**BROADCAST:** Wednesday's game will be broadcast live Fox Sports Net Rocky Mountain with Tim Ring delivering the play-by-play and former CU head coach Ceal Barry giving the color commentary. All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN 760 AM, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. Mike Rice, in his second year, will handle play-by-play duties and is joined by Carol Callan of USA Basketball with the color commentary. Live internet audio can be accessed through Yahoo! Sports.

**THE BUFFALOES:** Colorado is 4-2 overall and in the midst of a three-game winning streak after defeating Colorado State 82-47 in its last outing on Dec. 1. The Buffaloes will be looking to win four straight for the first time since winning five in a row during the tail end of the 2004-05 season's non-conference schedule.

Senior All-America candidate **Jackie McFarland** has once again started the season with a bang averaging a team-leading 18.0 points and 9.2 rebounds per game while shooting a customary

59.4 percent from the floor. McFarland, who is one of only three players in CU history with 1,400 points and 800 rebounds, also leads the team in free-throw shooting at 81 percent and ranks second in assists at 3.0 per game. The All-Big 12 forward ranks second on the league charts in scoring and rebounding so far this year and is also fourth in free-throw percentage, tied for fourth in 3-point field-goal percentage, seventh in field-goal percentage and tied for 14th in assists.

McFarland had 17 points and 10 rebounds against Colorado State to record her 40th career double-double. She has double-doubles in three of her last four games and has scored 20 or more points in three of six games this season.

Senior guard **Susie Powers** has stepped up her game over the past three contests. After being held scoreless for the first three games of the season, Powers has averaged 10.6 points, 5.7 rebounds and 5.7 assists over the last two games while hitting 48 percent (11-of-23) from the floor.

Powers, who had a career-high eight assists in CU's win over Northern Colorado, leads the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio at 5.5 as she has 22 assists against only four turnovers this season.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** continues to have a solid start to her collegiate career as she ranks second on the team in scoring (13.3 ppg) and is third in rebounding (7.5 rpg). Her scoring numbers and rebounding numbers are also tops among all freshmen in the Big 12 Conference so far this season while she tied for first in steals (2.5 spg) and second in assists (3.0 apg).

Sophomore **Aija Putnina** and junior **Hannah Skildum** have played their way into the starting lineup after coming off the bench to begin the season. Putnina has started the last three games and has responded with a pair of double-doubles and is averaging 11.0 points, 12.3 rebounds and 2.3 blocks per game. She has vaulted to the third spot on the league charts in overall rebounding at 9.0 per game, just one board behind McFarland. Skildum, who has started the past two contests, is averaging 7.0 points and 3.8 rebounds over the last four.

Sophomore **Bianca Smith** has been one of the first players off the bench for CU this season and is averaging 7.2 points per game. Her production is even higher over the last two games where she's registered back-to-back double-digit games for just the second time in her career. **Whitney Houston** and **Britney Blythe** have also seen extended minutes in the Colorado backcourt. Houston's minutes were limited against CSU, but she had a season-high four assists and two rebounds against UNC. Blythe broke a two-game scoreless streak against CSU by hitting a 3-pointer to go along with a career-best three rebounds.

Juniors **Caley Dow** and **Kara Richards** have been CU's first front court players off the bench. Dow is coming off a seven-rebound performance against CSU the most she's had since she recorded seven against Cal State Fullerton last season. Richards' 47 percent shooting ranks second on the team and she had a season-best seven points in her last home game against Northern Colorado.

Colorado's 82-point output against CSU upped its season average to 70 per game while the Buffs defense is holding opponents to 60.5 per contest. The Buffaloes have been tough on the boards early on, enjoying a +11 rebound margin, a number that ranks 16th nationally, thanks in part to a whopping 58-26 rebounding edge over Colorado State. The 58 rebounds were the most by a CU team since it grabbed 59 against Bowling Green on Nov. 23, 2001, and

the most on the road since it had 59 at Oklahoma State on Jan. 28, 1983. The Buffaloes currently top the Big 12 Conference in free throws at 74.3 percent. CU's has been sharing the ball well of late averaging 16 assists per game and have netted 20 or more assists in back-to-back games for the first time since the 2003-04 season.

**ABOUT THE COWGIRLS:** No. 21 Wyoming is 6-0 and off to its best start since the 1978-79 season when the Cowgirls started 8-0.

Wyoming has actually won 12 straight dating back to last season as the Cowgirls rebounded from a loss in the Mountain West Conference tournament to win the 2007 postseason WNIT. This will be the third road game for Wyoming during its streak of success, both coming this year and each very close. The Cowgirls defeated Saint Louis 61-57 on Dec. 18 before edging Wisconsin 67-66 in overtime on Dec. 20 in a rematch of last year's WNIT championship game.

Two-time All-MWC forward Hanna Zavec leads Wyoming in scoring at 16.2 per game and also tops the Cowgirls with 5.2 assists per game. Senior forward Justyna Podziemska, the 2007 MWC Newcomer of the Year, is averaging 13.8 points and 6.2 rebounds per game and tops the Wyoming perimeter attack with 14 3-point field goals. Sophomore guard Aubrey Vandiver is averaging 14 points and a team-best 8.0 rebounds off the bench for Wyoming. The Vandiver name should be familiar to Buffs fans as she is the daughter of former Buff men's standout Shaun Vandiver (1988-91).

Wyoming averages 64.3 points per game and is holding opponents to just 52.7 per contest. The Cowgirls are shooting 40 percent from the floor and 75 percent from the free-throw line. Wyoming has been solid on the boards averaging 37.7 per game while holding a +7.8 margin.

rado and Wyoming with the Buffaloes holding a commanding 32-9 series lead. The 32 wins over Wyoming are the most for CU over any nonconference opponent, and it is also the most played non-league series in Buffs' history. Although extended history is in favor of the Buffaloes, the Cowgirls have had the edge recently winning the last three contests including a 66-50 decision in the last game played in Boulder on Nov. 21, 2005. Last year's contest was played in Laramie with the Cowgirls claiming a 68-49 win.

Kathy McConnell-Miller is 0-2 against Wyoming in her head coaching career.

The Buffaloes are 87-48 all-time against teams currently in the Mountain West Conference. Sixty one of those wins have come against Wyoming (32) and Colorado State (29).

**STILL IN NEED OF A WIN OVER A RANKED TEAM:** Colorado has dropped 23 straight games to ranked teams dating back to

January of 2004. The Buffaloes last win over a ranked opponent was a 69-59 decision at No. 24 Baylor on Jan. 7, 2004. CU was ranked No. 14 at the time. The last time CU was unranked and defeated a ranked opponent was in the second round of the 2003 NCAA Tournament when the Buffaloes knocked off No. 12 North Carolina 86-67.

**REVERSING ROAD WOES:** Colorado is 2-1 on the road this season with wins at San Francisco and Colorado State. The two wins equal the team win total on the road for the last two seasons combined (1-10 in 2006-07 and 1-9 in 2004-05). CU's 82-47 win over Colorado State was significant on several fronts. The 35-point margin was the Buffs' highest on the road since a 70-35 win over Kansas on Jan. 16, 2002 and it was also their largest win over Colorado State (regardless of venue) since a 112-48 win on Nov. 16, 1979. The 82 points were the most CU has scored on an opponents home court since the Buffs' last trip to Moby Arena, an 86-83 loss to the Rams on Nov. 30, 2005.

**3-POINTERS FALLING:** Colorado has made and attempted more 3-pointers through six games than it has in any other season in team history, and by a wide margin. The Buffaloes are 57-of-161 through six contests (.354). CU's 57 3-pointers are 19 more than the previous best six-game total of 38 in 2003-04 and the 161 attempts are 54 more than the previous six-game high of 107 in 2005-06.

Colorado, which ranks third in the NCAA and second to only Iowa State in the Big 12 Conference at 9.5 3-pointers per game, had 14 against Colorado State, the second best single-game total in team history (CU had 16 against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004) and it's also the first time the Buffs have had double-digit 3-point efforts in three straight games. CU had 10 3-pointers against Northern Colorado and 13 against Rice. Against UNC, the Buffs set a school record for 3-point field goal attempts in one half with 21 in the first stanza and finished the game with 36 attempts, just one shy of the school record of 37 set against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004.

**THE COACH:** **Kathy McConnell-Miller** is in her third season as Colorado's head coach. She is 26-40 with the Buffaloes and has an overall eight-year head coaching record of 117-128.

**CAPTAINS NAMED:** Seniors **Jackie McFarland** and **Susie Powers** and junior **Caley Dow** will serve as team captains for the 2007-08 season. McFarland is a captain for a third straight season, Powers is in her second year as captain and Dow is a captain for the first time. CU team captains are voted on by players prior to the first regular season contest each year.

**PITERNIECE OUT, BUT PROGRESSING:** Junior forward **Dina Piterniece** who continues to recover from a broken toe suffered during practice on Oct. 19, returned to light practice drills Monday after receiving treatment for chronic plantar fasciitis, which played a role in the original toe injury. Piterniece, who has missed the first six games, is expected to make a significant contribution to the CU lineup this season after a two-year career at Odessa where her teams went 66-3, winning the 2007 junior college national championship and a second place finish in 2006.

**McFARLAND PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12; BUFFS PICKED 11TH:** Senior forward **Jackie McFarland** has been named to the 2007-08 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball team by a vote of league coaches.

McFarland is CU's second preseason All-Big 12 honoree as former Buffaloes standout Erin Scholz was named to the 1996-97 squad. She joins Nebraska forward Kelsey Griffin, Oklahoma center

Courtney Paris and Texas A&M guards A'Quonesia Franklin and Takia Starks on the five-member preseason team. All five players were first team All-Big 12 picks last winter.

A native of Derby, Kan., McFarland topped the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation in field-goal accuracy in 2006-07 at 61 percent. She was second in the Big 12 in scoring (17.8 ppg) and rebounding (10.8 rpg) and led the league in minutes at 36.4 per game.

Despite returning eight players from a team that finished tied for seventh last season, the Buffaloes were picked to finish 11th in the Big 12 in 2007-08 in annual preseason coaches poll.

Defending co-champion Texas A&M was picked to win the 2008 title with seven first place votes and 117 points overall, just edging out the league's other co-champion, Oklahoma who had the other five first place votes and 115 points. The Big South held down the top five spots in the poll as Baylor was third with 97 points followed by Texas (86) and Oklahoma State (66). Iowa State was the top North school (64) followed by Nebraska (56), Kansas State and Texas Tech (54 each), Kansas (43), Colorado (29) and Missouri (11).

**MORE NUMBERS FOR McFARLAND:** Jackie McFarland has had double-doubles in three of the last four games to become the second player in CU history to reach 40 career double-doubles. Her 41 career double-digit rebounding games are third on the CU career charts.

McFarland is the fourth player in Colorado history with 800 career rebounds, and now stands at 825. She needs 71 rebounds to pass Sandy Bean (1978-82) for third place on CU's all-time list. McFarland is the ninth player in team history to reach 1,400 career points and now has 1,428 in 93 career games (15.4 ppg). McFarland is the fifth player in school history to pass 400 free throws made (409). She needs 12 free throws to pass Mandy Nightingale (1998-02) for fourth place and is 85 away from catching Bridget Turner (1985-99) for the all-time mark of 494.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE:** Colorado once again faces a tough schedule with no less than 16 games against 2007 NCAA or WNIT tournament teams. The Buffaloes will travel to perennial NCAA women's powers Southern California and Vanderbilt during the non-confer-

ence season as well as region rival Colorado State. Colorado will host 2007 WNIT Champion Wyoming and will also see Rice, Clemson and Pepperdine at the Coors Events Center. Texas A&M, Oklahoma State and Texas come to Boulder this year out of the Big 12 South along with the Buffs' usual Big 12 North opponents.

**HOME AT THE CECC:** Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 309-93 all-time record at the Coors Events/Conference Center (.769). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CECC in 19 of the previous 29 years including, 2007-08 when the Buffaloes went 11-5 at home with four of the five losses coming to ranked teams. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CECC.

**BUFFS ON TV:** Colorado's schedule features 10 games that will be televised either regionally or nationally, nine of which will be carried by Fox Sports Net. Two games are part of the Big 12's national package with FSN: Sunday, Jan. 13 against Iowa State at home and Saturday, Jan. 26, at Texas Tech. FSN Rocky Mountain will televise six CU home games beginning with Wyoming on Dec. 5. FSN Midwest will televise CU's game at Kansas State on Jan. 19, which could potentially be picked up by FSN Rocky Mountain as well. CU's game at Colorado State on Dec. 1 will be televised by The Mtn. Network.

**UP NEXT:** Colorado will face its second-straight Top 25 opponent as the Buffaloes travel to No. 20 Vanderbilt on Sunday, Dec. 9, at 1 p.m. MST in Nashville.



*Kathy McConnell-Miller*  
 Head Coach  
 Third Season

When **Kathy McConnell-Miller** took over the University of Colorado program just over two years ago, there's no question the Buffaloes were rebuilding and the team was a work in progress.

In two seasons at Colorado, progress is certainly a valid term for McConnell-Miller's Buffaloes.

McConnell-Miller, 40, sports a 22-38 record in her two seasons at Colorado and is 113-126 overall in eight seasons as an NCAA Division I head coach.

She led Colorado to a 13-17 mark in 2006-07, the team's best record since the 2003-04 Buffaloes went 22-8 and advanced to the program's last NCAA Tournament. Colorado also enjoyed its best Big 12 Conference showing in three years, tying Texas and Texas Tech for seventh in the league standings at 6-10. The Buffaloes' six conference wins in 2006-07 were more than the previous two years combined (3-13 in 2005-06 and 2-14 in 2004-05).

McConnell-Miller, who officially became the sixth head coach in the history of CU women's basketball on April 27, 2005, has overseen the development of Jackie McFarland, who has emerged as one of the top players in the Big 12. McFarland has earned All-Big 12 honors in both her seasons under McConnell-Miller including first team acclaim this past season. All-league selections are nothing new to McConnell-Miller as she has had at least one first or second team all-conference performer in each of her eight seasons as a collegiate head coach.

The Buffaloes have also had academic success in the McConnell-Miller era. In her two seasons, McConnell-Miller has coached seven Academic All-Big 12 Women's Basketball team members and has helped guide McFarland two a pair of Academic All-America second team honors.

She has done well with the players inherited from legendary CU head coach Ceal Barry, but she has also excelled in bringing in her own players.

McConnell-Miller, who from day one has established a family type atmosphere in the lockerroom and a fighting spirit in her players, and her staff have landed back-to-back Top 40 recruiting classes, including the No. 29 class in 2006 according to the All-Star Girls Report. What was remarkable about the class of 2006 is McConnell-Miller and her staff didn't even have the chance to start on the recruiting trail until April when they arrived in Boulder. Despite that late start, McConnell-Miller and her staff managed to sign five top 150 players, including Whitney Houston and Aija Putnina who made significant contributions as first-year players.

Before arriving at CU, McConnell-Miller spent six seasons as head coach at the University of Tulsa where she constructed an impressive turnaround of the Golden Hurricane program. Before her arrival in 1999-2000, Tulsa had just one winning season in its 14-year history, an overall record of 81-250 (.324), and was actually dropped as a varsity sport for nine years following the 1986-87 campaign. In her six seasons at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller recorded a program-best 91 wins (15.2 wins per year), winning seasons in three of the last four years and two postseason appearances.

She left as Tulsa's all-time leader for coaching victories with a record of 91-88 and owns the longest tenure in school history by a women's basketball coach. McConnell-Miller, who earned WAC Coach of the Year honors in her rookie season as a collegiate head coach in 1999-00, led Tulsa to 14 or more wins in five of her six campaigns.

Under the direction of McConnell-Miller, Tulsa placed at least one player on either the All-WAC first or second team, each of her six seasons. McConnell-Miller also had the Golden Hurricane excelling in the classroom sporting four *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District first and second team performers. Tulsa players also earned 23 All-WAC Academic Team honors. One of McConnell-Miller's prize players was Allison Curtin who was an

*Associated Press* honorable mention All-American for the Golden Hurricane and was drafted by the Houston Comets in the first round of the 2003 WNBA Draft.

Prior to her appointment at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller spent four seasons on Theresa Grentz's staff at the University of Illinois (1995-99). She was an assistant coach for her first three years before being promoted to associate head coach for her final season. The Fighting Illini posted an overall record of 76-45 and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments with McConnell-Miller on the bench. Illinois won the Big Ten Conference Championship in 1997 and twice advanced to the Sweet 16. While at Illinois, McConnell-Miller was vital in the signing of a pair of recruiting classes that ranked among the top five in the nation.

McConnell-Miller coached with Grentz for a total of six years as she went with Grentz to Illinois from Rutgers University in 1995. McConnell-Miller was a Rutgers assistant for two seasons (1993-95), helping the Lady Knights post a pair of winning campaigns, the 1994 Atlantic 10 Championship and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Her recruiting expertise was well documented at Rutgers as her last class was rated as the 14th-best nationally, giving McConnell-Miller back-to-back Top 15 classes.

Her first collegiate assistant coaching job came at her hometown school, the University of Pittsburgh. She joined the Panthers in 1991 and served as the recruiting coordinator. She was also an assistant coach for the 1993 Big East All-Star Team which played in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

She is a member of the Western Pennsylvania Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, and was inducted into the Seton LaSalle High School Hall of Fame in October of 2006.

McConnell-Miller enjoyed a four-year playing career at guard for the University of Virginia (1986-90). She played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight. McConnell-Miller earned her bachelor's degree in rhetoric and communications from Virginia in 1989.

One of eight children, she is one of six McConnell siblings who attended college on a basketball scholarship.

Three McConnell's are presently in the coaching ranks, two at the college level and one at the high school level. Her older sister, Suzie McConnell Serio was the head coach of the Minnesota Lynx of the WNBA for three seasons (2003-06).

Born on Sept. 24, 1967, McConnell-Miller and her husband, Brad Miller, have three children: Brice (7), Mackenzie (5) and Macie (3).

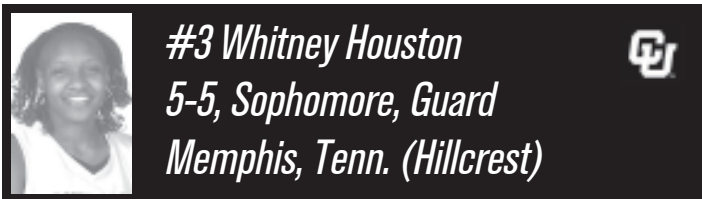

#### This Season:

- Has double-doubles in three of her last four games and has reached 20 or more points three times this season.
- Has shot 64 percent over her last three games (18-of-28) and has not shot below 50 percent in a game this season.
- Named to the Coors Classic All-Tournament team for the third straight season as she paced the Buffaloes by averaging 18 points, 11 rebounds and 6.5 assists over the two games...Notched a career-high seven assists against Rice.
- Ranks 2nd in scoring, rebounding and minutes, fourth in free-throw percentage, tied for 4th in 3-point percentage, 7th in field goal percentage and tied for 14th in assists on the Big 12 charts.
- A 2007 preseason All-Big 12 first team selection and named one of the top 5 power forwards in the nation by ESPN.com.

#### Career:

- 2007 *Associated Press* honorable mention All-American and All-Big 12.
- Member of the 2007 U.S. Jones Cup Team that won a bronze medal in Taipei, Taiwan this summer. Led Team USA in field-goal percentage during the six-game event at 57.1 percent (20-35)
- Two-time *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America second team selection.
- Ranked third in the NCAA and topped the Big 12 in field-goal percentage in 2006-07. Ranked second in the Big 12 in scoring, rebounding and double-doubles as a junior.
- Third player in CU history with 1,400 points and 800 rebounds. Ranks 9th on the CU career scoring charts at 1,428 and is fourth in rebounding (827).
- Second on CU's career list with 40 double-doubles and her 41 double-digit rebounding games, are third on the CU charts behind Erin Scholz (46) and Lisa Van Goor (63).
- Had 18 double-doubles in 2006-07 tying Lisa Van Goor (1982-83) for third on CU's single-season list. She missed five other double-double opportunities by either a single point or rebound.

- Her 18 double-doubles in 2006-07 were equal to or more than the totals of 10 of the 12 Big 12 teams.
- Her 533 points as a junior ranked seventh on CU's single-season list and she is just the third player in team history with back-to-back 500 point seasons.
- Her junior season rebounding average of 10.8 per game is the third-best mark in team history and her 325 total rebounds rank fifth on CU's single-season ledger and are the most ever by a Buff junior.
- Just the second different player in team history to score 500 points and 300 rebounds in the same season. (Lisa Van Goor did it in 1980-81 and 1981-82).

- Set a single-season CU record with 161 free throws made in 2006-07, passing Bridget Turner's mark of 154 set in 1988-89, and tied a school single-game record with 14 free throws against Texas Tech in the first round of the 2007 Big 12 Championship.
- On CU's career lists ranks fifth in free-throws made (409) and sixth in blocked shots (104).
- Set a Big 12 Championship first round record by scoring 32 points against Texas Tech. Her 32 points tied the best output by a CU player in Big 12 tournament action, matching Tera Bjorklund's 32 against Oklahoma in a quarterfinal game on March 12, 2003.
- Had a career-high 18 rebounds against Kansas, the most by a CU player since Raegan Scott had 21 against Texas in on Feb. 26, 1997.
- Named Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 13, after averaging 22 points, 12 rebounds and shooting 71 percent from the field (17-of-24) during the opening weekend of games. Named to the Coors Classic All-Tournament Team.
- The first player in CU history to register three straight double-doubles at the beginning of the season twice in her career as she also did it in 2005-06.
- The first player in CU history to average 20 points and 10 rebounds over the first nine games of a season.
- A 2006 All-Big 12 Conference second team selection.
- As a sophomore, ranked fourth in rebounding (9.2 rpg), sixth in scoring (17.2 ppg), eighth in free-throw percentage (.799), ninth in blocks (1.4 bpg) and 10th in field-goal percentage (.514) in the Big 12 Conference.
- Just the eighth player in team history with 500 points in a season and the second to record 500 points, 250 rebounds and 50 assists in one season.

**SAN FRANCISCO** — Freshman **Brittany Spears** had 15 points — all in the first half — to spark Colorado to a season-opening 66-48 win at San Francisco Friday night at War Memorial Gymnasium.

Spears, who also tallied seven rebounds and five steals, scored 15 of CU's first 23 points as the Buffaloes erased an early 13-6 deficit and closed the first half with a 30-12 run to take control of the game. Spears was 7-of-11 from the floor and had four of her steals by halftime equaling CU's top individual theft performance from any game all of last season. Her scoring output tied for the 10<sup>th</sup> best Buff debut in team history.

"I felt comfortable because we were prepared," Spears said. "We worked all week on (San Francisco's) plays, all the screens; flare screens. (The coaching staff) told us what they were going to do. I felt prepared mentally and physically for this game."

With Spears' strong start the game opened up for CU's all-Big 12 forward **Jackie McFarland** who had a game-high 22 points including 15 in the second half.

"The ball movement was great," McFarland said. "Before (opponents) have been able to double-down on me the entire game and tonight after a couple plays in the first half when we were getting good shots (outside), it opened up the post a lot and allowed me to move around."

Freshman guard **Britney Blythe** made her collegiate debut in her own back yard scoring 11 points with two steals and two assists. The San Mateo, Calif., native led a Colorado bench effort that outscored the USF bench 26-6. Sophomore **Aija Putnina** corralled nine rebounds and had six points, including her first career 3-point field goal.

"We have several options for players coming off the bench and tonight we wanted players on the floor that could score and I thought that was the difference," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "We had five players that could shoot the ball and USF had a difficult job of figuring out who to guard. In the past we've had just one (who could score) and now we have more offensive weapons."

"We wanted to improve our performance on the road this year and I was very pleased with the mental toughness of this team and the decision making on the floor. This team was prepared for what we were going to do and our staff had a confidence level going into the game tonight the way the players have worked in the off season and preseason."

The Buffaloes, which have won just one road game each of the last two years, enjoyed their widest margin of victory on the road since a 71-50 win over Kansas on Jan. 18, 2003. It's also the fewest points CU's allowed on the road since a 45-42 win over Pacific on Dec. 18, 2004.

Colorado's defense shut down San Francisco as the Dons were held to just 37 percent shooting for the game and just 32 in the second half (9-of-28). The Buffaloes had 11 steals — nine in the first half — and overall forced 18 USF turnovers. Lisa Olden led USF with 14 points and seven rebounds while Necolia Simmons had 11 points and seven rebounds.

**LOS ANGELES** — Southern California took advantage of hot perimeter shooting, nailing 11 3-point field goals to claim a 70-57 decision over Colorado Sunday afternoon at the Galen Center on the USC campus.

USC (1-1) hit a scorching 50 percent from the 3-point arc (11-of-22) and hit timely shots each time the Buffaloes made a run. Brynn Cameron was 4-of-6 from downtown and led USC with 16 points. Simone Jelks, who had just seven 3-pointers all of last season, was 3-of-3 for the afternoon scoring 10 total.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** led Colorado with 19 points, 14 of which came in the second half. Sophomores **Aija Putnina** and **Bianca Smith** each had nine points off the bench.

Colorado's had a first half to forget netting just 16 points while committing 15 turnovers. The Buffaloes made just 5-of-21 from the field (23.8 percent) and had trouble getting All-Big 12 forward **Jackie McFarland** involved in the game. McFarland was held to just one free throw for the first 20 minutes with two rebounds.

McFarland finished with seven points and seven rebounds.

Southern California began the game on a 21-7 run, forcing seven Buffaloes turnovers in the first nine minutes and holding CU to just 17 percent from the field (2-of-12). Camille LeNoir, playing in her first game of the season, had seven of her nine points in the opening minutes of the game.

Colorado closed the gap with a 7-0 run on a Spears free throw, and back-to-back 3-point field goals by Spears and Putnina, but Cameron scored five straight to ignite a 16-2 USC run to end the half. The guard combo of Cameron and LeNoir combined for 17 first half points on 7-of-11 shooting, including three 3-point field goals.

McFarland was able to get back on track early in the second half with six points in the opening moments, but each time USC had an answer on the other end. McFarland and junior center **Kara Richards** combined for six straight to knock the score down to 39-22, but Allison Jaskowiak, and Cameron answered with 3-pointers as the Trojans pushed the lead back to 47-24.

Spears then hit a 3-pointer and followed it up with back-to-back scores as the Buffs went on a 11-2 run to narrow the margin to 49-35 with 12:13 left. However, once again Cameron and Jelks hit back-to-back from downtown to push the USC lead back to 20 (55-35).

Overall Colorado committed 26 turnovers and shot just 38 percent for the game (21-of-55).

**BOULDER** — Senior **Jackie McFarland** and sophomore **Aija Putnina** each tallied double-doubles as Colorado defeated Rice, 72-55, in the consolation game of the 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Coors Class Saturday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Clemson won the Coors Classic with a 77-67 win over Siena in the championship game.

Putnina, making her first start since a game at Cal State Fullerton on Dec. 7, 2006, led the Buffaloes with a career-high 15 points to go along with 12 rebounds. It's her third career double-double, all three of which have come when she's in the starting lineup. Putnina also added three steals and two blocked shots.

She has a way to go to catch McFarland's numbers, as the All-Big 12 forward registered career double-double No. 39 and her second-straight as she earned All-Tournament honors for the third time. McFarland had 12 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high seven assists. She's actually been closer to a triple-double than she has a school-record eight blocks to go along with a traditional points-rebound double-double in 2005 against South Dakota State.

Colorado shot an overall season-high 47 percent from the field and spread the wealth around as four players scored in double-digits and two others had seven or more. Senior **Susie Powers**, held scoreless for the first three games of the season, had 11 while freshman **Brittney Spears** had 10 points to go with seven rebounds and six assists.

Junior **Hannah Skildum** had eight points and four rebounds off the bench and **Kara Richards** pitched in seven on a perfect 3-of-3 from the field.

"Last night our look was a result of our shots not going down, and we were also struggling on the defensive end," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "But they were excited about this game and the tournament, and they went into this game with good energy. We knew that things were going to change and I thought they responded well from a very tough loss last night."

Colorado found itself down 13-4 right out of the gate. The Buffaloes, which shot just under 40 percent last night against Siena, made just 2-of-10 to start the game.

Colorado finally found its rhythm by embarking on a 13-0 run capped off by back-to-back 3-point field goals by McFarland and Spears to take a 17-13 lead with 9:18.

The good fortunes continued for the Buffaloes after their initial struggle. Colorado made 11-of-16 to close the half (69 percent) and at one point outscored the Owls 21-2 and led by as many 10 in the first 20 minutes.

Colorado pulled away quickly, beginning the second half on an 8-2 run to take a 47-33 lead and never let the advantage dip below 11.

Rice was led by guard Kadie Riverin who had 14 points, four rebounds and three assists en route to All-Tournament team honors.

**BOULDER** — When Colorado needed a shot in the arm to get going against Northern Colorado, the Buffs looked to their seniors to step it up, and they answered.

Forward **Jackie McFarland** scored a game-high 26 points and point guard **Susie Powers** had 12 points, eight assists and seven rebounds to lead Colorado to a 69-60 win over Northern Colorado Wednesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Colorado improves to 3-2 overall while the Bears fall to 3-3.

McFarland, who became the ninth player in team history to reach 1,400 career points (1,424), sparked a 23-4 first-half run to overcome a slow start by the Buffaloes. UNC hit its first four 3-point field goal attempts and built a 19-11 lead in the first 8:56 of the game.

Coming out of a media timeout with 10:56 remaining in the first half, McFarland took over. The All-Big 12 Conference performer scored 10 straight points capped off by a 3-pointer to give CU a 21-19 lead. After Kate Kevorken tied the game at 21, CU sophomore guard **Bianca Smith** kept the momentum by in the home team's favor by hitting three 3-pointers in a span of 2:17. **Caley Dow** and **Whitney Houston** finished off the run with back-to-back buckets to give the Buffs a 34-23 advantage.

Powers had six of her career-high eight assists in the first 20 minutes, two of which went to McFarland during her 10-0 run. Powers, whose 16 assists against only three turnovers this season leads the Big 12, scored nine of her career-best tying 12 points in the second half.

CU built its lead to 55-41 early in the second half as McFarland and Powers each hit a pair of 3-pointers during the run. UNC answered with six straight to cut CU's lead to eight, but Powers' third 3-pointer of the half sparked a 7-0 run to give the Buffs their largest lead of the game at 62-47.

The 3-pointer was a big weapon for the Buffs against UNC. CU made 13 from downtown, its most since a similar baker's dozen against Iowa State on Jan. 10, 2007. Colorado was 8-of-21 in the first half alone, with the 21 attempts breaking the school record of 20 attempts in one half set against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004. Colorado ended up at 13-of-36, with the 36 attempts just one short of the school record for a game which is 37 against Buffalo. CU, which had 10 3-pointers against Rice on Saturday, has hit double-digits in 3-pointers in back-to-back games for the first time in school history.

Sophomore **Aija Putnina** had a career-high 15 rebounds and tied a personal best with four blocked shots for Colorado, which held UNC to just 34 percent from the field. McFarland finished with eight rebounds and three blocks while shooting 8-of-11 from the field.

Whitley Cox led Northern Colorado with 21 points and five assists. Courtney Stoermer had 13 points and nine rebounds while Danielle Hagen had a team-high 12 rebounds.
