FOR STARTERS: Dating back to last season, CU has lost 12-straight Big 12 road games, seven in a row this season (last Big 12 road win, Jan. 21, 2006 at Oklahoma State, 80-78, ot) ... In those 12 road losses, the opponent is outscoring CU, 80.7-to-65.7 and scoring 75 or more points, eight times ... With nine road losses, tonight could tie Coach Patton and the 1999-2000 season with 10. Ten plus road losses in a season happened 16 other times in school history and the last time CU lost 19 games occurred in 1988-89 (21 defeats) ... CU is 2-12 in conference play tying the 1992-93 campaign; the last time they lost more than 12 conference games was 1985-86 (0-14).

POSITIVE BITS: Dominique Coleman keeps moving up the season rebounding list for guards. With 153 boards so far, he's eighth overall (No. 1 is 173, Donnie Boyce, 1993-94) ... Coleman has made 97 field goals this season compared to 48 last year; his assists total has increased from 82-to-57 ... With 32 blocked shots, Marcus King-Stockton had only 30 combined in his freshman and sophomore seasons ... Xavier Silas has 279 points for eighth place on CU's freshman scoring list ... Richard Roby's career-best 33 points came at Mizzou (Jan. 14, 2006).

LAST TIME vs. MISSOURI: Back on Jan. 24, the Tigers took a 79-65 win in Boulder (complete box, story on page 25). Mizzou looks for the their first season sweep of CU since the 2001-02 season.

HOOK SHOTS: Richard Roby is the eighth player in CU history to score more than 1,400 career points (1,403 in 84 games). Only one player in school history - Cliff Meely from 1969-71 - has done it in fewer games (1,940 in 80)... **Xavier Silas** has double-digit scoring in nine of his past 11 games. He has 58 points in the last four contests (14.5 ppg.)...Roby stands 26 points from seventh (Michel Morandais, 1428). Roby has made 10 FGs in a game four times this season...Roby has led CU in scoring three straight games (22.0 ppg.)...In his last six games, **Dominique Coleman** is averaging 12.0 ppg., 8.5 rpg., 20 assists, nine steals and shooting 26-for-43 (.605). Coleman has six or more rebounds in 12 of the last 14 games...Coleman has led CU in assists (12 times), steals (11 times), rebounding (nine times)...In Big 12-only stats, **Marcus King-Stockton** is tied for first (21 blks., 1.5 a game)...In 10 road games, Roby (16.4 ppg.) and Silas (12.1 ppg.) are averaging 10 or more pts. **TEAM:** The Buffs have allowed eight Big 12 opponents to shoot 50% FG or better...CU has used 13 different starting combos...The opponent has 19 more 3-pointers (57 pts.) than CU at their own arena (Mizzou averages 8.1)...The last time the Buffs finished with one road win was 1995-96 ..In 14 conference games, CU has netted 60 points or less in five games (seven overall).

CU AT MISSOURI: Mizzou holds a 50-13 advantage over CU in Columbia, however the Buffs pulled out a 74-71 victory at the Mizzou Arena last season for their first win over the Tigers since Jan. 7, 1997.

QUICKLY ON THE TIGERS: Missouri brings a 14-4 home record into tonight's game with four of those losses coming in conference play (KU, Nebraska, K-State, Iowa State). Taking the Jayhawks 18-point win in Columbia, Mizzou's three other losses are an average of only 3.3 points...The Tigers' 17 victories this season are their most since a 22-11 record in 2002-03...Freshman Keon Lawrence has scored in double-figures in five of six outings since becoming a starter. MU is 4-2 since he entered the starting lineup...Junior guard Stefhon Hannah has led Mizzou in scoring in eight of the last nine contests. He has reached double-digit points in 23 outings, including six in a row...Hannah has shot 50 percent or better 15 times this season and has been perfect from the free throw line on eight occasions.

ON THE ROAD IN THE BIG 12: Since the Big 12 formed (1996-97), CU has played 87 regular season games on the road. At the close of the 2006-07 season, the Buffaloes under Coach Patton are 21-66 (.241). That means an average of 2.1 wins a season and 5.9 losses in eight road games. The highest win total was 4-4 in 1996-97; their lowest was one win in each of the 2002-03 (Baylor), 2001-02 (A&M) and 1999-2000 (Kansas State) seasons.

X FACTOR: After missing the game at Iowa State with a left ankle impingement, freshman Xavier Silas remains a force in the CU lineup, perhaps better in the starting lineup. In 15 starts, Silas averages 13.4 ppg. and 4.1 rpg., 68-for-161 from the field (.422) and has led the team in scoring five times. He's come off the bench in pair of home games, Kansas State and Kansas as well as the first six games of the season. In those eight games, Silas is averaging 9.8 ppg., 3.3 rpg. and shooting 26-for-77 from the field (.338). He also has 11 3-pointers.

LONG DISTANCE IS BETTER: If you look at his overall stats, freshman Kal Bay is second on the team in treys made (39). Bay has a higher percentage from the arc (.368) than the rest of the field (.338). In fact, 39 of his 45 made field goals are treys. In 14 Big 12 games, Bay has 18 3-pointers, four from the rest of the field.

SIXTH MAN...no more: With two games coming off the bench for the first time in his career (KU, Feb. 14; at Texas Tech, Feb. 17) Richard Roby returned to the starting up at Iowa State (Feb. 21) with 23 points, seven rebounds and 26 points, six rebounds against Kansas State (Feb. 24). His 21 shots from the field at ISU were the most since firing 24 back on Dec. 4 against

Pepperdine. His two-game total in a reserve role was 12.0 ppg. 5.5 rpg. and 10-for-21 FG% (.476).

HYPHENATED NAMES: Finally did some research and CU has the only two hyphenated names (Marcus King-Stockton and Jermyl Jackson-Wilson) in seven college basketball conferences (Big 12, ACC, SEC, Missouri Valley, Big East, Pacific-10, Big 10).

TWO WEEK NOTICE On Oct. 25, Coach Patton announced this would be his last season of coaching at CU. Patton said he would not seek nor accept an extension of his contract (expires June 30, 2007). In 11-and-half-years, Patton has 183 victories, four NIT appearances, two NCAA Tournaments, and three 20-win seasons.

LAST TIME OUT (complete box on page 27): Junior Richard Roby led the Buffs with 26 points, but Colorado could not hold a half-time lead, as the hot-shooting Wildcats shot 67 percent from the floor in the second half to win 87-71 Saturday afternoon. Freshman Xavier Silas chipped in 17 points for the Buffs. Cartier Martin came off the bench to score 19, Clent Stewart added 16 and Blake Young had 13. It's also the first time the Wildcats (20-9, 9-5 Big 12) have won 20 games in the regular season since 1987-88. They won 20 in 1998-99 but didn't record No. 20 until the Big 12 Tournament. The Buffaloes (6-18, 2-12) lost their ninth game at Coors Events Center this season, the most home losses in school history. They've now dropped five straight and nine of their last 10.

TOP-10 SHOOTER: Richard Roby ranks among the top-10 field goals attempts list. Entering tonight's game, Roby has 1,154 attempts good enough for sixth place. As for field goals made, Roby is a bit behind Scott Wedman's 10th place of 516. Roby has 481 field goals made.

HALL ALMOST ELIGIBLE: With a few more weeks remaining in the 2006-07 season, the countdown for Marcus Hall is also beginning for his senior year in 2007-08. The 6'1" guard from Houston, Texas will join seniors Richard Roby and Marcus King-Stockton along with a talent returning group. Hall has played 88 career games played (44 starts) and averages 8.3 points and 3.4 assists per game. He ranks ninth on the school's all-time assist list (295), 10th in 3-pointers made (99) and 19th in steals (82). Hall was also one of the captains on the 2005-06 team.

INDIVIDUAL BUFF BITS: **Richard Roby** has 11, 20+ efforts this season (29 career) ... Roby has led the team in scoring 12 times, including one shared and has scored double figures in 20 of 24 games ... Freshmen have led CU in scoring nine times this season, seven of the last 11 (**Xavier Silas** has six; **Kal Bay**, one) ... **Jermyl Jackson-Wilson** was a perfect 6-for-6 from the field at TTU (Feb. 17) for 15 points and seven rebounds ... **Jackson-Wilson** grabbed a career-best 10 defensive rebounds (11 overall) at Iowa State, the most boards since his 14 against Wyoming (Nov. 26) ... **Kal Bay** tied his season-best with 5 3-pointers and tied his career-best of 21 points (Central Florida); as did Coleman with 21 pts. and a career-best 15 rebounds. 'Nique's third double-double and third time this season with over

10 rebounds in a game ... Despite playing the point, **Dominique Coleman** has led CU in rebounding nine times ... **Xavier Silas** became the first player other than Richard Roby to lead the team in scoring three straight times (Mizzou, at Nebraska, Iowa State). The last time this was accomplished other than Roby was Michel Morandais during the 2002-03 season, twice ... **Marcus King-Stockton** had a season-high nine rebounds against Missouri (Jan. 24) and at Iowa State (Feb. 21) ... CU has six double-doubles this season: Coleman (3), **Jermyl Jackson-Wilson** (2), **Richard Roby** (1) ... Silas (23 pts.) and **Jeremy Williams** (18 pts.) each scored three season-bests at Baylor (Jan. 30) ... CU had three players with 20 or more points against Oklahoma State for the first time since Feb. 19, 2003 at Kansas ... Roby has netted 30+ points three times this season (six times in career): 32 pts

The opponent has scored 20+ points in a game 17 times and tallied seven double-doubles against CU this season CU is 1-15 when trailing at the half and 2-62 when trailing by 10 or more points at half (0-10 this season) under Patton ... CU was 31-for-52 from the field at Texas Tech, tying a season-best for FGs made this season...CU's .596 field goal percentage at TTU was the highest since the 2002-03 season (Feb. 15, 2003, Texas A&M).CU won its first back-to-back games against the Cowboys since Feb. 1, 1989 and Feb. 13, 1988 ... CU has outrebounded the opponent on the offensive glass 11 of 14 games (not Texas, K-State, at TTU) and

have outrebounded the opponent six of 12 games (not K-State, UT, Baylor and were even against OU & TTU ... CU has trailed at the half 11 of 14 conference games (led K-State, OSU and rallied to beat Iowa State) ... Against Kansas (Feb. 14) Mizzou (Jan. 24), CU had 17 offensive rebounds most in Big 12 play by the Buffs this year ... CU made 10 3-pointers in back-to-back games (OSU, at Baylor) ... 46 points scored at home vs. KU matches season-low of 46 scored at home against Air Force ... Other notes vs. KU: 15 FGs made lowest since 15 FGs vs. Iowa State (Jan. 31, 2001); .273 FG% lowest since Jan. 15, 2005 (Kansas, .299) ... CU had a season-best eight 3-pointers in the first half against Oklahoma State; 10 treys overall for the third time in 2006-07 (at Baylor and Texas)... Four of CU's six wins shot better from the field (Oklahoma St., Iowa St., Central Florida, Denver)...CU's 45 rebounds vs. the Cowboys, most this season in the Big 12 and most since grabbing 48 against Pepperdine ... CU led at half (15 pts. over OSU) for the first time in the Big 12 this season ... Twice this season CU has allowed 100 points (at New Mexico and Texas). The last time the opponent scored 100+ three times in a season was 2001-02 (KU twice, Texas) ... Against UCF, both teams combined for 55 free throws made breaking the Events Center record of 53 ... CU's 36 made free throws against UCF are the most since making 36 back on Feb. 22, 1997 (Missouri) ... Buffs suffered four non-conference home losses this season, a school-first since 1975-76.

AT HOME vs. RANKED TEAMS: Since the 2002-03 season (five years), CU has defeated at least one ranked opponent at the Coors Events Center. So far, they're 1-3 this season with the upset of then-No.12/14 Oklahoma State. Last season, it was No. 18/19 Oklahoma, 84-75(Feb. 15). In 2004-05, the Buffs defeated No. 23/22 Texas, 88-79. In 2003-04 it was No. 22/23 Texas Tech and during the last NCAA Tournament team in 2002-03, it was four opponents, including No. 3 Texas and No. 6 Kansas.

CU vs. RANKED TEAMS: The Buffaloes stuck to tradition and defeated a ranked opponent at home for the fifth straight season (W, 89-77, No. 12/14 OSU). So far, this season, CU is 1-3 against the nation's elite teams. Under Patton is 12-51 (.191) against ranked schools. However, on the road it's a much different story having lost last 23-straight (last win was at No. 20 Texas Tech, Jan. 11, 80-78).

Denver freshman guard Nate Rohnert rolled his ankle during a shoot-around Friday morning and was held out of the game. The Pioneers were already missing junior guard Mykhael Lattimore (right thumb injury) and junior center Adam Tanner (fractured left arm). They're expected to miss at least three more games.

Colorado guard Kal Bay became just the fifth freshman to start in the opener during Patton's tenure. Roby started for Patton in 2004-05.

BOULDER (AP) - The Colorado Buffaloes men's basketball team were held to 11 points in the first half and fell to the Air Force Falcons at the Coors Events Center.

Sophomore forward Jermyl Jackson-Wilson led Colorado with nine points. Leading scorer, junior guard Richard Roby was held to six points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Nick Welch added 18 points for Air Force (4-0), which last started out with four straight wins in the 1998-99 season, when it began 5-0. The Falcons hit 13-of-25 3-pointers, four by Tim Anderson.

The first half output of 11 was Colorado's lowest scoring half since being held to four points in the first half of a Jan. 23, 1980 game at Missouri.

It was also the first time CU failed to place a player in double figures since Feb. 15, 1992 at Kansas. Poncho Hodges and Joe Stephens each scored nine points in the 82-45 loss.

Colorado took a 4-0 lead early, but trailed 35-11 at halftime thanks to a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes and a patient Air Force team that shot 52 percent and had 11 points from Welch.

After a basket by junior forward, Marcus King-Stockton, the Buffaloes missed 11 straight shots and turned the ball over five times while the Falcons' Dan Nwaelele buried three, 3-pointers as part of a 22-0 run that ended with Matt McGraw following his own miss to push Air Force ahead 22-4.

Jackson-Wilson ended the scoreless string with a basket at 6:49 that drew a roar from the crowd. Colorado, which shot 23 percent for the half, managed only seven points the rest of the period, two by Roby, who was 1-for-8 shooting.

Things didn't get much better in the second half for Colorado. The Buffaloes improved their shooting to 42 percent, but fell behind 47-17 after a 3-pointer from Welch and a layup and free throw from Keith Henke.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP) - Richard Roby scored 22 points, and teammate Jermyl Jackson-Wilson made a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift Colorado to a 60-59 victory over Utah Tuesday night.

Kal Bay added 11 points and three 3 pointers for the Buffaloes who won at Utah for the first time in six tries dating back to 1946. It's also the first road win in seven road games for CU since winning at Oklahoma State back on Jan. 21, 2006 in overtime (80-78).

Jackson-Wilson missed his second of two free throws, and the Utes rebounded and called timeout with 1.8 seconds left. But Lawrence Borhas desperation three-pointer missed badly as time expired.

The victory was the first for the Buffaloes (2-2) after back-to-back blowout losses, while the Utes fell to a 0-3 start for the first time since 1970.

Johnnie Bryant scored 20 points for the Utes, including 11 in a row to start the second half, and Luke Nevill added 14 points and 10 rebounds.

But the Utes committed two crucial turnover in the final minute, with the game tied 59-59.

The first came on a bad pass after Utah's Shaun Green drew a charging foul on Roby, and the second came when the Utes lost the ball on a fast break following a blocked shot by Nevill. Borha fouled Jackson-Wilson in the ensuing scramble to set up the winning free throws.

Jackson-Wilson added 10 for the Buffaloes, who forced 17 turnovers and held the Utes to 43.6 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 17 turnovers in the first half, and the Utes made 6-of-22 shots. Neither team led by more than six points.

WILMINGTON, N.C. - Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks.

The Seahawks improved to 2-3 on the season and snapped a three-game losing streak as they made new skipper Benny Moss a winner in his first home game. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 in the new season.

Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break.

Senior playmaker Temi Soyobo poured in 12 points - all in the first half - on 6-of-8 shooting and added nine rebounds and dished out five assists in an all-around game. He also had eight steals to match the record set by Bob Martin in UNCW's 83-79 loss to Wake Forest when the arena opened on Nov. 26, 1977.

Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

Trailing by five points at halftime, the Seahawks finally caught up with the Buffs with a 7-0 mini-run midway through the second half. A finger roll by CU's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson with 15:48 remaining gave the Buffs a 40-36 lead, but UNCW reeled off seven unanswered points and grabbed a 43-40 edge when Fountain followed up his own shot at 13:09.

After CU sliced the deficit to two points, 49-47, with 6:18 left on a dunk by Jackson-Wilson, the Seahawks went on a 10-2 run. Freshman guard Daryl Felder converted a conventional three-point play on a spin move in the paint to start the rally and a jumper by Dejan Grkovic in the paint at 3:54 pushed the margin to 10 points, 59-49.

The Seahawks, who outrebounded the Buffs by a 37-32 margin, held CU to just six field goals and forced 11 turnovers in the final period.

The Bears kept clawing back with four 3-pointers in the last 3:17, none bigger than Will Figures' trey with 30 seconds remaining tying the score at 86-86 setting Jackson-Wilson heroics after CU called a timeout with 24 seconds remaining. CU gained the final possession and it would take two missed jumpers before Jackson-Wilson picked up the offensive rebound and hit the game-winning shot to end the game.

Jackson-Wilson also added seven rebounds, six blocked shots, four assists and three steals.

BOULDER (AP) - Jason Smith's 15 points and 16 rebounds led the Colorado State Rams past the Colorado Buffaloes, 72-69 for their first win in Boulder in nearly half a century.

The Rams (7-2), who frittered away most of their 16-point second-half lead, won their sixth straight and prevailed on the road against their biggest rival for the first time since Dec. 2, 1957, snapping a 13-game losing streak in Boulder.

Richard Roby's 20 points led the Buffaloes (3-6), marking his fifth 20-point effort of the season. Roby also had four assists, three blocks and a steal.

Smith's three-point play with 1:28 left in the first half ignited the Rams on a 17-3 run spanning halftime to turn a tie game into a 51-37 lead. The Rams closed the first half on a 9-0 run to take a 43-34 lead into the locker room, and the Buffs scored just one bucket in the first seven minutes of the second half.

Colorado State led 55-39 on Smith's dunk with 11:56 left. But the Rams' runaway didn't pan out as the Buffs went to a fullcourt press, chipped away and pulled to 70-65 on Kal Bay's 3-pointer with 50 seconds left.

Roby's basket after a Smith turnover made it a three-point game with 33 seconds left. Tim Denson sank one of two free throws to make it 71-67 and Roby raced downcourt to make it 71-69 with 22 seconds left.

He fouled Denson with 18 seconds left and Denson again hit one of two, giving the Rams a 72-69 lead. Roby was long a 3-pointer that would have tied it with 10 seconds left and the Rams got the ball out of bounds.

This time, they weren't trapped and go the ball upcourt to dribble out their rare win in Boulder.

Cory Lewis added 13 points for the Rams and Stephan Gilling had 12 on 4-of-5 shooting from beyond the arc. Jermyl Jackson-Wilson added 10 points for the Buffs.

The Buffs began the game with a 9-0 run as the Rams turned the ball over four times and missed five shots in the first five minutes before finding their range.

Roby and Durant nearly matched shot for shot in the first half. Durant, who had 21 points and three 3-pointers by halftime, had a scoop shot layup and free throw to put Texas up 50-43 with 2:23 before the break.

CU got four free throws from Roby in the last 1:34 as the Buffaloes closed the gap to 51-48 at intermission. Roby was 3-for-5 on 3-pointers and had 22 points in the first half.

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) - Nate Carter came off the bench to score 15 points and grab eight rebounds as Oklahoma defeated Colorado, 78-54 on Wednesday in the Sooners' Big 12 Conference home opener, giving rookie coach Jeff Capel his first league win.

Oklahoma (9-5, 1-1 Big 12) snapped a two-game losing streak. The Sooners have beaten Colorado (4-8, 0-2) 22 straight times at the Lloyd Noble Center, a streak that dates to February 1980.

Carter has 28 points and 17 rebounds in the Sooners' two league games. Freshman Tony Crocker, who entered the game with a 10.9-point scoring average, had 16 points and eight rebounds, and point guard Austin Johnson added 10 points for Oklahoma.

The Sooners controlled the basketball game on the defensive end, holding the Buffaloes to five points in the first 8:18. Colorado's final point total was about 17 below its previous season average.

Oklahoma also harassed the Buffaloes into a season-high 25 turnovers - stepping into passing lanes for 14 steals - and blocked three shots.

The loss was Colorado's fourth in five games. It's the eighth time in Big 12 history that the Buffaloes have started league play 0-2.

After scoring 30 points in CU's last game, against Texas, Richard Roby scored 20 points. Freshman forward Jeremy Williams had eight points to go with a season-best 12 rebounds for the Buffaloes.

The Sooners never trailed, jumping out to a 16-5 lead early behind five early points from Carter.

A layup by Dwight Thorne and a 3-pointer by Roby pulled the Buffaloes to within two points with just over four minutes left in the first half. Carter responded with a short jumper and Crocker took a charge on Colorado's next possession, then hit two free throws to extend the Sooners' lead.

Oklahoma ended the half on a 13-4 run and led 37-26 at halftime.

The Aggies put Colorado away with a 19-3 run as the Buffaloes went more than three minutes without a basket. Richard Roby scored 11 points, his 10th straight game in double figures. He came in averaging 25 points in Big 12 play.

"If you told me before the game that we could shoot 53 percent from the free throw line and still win, I don't know if I'd believe it. But our guys played hard," said CU head coach Ricardo Patton. "I saw some good things, but had to deal with some lapses. If we can take this game and learn and grow and make free throws maybe the game is not as hard as we made it."

Wesley Johnson and Jiri Hubalek each scored 15 points for the Cyclones, who showed some hangover from their overtime loss to No. 6 Kansas on Saturday, falling behind 20-8 when Roby scored eight points in the first 12 minutes.

Iowa State chipped away and took a 33-31 lead into the locker room on Rahshon Clark's pull-up 3-pointer just before the halftime buzzer. The Cyclones were just 1-for-11 from beyond the arc before Clark's swish, which capped a 14-3 run.

Silas scored 11 straight points, on a trio of 3-pointers and a layup down the baseline, to help the Buffaloes regain their lead at 47-41 in the opening minutes of the second half, and Colorado never trailed again.

Silas' 3-pointer with 6:47 left gave the Buffs a 58-52 lead that they extended to 63-52 on Jermyl Jackson-Wilson's three points and a bucket by Dominique Coleman (nine points, seven rebounds, four assists, four steals).

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) - Aleks Maric scored 28 points and Jamel White added 18 points, but it was a stellar effort on the defensive end that led the Nebraska men's basketball team to a 71-50 victory over Colorado Saturday at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

The Huskers held Colorado to just 13 first-half points, the lowest single-half point total by any conference opponent in the history of the Devaney Center. The Buffaloes' 13 points were also just one more than the Devaney Center record for few points scored in a half set by Arkansas in 1987, Bethune-Cookman in 2003 and Morgan State in 2004.

It was CU's second lowest first half output of the season after scoring 11 points in the first half against Air Force back on Nov. 18.

NU limited Colorado to just seven assists, while forcing 18 turnovers that led to 25 Husker points. Nebraska also held CU's leading scorer Richard Roby, who entered the night averaging 18.3 points per game, to just one point. The Huskers held Roby without a field goal for the first time in his career, while they forced him into 0-of-5 shooting and seven turnovers during his career-low scoring effort.

The Huskers' defensive effort propelled them to a 17-point halftime advantage and Nebraska (12-5, 1-2 Big 12) cruised from there to give Head Coach Doc Sadler his first Big 12 Conference victory. Colorado fell to 5-10 overall and 1-4 in the league.

Xavier Silas led two Buffaloes in doubles figures with 13 points, although he hit only five of his 12 shots from the field. Coleman added 12 points and five assists.

Lawrence found himself in an unusual situation - open. Lawrence typically draws a crowd around the 3-point arc, but found room against Colorado's defense, finishing 4-of-8 from 3-point range.

After Colorado pulled to within four late in the first half, the Tigers went on a 27-12 run to put the game away and improve to 12-6 for the first time since the 2000-01 season.

The Buffaloes have now allowed three first-year coaches to win their first Big 12 game this season - Missouri's Mike Anderson, Oklahoma's Jeff Capel and Nebraska's Doc Sadler.

Colorado was 1-for-15 from 3-point range for the game and committed 15 turnovers. The Buffaloes have lost five of their last six games.

It's the second straight game Oklahoma State trailed at halftime. The Cowboys fell behind Iowa State 23-17 at halftime, but managed to rally for a 62-50 win. There were 10 lead changes in the first half before the Buffs pulled away late.

Richard Roby, who'd averaged almost 23 points his last three games and 17.6 for the year, managed only five points on 1-for-9 shooting. Also having a bad game was Jermaine Maybank, Kansas State's 6-4 senior guard who scored 26 points against Kansas - 24 above his season average. He got his first career start but wound up with only three points.

Kansas State took its biggest lead of the first half, 37-25, when Stewart drove in for an under-handed scoop. The Buffaloes missed nine of their last 10 shots of the first half.

Leading 59-42 with about 8 minutes left, the Wildcats went on a 10-4 run capped by Hoskins' three-point play and a bucket and two free throws by Martin, 6-7 senior who's been coming off the bench the past two months in a new role.

The Jayhawks won this one 75-46 behind 14 points by Russell Robinson, 11 from Darrell Arthur and 10 from Sasha Kahn on Wednesday night.

As usual, the Jayhawks (22-4, 9-2 Big 12) had little trouble dispatching the Buffaloes (6-15, 2-9), whom they've lost to just once in their last 37 games, a one-point shocker in 2003.

Colorado coach Ricardo Patton, who is 1-25 against Kansas, didn't start his top two scorers, junior Richard Roby and freshman Xavier Silas.

The Wildcats had a big run in the first half, only to see Colorado rally back into the game. After falling behind early, Kansas State went on a 17-3 run to take a 21-15 lead with 7:54 remaining in the first half.

However, the Buffaloes regrouped and went into the locker room leading 30-29 after Dwight Thorne hit a 3-pointer with 49 seconds to go before halftime.
