COLORADO-STEVINSON RANCH INVITATIONAL HISTORY



A few years back, late University of Colorado head coach **Mark Simpson** had the idea of hosting a meet for District 5 (Central Region) teams at a good weather site, since many of the schools only faced each other once or twice a year at the most and usually in less-than-preferential weather conditions. **George Kelley**, the founder and owner of Stevinson Ranch, lettered in golf at Colorado in the early 1970s and was friends with Simpson, as the two were teammates in 1972. Simpson pitched Kelley on the idea and the rest is history, though the format is moving away from the central format, though all are still invited; the first nine tournaments have been a success and are quite popular with the participating teams.
