BUFFALOES HOST #3 WASHINGTON IN NCAA SECOND ROUND

ON TAP: Colorado (17-11) will host No. 3 Washington (26-4) in the second round of the NCAA Volleyball Tournament at the Coors Events Center on Friday, Dec. 1 at 7 p.m. Washington is the reigning NCAA Champion.

Colorado defeated No. 19 New Mexico State 30-24, 30-20, 34-32 to advance to the second round, while UW defeated Colorado State 26-30, 30-26, 30-24, 30-22 to move into the second round.

TICKETS: Tickets can be purchased at CUBuffs.com, TicketsWest or by calling 303-49-BUFFS.

Single match tickets will be available for purchase. Reserved seats are \$7, students and seniors are \$5, children ages 3-12 are \$4. Children 2 and under are free.

ON THE WEB: Livestats will be available through CSTV for the match. They can be accessed through CUBuffs.com or at NCAAAsports.com.

Internet streaming will also be available for the CU matches at CUBuffs.com. The broadcasts will be free to the public. Go to the live streaming banner on the right-hand side of CUBuffs.com and click on the link.

HAPPY 200 AT THE CECC: The Colorado volleyball team just celebrated its 200th victory at the Coors Events Center. The CECC has served as CU's home since 1987. The Buffs are 12-3 at home this season. The best home record for any CU volleyball team was in 1994 when the Buffs went 13-4.

ABOUT THE BUFFS: Colorado is 17-11 overall and 12-8 in the Big 12. The Buffs finished the Big 12 tied for fourth in the league with Iowa State.

CU started the year off with a victory against Denver, but fell to three top-10 teams in then #10 UCLA, #7 Hawai'i and #5 Florida at the Hawaiian Airlines Wahine Volleyball Classic. The Buffs bounced back with three straight sweeps at the Colorado Invitational to finish the nonconference schedule above .500 for the 18th straight season.

The Buffs went 6-4 in the first half of the conference season. They recorded a huge win against then-17th-ranked Missouri and included victories against Texas Tech, Kansas, Texas A&M, Kansas State and Baylor. CU fell to #1 Nebraska, #5 Texas, Oklahoma and Iowa State.

CU finished the second half of the league the same way as the first, with a 6-4 record. Highlighting the last half was a

five-game win against top-ranked Nebraska. The Buffs also beat Texas Tech, Texas A&M, Kansas State, Kansas and Baylor. Colorado lost to Texas, Missouri, Oklahoma and Iowa State.

Senior **Ashley Nu'u** has tallied 1,307 assists to average 12.57 per game, which ranks fifth in the Big 12. In league only matches, she is averaging 12.69 assists, which is sixth. Freshman **Kaitlyn Burkett** made her collegiate debut with one game against Florida. She has seen action in eight games this season, dishing out 33 assists to average 4.25 per game. Thanks to the direction of Nu'u and Burkett, the Buffs are hitting .222 on the season; eighth in the league. In conference matches, CU hit .215,

which ranked sixth.

Colorado has averaged 15.81 kills per game this season, which ranks fourth in the conference. Junior **Amber Sutherland** leads CU with 4.23 kills per game, which is good for fourth in the league. Sutherland averaged 4.32 in Big 12 contests, which is tied for third. Sophomore **Mallori Gibson** adds 3.43 kpg and is averaging a team best 0.32 aces per game.

On the right side, sophomore **Alex Butth** is averaging 2.11 kills per game. Butth is also averaging 1.97 digs and 0.60 blocks per game.

The Buffalo middles have been taking care of business in 2006. Senior **Lara Bossow** has averaged 2.03 kills per game.

She adds 0.85 blocks per game and is hitting .240. Sophomore **Lauren Schaefer** adds a team-high 0.94 blocks per game (89 total), along with 2.33 kpg. She is hitting .303 overall and hit .308 in league contests (10th in the Big 12). Senior **Austin Zimmerman** has recorded 1.92 kpg and is third on the team with 0.82 bpg and is hitting .344 (sixth in the Big 12). Zimmerman finished third in league only matches at .344.

Junior transfer **Kristen Karlik** ranks first for the Buffs with 4.12 digs per game and ranks fifth in the league. In conference only matches, she averaged 4.13 and ranking fourth. She has also added 20 aces which includes two in CU's upset of #1 Nebraska. Sophomore transfer **Callie Webster** has picked up 184 digs on the year to average 1.92 dpg in 96 games.

All of CU's 11 losses have come to CSTV/AVCA Top 25 ranked or receiving votes opponents.

ABOUT THE HUSKIES: No. 3 Washington is the reigning national champion and owns a 26-4 overall record and finished with a 15-3 record.

Courtney Thompson has dished out 1,539 assists to direct UW to a .288 hitting percentage. Thompson leads the NCAA with 14.92 assists per game. Christal Morrison leads the team with 4.79 kills per game and is hitting at a .266 clip. Stevie Mussie has recorded 3.93 kills per game.

The Huskies average 2.88 blocks per game. Jessica Swarbrick puts up a team best 1.37 bpg and Alesha Deesing adds 1.12 per game.

Tamari Miyashiro has recorded 5.62 digs per game. The Huskies pick up 17.19 per game.

THE SERIES: The CU-UW series is tied at 1. The Huskies won the first time (9/14/91) in four games. The Buffs won the next meeting (9/14/03) at the CECC in four.

WHAT DO WE HAVE IN COMMON?: Washington shares Texas and UCLA with CU. UW lost the NACWAA/AVCA championship match to UT in five games. The Huskies also split the season series with UCLA, dropping the first match in five games, but winning the second in four.

SAME TOURNEY, SAME TEAMS, SAME STATE, DIFFERENT CITY: In 2005, Washington, Colorado and Colorado State gathered in Fort Collins, Colo. for the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Washington went on to win the national championship. This year the same three have gathered in Boulder for the tournament.

NCAA CHAMPIONS WELCOME HERE: For the last two seasons, CU has hosted the reigning national champion. In 2005, the Buffs welcomed Stanford after winning the 2004 NCAA title. Washington won the 2005 title and will make their case for a repeat starting in Boulder.

ELITE COMPANY: Only 13 NCAA Division I teams can claim they have been to at least 15 (out of a possible 16) NCAA Tournaments since 1991. Colorado is one of those teams and joins an impressive list of college volleyball powerhouses.

A DECADE WITH PI'I AIU: Pi'i Aiu (*pronounced P-E I-U*) is in his 10th season as Colorado's head coach sporting a career record of 179-115. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to eight NCAA Tournaments in nine seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported three All-Americans, 10 All-Region, and 21 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu, who has led the Buffs to a 120-80 record in Big 12 matches, is joined on the bench this season by seventh-year assistant **Jil Thomason** and third-year assistant and USA Olympian, **Erik Sullivan**.

Aiu has never faced Washington as a head coach.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Amber Sutherland and Mallori Gibson each recorded 13 kills as Colorado defeated No. 19 New Mexico State 3-0 (30-24, 30-20, 34-32) in the first round of the NCAA Volleyball Tournament. CU improved to 17-11 on the year and the Aggies fell to 33-4.

Colorado owns a 6-0 record in NCAA Tournament play at the Coors Events Cen-

ter. The Buffs have not advanced past the first round of the tournament since 2001 when they defeated American in three games at Fort Collins. CU fell in the second round to Colorado State in five games.

The win was also the 200th victory for CU in the CECC. It was also the third win for the Buffs against a ranked opponent this season. CU had previously defeated top-ranked Nebraska and No. 15 Missouri.

Colorado owns a 12-3 record at home this season. The only losses have come at the hands of No. 8 Texas, Oklahoma and Iowa State.

Ashley Nu'u dished out 44 assists as she led CU to a .287 hitting percentage. Nu'u also added seven kills on 11 errorless swings to hit a team-high .636. Lauren Schaefer hit .429 with eight kills and Zimmerman added 11 kills while hitting .391. In total, CU recorded 58 kills, 14 more than the Aggies.

On defense, Kristen Karlik picked up a match-high 15 digs. Gibson added eight and Sutherland recorded seven. Schaefer put up four blocks (one solo and three assists) as did Nu'u (two solos and two assists). Zimmerman added three assists. CU outblocked the Aggies 11.0 blocks to 9.0.

Colorado used an 8-1 run to pull out to a 21-14 lead in the first game. The Buffs never let the Aggies get back in the game as they closed the game 30-24. Sutherland led the Buffs with eight kills in the game and Gibson added three.

The second game, Zimmerman proved a spark for the Buffs, recording six kills on nine errorless attacks to hit .667. Sutherland added four and Schaefer tallied three. Karlik recorded seven digs.

CU had to go the distance against the Aggies in the third game, but won in extra points, 34-32. Part of that was due to Amber Nu'u. Nu'u entered the game and served an ace to bring the Buffs to 27-28. She also added three digs as CU fought back from a six point deficit at 10-16.

TAKING DOWN GOLIATH: The Colorado Buffaloes defeated top-ranked Nebraska on Saturday, Nov. 11, for the first time since Oct. 28, 1997. The victory marked the first time CU has ever defeated a No. 1 ranked opponent in its 21-year history. The Buffs won in a five-game thriller.

Ashley Nu'u Named All-Big 12 Conference Team; Amber Sutherland and Lauren Schaefer Named Honorable Mention

The University of Colorado volleyball team has placed three on the All-Big 12 teams. Senior setter, Ashley Nu'u, has been named to the first team and junior outside hitter Amber Sutherland and sophomore middle blocker Lauren Schaefer have been selected to the honorable mention squad, announced Monday by the conference office. The Big 12 awards are selected by the league's head coaches.

Nu'u, an Aurora, Colo., native, has been a honorable mention selection for the past two years and was the 2003 Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year. Nu'u has worked her way up to third on Colorado's all-time career assists chart with 4,226 assists. She has passed out 1,263 this season to average 12.5 per game, which ranks 13th on the single-season chart. Nu'u has also collected 112 kills, 14 aces, 172 digs, 58 blocks and has hit .335 in 101 games. Nu'u was named the Sports Imports/AVCA and Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 13 after helping lead CU to an upset of top-ranked and then-undefeated Nebraska. She has picked up CU Athlete of the Week honors twice this season.

Sutherland, a Glenwood Springs, Colo., native, was selected to the honorable mention squad for the first time in her career. Sutherland was named the Big 12 and CU Athlete of the Week after recording 35 kills in an upset of No. 21 Missouri. She leads CU with 431 kills this season and ranks fifth in the Big 12 with 4.23 per game. Sutherland ranks 10th on CU's single-season kills list and is 15th on the career chart with 877. She leads the Buffs with 15 double-doubles this season. Sutherland also ranks 22nd for CU in career digs with 602. She was named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament Team earlier this season.

Schaefer, a Mountain View, Calif., native, was also selected to the honorable mention team for the first time in her career. Schaefer leads CU with 0.92 blocks per game. She has put up 11 solos and 74 assists this season. Schaefer is hitting .300, ranking third on the team. She has recorded 213 kills in 92 games. In Big 12 only matches, Schaefer is attacking at a .308 clip, which is 10th in the league.

NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Colorado senior setter **Ashley Nu'u** was named the Sports Imports/AVCA National Player of the Week for her performance in two Colorado victories (11/6-11/12). Nu'u led the Buffs to a three-game win against Kansas and a five-game upset of the top-ranked and undefeated Nebraska Cornhuskers. Colorado earned its first win over a No. 1 ranked opponent for the first time in school history.

The Aurora, Colo., native handed out 107 assists in eight games, including all 62 of CU's assists against Nebraska. She averaged 13.38 for the week. The Buffs hit .241 against the Jayhawks and .162 against the Huskers to average a .195 attack percentage. Nu'u also added nine kills, an ace, 15 digs, two blocks and hit .400.

Nu'u directed CU to its first win over Nebraska since Oct. 28, 1997 in front of a Coors Events Center record crowd of 4,111. The loss for NU was just its second conference loss in three seasons and its first loss since falling in the NCAA Championship match in 2005. Prior to the victory, the highest ranked opponent CU had defeated was fourth when the Buffs beat the Huskers in 1997.

In the match against Kansas, Nu'u moved to fourth on CU's all-time career assists chart. She is currently 165 assists from third on the list. With 1,068 assists this season, she is 15th on the single-season assists chart. She is also seventh (1,448) and 13th on the list (1,146).

For the week, Nu'u averaged 1.12 kills,

0.12 aces, 1.88 digs, 0.25 blocks and 1.38 points per game. She was also named Big 12 Volleyball Player of the Week for the second time in her career. She was also selected on Oct. 31, 2005 after Colorado knocked off eighth-ranked Missouri in five games at Columbia.

Nu'u is Colorado's first Sports Imports/AVCA National Player of the Week since Nov. 8, 1999 when Kelly Campbell, also a setter, earned the honor. The Buffs have only received this national honor three times. The other Buff to be named was Sarah Lodge on Oct. 13, 1997. Allie Griffin earned national recognition last season and was the first Buff to be named the Collegiate Volleyball Update National Player of the Week on Oct. 18.

BETTER THAN LAST YEAR: Colorado is currently 17-11 overall and 12-8 in the Big 12. The Buffs have recorded one more win than last season when they finished 15-13. CU has also bettered its conference record by two wins. The 2005 team finished 10-10 in the Big 12.

RECORD CROWD: A Coors Events Center Colorado volleyball record crowd of 4,111 saw CU upset top-ranked Nebraska in five games on Saturday, Nov. 11. The previous record of 3,685 was set on Nov. 16, 1994 and was also against Nebraska. The Buffs fell 3-0 in that match.

SET IT UP: Ashley Nu'u recorded all of CU's 62 assists against Nebraska (11/11). It was the first time a CU setter has handed out all of the Buff's assists since Nov. 3, 1999 when Kelly Campbell recorded all 58 assists against Kansas State in Manhattan, Kansas in five games.

WE'LL TAKE FIVE: Colorado owns a 7-3 record in five-game matches this season for a .700 winning percentage. Two of the losses have been against top-25 opponent Oklahoma.

CAREER-HIGH ANYONE?: Four Buffs either set a career-high or tied a career-high in a five-game win against Kansas State on Nov. 1. Ashley Nu'u recorded 74 assists, which ranks 14th in school history. Lauren Schaefer recorded 19 kills and Alex Buth tallied 17. Mallori Gibson tied her career-best with 18 kills.

CAREER-HIGH PART 2: CU had four Buffs record 15 or more kills in a match on Nov. 1 against KSU for the first time since Sept. 6, 2001 when Meghan Barkman (15), Kim Taskey (16), Sonja Russell (15) and Monique Gerlach (16) did it against BYU. Besides Schaefer (19), Buth (17) and Gibson (18), Amber Sutherland added 18.

TAKIN CARE OF BUSINESS: Colorado completed the sweep of K-State on Nov. 1 for the first time since 1997. The Buffs have now won four of its last six meetings against the Wildcats.

BRING OUT THE BROOMS: The Buffs swept the season series against Texas A&M for the first time in school history. CU defeated A&M in three games on Sept. 27 in Boulder and completed the sweep on Oct. 25 with a five-game thriller. The win also marked the second straight season the Buffs have defeated the Aggies on their home court.

TAKING THE LITTLE APPLE: Colorado won its first match in Manhattan, Kan., since Nov. 3, 1999. It was also the first three-game victory over the Wildcats in Kansas since Nov. 19, 1994.

SUPER STAR: Amber Sutherland recorded a career-high 35 kills against No. 17 Missouri on Sept. 13. It was the third-most kills any CU player has recorded in a match (the most being 40 by Sarah Lodge in 1997). Sutherland also hit at a clip of .397, added four assists, four block assists and 14 digs. Only five other Buffs have hit 30 or more kills in a match. Sarah Lodge did it twice (40 and 36), as did Karrie Downey (34 twice). They are joined by current AVP standout Rachel Wacholder (32), Staci Wolfe (31) and Tina Murray (30). Sutherland was also named Big 12 Player of the Week for her efforts.

BIG 12 OPENERS: The Buffs have won four of its five last Big 12 openers; including one in 2004 against No. 15 Kansas State. The only Big 12 opener CU has

dropped in the last five years was in 2005 against No. 18 Texas in Austin.

A THREE-GAME RECORD: Colorado set a school record for hitting percentage in a three-game match against Central Connecticut State at .528 at the Colorado Invitational on Sept. 8. The Buffs recorded 56 kills on 89 swings and committed just nine errors. It is also the highest hitting percentage recorded in a match for CU.

THE NEWEST BUFFS: The Colorado volleyball coaching staff recently had two additions in the month of August. On Friday, August 11, **Erik** and **Amanda Sullivan** welcomed a baby boy, Cade Kian. The Sullivans' also have a daughter, Shaye (4). **Jil** and **Chance Thomason** added a baby girl, Matilda Jane, to their family on Thursday, August 31. She joins sisters Isabel (5) and Josephine (3).

A HELPING HAND: **Andy Klussmann**, a veteran volleyball coach, filled in for Colorado assistant coach Jil Thomason while she is on maternity leave. Klussmann was the second assistant coach at Colorado State University from 2000-04. During that time, he was responsible for working with the middle blockers, travel, recruiting and scouting.

Klussmann played volleyball at UCLA from 1983-86 and helped the Bruins win back-to-back national championships in 1983-84. In 1984, the team went 38-0 enroute to the championship.

Klussmann has found his way back to coaching after making a remarkable recovery from a tragic car accident in 2004 that claimed his wife Janna's life. This past club season, he coached the Norco 17 Black team. As for joining the Colorado volleyball team, Klussmann says, "I'm having a great time."

Klussmann has two stepchildren, Sarah and Seth and two young sons, Drew and Jackson and resides in Fort Collins, Colo.

BUTH AND ZIMMERMAN NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-BIG 12

Colorado sophomore Alex Buth and senior Austin Zimmerman have been named to the Academic All-Big 12 teams, announced today by the league offices.

Buth was named to the first team for the second straight year. The East Grand Rapids, Mich., native is a four time member of the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll. Buth carries a 3.493 GPA and is a sports marketing major. This season Buth has averaged 2.05 kills, 1.98 digs and 0.58 blocks per game at right side. Buth recorded the final point in the five-game upset of top-ranked Nebraska on Nov. 11.

This is Zimmerman's first time on the Academic All-Big 12 Second Team. She has been a member of the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll three times in her career. 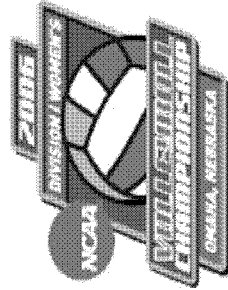
