THE GAMES: The University of Colorado hosts the University of Northern Colorado on Wednesday, Nov. 28, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

BROADCAST: All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN 760 AM, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. Mike Rice, in his second year, will handle play-by-play duties and is joined by Carol Callan of USA Basketball with the color commentary. Live internet audio can be accessed through Yahoo! Sports. BuffsTV, a video subscription service of CU's Official Athletic Website CUBuffs.com, Wednesday's game live.

THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 2-2 overall after placing third in the 21st Annual Coors Classic held on Nov. 23-24 in Boulder. Colorado dropped a first-round game to Siena College, 83-74, before rebounding to defeat Rice University, 72-55, in the consolation round. Clemson University won the 2007 Coors Classic by defeating Siena 77-67 in the championship. The loss to Siena marked just the second time Colorado has lost an opening round Coors Classic game and also just the second time in 34 seasons the Buffaloes have dropped their home opener.

Senior forward **Jackie McFarland** was named to the Coors Classic All-Tournament team for the third straight season as she paced the Buffaloes by averaging 18 points, 11 rebounds and 6.5 assists over the two games. McFarland had 12 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high seven assists in the win against Rice. Just missing out on the school's first-ever triple-double by three assists. She's actually been closer to a triple-double before as she had a school-record tying eight blocked shots to go along with 15 points and 12 rebounds in a 65-50 win over South Dakota State on Dec. 28, 2005. McFarland leads the Buffaloes through four games averaging 16.3 points, 9.3 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** continues to have a solid start to her collegiate career as she ranks second on the team in scoring (14.8 ppg) and rebounding (9.3 rpg). Her scoring numbers and rebounding numbers are also tops among all freshmen in the Big 12 Conference so far this season while she is second in steals (2.3 spg) and assists (2.5 apg).

Sophomore **Aija Putnina** ranks third on the team in scoring (8.5 ppg) and rebounding (7.3 rpg). She had a big game against Rice, answering the call to start for the first time in nearly a year -- Dec. 7, 2006 against Cal State Fullerton to be exact. Putnina responded to the start by notching her third career double-double by recording a career-high 15 points and pulling in 12 rebounds.

Junior guard/forward **Hannah Skildum** had a productive weekend off the bench for the Buffaloes, averaging 9.5 points and 4.0 rebounds at the Coors Classic while hitting 60 percent from the field. She hit all three of her 3-point field goal attempts against Siena and finished with 11 points.

With the three front-line players accounting for just over 24 rebounds a game, and throw in starting guard **Susie Powers'** nearly four rebounds a game, it's no wonder the Buffaloes are enjoying a +7.0 rebound margin through the first four games.

On the offensive end, Colorado is shooting 42 percent on the season, helped by a season-best 47 percent performance in the win over Rice. The Buffaloes drilled 10 3-point field goals against Rice, their most in one game since making 13 against Iowa State on Jan. 10, 2007.

Colorado has made and attempted more 3-pointers through four games than it has in any other season in team history. The Buffaloes are 30-of-97 through four contests (.309). CU's 30 3-pointers just edges by its previous best of 29 through four games set in 2003-04. The Buffaloes' 97 attempts are drastically more than the second-highest output ever of 72, also set in 2003-04.

THE COACH: **Kathy McConnell-Miller** is in her third season as Colorado's head coach. She is 24-40 in her first two seasons with the Buffaloes and has an overall eight-year head coaching record of 115-128.

ABOUT THE BEARS: Northern Colorado is 3-2 overall and coming off a 60-49 win over Southeast Missouri State at the New Mexico State Tournament last weekend. The Bears are led by guard **Whitley Cox** who averages 20.2 points per game and is second on the team with 16 assists. Center **Danielle Hagen** is Northern Colorado's top rebounder with 11.4 per game and averages 8.6 points per contest. Freshman guard/forward **Kate Kevorken** has been a big help off the bench averaging 11.4 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. Like Colorado, UNC has been strong rebounding, pulling down 44 per game and holding a +5.6 margin over its opponents. The Bears are not shy when it comes to shooting from outside, putting up just over 24 3-pointers per game while shooting 32 percent from that range. Kevorken is UNC's top shooter from out-

side hitting 14 3-pointers on the season.

Kathy McConnell-Miller is 1-0 against UNC as a head coach.

The Buffaloes are 45-19 all-time against teams in the current Big Sky Conference, although this will be CU's first meeting with UNC as a member of the nine-team conference.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the 15th meeting between Colorado and Northern Colorado with the Buffaloes holding an 8-6 advantage. This will be just the third meeting where both schools are affiliated with NCAA Division I, with CU winning both those prior meetings, 77-58 on Dec. 29, 2004 and 92-65 on Feb. 13, 2006. The two teams split the previous 12 matchups, most of which came from 1975-79 when both teams were affiliated with the AIAW and the Intermountain Conference.

CAPTAINS NAMED: Seniors **Jackie McFarland** and **Susie Powers** and junior **Caley Dow** will serve as team captains for the 2007-08 season. McFarland is a captain for a third straight season, Powers is in her second year as captain and Dow is a captain for the first time. CU team captains are voted on by players prior to the first regular season contest each year.

PITERNIECE OUT, BUT PROGRESSING: Junior forward **Dina Piteriece** who continues to recover from a broken toe suffered during practice on Oct. 19, has resumed limited drills in practice, but a time table on her return is still to be determined. Piteriece, who has missed the first four game, is expected to make a significant contribution to the CU lineup this season after a two-year career at Odessa where her teams went 66-3, winning the 2007

junior college national championship and a second place finish in 2006.

McFARLAND PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12; BUFFS PICKED 11TH: Senior forward **Jackie McFarland** has been named to the 2007-08 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball team by a vote of league coaches.

McFarland is CU's second preseason All-Big 12 honoree as former Buffaloes standout Erin Scholz was named to the 1996-97 squad. She joins Nebraska forward Kelsey Griffin, Oklahoma center Courtney Paris and Texas A&M guards A'Quonesia Franklin and Takia Starks on the five-member preseason team. All five players were first team All-Big 12 picks last winter.

A native of Derby, Kan., McFarland topped the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation in field-goal accuracy in 2006-07 at 61 percent. She was second in the Big 12 in scoring (17.8 ppg) and rebounding (10.8 rpg) and led the league in minutes at 36.4 per game.

McFarland, a 2007 *Associated Press* honorable mention All-American, is one of just five players in Colorado history with career numbers totaling 1,300 points and 700 rebounds and just one of three players to record back-to-back 500 point seasons. She is already in Colorado's career Top 10 for rebounding (fourth at 770), free throws made (sixth at 383) and blocked shots (sixth at 100) and is on pace to enter the Top 5 in all three categories as well as scoring and field goals made.

She was one of just two players in the Big 12 with 18 or more double-doubles in 2006-07 and missed five additional double-double opportunities by either a single point or rebound. Her 18 double-doubles were equal to or more than 10 of the 12 conference teams. McFarland's 37 career double-doubles are tied with Scholz (1993-97) for second on CU's all-time list.

Her 325 rebounds were a school-record for a junior and the fifth best single-season total in team history. McFarland's 10.8 rebounding average was the school's third best single-season mark while her 17.8 scoring average listed as sixth.

Despite returning eight players from a team that finished tied for seventh last season, the Buffaloes were picked to finish 11th in the Big 12 in 2007-08 in annual preseason coaches poll.

Defending co-champion Texas A&M was picked to win the 2008 title with seven first place votes and 117 points overall, just edging out the league's other co-champion, Oklahoma who had the other five first place votes and 115 points. The Big South held down the top five spots in the poll as Baylor was third with 97 points followed by Texas (86) and Oklahoma State (66). Iowa State was the top North school (64) followed by Nebraska (56), Kansas State and Texas Tech (54 each), Kansas (43), Colorado (29) and Missouri (11).

MORE NUMBERS FOR McFARLAND: Jackie McFarland had double-doubles in each of her Coors Classic games to move into sole possession of second place on CU's all-time list with 39. Her 40 career double-digit rebounding games are third on the CU career charts.

McFarland is the fourth player in Colorado history with 800 career rebounds, and now stands at 807. McFarland now has 1,385 points in 91 career games (15.2 ppg) and is just two points away from breaking into the top 10 and just 15 away from becoming the ninth player in school history with 1,400 points. McFarland needs just two free throws to become the fifth player to reach 400.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Colorado once again faces a tough schedule with no less than 16 games against 2007 NCAA or WNIT tournament teams. The Buffaloes will travel to perennial NCAA women's powers Southern California and Vanderbilt during the non-conference season as well as region rival Colorado State. Colorado will host 2007 WNIT Champion Wyoming and will also see Rice, Clemson and Pepperdine at the Coors Events Center. Texas A&M, Oklahoma State and Texas come to Boulder this year out of the Big 12 South along with the Buffs' usual Big 12 North opponents.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 308-93 all-time record at the Coors Events/Conference Center (.768). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at

the CECC in 19 of the previous 29 years including, 2007-08 when the Buffaloes went 11-5 at home with four of the five losses coming to ranked teams. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CECC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's schedule features 10 games that will be televised either regionally or nationally, nine of which will be carried by Fox Sports Net. Two games are part of the Big 12's national package with FSN: Sunday, Jan. 13 against Iowa State at home and Saturday, Jan. 26, at Texas Tech. FSN Rocky Mountain will televise six CU home games beginning with Wyoming on Dec. 5. FSN Midwest will televise CU's game at Kansas State on Jan. 19, which could potentially be picked up by FSN Rocky Mountain as well. CU's game at Colorado State on Dec. 1 will be televised by The Mtn. Network.

UP NEXT: Colorado will head north to face Colorado State University on Saturday, Dec. 1, at 2:30 p.m. at Moby Arena in Fort Collins. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

Kathy McConnell-Miller
Head Coach
Third Season

When **Kathy McConnell-Miller** took over the University of Colorado program just over two years ago, there's no question the Buffaloes were rebuilding and the team was a work in progress.

In two seasons at Colorado, progress is certainly a valid term for McConnell-Miller's Buffaloes.

McConnell-Miller, 40, sports a 22-38 record in her two seasons at Colorado and is 113-126 overall in eight seasons as an NCAA Division I head coach.

She led Colorado to a 13-17 mark in 2006-07, the team's best record since the 2003-04 Buffaloes went 22-8 and advanced to the program's last NCAA Tournament. Colorado also enjoyed its best Big 12 Conference showing in three years, tying Texas and Texas Tech for seventh in the league standings at 6-10. The Buffaloes' six conference wins in 2006-07 were more than the previous two years combined (3-13 in 2005-06 and 2-14 in 2004-05).

McConnell-Miller, who officially became the sixth head coach in the history of CU women's basketball on April 27, 2005, has overseen the development of Jackie McFarland, who has emerged as one of the top players in the Big 12. McFarland has earned All-Big 12 honors in both her seasons under McConnell-Miller including first team acclaim this past season. All-league selections are nothing new to McConnell-Miller as she has had at least one first or second team all-conference performer in each of her eight seasons as a collegiate head coach.

The Buffaloes have also had academic success in the McConnell-Miller era. In her two seasons, McConnell-Miller has coached seven Academic All-Big 12 Women's Basketball team members and has helped guide McFarland two a pair of Academic All-America second team honors.

She has done well with the players inherited from legendary CU head coach Ceal Barry, but she has also excelled in bringing in her own players.

McConnell-Miller, who from day one has established a family type atmosphere in the lockerroom and a fighting spirit in her players, and her staff have landed back-to-back Top 40 recruiting classes, including the No. 29 class in 2006 according to the All-Star Girls Report. What was remarkable about the class of 2006 is McConnell-Miller and her staff didn't even have the chance to start on the recruiting trail until April when they arrived in Boulder. Despite that late start, McConnell-Miller and her staff managed to sign five top 150 players, including Whitney Houston and Aija Putnina who made significant contributions as first-year players.

Before arriving at CU, McConnell-Miller spent six seasons as head coach at the University of Tulsa where she constructed an impressive turnaround of the Golden Hurricane program. Before her arrival in 1999-2000, Tulsa had just one winning season in its 14-year history, an overall record of 81-250 (.324), and was actually dropped as a varsity sport for nine years following the 1986-87 campaign. In her six seasons at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller recorded a program-best 91 wins (15.2 wins per year), winning seasons in three of the last four years and two postseason appearances.

She left as Tulsa's all-time leader for coaching victories with a record of 91-88 and owns the longest tenure in school history by a women's basketball coach. McConnell-Miller, who earned WAC Coach of the Year honors in her rookie season as a collegiate head coach in 1999-00, led Tulsa to 14 or more wins in five of her six campaigns.

Under the direction of McConnell-Miller, Tulsa placed at least one player on either the All-WAC first or second team, each of her six seasons. McConnell-Miller also had the Golden Hurricane excelling in the classroom sporting four *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District first and second team performers. Tulsa players also earned 23 All-WAC Academic Team honors. One of McConnell-Miller's prize players was Allison Curtin who was an

Associated Press honorable mention All-American for the Golden Hurricane and was drafted by the Houston Comets in the first round of the 2003 WNBA Draft.

Prior to her appointment at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller spent four seasons on Theresa Greutz's staff at the University of Illinois (1995-99). She was an assistant coach for her first three years before being promoted to associate head coach for her final season. The Fighting Illini posted an overall record of 76-45 and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments with McConnell-Miller on the bench. Illinois won the Big Ten Conference Championship in 1997 and twice advanced to the Sweet 16. While at Illinois, McConnell-Miller was vital in the signing of a pair of recruiting classes that ranked among the top five in the nation.

McConnell-Miller coached with Greutz for a total of six years as she went with Greutz to Illinois from Rutgers University in 1995. McConnell-Miller was a Rutgers assistant for two seasons (1993-95), helping the Lady Knights post a pair of winning campaigns, the 1994 Atlantic 10 Championship and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Her recruiting expertise was well documented at Rutgers as her last class was rated as the 14th-best nationally, giving McConnell-Miller back-to-back Top 15 classes.

Her first collegiate assistant coaching job came at her hometown school, the University of Pittsburgh. She joined the Panthers in 1991 and served as the recruiting coordinator. She was also an assistant coach for the 1993 Big East All-Star Team which played in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

She is a member of the Western Pennsylvania Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, and was inducted into the Seton LaSalle High School Hall of Fame in October of 2006.

McConnell-Miller enjoyed a four-year playing career at guard for the University of Virginia (1986-90). She played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight. McConnell-Miller earned her bachelor's degree in rhetoric and communications from Virginia in 1989.

One of eight children, she is one of six McConnell siblings who attended college on a basketball scholarship.

Three McConnell's are presently in the coaching ranks, two at the college level and one at the high school level. Her older sister, Suzie McConnell Serio was the head coach of the Minnesota Lynx of the WNBA for three seasons (2003-06).

Born on Sept. 24, 1967, McConnell-Miller and her husband, Brad Miller, have three children: Brice (7), Mackenzie (5) and Macie (3).

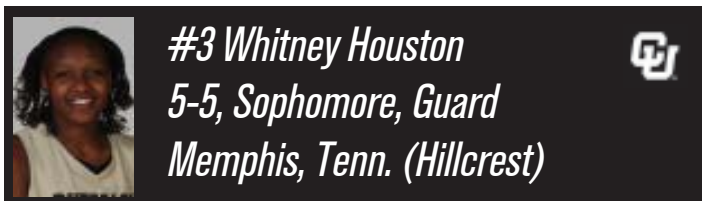

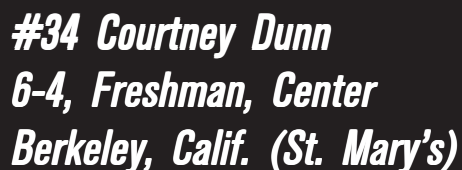

This Season:

- Named to the Coors Classic All-Tournament team for the third straight season as she paced the Buffaloes by averaging 18 points, 11 rebounds and 6.5 assists over the two games...Notched a career-high seven assists against Rice.
- Ranks 1st in minutes, 3rd in rebounding, 4th in scoring, 7th in free-throw percentage and 9th in assists on the Big 12 charts.
- A 2007 preseason All-Big 12 first team selection and named one of the top 5 power forwards in the nation by ESPN.com.

Career:

- 2007 *Associated Press* honorable mention All-American and All-Big 12.
- Member of the 2007 U.S. Jones Cup Team that won a bronze medal in Taipei, Taiwan this summer. Led Team USA in field-goal percentage during the six-game event at 57.1 percent (20-35).
- Two-time *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America second team selection.
- Ranked third in the NCAA and topped the Big 12 in field-goal percentage in 2006-07. Ranked second in the Big 12 in scoring, rebounding and double-doubles as a junior.

BOULDER — Senior **Jackie McFarland** and sophomore **Aija Putnina** each tallied double-doubles as Colorado defeated Rice, 72-55, in the consolation game of the 21st Annual Coors Class Saturday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Clemson won the Coors Classic with a 77-67 win over Siena in the championship game.

Putnina, making her first start since a game at Cal State Fullerton on Dec. 7, 2006, led the Buffaloes with a career-high 15 points to go along with 12 rebounds. It's her third career double-double, all three of which have come when she's in the starting lineup. Putnina also added three steals and two blocked shots.

She has a way to go to catch McFarland's numbers, as the All-Big 12 forward registered career double-double No. 39 and her second-straight as she earned All-Tournament honors for the third time. McFarland had 12 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high seven assists. She's actually been closer to a triple-double has she had a school-record eight blocks to go along with a traditional points-rebound double-double in 2005 against South Dakota State.

Colorado shot an overall season-high 47 percent from the field and spread the wealth around as four players scored in double-digits and two others had seven or more. Senior **Susie Powers**, held scoreless for the first three games of the season, had 11 while freshman **Brittany Spears** had 10 points to go with seven rebounds and six assists.

Junior **Hannah Skildum** had eight points and four rebounds off the bench and **Kara Richards** pitched in seven on a perfect 3-of-3 from the field.

"Last night our look was a result of our shots not going down, and we were also struggling on the defensive end," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "But they were excited about this game and the tournament, and they went into this game with good energy. We knew that things were going to change and I thought they responded well from a very tough loss last night."

Colorado found itself down 13-4 right out of the gate. The Buffaloes, which shot just under 40 percent last night against Siena, made just 2-of-10 to start the game.

Colorado finally found its rhythm by embarking on a 13-0 run capped off by back-to-back 3-point field goals by McFarland and Spears to take a 17-13 lead with 9:18.

The good fortunes continued for the Buffaloes after their initial struggle. Colorado made 11-of-16 to close the half (69 percent) and at one point outscored the Owls 21-2 and led by as many 10 in the first 20 minutes.

Colorado pulled away quickly, beginning the second half on an 8-2 run to take a 47-33 lead and never let the advantage dip below 11.

Rice was led by guard Kadie Riverin who had 14 points, four rebounds and three assists en route to All-Tournament team honors.
