FOR STARTERS: Dating back to last season, CU has lost nine straight Big 12 road games ... In those nine games, the opponent is outscoring CU, 82.2-to-65.4. The other difference is the halftime score where the home team holds the advantage, 37.6-to-25.8 ... Of the seven road losses this season, five of those games CU scored under 65 points ... Last Big 12 road win, Jan. 21, 2006 at Oklahoma State ... In their last two road games, the Buffaloes are averaging 78.5 ppg. and allowing 97.0 ppg.

CU vs. K-STATE: Coach Patton teams have been successful over the years holding a 15-8 advantage and a slim 6-5 edge at Bramlage Coliseum. Dating back to the infamous 2002-03 Big 12 Tournament first round game when CU won 77-76, the Buffaloes have won five of its last seven over the Wildcats and two of three at Bramlage. CU lost at K-State last season, 72-60, despite leading at half, 30-26.

QUICKLY ON K-STATE: The Wildcats are 10-1 at home this season and have won seven of eight since the loss to Texas Tech (Jan. 18, 62-52). K-State is third overall in the conference standings and throughout the season have had eight different players lead the team in scoring. This is the first meeting between Coach Patton and K-State head coach Bob Huggins. So far this season including non-conference games, CU is 3-5 against first-year head coaches.

HOOK SHOTS: Richard Roby is 28 points from 10th place on CU's all-time scoring list (1,325)...With only 66 rebounds last season, **Dominique Coleman** leads CU on the boards with 117 (6.2), assists (65, 3.4), steals (33, 1.7)...**Jermyl Jackson-Wilson** is the only other player over 100 rebounds (114); Roby has 96, **Jeremy Williams** (94)...CU had three players with 20 or more points against Oklahoma State for the first time since Feb. 19, 2003 at Kansas...**Kal Bay** tied his season-best with 5 3-pointers and tied his career-best of 21 points (Central Florida); as did Coleman with 21 pts. and a career-best 15 rebounds. 'Nique's third double-double and third time this season with over 10 rebounds in a game...In his last four games, Williams is averaging 13.0 ppg., 5.8 rpg. and 21-for-32 from the field (.656). **TEAM:** Had a season-best eight 3-pointers in the first half against Oklahoma State; 10 treys overall for the third time in 2006-07 (at Baylor and Texas)...Four of CU's six wins shot better from the field (Oklahoma St., Iowa St., Central Florida, Denver)...CU's 45 rebounds vs. the Cowboys, most this season in the Big 12 and most since grabbing 48 against Pepperdine...CU led at half (15 pts. over OSU) for the first time in the Big 12 this season...A loss today ties the 1998-99 team for poorest starts after 10 games (2-8) in the Big 12.

X FACTOR: Since leading the team in scoring four of the last six games, freshman Xavier Silas has also led the team in assists three times and twice in steals. His production during this stretch is 14.8 ppg., 4.8 rpg. 32-of-71 FG (.451) and leads the team from the 3-point arc with 14. Overall, he's second in scoring (11.6 ppg.), one of six players over four boards a game and is second in minutes played (30.3).

50% FG% (opponents): The Buffs have allowed the opponent (at BU, at KU, Mizzou, at Nebraska) to shoot 50% FG or better in four of five games. The four straight games over 50% was a school first in 18 years. The last time this happened was the 1989-90 season when CU allowed five opponents to shoot 50% or better, TWICE. That year the Buffs finished 12-18 and 2-12 in the Big Eight. Six of CU's nine Big 12 opponents this season have shot 50% or better.

DICKIE V'S WEEKLY AWARDS: In case you missed it the Buffaloes made Dickie V's weekly notes (Shock of the Week). Colorado over Oklahoma State. Sean Sutton's squad went into Boulder with an 18-3 record. The Buffs were 5-13 entering the contest. It was shock city as Colorado scored an 89-77 victory. The Buffs had the edge on the glass and on the scoreboard, baby!

END IS NEAR: On Oct. 25, Coach Patton announced this would be his last season of coaching at CU. Patton said he would not seek nor accept an extension of his contract (expires June 30, 2007). In 11 years, Patton has 183 victories, four NIT appearances, two NCAA Tournaments, and three 20-win seasons.

REGAINING FORM: Before scoring his sixth career 30-point effort at Kansas, then tacking on 18 more at Baylor, Richard Roby is performing into the scorer we know. Roby followed up previous games at KU and at BU, with 20 points in the upset win over Oklahoma State. Roby's three-game average of 22.7 points per game leads the team. Prior to his last three games, Roby scored just 38 points (9.5 ppg.).

LAST TIME OUT (complete box on page 22): Dominique Coleman and Kal Bay tied career highs with 21 points, leading Colorado to an 89-77 victory over No. 12 Oklahoma State. Coleman added a career-high 15 rebounds and Bay tied a career high with five 3-pointers. Richard Roby had 20 points for the Buffaloes, who have now beaten at least one ranked team at home in each of the last five years. JamesOn Curry scored 20 points for Oklahoma State, while Byron Eaton finished with a career-high 19 points and Mario Boggan had 17.

CRASHING THE BOARDS: In nine Big 12 games, CU has a quartet of players with at least 42 rebounds and all are averaging over 4.7 a game. Dominique Coleman heads the list (66, 7.3 rpg.), followed by Jeremy Williams (45, 5.0).

Xavier Silas (42, 4.7) and Richard Roby (42, 4.7) round out the list.

ON THE ROAD IN THE BIG 12: Since the Big 12 formed (1996-97), CU has played 84 regular season games on the road. Heading into 2006-07, the Buffaloes under Coach Patton are 21-63 (.250). That means an average of 2.1 wins a season and 5.9 losses in eight road games. The highest win total was 4-4 in 1996-97; their lowest was one win in each of the 2002-03 (Baylor), 2001-02 (Texas A&M) and 1999-2000 (Kansas State) seasons.

LOSSES AT HOME: With seven home losses this season, CU has matched the 2000-01 campaign for setbacks in a season. With three more home games left (KU, Kansas State, Nebraska), it looks like the Buffaloes will be a setting a school record for losses at home or at least tying it. The previous high is eight (1995-96, 1985-86, 1975-76).

TOP-10 SHOOTER: Richard Roby ranks among the top-10 field goals attempts list. Entering tonight's game, Roby has 1,086 attempts good enough for ninth place at CU. As for field goals made, Roby is a bit behind Scott Wedman's 10th place of 516. Roby has 452 field goals made.

FTs WHEN IT COUNTS: After 19 games, we're starting to see whose cool under pressure from the free throw line.

SEE THE 3, BE THE 3: The last three games the Buffaloes have erupted for 28 3-pointers (9.3 per game), the most over a three-game span this year. In the last two games, they have drained 10 in each and for the season have made 10 in a game three times (Oklahoma State, at BU, Texas). They're on pace to make 142, a far cry from last year's school-record of 240. CU is also shooting a conference low .309 percent (115-for-372) from the arc and have made a 3-pointer in 155 straight games (Jan. 16, 2002 vs. Iowa State).

BUFF BITS: Richard Roby has nine 20+ efforts this season (27 career) ... Freshman have led CU in scoring seven times this season, five of the last six ... CU has beaten at least one ranked team at home in the last five years (last win over a top-15 team at home was No. 3/3 Texas, Feb. 4, 2003) ... CU has won its first back-to-back games against the Cowboys since Feb. 1, 1989 and Feb. 13, 1988 ... CU has outrebounded the opponent on the offensive glass eight of nine games (not Texas) and have outrebounded the opponent six of nine games (not UT, Baylor and were even against OU ... CU has trailed at the half eight of nine conference games, led OSU and rallied to beat Iowa State ... The opponent has scored 20+ points in a game 13 times and tallied seven double-doubles against CU this season ... CU is 1-12 when trailing at the half and 2-59 when trailing by 10 or more half (0-6 this season) under Patton ... **Xavier Silas** became the first player other than Richard Roby to lead the team in scoring three straight times (Mizzou, at Nebraska, Iowa State). The last time this was accomplished other than Roby was Michel Morandais during the 2002-03 season, twice ... Roby tied his season-high 10 FGs made at KU for his sixth career 30+ point effort. His other 10 FGs made this season (Pepperdine, Texas) were also 30-point games ... Against Mizzou (Jan. 24), CU had 17 offensive rebounds most in Big 12 play by the Buffs this year; **Marcus King-Stockton** had a season-high nine rebounds against Missouri ... CU has six double-doubles this season: **Coleman (3)**, **Jermyl Jackson-Wilson (2)**, **Richard Roby (1)** ... Roby has led the team in scoring nine times, including one shared and has scored double figures in 17 of 19 games ... Despite playing the point, Coleman has led CU in rebounding six times ... CU's 30 turnovers at Kansas was the most since committing 30 at KU (Feb. 15, 1992) ... Roby has netted 30+ points three times this season (six times in career): 32 pts (Pepperdine), 30 each at KU and home against Texas ... Silas (23 pts.) and **Jeremy Williams** (18 pts.) each scored season-bests at Baylor (Jan. 30). **TEAM:** With seven

home losses this season, CU's next home loss ties three other seasons for most losses at home ... CU has used 10 different starting combos in 19 games.

CU vs. RANKED TEAMS: The Buffaloes stuck to tradition and defeated a ranked opponent at home for the fifth straight season (W, 89-77, No. 12/14 OSU). So far, this season, CU is 1-2 against the nation's elite teams. CU is now 12-50 (.194) in the Coach Patton era. However, on the road it's a much different story having lost their last 23-straight (last win was at No. 20 Texas Tech, Jan. 11, 80-78).

CANCELLED GAMES: The CU/UC Davis game (Dec. 23) was cancelled due to the inclement weather in the Denver area that caused severe travel difficulties; on Saturday, Dec. 30, both the TCU (men) and Houston (women) schools opted not to board their respective flights to Colorado. Officials from both schools cited the weather conditions in Colorado, despite the fact that their flights were not cancelled. The games will not be rescheduled this season.

TEAM NOTES: CU shot a season-best .529 from the field (27-of-51), a school-best since shooting .577 against Savannah State in 2005-06 ... CU fell to 1-6 at home in Big 12 openers ... First time CU opened the Big 12 Conference season with three straight opponents (Texas, OU, A&M) who made NCAA Tournament a year ago ... CU 11-14 at home against ranked opponents since 1996 ... Twice this season CU has allowed 100 points (at New Mexico and Texas). The last time the opponent scored 100+ three times in a season was 2001-02 (KU twice, Texas) ... Against UCF, both teams combined for 55 free throws made breaking the Events Center record of 53 ... CU's 36 made free throws against UCF are the most since making 36 back on Feb. 22, 1997 (Missouri) ... Buffs suffered four non-conference home losses this season, a school-first since 1975-76.

PRESEASON ROBY REVIEW: Before the season started Richard Roby was named to a trio of preseason honors lists: the top-50 preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy ... one of 50 preseason candidates named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team. Roby is the first CU player to be named to the Wooden List since David Harrison in 2003-04 ... Roby was named to the preseason All-Big 12 Team along with sophomores Brandon Rush and Julian Wright (Kansas), junior Joseph Jones (Texas A&M) and seniors Acie Law (Texas A&M) and Jarrius Jackson (Texas Tech).

SURPRISE LINEUP ADDITION: Chase Perkowski became the second player in the 11 plus years under Coach Patton to start a game as a non-scholarship player. The first came in Patton's 1995-96 season (where he was named interim then head coach) toward the end of the year. Jamie Miller started Feb. 28, 1996 against Nebraska and played only three minutes and only six games for the season. Perkowski came off the bench in the early stages of the first half at UNCW. The sophomore from San Juan Capistrano, Calif. took a charge in four minutes.

ROOKIES IN THE STARTNG LINE UP: Kal Bay became only the fifth rookie in Coach Patton's 11 years to start the first game of the season (vs. Denver). The others were guard Alan Barkdale (1996-97), guard/forward Michel Morandais (2000-01), point-guard Antoine McGee (2002-03) and guard Richard Roby (2004-05). Chauncey Billups started at CU in 1995-96 when Patton was an assistant under Joe Harrington.

NONCONFERENCE PLAY: CU finished 4-6, their first losing season in nonconference play since 1988-89 when they finished 5-8. It's also the fewest nonconference games the Buffaloes have played since the 1997-98 campaign when they finished 6-4.

CU vs. MOUNTAIN WEST: With the cancellation of the CU/TCU game (Dec. 30), the Buffs played five games against the Mountain West Conference and finished with a 1-4 record. CU is only 11-11 (.500) since 1996-97 and since 2002-03, 6-6 (.500) against the conference.

TEAM TIDBITS: The Nov. 10 match up with Denver was the earliest CU has started the season in its 105-year history...CU's 96 points scored against Central Florida was the most scored since beating up Savannah State, 116-52 on Jan. 3, 2006...CU's 12 blocked shots vs. Northern Colorado was the most since swatting 12 on Dec. 22, 2005 (Mercer) ... Allowing New Mexico to score 100 points on Nov. 14, was the first time CU allowed that many in a game since falling to Oklahoma State, Jan. 30, 2004 (L, 86-104). The 41-point loss at New Mexico is the most since losing by 32 points at Utah (80-48) on Dec. 30, 2004 and by 43 to Texas at the Big 12 Tournament, March 10, 2000 (78-35) ... The win at Utah was its first in seven road games (at Oklahoma State, Jan. 21, 80-78, OT) ... CU losses to New Mexico (41 points) and Air Force (38 points) were the worst back-to-back losses since losing consecutive 30+ point games Jan. 29, 1994 (Kansas, 87-53) and Feb. 1 (at Iowa State, 99-69)...CU's 46 point loss versus USAFA is the lowest point total since scoring 48 points at Utah (Dec. 30, 2004) ... CU remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton (9-0 in Boulder)...CU successfully kept its win streak alive during the exhibition season winning their 18th and 19th in a row defeating Concordia-Montreal (97-85) and Regis (73-37). CU improved to 24-1 (.960) under Patton. Their lone setback occurred Nov. 8, 1998 to the California All-Stars, 91-89. In their history, CU is 44-6 (.880) during the exhibition season.

BOULDER (AP) - Richard Roby scored 20 points and Colorado remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton during the Buffaloes' 78-64 win over Denver.

Colorado's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 rebounds, including 10 in the first half, and had 14 points, giving him his first career double-double. Jackson-Wilson's 11 offensive boards and his 17 for the game are the most by a Buff in a debut. Dominique Coleman, the lone senior on Colorado's roster, finished with 19 points and seven assists.

DaShawn Walker led Denver with 16 points. Joseph Jackson and Tyler Bullock each added 15 points.

It's the first time the two teams have played since 2000. Colorado leads the all-time series 56-25 and has won the last five in a row. Patton, who announced he'll step down at the end of his 11th season, is 4-0 against the Pioneers.

The Buffaloes led by as many as 21 points in the second half.

Roby had a play late in the first half that probably won't make his highlight reel. Roby attempted a one-handed dunk on a breakaway but was rejected by the rim and fell to the floor. He smiled as he headed back down the court. The Buffs were up 17 points at the time.

Xavier Silas was assessed a technical with 9:23 left in the first half for hanging on the rim.

The Pioneers trimmed a 17-point deficit in the first half to 37-24 at halftime with a 5-1 run to close out the half.

Denver freshman guard Nate Rohnert rolled his ankle during a shoot-around Friday morning and was held out of the game. The Pioneers were already missing junior guard Mykhael Lattimore (right thumb injury) and junior center Adam Tanner (fractured left arm). They're expected to miss at least three more games.

Colorado guard Kal Bay became just the fifth freshman to start in the opener during Patton's tenure. Roby started for Patton in 2004-05.

The Lobos hit their first 13 free throws and reserves Daniel Faris, Chad Toppert and Ryan Kersten provided much of the offense in the first 20 minutes.

Toppert hit a trio of 3-pointers in the first half, Faris scored 8 points and Kersten 6. Toppert's back-to-back 3s gave the Lobos a 36-25 lead with 5:02 left in the first half.

Faris, the sophomore backup center, finished with career highs of 14 points and 8 rebounds.

New Mexico led 47-34 at halftime and broke it open from there as the Lobos shot 67 percent in the second half. Giddens was the catalyst. He scored on a jumper in the lane, then came up with a steal and dunk that pushed the lead to 62-39 with 12:55 left.

Giddens, a junior who New Mexico coach Ritchie McKay has tabbed a likely lottery pick in next summer's NBA draft, flexed his muscles to the crowd of more than 12,000 after the dunk.

Giddens hit 11 of 19 shots and along with Faris and Aaron Johnson led the Lobos to a 51-35 edge in rebounding. Giddens had 9 rebounds and Johnson 11.

BOULDER (AP) - The Colorado Buffaloes men's basketball team were held to 11 points in the first half and fell to the Air Force Falcons at the Coors Events Center.

Sophomore forward Jermyl Jackson-Wilson led Colorado with nine points. Leading scorer, junior guard Richard Roby was held to six points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Nick Welch added 18 points for Air Force (4-0), which last started out with four straight wins in the 1998-99 season, when it began 5-0. The Falcons hit 13-of-25 3-pointers, four by Tim Anderson.

The first half output of 11 was Colorado's lowest scoring half since being held to four points in the first half of a Jan. 23, 1980 game at Missouri.

It was also the first time CU failed to place a player in double figures since Feb. 15, 1992 at Kansas. Poncho Hodges and Joe Stephens each scored nine points in the 82-45 loss.

Colorado took a 4-0 lead early, but trailed 35-11 at halftime thanks to a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes and a patient Air Force team that shot 52 percent and had 11 points from Welch.

After a basket by junior forward, Marcus King-Stockton, the Buffaloes missed 11 straight shots and turned the ball over five times while the Falcons' Dan Nwaelele buried three, 3-pointers as part of a 22-0 run that ended with Matt McGraw following his own miss to push Air Force ahead 22-4.

Jackson-Wilson ended the scoreless string with a basket at 6:49 that drew a roar from the crowd. Colorado, which shot 23 percent for the half, managed only seven points the rest of the period, two by Roby, who was 1-for-8 shooting.

Things didn't get much better in the second half for Colorado. The Buffaloes improved their shooting to 42 percent, but fell behind 47-17 after a 3-pointer from Welch and a layup and free throw from Keith Henke.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP) - Richard Roby scored 22 points, and teammate Jermyl Jackson-Wilson made a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift Colorado to a 60-59 victory over Utah Tuesday night.

Kal Bay added 11 points and three 3 pointers for the Buffaloes who won at Utah for the first time in six tries dating back to 1946. It's also the first road win in seven road games for CU since winning at Oklahoma State back on Jan. 21, 2006 in overtime (80-78).

Jackson-Wilson missed his second of two free throws, and the Utes rebounded and called timeout with 1.8 seconds left. But Lawrence Borhas desperation three-pointer missed badly as time expired.

The victory was the first for the Buffaloes (2-2) after back-to-back blowout losses, while the Utes fell to a 0-3 start for the first time since 1970.

Johnnie Bryant scored 20 points for the Utes, including 11 in a row to start the second half, and Luke Nevill added 14 points and 10 rebounds.

But the Utes committed two crucial turnover in the final minute, with the game tied 59-59.

WILMINGTON, N.C. - Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks.

The Seahawks improved to 2-3 on the season and snapped a three-game losing streak as they made new skipper Benny Moss a winner in his first home game. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 in the new season.

Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break.

He also had eight steals to match the record set by Bob Martin in UNCW's 83-79 loss to Wake Forest when the arena opened on Nov. 26, 1977.

Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

Trailing by five points at halftime, the Seahawks finally caught up with the Buffs with a 7-0 mini-run midway through the second half. A finger roll by CU's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson with 15:48 remaining gave the Buffs a 40-36 lead, but UNCW reeled off seven unanswered points and grabbed a 43-40 edge when Fountain followed up his own shot at 13:09.

After CU sliced the deficit to two points, 49-47, with 6:18 left on a dunk by Jackson-Wilson, the Seahawks went on a 10-2 run. Freshman guard Daryl Felder converted a conventional three-point play on a spin move in the paint to start the rally and a jumper by Dejan Grkovic in the paint at 3:54 pushed the margin to 10 points, 59-49.

The Seahawks, who outrebounded the Buffs by a 37-32 margin, held CU to just six field goals and forced 11 turnovers in the final period.

CU gained the final possession and it would take two missed jumpers before Jackson-Wilson picked up the offensive rebound and hit the game-winning shot to end the game.

Jackson-Wilson also added seven rebounds, six blocked shots, four assists and three steals.

Richard Roby added 14 points, 12 of those in the second half before fouling out with 1:12 in the second half.

A total of six CU players netted double figures, a first since Dec. 3, 2005 against UC Irvine.

Adding into the mix were Jermyn Jackson-Wilson (13 points), Dominique Coleman (12 pts.) and Jeremy Williams (10 pts.).

Bay added six assists, three steals and season-best five 3-pointers.

With the score tied at 70 and 7:54 remaining, the Buffaloes made 13-of-15 free throws the rest of the game and King-Stockton added nine points helping CU break a two-game losing streak and their first win since Dec. 2 (over Northern Colorado).

UCF residing from Conference-USA was led by Josh Peppers and Jermaine Taylor with 22 points each. The Golden Knights average over 50 percent from the field, were held to 44.4 percent shooting (28-of-63).

BOULDER (AP) - Freshman Kevin Durant scored a career-high 37 points to go with 16 rebounds as Texas won its ninth straight Big 12 Conference opener in a 102-78 victory Saturday over Colorado.

Durant was 5-for-7 on 3-pointers as he outgunned Colorado's Richard Roby.

Damion James, D.J. Augustin and A.J. Abrams had 15 points each for Texas (11-3, 1-0 Big 12). Roby led Colorado (4-7, 0-1) with 30 points, three points short of his career high. Xavier Silas added 17 points for the Buffaloes, who lost their 10th consecutive conference opener.

Colorado hasn't won a conference opener since beating Nebraska 79-73 on Jan. 4, 1997.

Roby buried a 3-pointer three minutes into the second half, but 30 seconds later Durant matched it with one of his own, putting Texas up 61-53. Durant connected on another 3-pointer with 15:38 left to begin a 19-7 run that also included two 3-pointers each by Abrams and Augustin that stretched the Longhorns' lead to 80-62.

A 3-pointer by J.D. Lewis and dunk by Durant extended the Texas lead, 88-66 with 7:56 remaining. Roby went scoreless over the last six minutes of the game and CU never got closer than 17 points in the final 5:50 of the game.

Roby and Durant nearly matched shot for shot in the first half. Durant, who had 21 points and three 3-pointers by halftime, had a scoop shot layup and free throw to put Texas up 50-43 with 2:23 before the break.

CU got four free throws from Roby in the last 1:34 as the Buffaloes closed the gap to 51-48 at intermission. Roby was 3-for-5 on 3-pointers and had 22 points in the first half.

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) - Nate Carter came off the bench to score 15 points and grab eight rebounds as Oklahoma defeated Colorado, 78-54 on Wednesday in the Sooners' Big 12 Conference home opener, giving rookie coach Jeff Capel his first league win.

Oklahoma (9-5, 1-1 Big 12) snapped a two-game losing streak. The Sooners have beaten Colorado (4-8, 0-2) 22 straight times at the Lloyd Noble Center, a streak that dates to February 1980.

Carter has 28 points and 17 rebounds in the Sooners' two league games. Freshman Tony Crocker, who entered the game with a 10.9-point scoring average, had 16 points and eight rebounds, and point guard Austin Johnson added 10 points for Oklahoma.

The Sooners controlled the basketball game on the defensive end, holding the Buffaloes to five points in the first 8:18. Colorado's final point total was about 17 below its previous season average.

Oklahoma also harassed the Buffaloes into a season-high 25 turnovers - stepping into passing lanes for 14 steals - and blocked three shots.

The loss was Colorado's fourth in five games. It's the eighth time in Big 12 history that the Buffaloes have started league play 0-2.

After scoring 30 points in CU's last game, against Texas, Richard Roby scored 20 points. Freshman forward Jeremy Williams had eight points to go with a season-best 12 rebounds for the Buffaloes.

The Sooners never trailed, jumping out to a 16-5 lead early behind five early points from Carter.

A layup by Dwight Thorne and a 3-pointer by Roby pulled the Buffaloes to within two points with just over four minutes left in the first half. Carter responded with a short jumper and Crocker took a charge on Colorado's next possession, then hit two free throws to extend the Sooners' lead.

Oklahoma ended the half on a 13-4 run and led 37-26 at halftime.
