NONCONFERENCE PLAY: CU finished 4-6, their first losing season in nonconference play since 1988-89 when they finished 5-8. It's also the fewest nonconference games the Buffaloes have played since the 1997-98 campaign when they finished 6-4.

HOOK SHOTS: **Dominique Coleman** and **Jermyl Jackson-Wilson** have been stellar in their last four games. Coleman: 13.3 ppg., 6.3 rpg., 3.3 apg., 1.8 spg.; 17-of-20 FT (.850), 17-of-38 FG (.447); Jackson-Wilson averages 7.0 ppg., 6.5 rpg., 2.0 apg., 2.5 bpg., 1.8 stl.; he also has 11 blocks and ranks 87th nationally in rebounding (7.7) ... CU has had four double-doubles this season: Jackson-Wilson (2), Coleman and **Richard Roby** (1) ... Roby has led the team in scoring six times, including one shared and has scored double figures in nine of 10 games ... **Kal Bay** notched career-bests in his last game vs. UCF: 21 pts., five three-pointers, three steals ... Coach Patton teams are 3-8 against the Longhorns ... **TEAM:** CU has used seven different starting combinations through 10 games ... CU is 1-5 at home in Big 12 openers ... CU is 96-for-124 from the FT line in the last four games (.774) ... Shot a season-best .529 from the field (27-of-51), a school-best since shooting .577 against Savannah State in 2005-06 ... Against UCF, both teams combined for 55 free throws made breaking the Coors Events Center record of 53 ... CU's 36 made free throws against UCF are the most since making 36 back on Feb. 22, 1997 (Missouri) ... CU is on TV for its next 11 straight games.

CU vs. TEXAS: Texas leads the head-to-head series, 9-8 and defeated CU last season in Austin, 89-64 (Jan. 7, 2006). The last time CU defeated the Longhorns at the Events Center was Feb. 8, 2005, upsetting the then-No. 23/22 'Horns, 88-79. That was the same season the Buffs shocked Texas at the Big 12 Tournament (March 10), 81-69, becoming the first No. 11 seed to upset a No. 6 seed.

TEXAS UPDATE: The Longhorns have won five of their last six games and have not won in Boulder since Feb. 7, 2001. Texas is led by freshman sensation Kevin Durant, who is eighth nationally in scoring (21.5 ppg.), 13th in rebounding (10.3 rpg.) and 64th in blocked shots (2.1). He also leads the Big 12 in those categories and has posted seven double-doubles and reached the 20-point mark in 11 of UT's 13 games (*CU footnotes: have allowed three double-doubles and seven 20 point performances*). Head coach Rick Barnes is a perfect 8-0 mark in Big 12 Conference openers, while Coach Patton is 1-9 (nine straight losses).

LAST TIME OUT: Kal Bay scored a career-high 21 points and Marcus King-Stockton scored 11 of his career-high 18 points in the second half leading CU to a 96-87 victory over Central Florida, Wednesday night. It was the first CU men's basketball in 25 days since last playing December 9 against Colorado State. Two games were cancelled due to inclement weather on December 23 (UC Davis) and December 30 (TCU). Richard Roby added 14 points, 12 of those in the second half.

A total of six CU players netted double figures, a first since Dec. 3, 2005 against UC Irvine.

Adding to the scoring mix was Jermyl Jackson-Wilson (13 points), Dominique Coleman (12 pts.) and Jeremy Williams (10 pts.). Bay added six assists, three steals and season-best five 3-pointers.

THE REST OF THE BIG 12: CU was the only team not to play a game during their extended holiday break due to the inclement weather, the Christmas holiday and final exams. Texas, Iowa State and Nebraska played the most games (5) from Dec. 10-31. The schools playing four games were Baylor, Kansas State, Missouri, Texas A&M and Oklahoma State; Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas Tech have played three.

SCOUTING THE NEXT THREE: The Buffs will take on three members of the Big 12 South Division to start the 2007 conference slate. Each of the Buffs' next three opponents—Texas, Oklahoma and Texas A&M—boast Big 12 award winners for the week of Jan. 2. Texas, which CU will face first, has the league's top freshman in Kevin

Durant. The 6-9 guard/forward was named the conference Rookie of the Week for the second straight time and fourth time overall. Durant leads Texas in scoring (21.5 ppg), rebounding (10.3 rpg) and blocked shots (27). Next up for the Buffs is Oklahoma led by Co-Big 12 Player of the Week Longar Longar. The junior center scored 20 points and grabbed 15 rebounds against SMU and leads the team in scoring (13.3 ppg), rebounding (7.8rpg) and blocked shots (18). Texas A&M, which comes to town last, will counter CU with a powerful lineup including sophomore forward Josh Carter who was also the Co-Big 12 Player of the Week. Carter tied a conference record with seven three-pointers in the first half against Grambling State, finishing with 24 points. The Aggie sharpshooter is second on the team in scoring (13.0 ppg) and second in the conference in three-point FG percentage (.534).

RECENT TRENDS AGAINST THE NEXT THREE: The Buffs are 7-8 against their next three opponents in the combined last five contests between each team:

Texas (CU is 3-2 in last five games): CU dropped an 89-64 decision to Texas last season after sweeping the Longhorns in two games during the 2004-05 season. The Buffs have struggled against the Longhorns at home. CU is 2-5 against Texas in Boulder, but 6-3 against the burnt orange on the road or in neutral sites.

Oklahoma (CU is 2-3 in last five games): The Buffs have taken two of the last five contests between the schools with the two wins coming at home. CU beat No. 19 Oklahoma 84-75 last season in Boulder behind 28 points by Richard Roby and 18 points by Chris Copeland.

Texas A&M (CU is 2-3 in last five games): The Aggies have won the last three games between the two teams, although CU still leads the all-time series 9-4, including 4-1 at home. Last season, the No. 25 Buffs traveled to College Station and could not hold a one-point halftime ad-

vantage, losing to the Aggies 61-58. In the second round of the Big 12 tournament, the two teams met again with the Buffs opening a quick 9-2 lead over A&M before succumbing to poor shooting in an 86-53 defeat.

CANCELLED GAMES: The CU/UC Davis game (Dec. 23) was cancelled due to the inclement weather in the Denver area that caused severe travel difficulties; and on Saturday, Dec. 30, both the Texas Christian (men) and Houston (women) schools opted not to board their respective flights to Colorado. Officials from both schools cited the weather conditions in Colorado, despite the fact that their flights were not cancelled. The doubleheader had the TCU men playing Ricardo Patton's Buffaloes at 1 p.m. at the Coors Events Center, with the Houston women to play Kathy McConnell-Miller's team at 7 p.m. The games will not be rescheduled this season.

CRASHING THE BOARDS: In their last four games the Buffs have five players with at least 20 rebounds apiece. Jeremy Williams and Jermyl Jackson-Wilson each have 26 (6.5 rpg.), Dominique Coleman has 25 (6.3 rpg.), Richard Roby is next with 23 (5.8 rpg.) and Marcus King-Stockton rounds out with 20 (5.0 rpg.). As a team, CU has only out-rebounded an opponent four times (Denver +13, Pepperdine +9, Northern Colorado +4, Central Florida +3).

INJURY LIST UPDATE: Freshman center Marc Van Burck is currently back as a reserve after suffering a right foot stress fracture. He was active for the Central Florida game, but did not play. He has not played in a game since the season opener against Denver. Freshman walk-on Trent Beckley is still out with a left Achilles tendon strain.

GETTING CLOSE: Richard Roby is nearing the school's top-10 field goals attempts list. Entering today's game, Roby has 963 attempts nearing the 10th spot held by Jay Humphries (1980-84) with 1,058. As for field goals made, Roby is a bit behind Scott Wedman's 10th place of 516. Roby has 400 field goals made.

SCORING 60 POINTS OR LESS: Three of CU's 10 games have resulted in scoring 60 points or less, a first in the 11 years under coach Patton. Prior to the 2006-07 season, this feat only happened five times over five other seasons (2004-05, 2003-04, 1999-2000, 1998-99, 1997-98).

HOW ABOUT 59 PTS. OR LESS?: That's happened twice this season (46 vs. Air Force, 55 at UNC Wilmington). When CU flirts with 59

points or lower they are 1-33 in the last 11 plus years under coach Patton [scoring 30-39 (0-1), 40-49 points (0-2), 50-59 points (1-30)]. The lone win came at Iowa State, 54-52 (OT), the Buffs first win in Ames since Feb. 19, 1991 (14 games).

THIS DAY IN BUFF MBB HISTORY: CU is 9-5 on this day in history and most recently played in 2001.

2001: L, 56-61 at Baylor (Michel Morandais scores 14 to lead Buffs, but Buffs shoot only 3-19 from beyond the arc in loss);

1996: L, 66-77 at Missouri (Mack Tuck leads the Buffs with a double-double, scoring 24 points and 11 rebounds);

1993: W, 117-96 vs. Centenary (Poncho Hodges has a career night, scoring 32 points and posting 20 rebounds);

1990: L, 61-66 vs. Oklahoma (Guard Reggie Morton leads the Buffs with 19 points and 6 rebounds in loss);

1986: W, 80-70 vs. St. Mary's (Matt Bullard (14 pts, 10 rebs) and Randy Downs (23 points, 10 rebs) both post a double double, with Bullard 3 assists shy of a triple-double);

1982: W, 95-77 vs. Wisconsin-Parkside (6 Buffs in double figures, with Jay Humphries leading the way with 24 points. Jacques Tuz posts a double-double (13 points, 10 rebs).

RARE LOSSES AT HOME: Falling to Colorado State at home was the fourth time this season CU lost in Boulder. It's also marks the first time in the 11 years under coach Patton the Buffaloes have lost four home games in nonconference play.

“YOUNG GUNS” Eight of the team’s 13 players are freshmen and are know as another name on the 2006-07 roster, the ‘Young Guns.’ If you haven’t already done so, check out the back cover of the 2006-07 media guide, they’re the future of CU Basketball. After 10 games, Kal Bay and Xavier Silas have made the most of the opportunity in the CU lineup. Bay has started seven of 10 games at the point and ranks first on the team in 3-pointers (21), second in assists (28; 2.8 apg.) and is fifth in scoring (8.2 ppg.).

“X” MARKS THE SPOT: Xavier Silas is averaging almost 30 minutes a game (28.4). In his four starts, Silas is averaging 32. 2 minutes, 11.8 ppg., 4.0 rpg. and is 12-for-15 (.800) from the free throw line. Overall, he’s averaging 9.7 ppg and 3.5 rpg. Part of those four starts was a career-best 19 points against Pepperdine and seven rebounds against Central Florida.

BIG 12 FOES: The Buffs conference opponents have a combined win percentage of .572 (195-146) from last season ... Six conference opponents played in postseason tournaments last year ... Four opponent played in the NCAA Tournament (Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas A&M, Texas); two played in the NIT Tournament (Oklahoma State, Nebraska).

SURPRISE LINEUP ADDITION: Chase Perkowski became the second player in the 11 plus years under Coach Patton to start a game as a non-scholarship player. The first came in Patton’s 1995-96 season (where he was named interim then head coach) toward the end of the

year. Jamie Miller started Feb. 28, 1996 against Nebraska and played only three minutes and only six games for the season. Perkowski came off the bench in the early stages of the first half at UNCW. The sophomore from San Juan Capistrano, Calif. took a charge in four minutes.

20 SHOTS + 20 PTS. = CU WIN (sometimes): Three times this season when Richard Roby shoots 20 times in a game, he also scores 20 points, CU is 2-1 when this occurs. Over his career, the team is 5-2 in this trend. Last season, he did it three times, all wins. be returning next year. Hall will join seniors Richard Roby and Marcus King-Stockton and it will seem like old times again, but with a new coach. Hall has played 88 career games played (44 starts) and averages 8.3 points and 3.4 assists per game. He ranks ninth on the school’s all-time assist list (295), 10th in 3-pointers made (99) and 19th in steals (82). Hall was also one of the captains on the 2005-06 team.

3-POINT WOES: After setting the 3-point school record last season with 240, CU is shooting a Big 12 Conference low .269 percent (56-for-201) from the 3-point arc in 10 games. At this pace CU is averaging 5.6 treys a game good enough for 140 3-pointers, their lowest since the 1993-

ROOKIES IN THE STARTING LINE UP:

Kal Bay became only the fifth rookie in Coach Patton's 11 years to start the first game of the season. The others were guard Alan Barkdale (1996-97), guard/forward Michel Morandais (2000-01), point-guard Antoine McGee (2002-03) and guard Richard Roby (2004-05). Remember, Chauncey Billups started at CU in 1995-96 when Patton was an assistant under Joe Harrington.

PRESEASON ROBY REVIEW:

Before the season started Richard Roby was named to a trio of preseason honors lists: the top-50 preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy ... one of 50 preseason candidates named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team. Roby is the first CU player to be named to the Wooden List since David Harrison in 2003-04 ... Roby was named to the preseason All-Big 12 Team along with sophomores Brandon Rush and Julian Wright (Kansas), junior Joseph Jones (Texas A&M) and seniors Acie Law (Texas A&M) and Jarrius Jackson (Texas Tech).

CU vs. THE MOUNTAIN WEST:

With the cancellation of the CU/TCU game on Dec. 30, the Buffaloes played five games against the Mountain West Conference and finished with a 1-4 record. The Buffs are only 11-11 (.500) since the 1996-97 season and since 2002-03, 6-6 (.500) against the conference.

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT:

Richard Roby held to two points (free throws) in the first half; scored his first basket 17:36 second half (3-point play) against Central Florida ... Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 boards versus Denver, the most from any CU player in his college debut since transferring from Ohio State; he passed the previous record of 10 by Shaun Vandiver against UC Santa Barbara, Nov. 25, 1988; JJW's 11 offensive rebounds, ties him for the most offensive rebounds in history with Stephane Pelle who had 11 against Nebraska in 2001...The Nov. 10 match up with Denver, was the earliest CU has started the season in its 105-year history...**TEAM:** CU's 88 points scored against Northern Colorado was the most scored since beating up Savannah State, 116-52 on Jan. 3, 2006...CU's 12 blocked shots vs. UNC was the most since swatting 12 in back-to-back games at the start of the 2004-05 season (College of Charleston and at Michigan)...The win at Utah was its first in seven

first time CU allowed that many in a game since falling to Oklahoma State, Jan. 30, 2004 (L, 86-104). Prior to that it was Jan. 7, 1998 (at Kansas, L, 62-111) ... the 41-point loss at New Mexico is the most since losing by 32 points at Utah (80-48) on Dec. 30, 2004 and by 43 to Texas at the Big 12 Tournament, March 10, 2000 (78-35) ... After falling on the road to UNC Wilmington, the Buffaloes are now 3-4 against the Colonial Athletic Association, while coach Patton teams are 2-4 overall and 0-3 on the road...In the previous 10 years, CU has lost the first two road games in the non-conference season, six times (1996-97, 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2001-02, 2002-03, 2004-05)... CU remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton (9-0 in Boulder)...CU successfully kept its win streak alive during the exhibition season winning their 18th and 19th in a row defeating Concordia-Montreal (97-85) and Regis (73-37). CU improved to 24-1 (.960) under Patton. Their lone setback occurred Nov. 8, 1998 to the California All-Stars, 91-89. In their history, CU is 44-6 (.880) during the exhibition season.

QUICK SHOTS FROM LAST YEAR:

- CU's upset of No. 19 Oklahoma in front of a nationally televised audience on Feb. 15 made it the fourth straight season CU has defeated a nationally ranked opponent a home.

- CU was ranked for two weeks as the No. 25 school in the ESPN/USA *Today* Coaches' Poll at the end of January, beginning of Feb. The back-to-back weekly rankings were a team-first since the 1996-97 season.

- CU won 20 games, the fourth time in the school's 105-year history.

- CU matched their best home record for wins in a season with 14 set back in 2002-03 (14-1).

- broke the school record for made 3-pointers made (240) and attempts (701)

- started the season 10-1 and during that stretch won nine straight. The 10-1 start matched the 1978-79 season, 26 years ago, and the 1968-69 seasons, 36 years ago.

- CU beat Oklahoma State 80-78 back on Jan. 21 for the Buffaloes first win at Gallagher-Iba Arena since Jan. 12, 1980, a stretch of 20 games. CU also hadn't won at Missouri since the 1996-97 season and only the second time in Columbia since Jan. 15, 1973, a span of 32 games.

- During conference play from Jan. 14-28, the Buffs won five consecutive conference games for the first time since the 1996-97 season. It was their best start to a conference season since 1996-97. The 5-2 mark is the 14th time CU has started 5-2 or better in league play in 59 years.

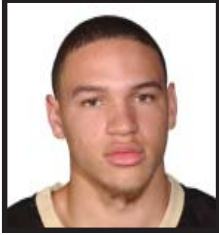

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) - Richard Roby scored 20 points and Colorado remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton during the Buffaloes' 78-64 win over Denver.

Colorado's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 rebounds, including 10 in the first half, and had 14 points, giving him his first career double-double. Jackson-Wilson's 11 offensive boards and his 17 for the game are the most by a Buff in a debut. Dominique Coleman, the lone senior on Colorado's roster, finished with 19 points and seven assists.

DaShawn Walker led Denver with 16 points. Joseph Jackson and Tyler Bullock each added 15 points.

It's the first time the two teams have played since 2000. Colorado leads the all-time series 56-25 and has won the last five in a row. Patton, who announced he'll step down at the end of his 11th season, is 4-0 against the Pioneers.

The Buffaloes led by as many as 21 points in the second half.

Roby had a play late in the first half that probably won't make his highlight reel. Roby attempted a one-handed dunk on a breakaway but was rejected by the rim and fell to the floor. He smiled as he headed back down the court. The Buffs were up 17 points at the time.

Xavier Silas was assessed a technical with 9:23 left in the first half for hanging on the rim.

The Pioneers trimmed a 17-point deficit in the first half to 37-24 at halftime with a 5-1 run to close out the half.

Denver freshman guard Nate Rohnert rolled his ankle during a shoot-around Friday morning and was held out of the game. The Pioneers were already missing junior guard Mykhael Lattimore (right thumb injury) and junior center Adam Tanner (fractured left arm). They're expected to miss at least three more games.

Colorado guard Kal Bay became just the fifth freshman to start in the opener during Patton's tenure. Roby started for Patton in 2004-05.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) - J.R. Giddens scored a career high 25 points and New Mexico got a huge first half lift from its bench in a 106-65 win over Colorado.

Giddens, the former Kansas guard who sat out last season after transferring to New Mexico, shook off a slow start and dissected the Buffaloes' defense with his quickness, slashing moves to the basket and outside jumper that repeatedly found the hoop.

Guard Xavier Silas led the Buffaloes (1-1) with 14 points. Richard Roby and Calvin Bay each scored 12.

New Mexico (3-0) took its first lead at 15-14 on a pair of free throws by Jeffrey Henfield with 11:46 left in the first half. New Mexico's reserves, who scored 25 points in the first half, and some solid free throw shooting, carried the Lobos' offense until Giddens found his stroke.

The Lobos hit their first 13 free throws and reserves Daniel Faris, Chad Toppert and Ryan Kersten provided much of the offense in the first 20 minutes.

Toppert hit a trio of 3-pointers in the first half, Faris scored 8 points and Kersten 6. Toppert's back-to-back 3s gave the Lobos a 36-25 lead with 5:02 left in the first half.

Faris, the sophomore backup center, finished with career highs of 14 points and 8 rebounds.

New Mexico led 47-34 at halftime and broke it open from there as the Lobos shot 67 percent in the second half. Giddens was the catalyst. He scored on a jumper in the lane, then came up with a steal and dunk that pushed the lead to 62-39 with 12:55 left.

Giddens, a junior who New Mexico coach Ritchie McKay has tabbed a likely lottery pick in next summer's NBA draft, flexed his muscles to the crowd of more than 12,000 after the dunk.

Giddens hit 11 of 19 shots and along with Faris and Aaron Johnson led the Lobos to a 51-35 edge in rebounding. Giddens had 9 rebounds and Johnson 11.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) - The Colorado Buffaloes men's basketball team were held to 11 points in the first half and fell to the Air Force Falcons at the Coors Events Center.

Sophomore forward Jermyl Jackson-Wilson led Colorado with nine points. Leading scorer, junior guard Richard Roby was held to six points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Nick Welch added 18 points for Air Force (4-0), which last started out with four straight wins in the 1998-99 season, when it began 5-0. The Falcons hit 13-of-25 3-pointers, four by Tim Anderson.

The first half output of 11 was Colorado's lowest scoring half since being held to four points in the first half of a Jan. 23, 1980 game at Missouri.

It was also the first time CU failed to place a player in double figures since Feb. 15, 1992 at Kansas. Poncho Hodges and Joe Stephens each scored nine points in the 82-45 loss.

Colorado took a 4-0 lead early, but trailed 35-11 at halftime thanks to a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes and a patient Air Force team that shot 52 percent and had 11 points from Welch.

After a basket by junior forward, Marcus King-Stockton, the Buffaloes missed 11 straight shots and turned the ball over five times while the Falcons' Dan Nwaelele buried three, 3-pointers as part of a 22-0 run that ended with Matt McGraw following his own miss to push Air Force ahead 22-4.

Jackson-Wilson ended the scoreless string with a basket at 6:49 that drew a roar from the crowd. Colorado, which shot 23 percent for the half, managed only seven points the rest of the period, two by Roby, who was 1-for-8 shooting.

Things didn't get much better in the second half for Colorado. The Buffaloes improved their shooting to 42 percent, but fell behind 47-17 after a 3-pointer from Welch and a layup and free throw from Keith Henke.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP) - Richard Roby scored 22 points, and teammate Jermyl Jackson-Wilson made a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift Colorado to a 60-59 victory over Utah Tuesday night.

Kal Bay added 11 points and three 3 pointers for the Buffaloes who won at Utah for the first time in six tries dating back to 1946. It's also the first road win in seven road games for CU since winning at Oklahoma State back on Jan. 21, 2006 in overtime (80-78).

Jackson-Wilson missed his second of two free throws, and the Utes rebounded and called timeout with 1.8 seconds left. But Lawrence Borhas desperation three-pointer missed badly as time expired.

The victory was the first for the Buffaloes (2-2) after back-to-back blowout losses, while the Utes fell to a 0-3 start for the first time since 1970.

Johnnie Bryant scored 20 points for the Utes, including 11 in a row to start the second half, and Luke Nevill added 14 points and 10 rebounds.

But the Utes committed two crucial turnover in the final minute, with the game tied 59-59.

The first came on a bad pass after Utah's Shaun Green drew a charging foul on Roby, and the second came when the Utes lost the ball on a fast break following a blocked shot by Nevill. Borha fouled Jackson-Wilson in the ensuing scramble to set up the winning free throws.

Jackson-Wilson added 10 for the Buffaloes, who forced 17 turnovers and held the Utes to 43.6 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 17 turnovers in the first half, and the Utes made 6-of-22 shots. Neither team led by more than six points.

WILMINGTON, N.C. - Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks.

The Seahawks improved to 2-3 on the season and snapped a three-game losing streak as they made new skipper Benny Moss a winner in his first home game. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 in the new season.

Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break.

He also had eight steals to match the record set by Bob Martin in UNCW's 83-79 loss to Wake Forest when the arena opened on Nov. 26, 1977.

Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

Trailing by five points at halftime, the Seahawks finally caught up with the Buffs with a 7-0 mini-run midway through the second half. A finger roll by CU's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson with 15:48 remaining gave the Buffs a 40-36 lead, but UNCW reeled off seven unanswered points and grabbed a 43-40 edge when Fountain followed up his own shot at 13:09.

After CU sliced the deficit to two points, 49-47, with 6:18 left on a dunk by Jackson-Wilson, the Seahawks went on a 10-2 run. Freshman guard Daryl Felder converted a conventional three-point play on a spin move in the paint to start the rally and a jumper by Dejan Grkovic in the paint at 3:54 pushed the margin to 10 points, 59-49.

The Seahawks, who outrebounded the Buffs by a 37-32 margin, held CU to just six field goals and forced 11 turnovers in the final period.

BOULDER, Colo. - Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed an offensive rebound and scored the game-winning shot for an exciting 88-86 victory at the buzzer lifting Colorado over Northern Colorado.

The victory helps the Buffaloes improve to 3-4, while the Bears fall to 1-7.

Richard Roby and Dominique Coleman each scored game-highs of 21 points, leading three other players in double-figures, Xavier Silas (17 points), Jeremy Williams (12 points) and Kal Bay (10 points). Roby also grabbed 10 rebounds, giving him his first double-double of the year, fifth career.

The Bears had five players in double figures and were led by Sean Taibi's 16 points. Dirk Archibeque recorded his ninth double-double of his career with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

CU finally put some distance between the Bears with a pair of 10-point cushions in the second half, however the resilient Bears chipped away the deficit after CU's Marcus King-Stockton fouled out with 8:27 in the game and KU holding a 72-64 lead.

UNC surged back closing the game 77-73 by a 3-pointer from Archibeque with 3:17 left, then 13 seconds later Archibeque was called for a technical foul (after slamming his hands on the floor) after fouling Roby. Roby subsequently made his two free throws and one from the technical pushing the led to 80-73 with 3:06.

The Bears kept clawing back with four 3-pointers in the last 3:17, none bigger than Will Figures' trey with 30 seconds remaining tying the score at 86-86 setting Jackson-Wilson heroics after CU called a timeout with 24 seconds remaining. CU gained the final possession and it would take two missed jumpers before Jackson-Wilson picked up the offensive rebound and hit the game-winning shot to end the game.

Jackson-Wilson also added seven rebounds, six blocked shots, four assists and three steals.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) - Jason Smith's 15 points and 16 rebounds led the Colorado State Rams past the Colorado Buffaloes, 72-69 for their first win in Boulder in nearly half a century.

The Rams (7-2), who frittered away most of their 16-point second-half lead, won their sixth straight and prevailed on the road against their biggest rival for the first time since Dec. 2, 1957, snapping a 13-game losing streak in Boulder.

Richard Roby's 20 points led the Buffaloes (3-6), marking his fifth 20-point effort of the season. Roby also had four assists, three blocks and a steal.

Smith's three-point play with 1:28 left in the first half ignited the Rams on a 17-3 run spanning halftime to turn a tie game into a 51-37 lead. Colorado State led 55-39 on Smith's dunk with 11:56 left. But the Rams' runaway didn't pan out as the Buffs went to a fullcourt press, chipped away and pulled to 70-65 on Kal Bay's 3-pointer with 50 seconds left.

Roby's basket after a Smith turnover made it a three-point game with 33 seconds left. Tim Denson sank one of two free throws to make it 71-67 and Roby raced downcourt to make it 71-69 with 22 seconds left.

He fouled Denson with 18 seconds left and Denson again hit one of two, giving the Rams a 72-69 lead. Roby was long a 3-pointer that would have tied it with 10 seconds left and the Rams got the ball out of bounds.

This time, they weren't trapped and go the ball upcourt to dribble out their rare win in Boulder.

Cory Lewis added 13 points for the Rams and Stephan Gilling had 12 on 4-of-5 shooting from beyond the arc. Jermyl Jackson-Wilson added 10 points for the Buffs.

The Buffs began the game with a 9-0 run as the Rams turned the ball over four times and missed five shots in the first five minutes before finding their range.
