Erin McEachren is the 2004 Women's Alpine Team Captain... Her best finishes of the season are an eighth place showing in the slalom (at Nevada) and ninth in the GS at the CU Invitational... In three-plus seasons, she has six top-10 and 19 top-20 finishes during an injury plagued career that includes 26 finishes... A 2003 Division I National All-Academic Ski Team Member, McEachren had a better than 3.0 gpa last semester.

Colorado's top downhill skier (men's or women's) in '04, **Erika Hogan** won her first run (in the only sub-45 second time of the morning) and first collegiate race, taking the giant slalom in the season opening Utah Invitational, edging Denver's Pia Rivelrud. It was the first slalom victory for a CU woman since Mia Cullman snared the win at Montana State in '03. The win sparked a streak of eight straight top-10 finishes, halted with an 18th place effort in the NCAA West Regional's giant slalom... In two seasons she has 13 top 10 finishes and has finished outside the top-20 just once in 19 finishes.

Colorado's top women's alpine newcomer, **Kristin Taylor** opened the season with an 11th place GS finish at Utah and a day later turned in her first of five top-10 downhill finishes (all but three races in '04)... She is only one of two CU women's skiers to go through the season without a DQ... Her strongest meet of the year was at the UNM Michele Lobo Invitational where she recorded season and career best finishes in the GS (5th) and slalom (9th)... A member of the Dean's List last semester in kinesiology.

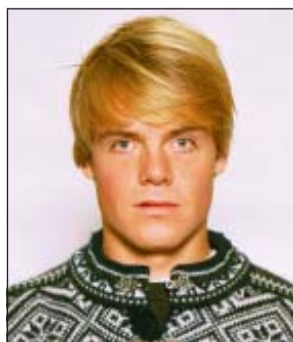
Colorado's top men's downhill skier, **Tahir Bisic** the Buffs in six races in '04, Bisic had all top-20 finishes entering the West Regional where he finished 26th in the GS and 25th in the slalom... His top finish in the GS is ninth (at New Mexico) and 10th in the slalom (on this course in January)... A 2003 Division I National All-Academic Ski Team Member, he was a Dean's List member in aerospace engineering last semester.

After joining the team in January, **Cody Jenick** opened his career with a pair of top-20 finishes at Utah, his first of eight in the season...He was CU's top finisher in two slalom races, at Utah (14th) and CU (17th) ...He has scored in all 10 races in '04... His top finishes in 2004 are 14th in the slalom (at Utah) and 16th in the GS (at New Mexico).

An immediate impact since joining the team in January, **Tor Erik Schjellerud** has paced the contingent of himself, Hoyer and Christiansen to all top 10 finishes in six races this season... Colorado's No. 1 men's nordic skier, he has finished no lower than fourth this season, and picked up his first collegiate win in CU's own invitational when he won the classical in 26:04.6, a distant 30 seconds ahead of New Mexico's Geir Endre Rogn... His highest freestyle finish was second a day later, again in CU's own carnival... He missed the Utah Invitational as he was back home in Norway competing in the Norwegian National Championships. ..His runner-up finish in the classical and third place effort in the freestyle at last week's NCAA West Regional was the strongest regional weekend for a Buff since Ove Erik Tronvoll finished second and first, respectively, in that meet in 1998.

Claire Critchley enters the NCAA Championships with five top-10 finishes in '03, including a seventh place effort in the classical at the NCAA West Regionals...Her season best finishes are fourth in the classical (at New Mexico) and third in the freestyle (CU Invitational)...After battling to a fourth place finish in the classical at New Mexico, she had to sit out the skate portion of the meet due to illness...In three seasons she has 17 top 10 and 29 top-20 finishes and has scored in 14 of 17 career races... A 2003 Division I National All-Academic Ski Team Member, she owns the team's highest grade point average and turned in a perfect 4.0 last semester in kinesiology.

The 2004 women's nordic team captain, **Muriele Huberli** enters the championship with two national meets under her belt, more than any other CU skier on this week's roster...While slightly off her freshman year pace, she has recorded six top-10 and 10 top-20 finishes this season...Her season best finishes are both fifth place efforts at Nevada (freestyle) and at CU's own invitational (classical)...A two-time second team All-American in both events in Anchorage in 2002...2003 Division I National All-Academic Ski Team Member and a member of the Dean's List last semester.

The official runner-up of the RMISA, Rehemaa is out for her first win and first trip to the podium this week, as she has had six runner-up finishes in 10 races in '04 and has finished outside of the top-5 only once this year...She has finished second behind Alaska Anchorage's Mandy Kaempf twice and New Mexico's Martina Stursova three times... She has 17 top-10 career finishes since joining the team in January of '03...In the classroom she recorded a better than 3.0 gpa in international affairs last semester.
