FOR STARTERS: Colorado has won three straight games for the first time since 2005-06 when they won five straight • For the first time since the 1998-99 season, CU has won back-to-back road games (at Denver, at Air Force) • The Buffaloes win at Air Force on Thursday ended the Falcons' 38-game home winning streak against non-conference foes • CU is 5-0 this season when leading at the half • CU's starting five has outscored the opponent's starting five every game except one (Wis.) and holds a 50.0-to-36.6 advantage among its starting five • Senior Marcus King-Stockton did not play at Air Force, marking the first time he did not play in a game since his freshman season (Mar. 2 at Nebraska), a string of 66 consecutive games • Marcus Hall, Cory Higgins, Richard Roby have started every game • CU boasts three players averaging over 10 ppg.: Roby (14.6 ppg.), Hall (13.6 ppg.), Xavier Silas (10.5 ppg.) • Hall and Roby have led CU in scoring three times each, Xavier Silas, once.

BIG 12/PAC-10 HARDWOOD SERIES: Colorado hosts Stanford part of the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series that begins in the 2007-08 season. The two conferences have agreed to play a four-year men's basketball series of 12 annual games between the two leagues that runs through 2010. The 2008 series will be return games of the match ups from 2007. All 12 contests in 2007 will be televised nationally by either FSN or the ESPN family of networks.



ABOUT STANFORD: The Cardinal enters today's matinee having won seven of eight games (six wins came at home), while averaging 80.2 points per game. Stanford also averages 41.5 rebounds per game and 8.5 3-pointers • Common opponent is Colorado State, the Cardinal took a 73-53 home win back on Nov. 24 • Today is Stanford's last game until hosting Santa Clara, Dec. 19 (17 days) • 10 of 14 players are 6'5" or taller • Stanford is 7-0 when leading at half, 0-1 when trailing.

CU vs. THE CARDINAL: CU is 3-5 all-time against Stanford having last played in 1991. The Buffs last matched up against a Pac-10 school during the 2004-05 season falling at Oregon State, Dec. 4 (98-87). CU is 39-38 (.506) vs. the Pac-10.

ONE-TWO PUNCH: In their last four games, seniors Richard Roby and Marcus Hall are CU's go-to guys. Since scoring 20 points at Wisconsin, Roby is averaging 18.5 ppg., 5.8 rpg., 28-of-49 (.571) from the field and 12-of-15 (.800) from the free throw line. Hall, on the other hand in three games: 19.0 ppg., 3.3 rpg./spg., 18-of-33 (.546) from the field, 13-of-16 (.813) from the charity stripe and 38 minutes a game.

MARATHON MAN: Marcus Hall became the first CU player to play all 40 minutes in a game since Michel Morandais logged 41 minutes March 17, 2004 at Oregon in an overtime loss in the NIT. Hall played the entire game at Air Force.

TWO MINUTES TO PLAY: As a team, Colorado is shooting 26-of-32 from the free throw line with under two minutes to play in the game, that's an .813 percentage. Marcus Hall is the coolest of them all, making a perfect 14-of-14 in that stretch.

ROBY WATCH: Senior guard Richard Roby has scored 102 points leading the team in scoring at 12.8 ppg. With 1,558 career points, Roby is nine points away from sixth place all-time and passing Randy Downs (1566 pts., 112 games, 1982-85).

FOUR STRAIGHT? - Richard Roby will be looking to become only the third player in school history to lead the team in scoring four consecutive seasons. From 2004-05 (16.0 ppg.), 2005-06 (17.0) through last year (17.3), Roby has made it three straight. Here are the others:

.500 CLUB: Five players are shooting 50.0 percent or better this season. Impressively, Richard Roby leads the team at a .535 clip (w/ over 70 shots taken. The others are Dwight Thorne II (.556), Levi Knutson (.548), Jermyl Jackson-Wilson (.517) and Caleb Patterson (.500).

PLAYING THE MWC: Last season, CU played five schools from the Mountain West Conference achieving a 1-4 record. This season, the new coaching staff inherits four opponents from that conference. After falling to New Mexico in the season opener, 54-47, the Buffs CU evened their record defeating Air Force, 60-50. Dates with

Wyoming (Dec. 8) and Colorado State (Dec. 22) loom.

BUFF BITS: Against DU, the Buffs reached team highs in rebounding (35), offensive rebounds (13) and steals (11) • DU's 44 points were the fewest allowed by a CU team since a 71-44 win over Tennessee State on Dec. 19, 2003 • CU has led at halftime in five games this season – all wins • CU's four offensive rebounds tied a team low since grabbing only four at Texas Tech last season (Feb. 17).

NEW PIECES TO THE PUZZLE: CU's freshmen are growing up fast in their initial season in Boulder. Levi Knutson (7.1 rpg., 8 3-pointers) and Cory Higgins (6.3 ppg., 3.1 rpg., 29.4 mins., seven starts) are helping the Buffaloes to five wins already this season (last year CU only won seven games).

EASY POINTS: For the first time in 12 years, CU is shooting their highest percentage from the charity stripe (.729). Granted it's only seven games into the season, however, CU is ahead of the pace since 1996. Marcus Hall is a prime example making all six if his attempts in the final 1:12 against DU; Xavier Silas and Cory Higgins each chipped-in with a pair each. Overall, CU pulled away in the second half making 12-of 14 (.857) from the free throw line. With under a minute to play at Air Force, CU players made 5-of-6 from the free throw line.

THORNE STEPPING UP: After Coach Bzdelik did not play Dwight Thorne at Wisconsin, Thorne responded against Colorado Christian with a career game: a career-high 13 points (5-of-5 FGs). He also made a 3-pointer, had six defensive rebounds, five assists, two steals and one blocked shot in 28 minutes.

OPENING TIPS: CU plays seven schools (Florida A&M, Kansas, Stanford, Texas, Texas A&M, Texas Tech, Wisconsin) that earned NCAA Tournament berths a year ago including three schools that made the NIT (Air Force, Kansas State, Oklahoma State).

- First-year head coaches in the Big 12 (Kansas State, Texas A&M).

- First-year head coaches in non-conference (Air Force, Colorado State, Denver, Florida A&M, New Mexico, New Orleans, Wyoming).

- CU opens the conference season for the second straight year on the road; it's the fifth time the Buffs open on the road since the inception of the Big 12, all against South schools (Baylor, 2000-01; Oklahoma, 2002-03 and 2004-05; Texas, 2005-06)

- For the first time since the 1997-98 season, CU closes the Big 12 regular season on the road with a pair of road games, also a first since 1997-98.

SUN TAN LOTION: For the next two seasons the Buffaloes will making multiple trips to the Hawaiian Islands. Next season, CU will be making first-ever trip to the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu. In 2009-10, CU will play in the Maui Invitational. Hosted by Division II college Chaminade, and sponsored by EA Sports, the Buffaloes will be one of eight schools participating in the 26th edition of the tournament. Joining CU two years from now will be Arizona, Gonzaga, Louisville, Maryland, Vanderbilt, and Wisconsin.

KNUTSON FOR 3: Freshman guard Levi Knutson is making the most of his freshman season connecting on a trio of 3-pointers in the win over Savannah State. Knutson, last year's 2007 Mr. Basketball and Player of the Year of the state of Colorado went 3-of-5 in each of first three games, and is averaging 7.1 ppg. His eight treys rank third on the team.

X-FACTOR: Sophomore guard Xavier Silas scored a career-high 24 points in CU's 83-59 victory over Florida A&M at the Kohl Center. Silas' previous best was 23 points at Baylor (Jan. 30). He also had a career-best five assists and a season-high 8-of-11 (.727) from the field. It was Silas' second career 20+ scoring game.

LONG TIME COMING: CU's win over Florida A&M was their first neutral court regular season victory outside the state of Colorado since Dec. 29, 2002 (Charlotte, N.C.). Excluding the Big 12 Tournament, CU last won a road game Nov. 21, 2006 (at Utah, 60-59).

3 GAMES in 3 DAYS: Playing three straight games was a school-first since playing three in a

row from March 9-11, 1990 at the Big 12 Tournament. Eighth-seeded CU won its first two games (upset wins) over Missouri and Oklahoma State to reach the Big Eight final against Oklahoma becoming the first eight seed to reach the final. CU lost to the Sooners, 92-80 as Shaun Vandiver (scored 75 pts. in three games) becoming the third tournament MVP on a losing team.

ROSTER CHANGES: In the 2007-08 media guide, senior guard Richard Roby and freshman guard Cory Higgins are listed as #23 and #20, respectively. Both of those numbers are retired (#20 Cliff Meely, 1968-71; #22 by Burdette Halderson, 1952-55). Roby now wears #23 (the # worn his freshman, soph., junior seasons), Higgins has selected #11.

FALL 2007 INELIGIBLE: Sophomore forward Jeremy Williams will be academically ineligible for the fall semester. Williams averaged 7.7 points and 4.6 rpg. last season for the Buffs with 18 starts. Williams may return to the line up the first week in January when CU wraps up the non-conference schedule (Jan. 4 SMU; Jan. 7 Tulsa).

MEDIA GUIDE CORRECTION: On page 59 of the 2007-08 CU media guide it states that Cory Higgins' father, Rod is the general manager of the Golden State Warriors. In fact, he's the GM with the Charlotte Bobcats.

NO NAME JERSEYS: For the first time in many years the 2007-08 Buffaloes will not have their last name on the back of their uniforms. It was an idea always discussed in recent years, but never followed through until head coach Jeff

Bzdelik decided that the name on the front is more important than the one on the back.

SENIOR ENCORE: Senior guard Marcus Hall returns to the Buffaloes after sitting out the 2006-07 season with academic issues. Hall joins fellow seniors Richard Roby and Marcus King-Stockton for their final year in Boulder. Hall, a Houston, Texas native averaged 8.7 points, 4.1 assists and 2.6 rebounds per game during his junior year in 2005-06. Hall is among the school's all-time leaders in assists, ranking ninth with 318 (3.4 avg.).

NOT THE NEW GUY: When he was hired back on April 5, Coach Bzdelik at the time was the newest coach in the Big 12. Then K-State and Texas A&M suddenly needed to hire a head coach. Here's a look at the most tenured head coaches to the newest.

REDSHIRT SEASON: Of the 15 players on the 2007-08 roster, two of them are ineligible to suit up for the Buffaloes after transferring from other schools. Casey Crawford (6-9, Forward, 230) from Overland Park, Kan. (Blue Valley North HS/Wake Forest); the other is Kyle Wright (6-5, Guard, 195) from Hartford, Conn. (Brewster Academy [Wolfeboro, N.H.]/Stony Brook). Both are redshirt sophomores with three years of eligibility remaining.

HONORBALE MENTION: Richard Roby was selected as an honorable mention in pre-season voting for the first/second Big 12 teams. Roby was a first-team selection in 2005-06.

NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENTS: Head coach Jeff Bzdelik announced the signing of five student-athletes for the 2008-09 season during the NCAA early signing period. They are **Javonte Clanton, Austin Dufault, Trey Eckloff, Nate Tomlinson** and **Toby Veal**.

"I couldn't be more pleased with the signing of these five young men," Bzdelik said. "All of them will have a major impact on the future of Colorado Basketball. This is a class filled with quality and depth."

Clanton, a 6-foot, 185-pound guard from Reynoldsburg, Ohio will be a junior-transfer from Blinn Community College (Brenham, Texas). Clanton was one of five candidates for the 20th annual Mr. Ohio Basketball as a senior at Reynoldsburg High School where he averaged 23.1 points and 6.0 assists per game as a senior.

"Javonte brings experience, toughness, and a high skill level to blend in well within the Colorado system," Bzdelik said of the former (AP) Ohio Central District Player of the Year.

Dufault, a 6-8, 210-pound, power forward from Killdeer, N.D. averaged 20 points and eight rebounds per game leading Killdeer High School to 19 wins as a junior. He is rated as a three-star athlete at ScoutHoops.com (33rd overall, power forward).

"Son of a coach, Austin brings a high school basketball IQ and a great shooting touch from long range," Bzdelik said. "His skill and 3.9 grade point average are a perfect fit for the University of Colorado."

Eckloff, a 6-9, 220-pound forward is from Englewood, Colo. Eckloff is three-star prospect by ScoutHoops.com as the 22nd rated center. He averaged eight points, six rebounds, and more than a block shot per game as a junior for Cherry Creek High School.

"Trey is a versatile, young big man who can pass, dribble, and shoot from long range," Bzdelik said. "Trey is also a perfect fit for the Colorado system, and he also excels in the classroom with a 3.9 GPA."

Tomlinson, a 6-2, 180-pound point-guard is from Lee Academy (Maine). The native Australian was a member of Australia's 19-and-under national team this past summer, and is three-star prospect by Rivals.com and Scout.com.

"Nate combines a high basketball IQ with great shooting and passing skills," Bzdelik said. "Both of his parents have a rich basketball background in Australia."

Veal is a 6-7, 210-pound power forward from Savannah, Ga., averaged 19 points and 12 rebounds as a junior at Johnson High School. Another three-star prospect by ScoutHoops.com, he is rated 86th of the top-100 Hoop Scoop prospects and the 32nd power forward overall.

"An explosive athletic rebounder and finisher around the rim," Bzdelik said. "Toby has the potential to be one of the premier rebounders and defenders in the Big 12."

HEAD COACH JEFF BZDELIK

1st Season at Colorado/5th College Season Overall

Jeff Bzdelik, a man synonymous with success on both the professional and college levels in the state of Colorado, was named the 17th men's basketball head coach for the University of Colorado men's basketball program, athletic director Mike Bohn announced April 4, 2007.

Bzdelik (buzz-DEL-ik), 54, comes to Colorado from the United States Air Force Academy, where he guided the Falcons to a 50-16 record (a 75.8 winning percentage) in two seasons from 2005-07. During those two seasons he led the Falcons to a 2005-06 NCAA Tournament and a 2006-07 NIT Final Four appearance.

Bzdelik brings 29 years of coaching experience to the Boulder campus from the collegiate to the professional ranks. He returned to the college game in 2005-06 after 15 seasons as both a coach and scout in the NBA, including two-and-a-half seasons as head coach of the Denver Nuggets.

His two-year win total of 50 victories at the Academy was a school-best in any two-year span of the 51-year history of Air Force basketball, while his 26 victories in 2006-07 was also a school high. He's the only coach to have won at least 24 games in back-to-back seasons. Bzdelik guided the Falcons to a 31-1 home record, including a 15-0 mark in 2005-06 and 16-1 in 2006-07.

In 2005-06, Bzdelik led the Falcons to a 24-7 record and the school's fourth appearance ever in the NCAA Tournament. He also led the Falcons to a 12-4 record and second place finish in the Mountain West Conference. Air Force also capped the season leading the nation for the fourth consecutive season in scoring defense.

Prior to returning to the college ranks with the Air Force Academy, Bzdelik was the Denver Nuggets head coach for two-and-a-half seasons (2002-2005). He was named head coach in August of 2002 after spending one year as a scout for the Nuggets. Bzdelik engineered one of the biggest turnarounds in NBA history during his second season in 2003-04, leading the Nuggets to the playoffs for the first time since 1994-95 while posting a 43-39 record. The 26-game improvement over the previous year was the sixth-best in NBA history.

Bzdelik also became the first coach in league history (since the adoption of an 82-game sched-

ule) to guide a team to the playoffs the year after winning less than 20 games. In his first season, Bzdelik earned NBA-wide praise for Denver's competitiveness, work ethic and never-give-up attitude. Despite having the youngest team in franchise history, Bzdelik's team shattered the franchise record for scoring defense by more than five points per game, giving up only 92.4 per outing. In addition, the Nuggets led the league in turnovers forced (17.1 per game) and had six of the top 12 marks for single-season scoring defense.

Surprisingly to many, he was let go by the Nuggets after just 28 games into the 2004-05 season, with the team off to a 13-15 start. But that decision would eventually become Air Force's and now Colorado's gain.

From 1995-2001, Bzdelik was an assistant coach under Pat Riley in Miami, holding the title of Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting during the final two years. With the Heat, he was responsible for the preparation of all game plans, video coordination and statistical data as well as player development.

In 2000, he was recognized by USA Today as one of the NBA's top five assistant coaches. In the 1998 Pro Basketball issue of Sports Illustrated, he was voted as the NBA's best advance scout by league general managers.

Prior to his tenure with the Heat, Bzdelik spent the 1994-95 season as the lead scout for Riley and the New York Knicks. He also served as an assistant coach with the Washington Bullets from 1988-94 and was Wes Unseld's first assistant in 1993-94. In addition, he coached the Bullets summer league team in 1988 and 1994.

The Illinois native began his coaching career in 1978 at Davidson (N.C.) College. In 1980, he was named an assistant coach at Northwestern University where he spent six seasons and was instrumental in the Wildcats' first NIT appearance in school history.

He then accepted his first head coaching position at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County, one he would handle for two years before moving on to the NBA.

During the 1986-87 season at UMBC, his squad was cited by The Sporting News as having "One of College's Biggest Turnarounds," in the school's inaugural season in Division I. After going just 11-44 the previous two seasons as a Divi-

sion II program before Bzdelik's arrival, UMBC went 12-16 in his first year and 13-15 in 1987-88 in Division I. His teams excelled in the classroom as well, posting a 2.86 grade point average during his tenure.

Bzdelik is a 1976 graduate of the University of Illinois-Chicago, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned four varsity letters in basketball at UIC and was named team MVP as a senior in 1975-76. He still holds the school record for the best free-throw percentage in one season, shooting 88.1 percent (59-for-67) from the line in 1975-76 and still ranks among UIC's all-time leading scorers.

Bzdelik also spent six years in the Army National Guard during the early to mid 1970s.

He was born December 1, 1952 and graduated from Prospect High School in Mount Prospect, Ill. He is married to the former Nina Bernardzik, who was a standout volleyball player at UIC between 1974-76 and is a member of the Flames' Athletic Hall of Fame. They are the parents of two children, Brett (18) and Courtney (16).

Lobos Hold On, Defeat Buffs, 54-57

BOULDER, Colo. (AP/CU Sports Info.) - J.R. Giddens 18-foot jumper in the corner with 33 seconds remaining helped New Mexico to a 54-47 victory over Colorado, Friday evening at the Coors Events Conference Center.

After Marcus Hall converted a driving layup with 1:04 remaining in the game, cutting the Lobos deficit to 50-47, the UNM countered with Giddens' jump shot as the visitors won their first season-opening road game since the 1979-1980 season.

Buffaloes senior guard Richard Roby, who averaged 17.3 points last season, was nearly shut out for the first time in his career. His only point came on a free throw with 1:16 remaining that pulled Colorado to 50-45.

The Buffs trailed by double digits most of the game but began its run on Xavier Silas' 3-pointer with 2:20 remaining that cut the Lobos' lead to 49-43.

Bzdelik, a former coach of the Denver Nuggets and the Air Force Academy, bolted for Boulder after leading the Falcons to a 50-16 mark in two seasons, including a trip to the NIT Final Four last season. He replaced Ricardo Patton, who was let go after 11 years and a 7-20 season.

It was the largest attended regular season opening game in 26 years of the Coors Events Center.

The Lobos, who beat the Buffs 106-65 last season in Albuquerque, jumped out to an early lead and took a 30-19 cushion into the locker room after closing the first half on a 9-2 run that featured a 3-pointer and two free throws by Wills.

Roby, who ranks seventh on Colorado's all-time scoring list, was one of two Buffaloes starters shut out in the first half. The other was Hall, who redshirted last season and underwent minor thumb surgery last month.

Hall scored all of Colorado's nine points over the first 10:18 of the second half, but his teammates went cold and New Mexico maintained a double-digit lead. Hall then committed charges on back-to-back possessions, one of them wiping off a basket for the Buffs.

Freshman Cory Higgins added 10 points, five rebounds and three steals for Colorado.

Bufs Rattle Florida A&M, 83-59

MADISON, Wis. (AP/CU Sports Info.) - Xavier Silas scored 24 points to lead Colorado to an 83-59 victory over Florida A&M, Thursday in the opening game of the America's Youth Classic.

The sophomore guard was 8-of-11 from the floor and scored 18 points in the first half as the Buffaloes (1-1) opened up a huge lead early and were never seriously threatened. Silas also had a career-best five assists.

Silas' jumper with 10:28 left in the first half gave Colorado a 25-7 lead.

The Rattlers (1-1), the defending Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference tournament champions, could get no closer than eight points the rest of the way.

Jermyl Jackson-Wilson scored 11 points, while Cory Higgins, Richard Roby and Levi Knutson each added 10 for the Buffaloes.

Marcus Hall added nine points, four rebounds and his four assists, bring his career total to 303. He also collected three steals.

Akini Akini paced Florida A&M with 21 points. The 6-foot-10 senior forward scored eight points during a 20-10 Rattler spurt that cut Colorado's lead to 35-27 just before halftime.

The Buffaloes used an 8-0 run early in the second half to stretch their advantage to 50-33, and the lead remained in double digits.

CU's victory tonight is the first win on a neutral court outside the state of Colorado in the regular season since Dec. 29, 2002 against the University of Loyola-Chicago at the Pepsi Classic (Charlotte, N.C.).

It was the first-ever meeting between the two schools, who are both breaking in new coaches: Eugene Harris at Florida A&M, and former Denver Nuggets head coach Jeff Bzdelik at Colorado.

Badgers Strong At Home, Defeat CU

MADISON, Wis. (AP) - Trevor Hughes scored 18 points as Wisconsin beat Colorado 78-52 in the final game of the America's Youth Classic Saturday night.

The Badgers (4-0) limited backdoor cuts by the up-tempo version of the Princeton-style offense being installed by first-year Buffaloes coach Jeff Bzdelik.

They built an early lead on hot 3-point shooting by Hughes, a sophomore guard who led the Badgers in scoring in three of their first four games of the season. Brian Butch scored 17 points for Wisconsin, and Michael Flowers added 12.

Richard Roby scored 20 to lead Colorado (2-2), while Xavier Silas added 13. Roby was also named to the America's Youth Classic all-tournament team, averaging 15.7 points and 4.7 rebounds per game.

Hughes opened the game with an early 3-pointer from beyond NBA range, and was 3-for-6 from outside the arc in the first half. The Badgers built a double-digit lead in the first six minutes of the game and never were in danger of giving it up.

A 3-pointer by Colorado's Marcus Hall (eight points) cut the Wisconsin lead to 27-16 with 7:33 left in the first half. But the Badgers went on a 12-2 run that included two scores from freshman forward Jon Leuer to take a 39-18 lead with 3:24 left in the half.

Wisconsin was ahead 44-27 at halftime, shooting 56 percent from the floor and hitting 6-of-13 from 3-point range.

Overall, Colorado shot 49% from the field, making 20-of-41 field goals, including 6-of-14 from the three-point line.

Wisconsin was careful on offense, turning the ball over only nine times. Colorado had 19 turnovers.

Colorado went into the locker room with what the team thought was a 26-19 lead, but Hall's shot at the buzzer was eventually waved off after officials took a second look on the video monitor.
