Lincoln, Neb. — Quarterback Joe Dailey produced six touchdowns to tie the Nebraska single-game record to lead the Huskers to a 56-17 win over Western Illinois in Coach Bill Callahan's debut. In NU's NCAA record 263rd consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium, Dailey completed 15-of-30 passes for 218 yards and four touchdowns in his first start to drive NU to its 19th straight season-opening victory. Dailey also rushed four times for 28 yards and two more scores. Dailey directed the Huskers to 581 yards of total offense, including 363 rushing yards. Two NU players surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark for the game. Cory Ross totaled 125 yards on 13 carries for the fourth 100-yard rushing game of his career. Tierre Green rushed seven times for 112 yards and two scores in his career game. Tight end Matt Herian hauled in seven receptions for 98 yards and two touchdowns, while wide receiver Willie Amos added the first two catches of his career for 54 yards and two touchdowns.

Lincoln, Neb. — Southern Miss scored 18 points off four Nebraska turnovers to pick up a 21-17 victory and hand Nebraska its first non-conference home loss since 1991. The Golden Eagles got things going quickly with an interception on each of Nebraska's first two possessions, turning the picks into six points on a pair of field goals. Husker quarterback Joe Dailey settled down after the first quarter as he led NU on three scoring drives in the next 30 minutes. Sandro DeAngelis hit his first field goal of the season to pull the Huskers within six, 9-3, at the intermission and Dailey added a pair of touchdown passes in the third quarter to put Nebraska ahead. Grant Mulkey was on the receiving end of the first touchdown pass while Matt Herian, who tied the NU single-game record for receptions by a tight end with eight, picked up his third touchdown in two games on a 13-yard scoring pass. Dailey's final pass of the third period swung the momentum in USM's favor, as Naton Stewart intercepted the attempt and returned it 49 yards to pull the Golden Eagles back within two, 17-15. USM then took the lead, 21-17, on a Dustin Almond-to-Marvin Young 46-yard scoring strike following another Nebraska turnover. The Huskers came back with 1-back Cory Ross, who helped push NU up the field, but another lost fumble cut Nebraska's chances at a comeback. Ross recorded a career-high 169 yards on 27 carries for his second straight 100-yard game to open the season, and despite the final score, Nebraska outgained the Golden Eagles 476-239 in total offense.

Pittsburgh, Pa. — The Nebraska defense forced four turnovers and hurried the Pittsburgh quarterbacks all day as the Huskers pulled out a 24-17 victory in Coach Bill Callahan's first road contest guiding the Huskers. Wali Muhammad led the defensive charge as he recorded three tackles, a tackle for loss, a forced fumble, an interception and five quarterback hurries. As a team, the Huskers recorded 21 hurries and 16 pass breakups, including a team season high five by Kellen Huston. The Huskers allowed just 108 yards total offense through three quarters and finished the game outgaining Pitt 265-258. Joe Dailey hit 11-of-22 pass attempts for 142 yards and one touchdown while also rushing for a 17-yard score. Dailey's third rushing touchdown of the season gave the Huskers a 24-10 lead at halftime. Sandro DeAngelis opened the scoring with a 26-yard field goal and Cory Ross added a two-yard touchdown run following Muhammad's interception return to the 2. Fabian Washington's interception set up DeAngelis' field goal and Huston's fumble recovery set up Dailey's six-yard scoring strike to Ross Pilkington, as the Huskers converted the four turnovers into 17 points. Pilkington finished with a career-high tying five catches for 81 yards, one of five Huskers with receptions on the day.

Lincoln, Neb. — Nebraska relied on a stingy defensive effort and the steady running of Cory Ross to defeat Kansas, 14-8, in front of the 265th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium. The victory was Nebraska's 36th straight in the series with the Jayhawks, as the two teams played for an NCAA-record 99th consecutive season. Nebraska improved to 3-1 on the season and 1-0 in Big 12 play. Ross produced his third 100-yard rushing effort of the season with 107 yards and one touchdown on 19 carries, while adding three receptions for a career-best 37 yards and another touchdown to account for all of Nebraska's points. Wide receiver Ross Pilkington added career highs with eight receptions for 113 yards to help the Husker offense. Joe Dailey completed 16-of-24 passes for 183 yards, but threw three interceptions. However, the Nebraska Blackshirt defense answered the call time and time again to thwart KU's opportunities. The Jayhawks opened the scoring with a safety on Nebraska's second play from scrimmage when Dailey's pitch to Tierre Green sailed wide. Dailey recovered it the end zone, but KU took a quick 2-0 lead. The Jayhawks made it 5-0 with Johnny Beck's 36-yard field goal early in the second quarter. Ross then erupted for an 18-yard scoring run to cap a five-play, 47-yard drive to send the Huskers to halftime with a 7-5 lead. Beck gave KU the lead back at 8-7 with a 39-yard field goal midway through the third quarter, but Ross answered with a 14-yard touchdown reception on a screen pass from Dailey to cap the scoring. The Blackshirts did the rest, holding KU to 3-of-19 on third-down conversions. Fabian Washington starred for the defense with his third interception of the season to go along with a career-high six pass breakups and a tackle for loss. Linebackers Barrett Ruud and Stewart Bradley were also spectacular. Ruud notched 15 tackles, including 10 solos, while Bradley added 12 stops with six solos.

Lubbock, Texas — Nebraska fell to high-flying Texas Tech in a 70-10 loss in front of 52,954 fans and a TBS primetime national television audience. The Huskers were victimized by Red Raider quarterback Sonny Cumbie, who completed 44-of-56 passes for 436 yards and five touchdowns. The 70 points scored by Texas Tech were the most ever against the Huskers, and the 60-point margin of victory was also an opponent all-time high. Cumbie became just the sixth opposing quarterback in history to throw for more than 400 yards, with his 436 yards ranking as the third-highest total in history against the Huskers. He also set the opponent regular-season record with five touchdown passes and an opponent season-high 523 yards in total offense. Mark LeFlore provided Nebraska with a highlight on his 74-yard touchdown reception to open the second half, which cut Texas Tech's lead to 21-10 with 14:07 left in the third quarter. LeFlore produced his first 100-yard receiving effort of his career with five catches for 110 yards. Linebacker Barrett Ruud reached a milestone with 12 tackles to surpass Jerry Murtaugh as NU's all-time tackle leader. Matt Herian also became just the 12th NU receiver and third tight end to reach the 1,000-yard receiving mark in his career.

Lincoln, Neb. — Sophomore quarterback Joe Dailey produced a record-breaking performance to lead Nebraska to a 59-27 win over Baylor in front of the 266th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium. Dailey completed 13-of-20 passes for an NU record 342, surpassing the previous mark of 297 yards set by David Humm in 1973. Dailey also tied the school record with five touchdown passes, while directing the Huskers' most efficient offensive attack of the season. Sophomore wide receiver Isaiah Fluellen hauled in his first two receptions of the year, each for touchdowns on consecutive plays from scrimmage to close the first half to give NU a commanding 31-3 lead. Freshman runningback Brandon Jackson joined Dailey with a career-best performance. He rushed 18 times for 89 yards and two scores. He also returned five kickoffs for 158 yards, including an NU season-long 59-yard return. Cory Ross added 51 yards and a touchdown on the ground, while adding a 74-yard touchdown reception on a screen pass for the longest touchdown grab by an NU running back since 1978.

Manhattan, Kan. — The Huskers fell behind 14 points early in the first quarter and were unable to overcome a strong rushing performance by Kansas State in a 45-21 Wildcat win in front of 52,234 fans at Wagner Field. KSU quarterback Allen Webb carried 34 times for 147 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Wildcats, while running back Darren Sproles added 135 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries. The Wildcats outgained NU, 418-222, on the afternoon, including 294-106 on the ground. Despite KSU's control statistically, the Huskers trailed just 24-21 midway through the third quarter after NU strong safety Daniel Bullocks scooped up a botched Wildcat punt snap and sprinted 10 yards for a touchdown. But the Huskers could get no closer, as the NU offense stalled throughout the second half. NU went into the third quarter trailing 31-21, before committing turnovers on four straight possessions to help KSU pull away down the stretch. Freshman I-back Brandon Jackson provided several highlights for the Huskers by rushing 11 times for 57 yards, including a pair of touchdowns. But quarterback Joe Dailey suffered through one of his roughest days as a Husker by completing just 3-of-12 passes for 116 yards and one interception. He also committed a pair of fumbles. Linebacker Barrett Ruud had a career game with 19 total tackles, including a school-record 16 solo stops on the day.

Lincoln, Neb. — The Blackshirts flexed their muscles and the Husker special teams came up with two huge plays to fuel Nebraska's 24-3 victory over Missouri in front of 77,616 fans and a FSN national television audience. Playing in front of the 267th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium, the Huskers extended their Homecoming winning streak to 36 straight victories by beating the Tigers. The win moved NU into sole possession of first place in the Big 12 North with a 3-2 league mark and a 5-3 overall record. The Huskers also reclaimed the Victory Bell after falling to the Tigers in Columbia, 41-24, in 2003. The Blackshirts kept Missouri quarterback Brad Smith in check, limiting MU to three long field goal attempts. Cory Ross provided the offensive highlights by erupting for a career-high 194 yards on 19 carries. Ross added a pair of touchdowns, including a career-long 86-yard burst in the fourth quarter that was the eighth-longest run in school history. Andrew Shanle sparked NU's special teams by blocking a Matt Hoenes punt that Adam Ickes scooped up and carried 16 yards for a touchdown to give Nebraska a 10-3 lead with 9:42 left in the first half. Shanle provided another big special teams play when Hoenes fumbled a snap on another punt and Shanle covered it on the MU 15. Ross scored from 15 yards out on the next play to build NU's lead to 17-3 in the third quarter. Linebacker Barrett Ruud led a strong effort by the Blackshirts with 17 total tackles to earn Big 12 Defensive Player-of-the-Week honors. The Huskers did suffer one major loss in the victory, as All-Big 12 tight end Matt Herian sustained a broken leg while blocking downfield in the first half.

Ames, Iowa — Nebraska's late comeback attempt fell short and the Huskers dropped into a tie for the Big 12 North lead with a 34-27 loss to Iowa State at Jack Trice Stadium. NU slipped to 5-4 overall and 3-3 in the conference, while ISU improved to the same overall and league marks with the victory. Brandon Jackson capped a nine-play, 60-yard scoring drive with 5:01 remaining in the game to pull Nebraska within seven points, 34-27. The scoring run was Jackson's second of the day, marking his third two-touchdown game of the season and fourth straight game that NU had an 1-back run for two scores. It also narrowed an ISU lead to seven points after the Cyclones had built a 27-7 advantage early in the third quarter. Following Jackson's touchdown run, the Blackshirts held ISU on the next drive to give the ball back to the offense with 2:55 to play in the contest. But quarterback Joe Dailey's first pass was intercepted by Tim Dobbins to give ISU its second straight win over the Huskers in Ames. Dailey ended the day 18-of-42 with 230 passing yards, including six-yard touchdown pass to fullback Steve Kriewald to get Nebraska on the scoreboard in the second quarter. Dailey added 39 rushing yards and a 19-yard reception from wide receiver Ross Pilkington. Cyclone quarterback Bret Meyer managed even bigger numbers with 345 passing yards and three touchdowns, while completing 17-of-38 attempts. Meyer added 36 rushing yards. Todd Blythe supplied Meyer with his most frequent target by hauling in eight catches for 188 yards and a touchdown, while Jon Davis added four receptions for 103 yards, including a 77-yard touchdown catch for the ISU's final score.

Norman, Okla. — 1-back Cory Ross rushed for 130 yards to provide the biggest spark for Nebraska, but Oklahoma's efficient offense and stifling defense proved to be too much as the No. 2 Sooners handed the Huskers a 30-3 loss at OU's Memorial Stadium. With the loss, the Huskers dropped to 5-5 overall and 3-4 in Big 12 play, while OU improved to 10-0 overall and 7-0 in conference action. Ross pounded through one of the nation's top defenses 30 times Saturday for his sixth 100-yard effort this season. Ross became the 27th Husker in history to top the 1,000-yard mark on the season with the effort. The Huskers finished with 201 rushing yards but were outgained 511-274 in total offense as quarterback Jason White rewrote the Oklahoma record book. The 2003 Heisman Trophy winner completed a school-record 18 consecutive passes before finishing 29-of-35 for 383 yards and three touchdowns. NU quarterback Joe Dailey completed 8-of-12 passes on the night, but the Huskers managed just 73 yards through the air. After producing a field goal on their opening drive of the game, the Sooners added 20 points in the second quarter to build a 23-0 halftime lead. The Sooners built the lead to 30-0 midway through the third quarter, and appeared to have Nebraska shut out for the first time since 1996. But after White's completion to Ataleo Ford came up four yards short of a first down at the Nebraska 13-yard line, NU senior Steve Kriewald sparked the Huskers. Kriewald erupted 48 yards on the first carry by an NU fullback this season to give the Huskers a first down at the OU 24. Kriewald carried for three yards on the next play to set up David Dyches' 39-yard field goal as time expired for the final margin.
