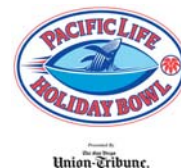

SCHEDULE STRENGTH

The Big 12 has 11 teams ranked in the top 50 of Division I-A schedule strength. Texas A&M ranks as the team with the toughest schedule in the nation based on the cumulative winning percentage of its opponents. Baylor is listed with the fourth toughest schedule. OUT OF CONFERENCE

The Big 12 led the nation with 28 non-conference wins this season. Its total of eight losses in non-conference tilts was the lowest in I-A, while the league's 0.624 win percentage was the second highest in the country.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME REGULARS

The 2004 season marks the second consecutive and fourth time in the last five years that a Big 12 team has played in the BCS National Championship game. This is the second time in as many seasons that Oklahoma has played in the game, and the third overall. Since the inception of the BCS, the Big 12 is 1-2 in the National Championship game. Oklahoma claimed the 2000 national title, while Nebraska and OU were denied the crown in '01 and '03, respectively.

BAYLOR (3-8, 1-7)

Next Game: Season Complete

Ray Guy Award winner Daniel Sepulveda became the first Baylor player to have at least 20 punts of 50 yards or longer in consecutive seasons. Sepulveda ranks third in the NCAA with a punting average of 46 yards. He also had a season-long punt of 69 yards.

Maurice Lane closed the season by registering game-high tackle totals in each of the last three games. Lane combined for 43 tackles during the stretch, including 36 solo stops. His tackle totals over the last three games included 14 (11) against Oklahoma, 16 (14) at OSU and 13 (11) vs. Texas Tech. Lane leads the Big 12 with 77 solo stops and is third with 104 tackles.

The Texas Tech game marked the only time this season the Baylor offense did not commit a turnover.



COLORADO (7-5, 4-4)

Next Game:

vs. UTEP

EV1.net Houston Bowl, Dec. 29

With his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season, a 130-yard effort against Nebraska, Bobby Purify (3,016) moved into third place on the Colorado career rushing yards list behind Eric Bieniemy (3,940) and Rashaan Salaam (3,057).

Mason Crosby has connected on five field goals from 50-plus yards, tying him for the most in the NCAA this season.

Colorado forced three turnovers in the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship game against Oklahoma. The CU defense has caused at least two turnovers in each of the last five games.

The Buffs have scored in 196 consecutive games, the longest streak in the Big 12.



IOWA STATE (6-5, 4-4)

Next Game:

vs. Miami (Ohio)

Independence Bowl, Dec. 28

The Cyclones will be making their fourth bowl appearance in the last five seasons.

After going winless in the Big 12 last season, ISU came within a field goal of winning the Big 12 North Division, the school's first title since 1912, in its regular season finale vs. Missouri, a 17-14 overtime loss.

Iowa State is averaging 406.3 yards of offense over its last three games.

ISU's defense has forced 14 turnovers over the final five games, after forcing nine through the season's first six contests. During this span, the Cyclones are plus-10 on turnovers (14 takeaways vs. 4 turnovers).



KANSAS (4-7, 2-6)

Next Game: Season Complete

Charles Gordon leads the NCAA with seven interceptions. His season total is the most by a KU player since 1951.

Five of the Jayhawks' seven losses were by less than seven points, including four of six in Big 12 play.

Kansas recorded a Big 12-leading 19 interceptions. Sophomores Charles Gordon (7) and Rodney Harris (4) combined for 11 pickoffs.

The Kansas defense did not allow a first quarter touchdown all season. The Jayhawks allowed two field goals, a safety and a defensive TD in outscoring opponents 75-15 in the opening stanza.

Nick Reid is second in the Big 12 with 9.9 tackles per game.



KANSAS STATE (4-7, 2-6)

Next Game: Season Complete

Darren Sproles ranks as the all-time Big 12 leader with 6,812 all-purpose yards. Sproles leads the Big 12 and ranks fourth in the NCAA, averaging 187.9 all-purpose yards.

Over its last five games, KSU averaged 378.6 yards of offense.

The Wildcats committed at least one turnover in every game.

This season ended the Wildcats' streak of 11 consecutive bowl appearances.

Twice this season K-State forced a season-high four turnovers (Nebraska, Missouri).

K-State lost a Big 12-leading 15 fumbles, with 12 of them coming in conference play.



MISSOURI (5-6, 3-5)

Next Game: Season Complete

Mizzou leads the Big 12 and is fourth in the NCAA in pass defense, at 149.3 yards per game.

Missouri held its opponents to less than 175 yards of passing on eight occasions, including three games in which it allowed less than 100 yards through the air.

Brad Smith ranks second all-time in the Big 12 with 9,583 career yards of total offense.

Missouri is second in the Big 12 in total defense and 16th nationally, allowing 301.4 yards a game.

The Tigers held opponents to two of 11 fourth-down conversions to lead the Big 12 (18.2 pct). The Missouri offense converted on 11 of 20 fourth down attempts.



NEBRASKA (5-6, 3-5)

Next Game: Season Complete

Barrett Ruud leads the Big 12 with 125 total tackles and is second with 68 solo stops. He averaged 11.4 tackles per game. Ruud's 432 career tackles ranks second all-time in the Big 12.

In the season finale against Colorado, Joe Dailey set Nebraska single-game records for pass attempts (55) and completions (29).

Nebraska is second in the Big 12 and ranks 12th in the NCAA in rush defense, allowing 104.0 yards per game.

This season saw the end of the Cornhuskers' NCAA-record 35 consecutive bowl appearances.



OKLAHOMA (12-0, 8-0)

Next Game:

vs. USC

FedEx Orange Bowl, Jan. 4

Quarterback Jason White won the Maxwell Award (best all-around player) and the Davey O'Brien trophy (top quarterback). It is his second straight O'Brien honor.

Adrian Peterson has rushed for 1,843 yards this season, the highest overall total in the Big 12. Peterson has eclipsed the 200-yard rushing mark three times.

The OU defense is holding opponents to 86.4 rushing yards per game to lead the Big 12 and rank fifth nationally.

The Sooners have allowed 72 yards or less on the ground seven times. OU has given up 22 total rushing yards the last two games.



OKLAHOMA STATE (7-4, 4-4)

Next Game:

vs. Ohio State

Mastercard Alamo Bowl, Dec. 29

The Cowboys lead the nation in turnover margin at plus-18. The OSU defense has caused 25 turnovers, while the offense has coughed the ball up seven times.

Three of Oklahoma State's losses have been to teams ranked in the top 25 for the week in which the game was played (Oklahoma, Texas, Texas A&M), with Texas Tech returning to the national rankings following its win over OSU.

OSU is second in the Big 12 in rushing offense and eighth in the NCAA, averaging 245.0 yards.

Oklahoma State leads the Big 12 in red zone offense, scoring 93.3 percent of the time it penetrates the opposing 20-yard line. The Cowboys have scored on 42-of-45 red zone trips, including 34 TDs.



TEXAS (10-1, 7-1)

Next Game:

vs. Michigan

Rose Bowl presented by Citi, Jan. 1

Texas is 58-0 when outrushing its opponent. The Longhorns have rushed for over 300 yards in a game six times this year, including a season-high 513 against North Texas.

Butkus Award, Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy winner Derrick Johnson leads the Big 12 in tackles for loss (15.5), has caused an NCAA-leading six fumbles, and ranks fourth in the conference in tackles (94).

The Longhorns lead the Big 12 and are second nationally in rushing offense at 302.4 yards a game.

Doak Walker Award winner Cedric Benson has scored in an NCAA-record 37 games. Benson is fourth in the country and leads the Big 12 with a 160.4-yard rushing average. He has rushed for over 100 yards 10 times this season.



TEXAS A&M (7-4, 5-3)

Next Game:

vs. Tennessee

SBC Cotton Bowl, Jan. 1

Texas A&M has played in a Big 12 single-season record three overtime games this year. Three of the Aggies' last five contests required extra frames. All-time A&M is second in the Big 12 with eight overtime games since the 1996 season (4-4).

A&M is second in the Big 12 in passing offense at 263.0 yards per game.

Todd Pegram missed his first field goal attempt of the year in the regular season finale at Texas. Pegram entered the contest perfect on all 12 attempts this season.

The Aggies have posted over 400 yards of offense in nine games. A&M ranks fourth in the Big 12, averaging 438.5 yards, and averages a conference-leading 6.4 yards per play.



TEXAS TECH (7-4, 5-3)

Next Game:

vs. California

Pacific Life Holiday Bowl, Dec. 30

Texas Tech leads the nation in pass offense (388.7 ypg), while leading the Big 12 and ranking sixth nationally in total offense (483.5).

The duo of Trey Haverty and Jarrett Hicks holds the Big 12's top two spots in receptions and receiving yards per game. Hicks leads the conference with 1,108 receiving yards on 67 receptions, while Haverty leads the league with 69 catches for 872 yards.

The Red Raiders are second in the Big 12 in pass defense, allowing 175.5 yards a game.

Tech will be playing in the post season for the fifth consecutive year.

Sonny Cumbie leads the nation in total offense (370.5 ypg) and passing yards (383.8 ypg).

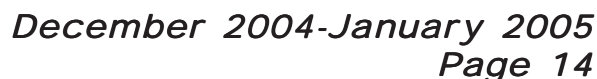
