Colorado win its 10th straight, 65-53 over Pepperdine on Friday night at the Coors Events Conference Center.

Bianca Smith added 18 points and **Brittany Spears** had 16 for Colorado (11-2) which is off to its best start since beginning the 2003-04 season 12-1. The Buffaloes begin their Big 12 Conference season on Wednesday at Missouri.

"I think right now we've come in and played strong," McFarland said on CU's 11-2 start. "I couldn't be happier. This is what I came to Colorado for; the tradition of winning. I can't keep a smile off of my face." Daphanie Kennedy led Pepperdine (5-8) with 15 points. The Waves have lost six in a row, all on the road. The Waves open West Coast Conference play Jan. 10 at Gonzaga.

Trailing by 15 at the break, Kennedy hit a short jumper to get Pepperdine within 38-33 with 18:08 to play and then McFarland took over for Colorado.

McFarland muscled in four layups and Smith added a 3-pointer in a three-minute span for a 49-32 lead. Two free throws by Kennedy with 1:50 left got Pepperdine to within 61-53 with 1:50 left, before Smith's basket and two free throws put the game away for Colorado.

"All I can say is that this team has the characteristics of a top 25 team," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "They show up everyday, practice hard and the seniors are leading this team. It's nice to have the recognition and I think they have earned that. This team isn't worried about getting higher in the rankings, they just keep the same mentality they've had all season."

Pepperdine led only once when Kennedy buried a 3-pointer 39 seconds into the game. The Waves then promptly missed their next 14 shots.

While the Waves struggled, Colorado went on a 19-1 run. McFarland scored seven of the points to put the Buffaloes ahead 19-4.

Miranda Ayim's basket with 7:53 remaining capped an 11-0 run, but Smith came off the bench to hit three 3-pointers in the last seven minutes as Colorado pulled away to a 36-22 halftime lead.

Susie Powers had a career high 10 assists for Colorado, the most by a Buff since Whitney Law's school record 15 on Nov. 18, 2005 against Cal State Fullerton.

COLUMBIA, Mo. – Reigning Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week **Brittany Spears** had a career-high 24 points to help No. 23 Colorado open the league season in style with a 70-58 decision over Missouri Wednesday evening at Mizzou Arena.

Colorado, which claimed its first win in a Big 12 road opener since winning at Baylor in 2004, registered its 11th straight win and improves to 12-2 overall. Missouri drops to 7-7, 0-1.

Spears' 24 points are the second-most by a Buffs' freshman in her conference debut, trailing only CU Athletic Hall of Famer and All-American Shelley Sheetz who had 25 against Nebraska in 1992.

Spears was 9-of-13 from the floor and added seven rebounds and two assists. She teamed with **Bianca Smith** for six second-half 3-pointers to allow the Buffaloes to build a lead as large as 21 late in the second half before the Tigers closed the gap late.

Colorado led by as much as nine late in the first half, but Missouri went on a 13-0 run to take a 32-28 lead with 18:17 remaining in the contest. But Smith and Spears hit five 3-pointers over the next eight minutes to spark a 27-6 CU run.

Smith finished with 14 points which included four 3-point field goals as she moved into 11th place on CU's all-time list for 3-pointers with 68.

Aija Putnina registered a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Senior **Jackie McFarland** had 17 points and five rebounds.

Alyssa Hollins led Missouri with 22 points, hitting 6-of-10 from the 3-point arc. Shakara Jones had 12 points and six rebounds off the bench.

BOULDER - Jackie McFarland had 24 points and **Brittany Spears** had a double-double but it wasn't enough as No. 19 Texas A&M defeated No. 25 Colorado Wednesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Danielle Gant scored 24 points and Takia Starks added 18 for the Aggies (13-4, 1-2), who avoided their first 0-3 Big 12 start since the 2003-04 season.

McFarland, who became the fifth player in CU history to register 1,600 career points (she now has 1,614), hit 8-of-13 from the field and made 8-of-12 from the free-throw line while also grabbing nine rebounds and blocking two shots. Spears had 11 points and a personal-best 12 rebounds for her third career double-double.

Colorado (12-4, 1-2) led for most of the game before Morenike Atunrase's only basket of the night gave Texas A&M the lead for good, 66-64, with 1:35 left. A'Quonesia Franklin hit six free throws in the final 30 seconds to seal the win for the Aggies.

Starks hit a 3-pointer with 4:22 left to give Texas A&M a 58-57 advantage, their first lead since hitting the first basket of the game. Starks extended the lead to three with another basket, but Colorado took the lead back on two free throws each from McFarland and Spears.

Colorado led 50-41 midway through the second half when the Aggies rallied. Starks hit two buckets, Sydney Colson had a steal and a layup and Gant had four points to pull the Aggies within 55-54 with 6:16 left.

Earlier in the half, Texas A&M had cut Colorado's lead to 36-34 with 16:51 left, and the Buffaloes responded. Sophomore **Bianca Smith** hit two 3-pointers and McFarland and **Aija Putnina** hit two free throws each to stretch the advantage to 46-37 with 14:43 left.

The Aggies stayed within striking distance in the first half despite poor shooting and a 15-2 disadvantage in free-throw attempts. Texas A&M, which came into the game shooting 40 percent from the field, shot just 33 percent in the first 20 minutes, and leading scorer Takia Starks was 2-for-9 from the field.

The Buffaloes weren't much better from the field, hitting just 37.9 percent of their shots and were 1-for-13 from behind the 3-point line. They held a 32-28 lead at the break thanks to an advantage from the line. Colorado was in the bonus with 13:32 left in the half and outscored the Aggies 9-1 from the stripe.

Colorado held a 36-18 advantage in free-throw attempts for the game. Putnina narrowly missed a double-double of her own with 10 points and nine rebounds. **Susie Powers** had seven assists, three rebounds and two steals.

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Jackie McFarland recorded her 42nd career double-double, in her home state, but Kansas State wasn't interested in the homecoming as the Wildcats remained perfect in the Big 12 with a 67-60 win Saturday night at Bramlage Coliseum.

Colorado dropped its third straight moving to 12-5 overall, 1-3 in league play. Kansas State wins its seventh straight overall improving to 12-5, 4-0.

McFarland scored 20 points to move into fourth place on CU's all-time scoring list (1,634) and grabbed 11 rebounds to become the third player in team history to reach 900 boards (908).

Kimberley Dietz led four Kansas State double-digit scorers with 18 points, hitting three 3-pointers. The Wildcats were sharp from the outside hitting 7-of-15 3-pointers in the game, and 4-of-6 in the second half.

Brittany Spears had 16 points and hit 2-of-6 from 3-point range. Overall the Buffs struggled from downtown hitting just 4-of-16 3-point attempts.

Spears hit three of her first four shots of the second half, including two straight 3-pointers as the Buffaloes led 43-41 at the 14:40 mark. Kansas State then took over hitting three straight 3-pointers, including two from Dietz, as the Wildcats embarked on a 21-4 run to pull away.

Aija Putnina had 12 points and seven rebounds. **Courtney Dunn** had six points and five rebounds off the bench. Shalee Lehning had 11 points, 11 rebounds and eight assists for Kansas State.

Colorado held an early 12-6 lead, but Kansas State went on an 11-0 run to put the Wildcats up 17-12 with 10:16 left in the first half.

The Buffaloes battled back behind 13 first-half points from McFarland and her first of two 3-pointers in the game tied the score at 25 with 4:55 remaining. CU briefly took the lead back at 29-28 when Dunn scored on a put back. Kansas State responded and closed the half with a 3-pointer from Dietz to take a 35-31 halftime lead.

CU struggled from the outside early making just 1-of-11 from 3-point range in the first half. The Buffaloes were able to recover by dominating in the paint. Colorado held a 23-14 rebounding edge and had 10 second-chance points to just two for Kansas State.

LUBBOCK, Texas – Senior **Jackie McFarland** tied a season-high 28 points, but cold shooting doomed Colorado as Texas Tech claimed a 62-44 decision in a Big 12 Conference game Saturday afternoon at the United Spirit Arena

Colorado falls to 13-6 overall, 2-4 in league play as the Buffs haven't won at a Big 12 Southern Division school in their last 12 tries dating back to a win at Baylor in 2004. Texas Tech improves to 14-6, 2-4.

The Buffaloes suffered their lowest point output of the season due to shooting just 24 percent from field. McFarland hit 57 percent, making 8-of-14, but the rest of the team hit just 13 percent (5-of-40) as the Buffs had their lowest team total since making just 13-of-56 (.232) against Texas in 2005.

McFarland was the only CU player to hit a field goal in the final 28 minutes of the contest and had 28 of CU's final 31 points. She hit 10-of-11 free throws leaving her just two shy of Bridget Turner's school record of 494 set from 1985-89.

Despite a heavily taped shooting hand, **Aija Putnina** scored Colorado's first eight points, hitting her first three field goal attempts and the Buffs had it knotted up at 10 early.

Texas Tech's Dominic Seals, who led the Lady Raiders with 21 points and nine rebounds, then began to take over. She scored four straight points and a Raquel Christian 3-pointer gave Tech a 17-10 lead. Colorado answered with the next five, thanks to a **Bianca Smith** put back and three free throws from Putnina and McFarland, but the Lady Raiders one-upped the CU run scoring nine straight, six coming from Seals, to give Texas Tech a 26-15 lead.

McFarland brought CU back scoring the next seven points, including a 3-pointer, which halted Tech's 11-0 run, but Seals scored the next four points and Christian hit another 3-pointer to give Tech a 35-26 halftime lead.

Texas Tech then put the game away by opening the second half on a 12-0 run. The Buffaloes missed their first 10 shots of the period and didn't score until a McFarland layup with 11:05 remaining in the game. Free throws from **Brittany Spears** and **Britney Blythe** accounted for Colorado's lone scoring other than McFarland in the second half.

Putnina finished with nine points and six rebounds. Spears had six rebounds but made only 1-of-11 from the field scoring four points, the low of her young career.

AMES, Iowa – Colorado struggled offensively for the second-straight outing as Iowa State claimed a 65-45 win over the Buffaloes in Big 12 Conference action Wednesday night at Hilton Coliseum.

Colorado drops its third straight on the road after beginning the season 4-1 away from Boulder, falling to 13-7 overall and 2-5 in the Big 12. Iowa State breaks its own three-game skid improving to 13-6, 2-4.

The Buffaloes shot just 31 percent from the field (15-of-49) and were held under 50 points for the second-straight game. The last time CU endured back-to-back sub-50 point games was during the 1983-84 season in losses to Colorado State (48-63) and UNLV (41-67).

Senior **Jackie McFarland** scored a game-high 18 points as she was the Buffs' only double-digit scorer for the second-straight game. McFarland made 7-of-13 from the floor as she has now shot 50 percent or better in 17 of 20 games this season, but the rest of the Buffs' roster was just 8-of-36 (.222) on the evening.

McFarland became CU's all-time leader in free-throws made by making 3-of-3 from the line to move her career total to 495. She passes Bridget Turner who made 494 from 1985-89.

Sophomore guard **Whitney Houston** scored nine points off the bench hitting three of CU's five 3-point field goals. For Houston, it was her highest point total since scoring 11 in a home loss to Siena on Nov. 23.

Colorado opened with an early 12-9 lead before Iowa State heated up from the field. Heather Ezell hit a 3-pointer with 10:58 remaining in the first half to tie the game and spark a 21-6 Cyclones' run. Iowa State hit four of its six first-half 3-point shots during that run and held a 21-13 advantage on the boards.

The Buffaloes were able to cut the lead to 10 at halftime after Houston hit her first 3-point field goal since November and **Hannah Skildum** hit a pair of free throws as ISU took a 35-25 lead into the lockerroom.

Iowa State put the game away with an 18-4 run to open the second half. The Cyclones hit 10 of their first 19 3-point attempts before missing their last four to finish the game at 43 percent.

Amanda Nisleit led ISU's balanced attack with 16 points. Alison Lacey and Kelsey Bolte each had 15.

Iowa State dominated on the boards, outrebounding Colorado 43-27. Bolte led the way with eight while Nisleit had seven.

BOULDER — In a game of runs, Nebraska had a couple more than Colorado and at the right time as well.

Brittany Spears and **Bianca Smith** each had 19 points but a 19-7 Nebraska run to end the game gave the Huskers an 80-71 Big 12 Conference win Wednesday evening at the Coors Events Conference Center.

Colorado (13-8, 2-7 Big 12) trailed by two at the half (36-35), but Spears scored six points during a 12-5 run to open the second period, giving the Buffaloes a 47-41 lead. Nebraska (16-6, 6-3) answered with six straight points to tie the game, five of which were scored by Kelsey Griffin who led all players with 25 points.

The Buffaloes struggled on the inside as All-Big 12 forward **Jackie McFarland** was held to just one free throw and just 0-of-2 from the field. For McFarland, who entered the game averaging 18.9 points per game, it was her lowest output since being held scoreless in her first ever Big 12 game at Nebraska on Jan. 5, 2005. McFarland did have 10 rebounds for the 45th double-digit rebounding performance of her career.

Although McFarland was held in check, other Buffs made sure it was a competitive game all the way to the end. Spears was 6-of-14 from the field and also had eight rebounds, six assists and two blocks. Smith, making her second start of the season, tied a career high with five 3-point field goals and was 7-of-15 from the floor overall.

CU's bench also provided a big spark. With McFarland being double-teamed the whole night, junior forward **Caley Dow** had her best Big 12 game of 2008 registering season-highs with eight points and seven rebounds in 30 minutes. Sophomore guard **Whitney Houston** had 10 points, her most since she had 11 against Siena on Nov. 23, with two assists and one steal.

Colorado held a 64-61 lead with 3:51 left after Smith layup, but it quickly vanished when Yvonne Turner hit her third 3-pointer of the night to tie the game. Danielle Page gave Nebraska the lead on a turn-around jumper and on the next possession, Turner stole the ball from Houston and took it all the way in to give the Huskers a 68-64 advantage. Griffin scored the next time down the floor for Nebraska and the Huskers put the game away with free throws hitting 10-of-12 in the final 1:37.

After falling behind 11-4 to open the game, Colorado stormed back with a 15-0 run. Smith hit three consecutive 3-point attempts on the run and good ball movement allowed for easy layups by Houston, Dow and Spears. Nebraska trimmed the lead to four at 19-15 before an 8-0 run gave CU its largest lead of the game at 27-15.

However the lead didn't last as Nebraska hit five 3-pointers in the final 5:21 of the first half during a 21-8 run to take a one-point lead at halftime.

NORMAN, Okla. - Oklahoma's Courtney and Ashley Paris combined for 48 points and 20 rebounds to lead No. 10 Oklahoma to an 82-66 win over Colorado in Big 12 Conference action Saturday night at the Lloyd Noble Center.

Jackie McFarland and **Brittany Spears** each had 19 points to pace the Buffaloes (13-10, 2-8 Big 12) who have dropped five straight and eight of their last nine. Oklahoma improves to 17-4, 7-2 in league play.

Courtney Paris had a game-high 30 points and 14 rebounds for the 87th double-double of her career. Sister Ashley had 18 points and six rebounds. The twins made 22-of-35 shots (.629) as Oklahoma outscored CU 50-22 in the paint. As a team, the Sooners shot 53 percent from the floor.

The Buffaloes kept the game close in the first half. After withstanding a 10-2 OU run to open the game, Colorado responded with a Spears bucket, a **Bianca Smith** 3-pointer and a **Caley Dow** putback to close the gap to three at 12-9. Oklahoma pushed its lead back to seven at 18-11 on one of Courtney Paris' 14 field goals, but CU went on a 10-4 run with 3-pointers from Spears and **Courtney Dunn** as the Sooners led just 22-21 with 8:03 remaining in the half.

Oklahoma built its lead back up to nine at 35-26 with just 2:25 remaining, but CU wouldn't quit. McFarland made back-to-back shots along with a free throw as the Sooners took a 37-31 lead at the break.

Oklahoma scored the first six points of the second half on two Courtney Paris layups and another by Ashley. The Buffaloes made one last good run as Smith hit 3-pointers on back-to-back possessions to bring CU to within six at 45-39 with 16:56 remaining.

The Sooners scored seven straight, capped off by a Nyshia Stevenson 3-pointer, to take a 52-39 advantage and never let the lead dip back below double-digits.

Spears had five rebounds and two blocks to go along with her 19 points, equalling her scoring output from the Nebraska game on Feb. 6. Her 307 points on the season are the most by a CU freshman since Erin Scholz had 343 in 1993-94.

McFarland had seven rebounds and was 8-of-14 from the floor as she became the eighth player in team history to reach 600 field goals (601). Smith finished with 15 points, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range as she moved into ninth place on CU's all-time list for 3-pointers with 86.

The Buffaloes received a scoring boost off the bench from Dow and Dunn. Dow had seven points and tied a season high with seven rebounds while Dunn had six points and five boards.

Stevenson finished with 16 points for the Sooners while Danielle Robinson had 11.

BOULDER — Sophomore **Bianca Smith** scored a career-high 26 points and tied several long-ball records as Colorado broke a six-game losing streak by defeating Texas 67-52 in Big 12 Conference action Saturday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Colorado, which snapped an eight-game skid against Texas, moves to 14-11 overall and 3-9 in Big 12 play. Texas drops to 16-9, 4-7 in the Big 12.

Smith connected on a school-record tying seven 3-pointers and hit all five of her free-throw attempts as she passed her previous career high of 22 set earlier this year against Vanderbilt. She also tied school marks for 3-pointers made and attempted in one half hitting 5-of-9 in the first 20 minutes.

Colorado led 38-31 early in the second half, but Texas responded with an 8-0 run. Ashley Lindsey scored a layup in transition and Carla Cortijo converted a 3-point play to give the Longhorns their only lead of the game at 39-38 with 13:22 remaining.

Sophomore **Aija Putnina** gave the lead back to the Buffs at 40-39 on a jumper from the foul-line area, and then on the next possession Smith hit her sixth 3-pointer of the night, was fouled by Crystal Boyd, and completed the 4-point play to put CU up 44-39.

Erneisha Bailey scored for Texas on the other end, but **Kara Richards** answered for CU on a put-back and Smith then hit her record-tying 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 49-41 advantage.

From that point on, Colorado survived on rebounds and free throws. Both teams were cold in the second half shooting an identical 7-of-29 from the field (24 percent). The Buffaloes nearly doubled up the Longhorns on the boards in the second half (32-17) and made 17-of-19 foul shots including their last 13 in the final three minutes.

Colorado hit 22-of-29 free throws overall and held a 50-29 advantage on the boards led by three Buffs in double-digits. Putnina led the way with a career-high tying 15 rebounds, six on the offensive end, to go along with 14 points. Senior **Jackie McFarland** notched her 44th career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. Freshman **Brittany Spears** pulled down 12 rebounds for the second-straight game.

Texas pressured the Buffaloes enough to cause 10 first-half turnovers and allow the Longhorns to respond to several CU runs. Smith hit two early 3-pointers and junior **Caley Dow** put back a Smith miss as the Buffaloes took a 14-8 lead at the 10:44 mark of the first half. But Texas responded with a 10-4 run to tie the game at 18.

Smith had three 3-pointers in the final six minutes of the half to give the Buffaloes a 34-29 lead at the break.

Brittainey Raven led the Longhorns with 16 points. Cortijo had 12 and Lindsey pitched in 11.
