

COLORADO GOLF NOTES / 11TH ANNUAL STEVINSON RANCH INVITATIONAL

QUICKLY Colorado will host and participate in the 11th annual **CU-Stevinson Ranch Invitational**, set for April 6-7 in Stevinson, located in central California (south of Turlock in the heart of the state) ... The Buffaloes are the only school that will have participated in all 11; Drake had played in the first 10 but is not in the field this year ... It's the fifth competition of the spring season for the Buffaloes, the last before the Big 12 Championships later this month at Prairie Dunes in Hutchinson, Kan. (April 27-29).

COURSE INFORMATION The tournament will take place at Stevinson Ranch Golf Club in Stevinson, just outside of Turlock, Calif. (about halfway between Modesto and Merced). The championship layout is a 7,142-yard, par-72 configuration, and the greens feature bent grass. The telephone number to the pro shop is 209/668-8200 (press 2); the course also has a web site at www.stevinsonranch.com. *Golf World* in its October 2008 issue ranked Stevinson Ranch at No. 11 in its top 50 public courses in the United States listing, with No. 1 rankings in course conditions and practice facilities, No. 2 in customer service, No. 6 in value and No. 9 for quality of course.

FORMAT (54 holes) College-Am/practice rounds on Sunday; 36 holes of continuous play (foursomes) on Monday with a shotgun start at 8:30 a.m. (PDT), 18 holes on Tuesday in a shotgun format at 8 a.m. (PDT).

CU-STEVINSON CONNECTION The Buffaloes have a solid tie-in to the Stevinson Ranch facility. **George Kelley**, the founder and owner of Stevinson Ranch, lettered in golf at Colorado in the early 1970s and was a teammate of the late **Mark Simpson**, CU's head coach who co-founded the tournament with Kelley. Kelley is one of 28 Buffaloes to have earned medalist honors in major tournament play, winning the Galveston Island Intercollegiate during the '72-'73 school year, and led the team in stroke average the '72-'73 season (74.00 for 16 rounds).

THE COACH In his third season as Colorado head coach is **Roy Edwards** (Kansas '00), who was named just the third full-time coach in program history on July 14, 2007. The Buffaloes already have three tournament wins in his short tenure at the school, which has included him creating Colorado Golf Partners, a very successful fundraising program, and played an integral role in CU finally having a home golf course to call its own, Colorado National Golf Club. The 32-year old Kansas native came to CU with an impressive pedigree, joining the Buffaloes from his alma mater, the University of Kansas, where he had served as the assistant for both the men's and women's programs the 2002-03 through 2005-06 seasons. He held the same position at Vanderbilt University for a year prior to returning to KU. He was one of three finalists for the 2004 Golf Coaches Association of America Assistant Coach of the Year. At Kansas, he helped coach six first-team All-Big 12 players (five men, one woman) and four Academic All-Americans. He started his coaching career as a volunteer/graduate assistant in 1998, working three years in that capacity before moving on to Vanderbilt for his first full-time assistant coaching position. Between KU and Vanderbilt, he coached five players who attained some level of All-American status, ranging from first-team to honorable mention. A three-year member of the Jayhawk golf team, he lettered as a senior under legendary and long-time coach **Ross Randall** and earned his bachelor's of science degree in business administration from Kansas in 2000.



THE ROSTER Edwards is taking his entire active team to California (nine players), as five will officially count toward CU's team score and four will compete individually. Seniors **Patrick Grady** and **Derek Tolan**, juniors **Justin Bardgett** and **Luke Symons** and freshman **Kevin Kring** will have their scores count toward the Buff team total, while senior **Tom Gempel**, sophomore **Michael Imperato**, redshirt freshman **Sebastian Heisele** and true frosh **Johnny Widmer** will play as individuals. Grady and Tolan have been ranked among the nation's top 100 golfers most of the season and have three wins between them; the CU roster for the trip:

CU SEASON AT-A-GLANCE Colorado has played in 10 tournaments this year; six are currently ranked between the 13th and the 48th toughest out of 182 meets to date according to *Golfweek* (last week's Western Intercollegiate not yet included). The toughest two were The Prestige At PGA West and the Hawai'i-Hilo Invitational, ranked Nos. 13 and 17, respectively; the "easiest" was DU's Ron Moore invite, currently ranked No. 99, though that golf course is no walk in the park (Green Valley Ranch). CU has eight top 10 finishes, including five top five to date, topped by a 39-stroke win in the DU-Ron Moore and two runner-up finishes in the USF Olympic Club and Western Intercollegiate. The five top five efforts match last year's total and are the most since seven in the 2003-04 season. Colorado has a team stroke average of 73.8 (74.2 for the spring); the 73.51 number for the fall was the second lowest in school history, trailing only the record 73.31 mark set by the 1999-2000 squad. Senior **Derek Tolan**, who was co-medalist in two meets, set the school record for fall stroke average at 71.00 (breaking the mark of 71.15 set by John Lindberg in 1987). Senior **Patrick Grady** also was a medalist (DU).

RANKINGS There are three ranking systems in Division I college golf. Here's a look at the field for the CU-Stevinson Ranch Invitational in the latest rankings (no team is in the GCAA Coaches poll):

Team Rankings by Golfweek/GolfStat (as of March 30/April 1): Colorado (45/49), Nevada (75/78), Washington State (80/77), Missouri (91/90), South Dakota State (99/113), Loyola-Marymount (102/112), Long Beach State (113/106), San Francisco (115/116), Liberty (118/109), UMKC (130/134), Portland (141/135), Sacramento State (143/124), St. Mary's (163/158), Northern Colorado (193/193), CSU-Bakersfield (223/NR); CSU-Stanislaus is No. 39 in the GS Division II rankings. **Individually:** There are five top 100 golfers in the GolfStat Cup Standings in the field: Liberty freshman Robert Karlsson (No. 14), SDSU senior Trent Peterson (No. 38), CU seniors Derek Tolan (No. 48) and Patrick Grady (No. 68) and Mizzou senior Peter Malnati (No. 53). Karlsson (No. 35), Malnati (No. 63), Tolan (No. 58) and Grady (No. 82) are the highest ranked in the *Golfweek* individual NCAA rankings.

In the *Golfweek* rankings, Colorado is 3-12 against top 25 teams, 11-21 versus top 50 teams, 28-42 against the top 100 and 85-45-1 overall (prior to CU's second place finish in the Western Intercollegiate). In the GolfStat computations, Colorado owns a 248-48 record in a round robin, head-to-head comparison.

STEVINSON RANCH INVITATIONAL HISTORY A few years back, late CU head coach **Mark Simpson** had the idea of hosting a meet for District 5 teams at a good weather site, since many of the schools only faced each other once or twice a year at the most and usually in less-than-preferential weather conditions; the first 10 tournaments have been a success and are quite popular with the participating teams (the 2006 event was the first one reduced to two rounds due to weather) ... For this meet, Stevinson Ranch will play to a 7,142-yard, par-72 layout; the course has a 74.7 rating and slope of 138, and features greens with bent grass ... **Kansas** won the first four CU-Stevinson meets and has been crowned champion six times in 10 tries in the event; **Pacific** broke through and won in 2003, with **Colorado** capturing the shortened tourney in 2006 (play was called when rain and lightning peppered the area for over an hour, but teams had to depart to catch their flights; most schools had up to four holes remaining to play). **Wichita State** cruised to the 2007 title, with **New Mexico State** claiming the 2008 crown. Eight of the 10 previous Stevinson meets have been decided by eight strokes or less (four by three or fewer), with only two real blowouts in the decade history.
