NCAA Central Regional Notes



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ON THE RANGE...

The **109th Annual NCAA Golf Championships** begin this week with 81 schools competing in three regionals around the country, with the **University of Colorado** one of 27 schools competing in the 19th Annual NCAA Central Region Golf Championships in Sugar Grove, Ill. (about 35 miles west of Chicago; Northern Illinois University is the host school)... It's the seventh trip in the last nine seasons to the NCAA's as a team for Colorado; the Buffs have now been invited in 14 of the 19 years of the regional format... The top 10 teams out of 27 competing in the Central Regional will advance to the NCAA Finals, set for May 30-June 2 in Williamsburg, Va. (Virginia Commonwealth will host)... Ten out of 27 teams will also advance to the finals out the East and West regionals, taking place at the same time; the top two individuals from teams that do not qualify also will be invited... CU is the No. 5 seed in this meet out of the NCAA's District 5 (or Central District) but is the No. 21 seed overall... CU tees off at 7:00 a.m. (CDT) on Thursday off No. 10 and at 12:12 p.m. Friday on No. 1, as the Buffs will be paired with familiar Big 12 rivals Baylor (No. 19 seed) and Kansas (No. 20).

THE SITE

This is the first time that **Rich Harvest Farms Golf Course** (Sugar Grove, Ill.) will be hosting the NCAA Central Regional, as the Jerry Rich-designed layout opened in 1997. The course can play up to 7,800 yards in a par-72 configuration, but will be around 7,350 yards for the regional. It's the fourth straight year the Central Regional will be in that part of the nation, as West Lafayette, Ind., was the site in 2004, South Bend, Ind., in 2005 and Chardon, Ohio last year. It will return to the area for a fifth year in 2008 (Ohio State Scarlet Course). Northern Illinois University is the host and additional information can be found at www.niuhuskies.com.

THE EVENT

This is the 19th year that the NCAA is holding regionals (east, central, west) in order to stock the 30-team field at the NCAA Championship Finals. There are 27 teams at each site, with the top 10 to advance out of each. Out of the regional format, the Buffaloes have advanced to the NCAA Finals on four occasions, all four times with some style. In **1989**, the inaugural year for regional activity, CU finished third at Stonebridge Country Club outside of Dallas. Oklahoma and Oklahoma State tied for team honors with an 880 score, followed by the Buffs at 902. In **1994**, the Buffs placed second with an 853 score, just two strokes back of regional champion Texas, at Oklahoma City Golf & Country Club. In **1999**, at Ohio State University's Scarlet Course, the Buffs rallied from 18th place and eight shots back after 36 holes to force a playoff with Kent State, winning the battle on the first extra hole and thus advancing to the national finals. It remains the second largest comeback in regional history. In **2002** in Little Rock, Colorado was 11th after day one and in 13th after day two, but rallied to post the seventh best score in a final round hampered by tough winds, finishing in the 10th and final spot with an 886 team score. The Buffs edged two teams by one stroke—Big 12 rivals Kansas and Oklahoma.

THE REGIONAL FIELD

The field is comprised of 141 golfers, 27 five-man teams, plus six individuals. The Central Regional is again as tough as ever, with seven top 21 teams and 16 top 45 teams in the field. Here are the overall regional seeds by district, with CU's record against team in parenthesis—the Buffs are 8-38-1 against teams competing):

THE COLORADO ROSTER

The quintet representing Colorado in the NCAA's have earned 11 letters between them, two less than the last two fivesomes that qualified for CU in 2004 and 2006; however, this group has four players with NCAA experience compared to two last year and just one in '04. The last Colorado team to advance to the NCAA Finals, the 2002 squad, had a combined 17 letters with 12 previous NCAA regional or finals tournaments among them. The 2007 Buffalo five:

Baird played in two regionals and one finals as a member of Pepperdine's golf team his freshman and sophomore years, Grady and Tolan played last year in Chardon, Ohio, and Moore as a sophomore in 2004 at West Lafayette, Ind. If the Baird qualifies in 2008 either with the team or individually, he would join the short list of four CU players who have qualified to play in four: **Rick Cramer** (1979-82), **Bob Kalinowski** (1991-94), **Matt Zions** (1999-2002) and **Kane Webber** (2000-04).

HEAD COACH ROY EDWARDS

Roy Edwards was named just the third full-time men's golf coach in University of Colorado history on July 14, 2007, following in the footsteps of the only two coaches the program had ever known over a span of six decades.

Edwards, 30, came to CU with an impressive pedigree, joining the Buffaloes from his alma mater, the University of Kansas, where he has served as the assistant for both the men's and women's programs for the previous four years. He held the same position at Vanderbilt University for a year prior to returning to KU.

One could say the "29's were wild" at the time of his hiring. Edwards was 29 when hired, and the two full-time coaches who preceded him both served the CU golf team for 29 years each as head coach. He replaced Mark Simpson, who passed away from complications due to lung cancer in December 2005. Simpson had held the post since 1977, when he replaced his college head coach, Les Fowler. Fowler took over as player-coach in 1948 and remained on board until Simpson, his assistant, replaced him.

Thus, Edwards becomes just CU's third full-time head coach since 1948, though he is actually the oldest person ever hired for the position as Fowler took over when he was 23, while Simpson was 27.

His first CU team had moderate success, and finished 11th in the Big 12 Championships; while that was disappointing, his team did something that neither Fowler's or Simpson's did, qualify for the NCAA Championships (though in fairness, more teams are invited today than when they coached, but it still was an impressive accomplishment).

At Kansas, he was heavily involved in recruiting and the day-to-day functions for both the men's and women's teams, managed the Jayhawks' Birdie Club and was the main contact for both golf camps. A KU graduate, he returned to his alma mater in August 2002 as the assistant coach for both the men's and women's programs and further developed all the skills necessary to one day become a head coach. He coordinated and managed a \$1 million-plus fundraising campaign for KU's golf practice facility, founded and coordinated the annual booster club program, oversaw program communications, budgeting, alumni-parent relations and condition programs, and cording all aspects of official and unofficial visits for the recruiting process, including prospect evaluation and communication. He also was designated as the head coach on numerous occasions, including for 2003 and 2004 NCAA regional play.

He was one of three finalists for the 2004 Golf Coaches Association of America Assistant Coach of the Year, named for Jan Strickland. The award is given to the NCAA Division I, II, III or NAIA assistant coach who has excelled in working with their student-athletes both on the course and in the classroom.

At Kansas, he helped coach six first-team All-Big 12 players (five men, one woman) and four Academic All-Americans. He started his coaching career as a volunteer/graduate assistant in 1998, working three years in that capacity before moving on to Vanderbilt for his first full-time assistant coaching position. During this time, he was also the Junior Golf Director for the Kansas Golf Association, running all activities for over 600 junior members of the KGA.

He was the assistant for both the men's and women's teams at Vanderbilt from May 2001 until returning to his alma mater the following year. At Vandy, he headed the Commodore Golf Day and the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate Golf Championships, and was involved in Commodore recruiting as well as the day-to-day practice and traveling schedules. He was a part of history as both teams experienced two of the best seasons in the programs' existence the 2001-02 academic year, and had a hand in coaching a pair of first-team All-Southeastern Conference players, including Brandt Snedeker, a first-team All-American.

A three-year member of the Jayhawk golf team, he lettered as a senior under legendary and long-time coach Ross Randall and earned his bachelor's of science degree in business administration from Kansas in 2000. Simultaneously while finishing his degree, he worked as a volunteer assistant coach for the men's team. His career playing highlights include being named the PGA Midwest Section Player of the Year in 1995 and the Heart of America Four-Ball champion in 1997. As a student, he was also heavily involved on KU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and held several leadership roles on campus.

Edwards' family has a long history with the University of Kansas. His father, R.A., is a distinguished alumni who was awarded the 2002 Fred Ellsworth Medallion for "unique and significant service to the university." A grandfather was a yell-leader in the 1930s and was honored by the 1988 National Champion Jayhawk basketball team, and two grandparents were also awarded the Ellsworth medal.

He is also the nephew of Ray Evans, who is recognized as one of the greatest athletes in KU history. A two-time All-American in basketball (1942-43), he became Kansas' first football All-America award winner after returning from World War II in 1947.

Born October 14, 1976 in Kansas City, Mo., but truly a native of Hutchinson, Kan., he was a four-year letterman in golf at Hutchinson (Kan.) High School and was an Eagle Scout. His hobbies include playing golf, cooking and traveling. He is engaged to Shelly Bonfantine of Albuquerque, N.M., and the two will marry this July 7.

FIRST TIME COACHES IN THE NCAA

Colorado coach **Roy Edwards** is one of four coaches (out of 87) who had their teams qualify for the 2007 NCAA Championships in their first year as a men's college head coach. He is joined by **Casey Martin** (Oregon), **Brian White** (Lamar) and **Chris Zambri** (Southern Cal); White had been coach of Lamar's women's team and now coaches both programs. Edwards is the first CU golf coach to lead his team to the NCAA meet in his first season.

FIFTH MAN/SCORE BLUES

Colorado has struggled this season when it comes to the score for the fifth player each round, likely the direct cause of CU's inconsistency in its tournament finishes. In 34 rounds (minus two at Wichita State's meet where CU had the minimum four playing due to illness), the average score that the Buffaloes had to throw out was **80.03**. Only four times did Colorado have a fifth score that was lower than 77 (two 72s and two 74s). "That would be an interesting stat to figure for the top teams," CU coach **Roy Edwards** wondered. "I would think that number would be fairly low more often than not for the really good teams; when it's as high as ours, it makes it hard to be consistent."

THIS-N-THAT

Junior **Patrick Grady** is the only Buff to play in all 12 tournaments to date; should CU qualify for the finals, he could finish with anywhere from 41 to 43 rounds. The only player to finish with 40 since 1992-92 was Knut Ekjord with 40 in 1998-99... **Luke Symons** currently owns a 76.13 scoring average, currently the 10th best in school history by a freshman (and the eighth best by a true frosh)... Of Symons' 12 rounds in the spring, nine came playing as an individual when CU took extra golfers on the trip; he has 24 on the year, the fourth most by a true frosh this decade, trailing **Edward McGlasson** (33 in 2002-03), **Kane Webber** (32 in 1999-2000) and **Shea Sena** (29 in 2004-05).

THE SCHEDULE

The NCAA Central Regional figures to be one of if not the toughest tournaments that Colorado will play in to date in 2006-07; the Buffs have played in 12 tournaments so far, and have played the 61st toughest schedule nationally according to *Golfweek* (the seventh toughest in the Big 12, but the hardest by the six North Division teams). The Hawai'i-Hilo Intercollegiate currently ranks as CU's toughest meet of the year (ranked No. 34), with the Prestige At PGA West (No. 41) and the Big 12 Championships (No. 42) the next two on the list (The Maxwell had not been rated as of press time, but likely is somewhere between No. 30 and 40).

SEASON CAPSULE

The 2006-07 **University of Colorado** men's golf team is just the third in school history to be piloted by a first-year head coach, as **Roy Edwards** took over last July as just the Buffaloes' third full-time coach in the last six decades. He follows in the footsteps of the two late men who preceded him, **Les Fowler** (1948-77) and **Mark Simpson** (1977-2005).

Now first-year comparisons stretched over 60 yards aren't very valuable. In Fowler's first season, the team competed mainly in dual meets (going 7-1), while Simpson took over for Fowler at midyear. Both their teams finished third in the conference championship meet, but the Big Seven of '48 and the Big Eight of '77, while competitive, were lightweights by comparison to the current stature of the Big 12 Conference. Edwards' team finished 11th in his first Big 12 meet, though CU was just 13 strokes out of a first division finish.

But Edwards' team accomplished something neither of his predecessors did in their first seasons, and that was to qualify for the NCAA Championships. Colorado is currently ranked No. 66 (GolfStat; No. 69 *Golfweek*) in the nation, and is seeded No. 21 in the Central Region, the fifth seed out of its district. The team was considered likely on the bubble after the showing in the conference championships, but Edwards always felt his team was deserving. "When we were compared to everyone in our district from the start to the end of the year, I felt we were clearly one of the teams that should make it into the NCAA's."

Junior **Michael Baird**, who transferred back to his home state from Pepperdine last summer, leads the team in stroke average (73.37) heading into regional play. He was one of three finalists for CU's Male Athlete of the Year for all sports and was the Big 12 Golfer of the Month for February, rewarding him for a strong spring start. He leads or is tied for the lead in 14 statistical categories on the team.

Junior **Patrick Grady** is the only Buff to have played in all 12 tournaments, while senior **Blake Moore** and sophomore **Derek Tolan** have played in all but one (Baird has played in nine). There are two seniors currently on the team, Moore and **Ryan Anderson**, with a third, **Derek O'Neill** leaving the team at the semester break to begin his pro career on the Gateway Tour in Arizona. Anderson and Patrick Grady were named to the Academic All-Big 12 team, with Grady named as CU's representative on the league's Spring Good Works Team, recognizing his community service.

U.S. OPEN LOCAL QUALIFYING

Eight Buffaloes participated this past Monday in U.S. Open Local Qualifying, seven in Colorado at Walking Stick Golf Club outside of Pueblo. Michael Baird tied for the final position with a 1-under 70 (four players for one spot), losing on the first playoff hole for the automatic sectional berth, and then succumbing on the second hole for alternate status. Patrick Grady and Luke Symons recorded 71s, Jim Grady a 73, Derek Tolan a 74 and Ryan Anderson and Tom Gempel each posted 75s. Justin Bardgett played in the event closer to his hometown in St. Louis, as he shot a 77 in Springfield, Ill., and did not advance. Symons and Anderson used the round to also determine CU's fifth player for the regional; it was the fourth round in their personal qualifier as the three rounds at last weekend's Perry Maxwell Intercollegiate started things off. Symons had a 282 total to earn the last spot, while Anderson had a 298 score.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A STROKE MAKES

History has shown time and time again that a single stroke can mean the difference between advancing to the NCAA Finals and having a season end early. The last six Central regionals have all come down to one or fewer strokes separating the 10 teams that qualified and the 11th that was left on the outside looking in. Overall, on five occasions, there was a tie for the last qualifying spot, with one stroke the difference seven times and two strokes three times. Only three years has the margin between qualifying and going home been more than two shots, in 1992 (seven), in 1998 (three) and in 2000 (four). A closer look:

THE "DID YOU KNOW?" FACT

Colorado, Ohio State and Wake Forest have produced the most U.S. Open champions with four. CU's **Hale Irwin** has won three (1974, 1979, 1990) and **Steve Jones** one (1996). Ohio State's **Jack Nicklaus** claimed four by himself, while Wake Forest has had three players do it.

QUOTING ROY EDWARDS**On The Maxwell, CU's Final Tune-Up For Regionals**

"I think we played our best Sunday (the final round) as a team, the guys created more opportunities to shoot lower. We didn't necessarily come through every time, but we made progress. It was good to see Luke get back on track, and Derek never gave up after a frustrating first round and played closer to what he's capable of. We feel refreshed. We really tried to use all three rounds as preparation for the NCAA's later this week, and I think we're ready, the guys think we're ready, and we're definitely excited."

On CU's Chances At Regionals

"I think our chances are good. The guys are in good spirits, I think there's a renewed sense of opportunity that we're excited about. It's the ultimate time for the team to come together, and we know we're a better team than what we've showed. We have one last chance to prove that we do belong as one of the nation's top 30 programs this season, and this is one sport where your fate is always in your hands."

On The One Thing CU Has Been Consistent Of All Season

"They've maintained a great attitude the whole year, and I think that is the type of thing that can payoff in the end. We've never been down, we've been positive in wanting to improve and to put in the work to do so."

On The One Thing CU Has To Accomplish or Improve Of

"We need to be more consistent from one to five. All our guys have had good tournaments, but we need to get three or four of the playing well at the same time. If we can do that, I think we'll be in good shape."
