CU vs. BAYLOR... Colorado leads the head-to-head series 14-7, however trail 3-4 in Waco. In Big 12 play, the series is 3-3 in Waco with the Bears winning the last two at home. Since 2006, CU holds a 3-2 edge.

LAST YEAR vs. BU... The schools split the two meetings last season with Baylor defeating CU in Boulder, 68-57 on Feb. 27. At the Big 12 Basketball Championships in Kansas City, CU became the first No. 12 seed to beat a No. 5, defeating Baylor, 91-84 in double overtime.

IF SEASON ENDED TODAY...

CU would be the No. 12 seed and play No. 5 Kansas State at 1 p.m. (MST) at the Big 12 Basketball Championships in Oklahoma City.

LOOK AT THE BEARS... Baylor is struggling with an 1-8 record in its last nine games. The Bears were selected as the Big 12 Pre-season number three team (tied w/ Kansas) and has only defeated Texas A&M in the last nine games. The Bears are 12-4 at home with an average loss in four home games at 8.0 ppg. Head Coach Scott Drew is in his sixth year in Waco and returns four starters from last year's NCAA Tournament team.

NARROW MARGIN... CU has dropped 10 single-digit losses this season, and seven of their last 11 in Big 12 play. Seven of CU's 13 Big 12 losses are by an average of 5.1 points. Last year, the Buffaloes dropped 10 games by single-digits (seven against Big 12 schools).

BUFF TIDBITS (team)... CU has lost eight straight games their longest since losing eight in row back in the 1995-96 season. The last nine-game losing streak occurred in 1986-87 ... The Buffs also own the Big 12 record for consecutive road losses (27). Previous mark was Baylor, 25, set from 2004-07 ... Up next is Texas A&M and Kan-

sas State to round out the conference regular season. A&M is the home finale next Wednesday with the Aggies winning the last five in a row over CU; K-State has won six straight over CU including a 77-75 overtime win in Boulder on Jan. 24 ... The Buffs have played three OT games this season, the most since playing three in the 2000-01 season (1-2).

BUFF TIDBITS (individual)... Levi Knutson scored a career-best 19 points off the bench on 8-of-13 shooting against Oklahoma State (Feb. 25) ... Casey Crawford tied a career-best four treys and racked up 14 points against OSU ... The CU bench scored 38 points compared to only 17 points by CU starters versus the Cowboys ... Against OSU < CU committed only eight turnovers, the sixth time committing single-digit turnovers this season ... Austin Dufault led CU in scoring and rebounding for the first time this season with 15 points and five rebounds against Missouri (Feb. 21) ... In Big 12 play, Cory Higgins has led the team in scoring six times and Dwight Thorne (four times). Austin Dufault, Ryan Kelley, and Levi Knutson have led the team once ... Higgins has led

CU in scoring 15 times this season (17 career) ... Cory Higgins scored the most points by any Colorado player in Big 12 play against Texas with a career-high 34 points in their overtime loss to the Longhorns. Higgins tied a career-best 11 field goals made and scored 30+ points for the second time in his career ... Higgins has led CU in scoring and rebounding 14 times this season (16 career) and has accomplished that feat in the same game nine times.

MORE INDIVIDUAL/TEAM NOTES...

Dufault, Higgins, Thorne II have started all 27 games; Tomlinson has started every game he has played in (25) and has missed two games due to injury (TCU, OSU) ... CU's 46-41 loss at Nebraska was the lowest point total (87 pts.) since March 5, 1960 (CU 41, Oklahoma State 39 in Stillwater) ... CU made five 3-pointers in the first half at Nebraska, that's a team-high in 12 conference games for three-pointers in the first half, second most behind six treys made against Arkansas-Pine Bluff ... The Buffs out-rebounded the Cornhuskers 35-25 (Feb. 18) and for the first time all conference season out-rebounded a Big 12 opponent and by double-digits ... CU has made a 3-pointer in 222-straight games dating back to the 2001-02 season (seventh overall in the Big 12) ... CU is second in Big 12-only FT percentage (.734) and rebounding defense (32.3) ... In the Big 12 era, the Buffs have won at least three conference games in a season (2006-07, 2008-09) ... CU's 76 points scored against Texas (Feb. 14) was the most points scored by a CU team since netting 80 against Coppin State at the Rainbow Classic ... The Buffs were 14-of-14 from the free throw line in the second half against the Longhorns and finished 25-of-29 (.862). It was the ninth time in 12 league outings that CU has hit at 70 percent or better ... In the 108-year history of CU basketball, the Buffs are on the verge of three consecutive 20 loss seasons, a school-first.

HIGGINS CAREER WATCH... Cory Higgins has 730 career points and is tied for 50th all-time at CU. Also, his 87 steals are 20th, 59 game starts is t-21st, and his 2075 career minutes is 26th.

FT RECORD HOLDER... Cory Higgins reigns as the CU and the Big 12 free throw record holder with 45-straight made free throws over eight games. Since then, he rattled off another 23-straight over three games ending at Texas Tech. On the season, he's .836 (153-of-183, 42nd nationally as of Feb. 16).

40+MINUTES... Cory Higgins, Dwight Thorne, Nate Tomlinson and Austin Dufault are the only players to have played 40-plus minutes in a game this season. Higgins has done it five times this season, followed by once by Thorne II, Tomlinson and Dufault, all in overtime games.

35+MINUTE MEN... More impressively the same four players have recorded 35-plus minutes a number of times. Cory Higgins in 21 games; Dwight Thorne 14 games; Nate Tomlinson 11 times, and Austin Dufault six

games.

FALL 2008 SEMESTER... The team G.P.A. for the spring semester was 2.713 ranking as the second highest GPA for the men's basketball team since the Spring of 1999 (Spring 2001 was the highest at 2.74). The CU men had nine student-athletes with a 2.9 grade point average or higher. The team also has four student-athletes with a 3.0 or better G.P.A. (Trent Beckley, Austin Dufault, Trey Eckloff, Levi Knutson).

YOUTH MOVEMENT... A combination of 10 underclassmen (five freshmen and five sophomores) highlight the roster matching one of the youngest CU teams in history. Back in 2006-07, CU had 10 underclassmen (eight freshmen), in addition to the 1992-93 season (four freshmen, six sophomores).

TV APPEARANCES... CU will play on television 20 times this season, six of those nationally (FSN, ESPN, ESPNU 4 times). Here are the rest ... ABC Regional: 1; FSN: 1; ESPN: 1; ESPNU: 4; Big 12 Network (previously ESPN Regional): 5; FSN RM: 8.

FG%... During non-conference play, the Buffs shot above 50 percent from the floor eight out of 14 games, going 6-2. That is the most .500 shooting games since the 2000-01 season when the Buffs recorded eight games of .500 or better shooting. The last time CU recorded more than eight games of shooting .500 or better from the floor in non-conference play was the 1985-86 season when they went 8-2 in 10 games. Ironically, the Buffs were also 8-6 after non-conference play in the 1985-86 season, Tom Miller's first as Colorado's head coach, unfortunately the Buffs finished the season on a 17-game losing streak going 0-15 in conference play (0-1 in the Big 8 Tournament).

RAINBOW CLASSIC RECAP... CU went 1-2 over the three days with its lone win coming on the opening day against Coppin State. CU sophomore Cory Higgins was named to the All-Tournament team leading the Buffaloes in scoring in every game and averaging 18 points a game. He also recorded his first career double-double (21 pts., 10 rebs.) against Coppin State. CU averaged 66.3 ppg., shot .489 from the field (69-of-141) with an impressive .852 from the free throw line (46-of-54). **All-Tourney Team:** Cory Higgins, Colorado; Calvin Betts, Buffalo; Roderick Flemings, Hawai'i; Mike Trimboli, Vermont; Marcus Walker, Colorado State; Andy Robinson, Buffalo (MVP).

VOLUNTEERS... One Saturday, Dec. 6, the CU men's basketball team and more than 150 community volunteers teamed up to deliver gift baskets to nearly 1,000 low-income families. The CU men's team visited the Golden West senior residence in Boulder. The program was associated with RSVP of Boulder County.

CU SINCE 1996-97... In the 13-year history of the Big 12 Conference, CU is shooting a team-best from the free throw line so far this season.

CECC RECORD...maybe a school record? Sophomore guard Cory Higgins was the first CU student-athlete to lead the team in rebounds AND assists the first two games of any season since 1973-74. It's a Coors Events Conference Center mark (building opened in 1979). The research was stopped at the 1972-73 season because assists were not kept. So, in the last 35 years, no CU player has led his team in rebounding AND assists in the first two games of the season.

HAWAII BOUND...AGAIN... The Buffaloes will be making another trip to the Hawaiian Islands playing in the 2009-10 Maui Invitational. The dates are Nov. 23-25 (Mon.-Wed.) of Thanksgiving week. It will be CU's first-ever appearance in Maui hosted by Division II college Chaminade, and sponsored by EA Sports. The Buffaloes will be one of eight schools participating in the 26th edition of the tournament. Joining CU next year will be Arizona, Cincinnati, Gonzaga, Maryland, Vanderbilt, and Wisconsin.

Tunks officially signed National Letters of Intent.

"With the signing of these three young men, once again we have taken a major step toward creating the vision for this program," Bzdelik said. "All three are highly skilled, highly intelligent and play with a competitive spirit."

Burks is a 6-foot-5 shooting guard from Grandview, Mo., is a skilled left-handed player who is capable of playing point-guard and will fit CU's system because of his ability to shoot from distance and slash to the basket. He committed to CU over Kansas State.

Hornbuckle is a 6-foot-6 small forward from Los Angeles, Calif., is a smooth shooter with deep three-point range and the ability to finish above the rim in transition. Hornbuckle helped Campbell Hall High to a 31-5 record as a junior in 2007. He is rated as the No. 34 small forward/shooting guard by Scout.com. Hornbuckle selected CU over Arizona and Arizona State.

Harris-Tunks is a 6-foot-11 center/forward from Sydney, Australia, will join current CU freshman guard Nate Tomlinson, who also hails from Sydney. Harris-Tunks is the third recruit to sign with the Buffaloes, selected CU over Vanderbilt and Gonzaga.

Harris-Tunks spent the last year and a half at the Australian Institute of Sport, a prestigious academy that has college like demands both athletically and academically.

JEFF BZDELIK - HEAD COACH

Jeff Bzdelik begins his second year as the University of Colorado men's basketball head coach continuing to build the Buffaloes to greater heights in one of the best basketball conferences nationally.

Bzdelik (buzz-DEL-ik), 56, a man synonymous with success on both the professional and college levels in the state of Colorado, was named the 17th men's basketball head coach on April 4, 2007.

During his first season on the Boulder campus, Bzdelik and his staff saw a mix of positives and negatives in their 12-20 campaign. CU remained competitive despite its lack of depth losing nine games by an average of 4.8 points. The defense allowed opponents an average of 64.4 points per game, its lowest in 46 years, while committing 13.4 turnovers a game – another school-low in 28 years.

Entering the 2008-09 season, CU will again be one of the youngest and most inexperienced team in the Big 12 with five freshmen on the roster, in addition to five sophomores, two juniors and one senior.

Bzdelik came to Colorado from the United States Air Force Academy, where he guided the Falcons to a 50-16 record (a 75.8 winning percentage) in two seasons from 2005-07. During those two seasons he led the Falcons to a 2005-06 NCAA Tournament and a 2006-07 NIT Final Four appearance.

Bzdelik brings 30 years of coaching experience to the Boulder campus from the collegiate to the professional ranks. He returned to the college game in 2005-06 after 15 seasons as both a coach and scout in the NBA, including two-and-a-half seasons as head coach of the Denver Nuggets.

His two-year win total of 50 victories at the Academy was a school-best in any two-year span of the 51-year history of Air Force basketball, while his 26 victories in 2006-07 was also a school high. He's the only coach to have won at least 24 games in back-to-back seasons. Bzdelik guided the Falcons to a 31-1 home record, including a 15-0 mark in 2005-06 and 16-1 in 2006-07.

In 2005-06, Bzdelik led the Falcons to a 24-7 record and the school's fourth appearance ever in the NCAA Tournament. He also led the Falcons to a 12-4 record and second place finish in the Mountain West Conference. Air Force also capped the season leading the nation for the fourth consecutive season in scoring defense.

"Jeff symbolizes all the essential leadership qualities that are important to successfully direct the Buff basketball program and represent the University of Colorado with class and distinction," Bohn said. "His high level of professionalism, competitive spirit, work ethic and integrity makes him the perfect choice for our world class institution."

"With the hiring of Jeff Bzdelik, the University of Colorado at Boulder has made a strong statement about our values as well as our athletic aspirations," said CU Chancellor Bud Peterson. "Coach Bzdelik's experience, commitment to excellence, concern for his players as scholar-athletes, along with his intensity and attention to detail, are a perfect fit for the type of environment we are creating here at CU."

Prior to returning to the college ranks with the Air Force Academy, Bzdelik was the Denver Nuggets head coach for two-and-a-half seasons (2002-2005). He was named head coach in August of 2002 after spending one year as a scout for the Nuggets. Bzdelik engineered one of the biggest turnarounds in NBA history during his second season in 2003-04, leading the Nuggets to the playoffs for the first time since 1994-95 while posting a 43-39 record. The 26-game improvement over the previous year was the sixth-best in NBA history.

Bzdelik also became the first coach in league history (since the adoption of an 82-game schedule) to guide a team to the playoffs the year after winning less than 20 games. In his first season, Bzdelik earned NBA-wide praise for Denver's competitiveness, work ethic and never-give-up attitude. Despite having the youngest team in franchise history, Bzdelik's team shattered the franchise record for scoring defense by more than five points per game, giving up only 92.4 per outing. In addition, the Nuggets led the league in turnovers forced (17.1 per game) and had six of the top 12 marks for single-season scoring defense.

Surprisingly to many, he was let go by the Nuggets after just 28 games into the 2004-05 season, with the team off to a 13-15 start. But that decision would eventually become Air Force's and now Colorado's gain.

From 1995-2001, Bzdelik was an assistant coach under Pat Riley in Miami, holding the title of Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting during the final two years. With the Heat, he was responsible for the preparation of all game plans, video coordination and statistical data as well as player development.

In 2000, he was recognized by *The USA Today* as one of the NBA's top five assistant coaches. In the 1998 Pro Basketball issue of *Sports Illustrated*, he was voted as the NBA's best advance scout by league general managers.

Prior to his tenure with the Heat, Bzdelik spent the 1994-95 season as the lead scout for Riley and the New York Knicks. He also served as an assistant coach with the Washington Bullets from 1988-94 and was Wes Unseld's first assistant in 1993-94. In addition, he coached the Bullets summer league team in 1988 and 1994.

The Illinois native began his coaching career in 1978 at Davidson (N.C.) College. In 1980, he was named an assistant coach at Northwestern University where he spent six seasons and was instrumental in the Wildcats' first NIT appearance in school history.

He then accepted his first head coaching position at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County, one he would handle for two years before moving on to the NBA.

During the 1986-87 season at UMBC, his squad was cited by *The Sporting News* as having "One of College's Biggest Turnarounds," in the school's inaugural season in Division I. After going just 11-44 the previous two seasons as a Division II program before Bzdelik's arrival, UMBC went 12-16 in his first year and 13-15 in 1987-88 in Division I. His teams excelled in the classroom as well, posting a 2.86 grade point average during his tenure.

Bzdelik is a 1976 graduate of the University of Illinois-Chicago, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned four varsity letters in basketball at UIC and was named team MVP as a senior in 1975-76. He still holds the school record for the best free-throw percentage in one season, shooting 88.1 percent (59-for-67) from the line in 1975-76 and still ranks among UIC's all-time leading scorers.

Bzdelik also spent six years in the Army National Guard during the early to mid 1970s.

In June 2008, Bzdelik was one of six coaches invited by the USO (United Service Organizations) to visit and experience the Persian Gulf called "Operation Hoop Talk: Talking Hoops with the Troops."

During the tour, Bzdelik and the coaches visited Bethesda and Walter Reed Hospitals in Washington, D.C., visiting wounded military personnel and toured multiple military posts in Kuwait City and Iraq. The coaches also posed for photos, signed autographs and spent quality time talking with military about the game of basketball, in addition helping boost troop morale bringing a touch of home to those in uniform.

"It keeps things in perspective," said Bzdelik on how the experience affected him. "As a coach you are in awe of the collective will, of sacrificing the individual for the collective good, of unselfishness, and dedication. And the military is the best example of this. I want to rally this message to my team, and hopefully that will help them grow. I would go back tomorrow. There is special spirit there that engulfs one, and you just feel it, and want to be around it."

Bzdelik was born December 1, 1952 and graduated from Prospect High School in Mount Prospect, Ill. He is married to the former Nina Bernardzik, who was a standout volleyball player at UIC from 1974-76 and is a member of the Flames' Athletic Hall of Fame. They are the parents of two children, Brett (19) and Courtney (17).

Bzdelik Quotes - Game-by-Game**Nov. 14, 2008 vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff (W 76-56)**

"It was what I hoped would happen. This team is unselfish; you just have to look at the box score and see that four players were in double digits. They are not afraid to pass the ball to one another; we had 18 assists on 27 baskets. They care, they are passionate and they are coachable."

Nov. 18, 2008 vs. Montana State (L 85-82)

"Give Montana State credit. I think we were soft on defense, and soft rebounding the ball. And that was what we talked about all week when game planning. I think that the team learned a lesson about the intensity level that needs to be exhibited all the time on defense and on the boards. I am proud of the fact that our players did not quit and battled back and that is a testimony to their character. We fell short because we dug such a deep hole. We were just not very sharp tonight."

Nov. 22, 2008 vs. Harvard (W 70-57)

"I want to teach them, motivate them, encourage them, and have them get better. Winning is a byproduct of getting better. I'm not worried about winning or losing right now because the results will be there as we continue to get better. I tell them to be fearless. I'm not going to get mad if you miss a shot or try to do the right thing with effort. I want them to be fearless. They are a very unselfish team."

Nov. 25, 2008 vs. Lafayette (W 73-59)

"There was a lot of good. We shot 51% from the field, we got to the free throw line 30 times, and we had four players in double digits, so that means that we are unselfish and share the ball. Those are all great things. But I think that we need to improve our defensive rebounding and turnovers. They affect the game in a big way. We defended well. When you play teams like Lafayette and Harvard, they make you cut hard. You have to be rock solid to be in the proper position. We have to culminate the defense with rebounding and get out and run, because we are a good team when we get out and run."

Nov. 29, 2008 at Stanford (L 76-62)

"We've got to defend better and rebound the ball better. There is a lot of youth out there. I'm really proud of our basketball team, I thought they competed hard. We just need to keep getting better and to learn. I think they are starting to realize they can compete. I think we did a little better on the boards than we normally have done."

Dec. 3, 2008 vs. TCU (L 62-46)

"The worst feeling for a coach is when your team doesn't play with emotion, discipline, or passion, and appears to just be disorganized. That's on me and it's a rotten feeling. We had a great crowd, great student body turn-out and it's really a shame we couldn't at least give any kind of effort. Obviously I have to do a much better job than I have been doing."

Dec. 10, 2008 vs. Colorado State (W 75-56)

"I was really proud of the effort. It was a wire-to-wire effort. We just kept battling and staying within our offense. We had 16 assists on 28 baskets, we had four guys in double-digits, we drew charges, and we battled on the boards. We made a couple adjustments defensively. That was the first time we have run a 1-3-1 [zone defense]. We have been working on that in practice the last five or six days. It's something I have never run as a coach and tried to catch Colorado State off-guard."

Dec. 19, 2008 vs. Prairie View A&M (W 72-47)

"Coming off a nine-day layoff with finals and spotty practice time and location, with players coming in and out of practice because of study sessions and tutors, I am very happy with how we came out of the gate. I thought we were pretty active for the most part. We turned the ball over too much. What we get out of it is all of these guys are getting as much court time as they can. All of these guys need experience and getting out there in front of people and playing is how you gain experience period."

Dec. 23, 2008 vs. Louisiana-Monroe (W 65-62)

"The lesson to be learned from this is we got to block people out with great force. They had 15 points on the offensive glass, probably should have had more. We need to rebound, take charges, get our nose dirty, get bloodied up, and skin our knees for all 40 minutes from everybody. We made the right plays at the right time and that is a positive to build on."

Dec. 28, 2008 vs. Coppin State (at Rainbow Classic) (W 80-63)

"There were a lot of good things tonight, we shot 55 percent from the floor, 50 percent of our three-point shots and 88 percent from the line, we outrebounded somebody and we have four players in double figures. But 18 turnovers, that's not so good. Buffalo is a very good basketball team and they gave Connecticut all they could handle. They are very strong and physical. We'll have to do a much better job of taking care of the basketball and hitting the boards."

Dec. 29, 2008 vs. Buffalo (at Rainbow Classic) (L 62-60)

"We dug ourselves such a deep hole in the beginning. Buffalo had more energy than we did and they had a will and a want-to. I can't dive on the floor, or take a charge, I would if I could. But I can't do those things and we drill and show them those things. We got beat on the boards and we turned the ball over too much in the beginning."

Dec. 30, 2008 vs. Vermont (at Rainbow Classic) (L 84-59)

"As freshman they're learning hard lessons. With a young team, three games in three days runs a whole gamut of emotions and the preparations are different. It is all part of the process and if you're going to build this team right you have to start at the ground level and there are hard lessons."

Jan. 5, 2009 at SMU (L 70-67)

"We're just not deep enough. I wish I had confidence in our bench, but people don't see what I see in practice. They need to step up and help because we run out of gas and get a step slow in parts of the game and that hurts us. You can't expedite experience, it just has to happen."

Jan. 7, 2009 vs. Western State (W 65-52)

"It was all over the map. There are signs that are very encouraging, and there are things that are very disappointing. We have a good field goal percentage. Our free throw percentage has moved up there. So we are shooting the ball pretty well. However, our rebounding is not very good. And we will continue to work on that. I have been patient, it is about handling them right. At half time, I didn't panic and I didn't raise my voice. We just talked about the adjustments we needed to make. I played a lot of players in the first half to give them some time."

Jan. 14, 2009 at Missouri (L 107-62)

"That's all we practiced and emphasized was to in-bound the ball, advance the ball and get a good shot and yet we turned the ball over 26 times to yield 30 points. The combination of missing layups, turning the ball over and breakdowns defensively, it snowballed quickly."

Jan. 17, 2009 vs. Kansas (L 73-56)

"Obviously, in order to have chance for success in basketball, the first two criteria are to value the possession of the basketball, and yield nothing easy for the opponents. Those are the two areas that our young basketball team has not quite done yet. Kansas scored 37 of their 73 points off of bad turnovers and second chance points. Those are areas that constantly kill us. Hopefully all this experience they are gaining now will pay off in the future. I am not discouraged, and I am excited about the future of this program."

Jan. 20, 2009 at Texas Tech (L 63-55)

"Our guys really tried to play to win and they battled their butt off. But we can't lose our spirit and we didn't. We played really hard and just came up a little short in a lot of areas. A little bit here and a little bit there makes a difference. We just have to be a little bit more efficient. It's just a case where we just need to keep battling and keep improving."

Jan. 24, 2009 vs. Kansas State (L 77-75 OT)

"Every possession has to matter. To start the game we were down 20-10 and already had seven turnovers. Why did we lose? If we have two or three less turnovers and two or three defensive rebounds, a little better execution on the timeout plays would have been better too. We have progressively gotten better, but we're not into that, we're into winning. The winning and losing will take care of itself if we get better in those areas. We need to be down to 12 or less turnovers and we can't allow teams to get 13 offensive rebounds."

Jan. 27, 2009 vs. Iowa State (W 55-49)

"We made some timely stops and we made some timely shots. We only turned the ball over three times in the second half. We started the second half only 3-of-15 shooting the basketball. We had some really good looks, we got the ball in the post and we drove the ball well. The fact we didn't turn the ball over allowed us to continue to get good shots and not give them easy points. The fact we held them even on the boards, and they only had three offensive rebounds. We were solid and we defended well. [Craig] Brackins did get 24 but nobody else scored in double-digits, in fact their next leading was scorer was six points from [Lucca] Staiger and [Bryan] Petersen."

Jan. 31, 2009 at Kansas (L 66-61)

"I thought we came out very tentative. We gave up offensive rebounds in the first half and had a lot of open shots that we didn't make. I thought we grew as a basketball team considerably. We got in our stance defensively, we attacked and played aggressively. We're getting better; we just have to keep growing as a team. I'm proud of this team because they battled back."

Feb. 4, 2009 vs. Nebraska (L 55-53)

"We are not tough enough or strong enough to finish around the rim. We had open shots that we have to make. We shot 46% and had 13 turnovers and about four of those were unforced, where we are trying to make a pass where we shouldn't or travelling in the open floor. We have guys who are strong, but we are not strong enough or tough enough. You can blame it on youth if you want, but I am not going to do that. I am not into moral victories, and I know some people around here are, but I am not. Every possession is critical for a team that has little margin for error."

Feb. 7, 2009 at Oklahoma (L 77-72)

"There was a two and a half minute segment in there where we turned the ball over three times. We only had nine turnovers in the game but one was a real bad turnover. We had a chance to take a charge on [Blake] Griffin and we didn't. Then we didn't box out on the free throw and [Tony] Crocker made the three."

"They're not getting rewarded with W's," Bzdelik said of his young team. "But they keep battling and that shows you what type of young people they are and the type of program we want to build."

Feb. 11, 2009 at Iowa State (L 70-42)

"It was a very disappointing beginning for us. I was concerned about the approach our team had mentally. I thought at Kansas and Oklahoma we knew we had to play so hard to compete and we did and we found ourselves in the ball game. Against Iowa State, I sensed we were comfortable knowing we beat them once. That's not good enough."

Feb. 14, 2009 vs. Texas (L 85-76, ot)

"First of all I am very proud of my basketball team, with the exception of one half versus Iowa State. They are working hard to improve, their competitive spirit is great. Gaining wisdom and experience are coming at the high cost of tough losses. They need to keep believing. I thought that our fans were awesome. We are just going to continue to work hard to turn this thing around. We are not quite physically strong enough, and we are not there mentally in certain aspects of the game."

Feb. 18, 2009 at Iowa State (L 46-41)

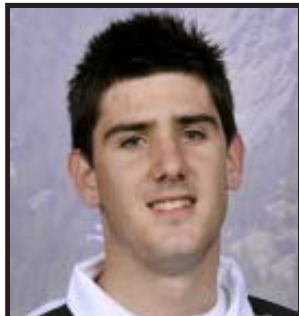
"We had every opportunity to seize the lead but we couldn't finish. We put ourselves in position for the win and we need to not waiver with our competitive spirit. We had some empty possessions; it wasn't anything they did, it was what we didn't do. A lot of those turnovers we just lost the ball. That's getting back to being mature and a little stronger and again, time will heal that."

Feb. 21, 2009 vs. 11/10 Missouri (L 66-53)

"We don't play well all the time but they are trying and competing which is testimony to how they are as people and how they're wired. I'm going to keep challenging and keep pushing them. They're growing up the hard way but that's a good thing."

Feb. 25, 2009 vs. Oklahoma State (L 76-55)

"The lack of passion and effort from a great majority of our team was embarrassing. Even though we haven't won a lot of games we have played with a lot of effort and passion and a commitment to play the game the right way. Tonight that was absent from a great majority of the team. I know I am embarrassed, I would hope our team is embarrassed because I am. No excuses, we got our butt beat. Defensively we were chasing people instead of guarding people. Early on, we got sucked in on flat drives and didn't locate shooters. Everybody has to be collectively engaged with a commitment to playing hard and right for all 40 minutes for us to have a chance to win."
