ON THE RANGE...

The 13th Annual Big 12 Conference Golf Championships will be held at **Prairie Dunes Country Club** in Hutchinson, Kansas, April 27-29, with play beginning at 7 a.m. (MDT) all three days ... For the second straight year, the championships will be four rounds (72 holes), with the 60 competitors to play 36 holes on Monday (April 27) and then 18 on Tuesday and Wednesday; it's just the second 72-hole conference meet that CU will participate in during its 90-plus year golf history ... Prairie Dunes (Hutchinson, Kan.) hosted the first six meets (1997-2002, then in 2004); Southern Hills (Tulsa) served as the site in 2003 and 2006; Whispering Pines (Trinity, Texas) was the site in 2005 and 2008 as the three courses are currently the rotating home sites (despite Colorado no doubt being home to some of the best courses in the Big 12 region, the threat of spring snow makes it risky for CU to host) ... W-Pines hosts in 2010 and P-Dunes again in '11 ... Colorado enters the meet ranked No. 47 (*Golfweek*) and No. 53 (GolfStat) in the country in the most recent rankings (as of April 22, though CU somehow mysteriously dropped six spots in the latter since last weekend without playing ... Colorado is 8-2 versus Big 12 schools in 2008-09, but will see Oklahoma State, Texas, Texas A&M and Baylor for the first time this season in the Big 12's ... CU is the No. 6 seed (and the top North Division seed) for the second straight year and will be paired with Texas A&M (No. 4) and Baylor (No. 5) on day one; the trio will begin on No. 1 at 7:50 a.m. MDT and will start round two around 1:20 p.m. off No. 10 ... Prairie Dunes boasts a **6,598-yard, par-70** layout; it will be just the second par-70 course CU will have seen this year (11 meets to date), the other being at the Western Intercollegiate (Pasatiempo Golf Club) where the Buffs tied for second.

OFF THE TEE...

CU has had a rough run of late in the Big 12 meet, as since 2005, the Buffs have posted finishes of 11th, 10th (tie), 11th and 10th; the Buffs did fend off finishing last, which they have done just once in a conference meet in its storied history, that coming in the second year as a member of the Big Seven in 1949). The Buffs had finished in the "first division" (top 6) in six of the seven years prior, and are one of just two teams to improve as many as eight spots one year to the next when they jumped from 11th in 1997 to third in 1998 (Missouri did the exact same between 2004 and 2005). Still, CU has six first division finishes, tied for the sixth most; only OSU and Texas have finished in the first division all 12 times in Big 12 meet history, with Oklahoma third (9), followed by Texas A&M (8) Kansas (7) and then CU and Texas Tech. CU's best efforts have been a pair of third place finishes in 1998 and 2000.

ROSTER

Colorado will be represented by two seniors, one junior and two freshman (both true) in the 2009 Big 12 title meet, though young overall, the group has earned a collective 13 letters, including this season. CU's youngest team ever at a league championship came in 2003, as three freshmen, one junior and one senior turned in a sixth-place finish. Here are the five players representing CU in this year's championship (ranked by position):

FRESHMEN IN THE LEAGUE MEET Two freshmen have participated several times, often with success in the conference meet, most recently, in 2000, **Kane Webber** and **Stephen Carroll** tied for 11th as frosh. The highest finish by a freshman, true or redshirt, in a league meet came in the 1979 Big Eight Championships, when **Rick Cramer** finished second (**Steve Jones** was third as a frosh the previous year). In 2008, **Michael Imperato**, who tied for 46th, was the first true frosh to participate in the Big 12 meet since 2005, when **Shea Sena** tied for 53rd; in 2003, **Edward McGlasson** tied for 19th.

PLAYER SUMMARY

Only seniors Patrick Grady and Derek Tolan have played Prairie Dunes, at least collegiately, plus there is a rule, no conference team or player can play a course in the year leading up to the championships. The season statistics for the CU five:

This is Tolan's fourth Big 12 Championship: he finished 58th at Southern Hills in 2006 (83-71-82—236), tied for 53rd in 2007 at Prairie Dunes (80-80-78—238) and tied for 33rd last year at Whispering Pines (83-75-76-70—304); he owns a stroke average of 77.8 in the league meet. It's the second for both Grady (76-78-82—236, tying for 48th in 2007) and Symons (76-73-77-74—300, tied for 28th in 2008), and obviously the first for the two freshmen.

COACHES POLL

Oklahoma State was the choice by the 12 league coaches to win this year's championship, as the Cowboys are gunning for third second straight league title and seventh overall. The predicted order of finish (coaches could not vote for their own team): Oklahoma State, Texas Tech, Texas, Texas A&M, Baylor, **Colorado** (6th), Kansas State, Oklahoma, Missouri, Iowa State, Kansas, Nebraska

HEAD COACH ROY EDWARDS



Roy Edwards, is now in his third season as head coach of the University of Colorado men's golf team, just the third full-time men's golf coach in Buffalo history. He was named to the position on July 14, 2006, following in the footsteps of the only two coaches the program had ever known over a span of six decades.

Edwards, 32, came to CU with an impressive pedigree, joining the Buffaloes from his alma mater, the University of Kansas, where he had served as the assistant for both the men's and women's programs for the previous four years. He held the same position at Vanderbilt University for a year prior to returning to KU.

Edwards replaced the late Mark Simpson, who passed away from complications due to lung cancer in December 2005. Simpson had held the post since 1977, when he followed in the footsteps of his college head coach, Les Fowler. Fowler took over as player-coach in 1948 and remained on board until Simpson, his assistant, replaced him. Thus, Edwards is just CU's third full-time head coach since 1948.

In less than three years, Edwards has made his mark on the CU golf program, perhaps in no bigger way than helping to complete the dream of his two predecessors. One of the few major golf programs in the nation without its own true home golf course and facilities, Edwards played an integral part in working with Colorado alum Steve Kerr in the latter's acquisition of Vista Ridge Golf Club in Erie this past winter. The club officially became Colorado National Golf Club on March 2, 2009 and will serve as the official home for the university's men's and women's golf teams.

He also initiated the Colorado Partners program, a group that has quickly grown to 80 members who contribute financially to augment the school's golf budget, and established the Mark Simpson Colorado Golf Day which is an annual celebration and fundraiser for CU golf.

On the course, the team has steadily improved in his first two-and-a-half seasons. In the 2008 fall season, CU won its third meet under Edwards, smoking the field in the DU-Ron Moore Invitational by a school record 34 strokes. Seniors Derek Tolan and Patrick Grady won three tournaments between them, and the Buffs were ranked early in the nation's top 10 before roaming in the top 40 for most of the fall as the team appears headed for a third straight NCAA Championship berth.

His first CU team had moderate success, and finished 11th in the Big 12 Championships; while that was disappointing, his team did something that neither Fowler's or Simpson's did, qualify for the NCAA Championships (though in fairness, more teams are invited today than when they coached, but it still was an impressive accomplishment). The team placed 20th in the NCAA Central Regional.

His second team, in 2007-08, became just the third in school history to win two major tournaments in the same season, as the Buffs won the Louisiana Classics and the Ohio State Kepler Intercollegiate. The Buffs finished 10th in the Big 12 meet, which moved to a 72-hole format for the first time, and was again invited to the NCAA's, placing 18th in the Central Regional. Junior Derek Tolan was one of two individuals to advance out of the regional into the finals, the first Buff to do so since 1993.

At Kansas, he was heavily involved in recruiting and the day-to-day functions for both the men's and women's teams, managed the Jayhawks' Birdie Club and was the main contact for both golf camps. A KU graduate, he returned to his alma mater in August 2002 as the assistant coach for both the men's and women's programs and further developed all the skills necessary to one day become a head coach.

He was one of three finalists for the 2004 Golf Coaches Association of America Assistant Coach of the Year, named for Jan Strickland. The award is given to the NCAA Division I, II, III or NAIA assistant coach who has excelled in working with their student-athletes both on the course and in the classroom.

He was the assistant for both the men's and women's teams at Vanderbilt from May 2001 until returning to his alma mater the following year. At Vandy, he headed the Commodore Golf Day and the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate Golf Championships, and was involved in Commodore recruiting as well as the day-to-day practice and traveling schedules. He was a part of history as both teams experienced two of the best seasons in the programs' existence the 2001-02 academic year, and had a hand in coaching a pair of first-team All-Southeastern Conference players, including Brandt Snedeker, a first-team All-American first-team All-American and the runner-up in the 2007 Masters.

Born October 14, 1976 in Kansas City, Mo., but truly a native of Hutchinson, Kan., he was a four-year letterman in golf at Hutchinson (Kan.) High School and was an Eagle Scout. His hobbies include playing golf, cooking and traveling. He is married to the former Shelly Bonfantine, a former golfer at the University of New Mexico.

QUOTING COACH ROY EDWARDS

On CU's Big 12 Outlook

"We really believe we are prepared for this year's championship. Everyone is excited to go play Prairie Dunes and the challenge that it presents. We believe the Big 12 has the best conference championship in the country because of the courses we play for the event, and the best team usually is the team that comes out. That's because of the high quality of the golf courses and how well those courses are prepared for the championship."

On The Team's Familiarity With Prairie Dunes

"Pat and Derek both played there in 2007, but we didn't play that well as a team. Those guys have been motivated by that since then. It's truly one of the great golf courses in the world. It's a golf course that rewards patience, confidence and tests every part of every player's game, both physically and mentally."

What Would Be A Good Tournament For CU

"Our goal at every tournament is to win, and we do that by worrying about all the things we have control over. Those include how we prepare, our mental approach, our course management and staying in the present for all 72 holes. If we do that, to the best of our abilities, we'll have as successful event as we can and feel we'll be right there on Wednesday (for the final round). We're hungry, and we're playing with a bit of a chip on our shoulder. We haven't fared well in the conference meet for quite some time and the guys are anxious to turn that around."

THE SCHEDULE & SEASON AT-A-GLANCE

Colorado has played in 11 tournaments this year; four are currently ranked between the 17th and the 40th toughest out of 248 meets to date according to *Golfweek*. The toughest two were the Hawai'i-Hilo Invitational and The Prestige At PGA West, ranked Nos. 17 and 18, respectively; the "easiest" was DU's Ron Moore invite, currently ranked No. 126, though that golf course is no walk in the park (Green Valley Ranch). The Big 12 Championships figure to be one of the toughest three or four tournaments that Colorado will play in 2008-09. CU has nine top 10 finishes, including six top five, topped by a 39-stroke win in the DU-Ron Moore and three runner-up finishes in the USF Olympic Club, Western Intercollegiate and its own CU-Stevinson Ranch Invitational. The six top five efforts and are the most since seven in the 2003-04 season. Colorado has a team stroke average of 74.15 (74.79 for the spring); the 73.51 number for the fall was the second lowest in school history, trailing only the record 73.31 mark set by the 1999-2000 squad. Senior **Derek Tolan**, who was co-medalist in two meets (USF, UNM), set the school record for fall stroke average at 71.00 (breaking the mark of 71.15 set by John Lindberg in 1987) and leads the team with a 71.88 stroke norm. Senior **Patrick Grady** is also a two-time medalist (DU, CU meets) and has a 72.00 average; those two stroke averages as of now rank as the second and third best in CU single season history, as they are chasing the mark of 71.46 set by Kane Webber in 2003-04.

THE RANKINGS

There are three men's collegiate golf rankings: one poll, conducted by the GCAA by head coaches, and two that are computer generated (*Golfweek* and GolfStat). But generally speaking, with a consensus four top 25 and seven top 75 teams competing, the Big 12 Championships should again be one of the fiercest golf tourneys to date on the collegiate circuit for 2008-09. TOLAN, GRADY AMONG BIG 12'S BEST

Colorado's dynamic senior duo of **Derek Tolan** and **Patrick Grady** are good, but only when compiling conference statistics does it reveal what kind of season the pair has enjoyed. The pair rank third and fourth, respectively, in stroke average, with Grady first in rounds in the 60s with 10 (Tolan is third with 8), both are tied for first in top 20 finishes (9), Grady is third in top 10 finishes (7, with Tolan tied for fourth with 5), and they are tied for second in top five efforts (5) and tied for first in wins (2). Here's a look at some extensive conference statistics through all events prior to the Big 12 Championships:

BUFFS OWN THIRD BEST BIG 12 RECORD

School's win-loss records will play more of a roll than before in selection for the NCAA Regionals. Colorado's mark against fellow Division I teams entering the Big 12 meet is 111-47-2, a 70.0 winning percentage. Thus the Buffaloes will meet that criterion for the team selection, which will be announced May 6. CU THE FIRST WITH 5/20

In the 2001 Big 12 Championships, **Colorado** became the first school to have all five of its participating golfers finish in the top 20. In CU's case, all five were in the top 16: **Kane Webber** (t-7th), **Ben Portie** and **Matt Zions** (t-13th) and **Matt Call** and **Joe Liley** (t-16th). Oklahoma placed all five in the top 18 in the 2003 meet, and Oklahoma State did the same in 2008, joining CU as the only three schools to place all five in the top 20; the Buffs still have the mark for the fewest places (16). Four players from the same school have finished in the top 20 on nine occasions, in 1998 (Oklahoma State), 2000 (Kansas), 2001 (Oklahoma), 2003 (Texas), 2004 (CU, OU and OSU), 2005 (OSU) and 2008 (OSU).
