NATIONAL RANKINGS: Colorado is nationally ranked No. 19 in both the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll, the highest among the top-20 since Mar. 4, 1997 when they were No. 18 • Last time CU was ranked in the Coaches Poll occurred in back-to-back weeks in 2005-06 at No. 25.

UNDEFEATED: CU is 6-0 for the first time since the 1989-90 season (finished 12-18) • Both CU basketball teams are unbeaten (women 5-0), the first time both programs started with 5 or more wins since 1982-83 when both programs started 7-0.

SERIES WITH WYOMING: The Cowboys have gotten the best of the Buffaloes in the head-to-head series leading 41-35, and a 25-11 advantage in Laramie. UW has beaten CU in five straight games since 1997 • The Cowboys defeated the Buffs in Boulder last year, 65-54 ending CU's 25-consecutive home game non-conference winning streak • CU has not won in Laramie since Dec. 10, 1996 (84-68) - 16 years • Coach Boyle teams are 0-2 vs. the Cowboys • Wyoming is 21-3 at home over the last two years • CU at Wyoming marks the first true road game for the Buffaloes this season • CU is 3-0 at home and 3-0 on a neutral court (Charleston) • CU is 1-1 under Coach Boyle in season road game openers.

FOUR-GAME STRETCH: CU's next four opponents are 20-4 (.833) with three of them on the road • Wyoming (7-0); Colorado State (5-0); at No. 10/10 Kansas (5-1); at Fresno State (3-3) • CU is one of seven schools among the six BCS Conferences to play three of four true road games during the non-conference season. The others are Utah, Alabama, DePaul, LSU, Miami, Villanova). LSU is the only school playing three straight road non-conference games.

TRENDS: CU is 11-1 in its last 12 games dating back to the Pac-12 Tournament, following two road losses to end the 2011-12 season (at Oregon, at Oregon State) • In his three years at CU, Boyle is 8-0 at home in the month of November and 13-6 in November games • In December, Boyle is 11-2 overall; 1-1 on neutral courts; 0-0 on the road.

PLAYER TRENDS: Askia Booker has scored 13+ points in each of CU's first six games; Spencer Dinwiddie 11+ points in all six games; Josh Scott 13+ points in five of six games • Andre Roberson has grabbed 12+rebounds in four of six games • Booker is averaging 4.5 assists over his last two games • With under five minutes (overtime included) to play, Josh Scott is 9-of-9 from the free throw line.

TRAVELLING FANS: Wyoming's Arena-Auditorium will not be totally one-sided rooting for the home team. CU will be travelling 115 fans of its own on two buses. One bus will depart from Boulder, then the other from Denver. Fans will get a game ticket, food and drink and round-trip transportation (cost is \$40 for the Denver bus, \$45 for the Boulder bus).

CU vs. MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE: Saturday is CU's second match up against the Mountain West Conference. CU defeated Air Force, 89-74 on Nov. 25. After playing Wyoming on Dec. 1, the Buffs will host unbeaten Colorado State (Dec. 5) and play at Fresno State (Dec. 12), who is 3-3. Dating back to last season, CU has two straight against the MWC, the first win came against UNLV in the NCAA Tournament last March 15.

CAPACITY CROWDS: Both non-conference home games (Wofford & Air Force) were sellouts, making it the first time back-to-back games in November exceeded 10,000 fans (vs. Wofford: 10,611; vs. Air Force: 10,607). Both games rank three and four, respectively in non-conference most-attended games • MBB season ticket sales have increased to over 6,400 season tickets (as of Nov. 19), an increase of 60% over last season (previous record set last season was 3,941) • In the last three seasons, the Buffs have recorded 11 sellouts and are 9-2 in those games.

ANDRE ROBERSON: Two double-doubles in his last two games: 11 pts., 12 rebs. vs. Texas Southern; 18 pts, 13 rebs. vs. AFA • CU is now 22-5 when Roberson records a double-double • CU is 20-5 when Andre Roberson grabs at least 12 rebounds in a game; 8-0 when 15+ • In 80 career games, has grabbed 7+ rebounds 61 times • Roberson is averaging a double-double (10.8 ppg, 11.0 rpg.) the second straight season accomplishing this feat. He is looking to become the first CU player to average a double in back-to-back years since Shaun Vandiver (1988-91).

MORE 'DRE: CU is 20-5 when Andre Roberson grabs at least 12 rebounds in a game; 8-0 when 15+ • Roberson is fifth on CU's all-time rebounding list with 764. He trails Jim Davis (1961-64, 863) by 99 • Roberson is tied for fourth in career blocks (123) with Cliff Meely (1968-71) • Has 58 rebounds in his last five games, the 32nd time he has registered a combined 20-something rebounds in back-to-back games • In 80 career games, has grabbed 7+ rebounds 61 times.

JOSH SCOTT: Led the Buffs in scoring with a career-high 20 points against AFA • He recorded his first career double-double with 18 pts., 12 rbs. against Texas Southern • He made six FGs in each of his last two games with personal bests in field goal attempts (13) and rebounds (12) • He has started all six games and netted 13+ points in five of six games

ASKIA BOOKER: Scored double digits in all six games this season and leads the Buffs in scoring with 16.8 points per game, assists (18), treys made (11) • Also had a season-high seven rebounds against Air Force • Has led CU in assists four of the last five games.

SPENCER DINWIDDIE: Has started every game as a Buff (42) • Scored 10+ points every game (6 games), second longest of career (8 games) • Career-high 24 points with personal best of 16-of-18 free throws in double overtime home win over Texas Southern.

Pac-12 HONOR: Sophomore guard Askia Booker was named Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week (Nov. 19) on the heels of the Buffs winning the Charleston Classic and Booker being named tournament MVP. Booker averaged 19.3 points, 3.0 assists, 2.7 steals and 2.3 rebounds per game en route to MVP honors, helping the Buffs knock off Dayton, No. 16 Baylor and Murray State in four days in Charleston, S.C. Booker is the second men's player to earn Pac-12 Player of the Week honors in as many seasons as Carlton Brown garnered conference honors Jan. 2-8, 2012.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Boyle coaching staff is an impressive 33-4 (.892) at the Coors Events Center in their first 75 games in Boulder. The 33 victories is the best winning span in school history.

- CU's home win over California (70-57) on Senior Day (Feb. 26, 2012) was the 500th game at the Coors Events Center.

- Two conference attendance seasons under Boyle: 9,809 (2010-11) and 9,160 (2011-12), first time 9k in back-to-back seasons.

- The men's basketball team is 346-155 (.691) at the Events Center in 34 seasons.

- 10 sellouts (1 in 2012-13; 5 in 2010-11; 4 in 2011-12). CU is 8-2 in those games.

- According to *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, CU went from 4,637 fans in 2009 to 7,804 in 2012 for a 68 percent increase. The 68 percent makes CU the biggest gainers in attendance and a No. 1 ranking. Among the top 10 schools listed, CU is the only Pac-12 school that improved in attendance, while five Pac-12 schools decreased in attendance.

- In 2011-12, CU set a school-record for conference total attendance (82,442) breaking the 2010-11 total of 78,472.

- CU set a school-record for average attendance (7,804), breaking the 2010-11 total of 7,014.

Pac-12 Notes (as of Thursday): CU is one of three unbeaten teams in the conference (Cal 6-0, Arizona 4-0) • CU ranks second behind Arizona is home attendance average (13,616 to 9848) • Andre Roberson is first in rebounding (11.0 rpg), and defensive rebounding (8.2), and tied for first in steals (2.3) • Spencer Dinwiddie is second in 3-pt. FG Pct. (.526). CU also has made the most free throws in a game (33 vs. Texas Southern).

NATIONALLY RANKED: Last week, the Buffs were ranked No. 23 in the Associated Press poll (Nov. 19-25), the first time the program has been ranked in a major poll since earning back-to-back No. 25 rankings in the Coaches Poll during the 2005-06 season. In the AP poll, it is the first ranking since appearing at No. 24 in the final poll of the 1996-97 season, when Chauncey Billups led the Buffs to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. It's the first time the Buffs have been ranked before the start of conference play in 43 years, since a showing on the Dec. 30, 1969, poll, coming in at No. 20. Overall, it is the 32nd time the Buffs have appeared in the AP rankings. CU's highest ranking came on Dec. 18, 1963, coming in at No. 6.

TOURNEY SETTING: In the past three seasons under coach Tad Boyle, the Buffaloes are 15-6 in a tournament setting, including winning eight of their last nine games dating back to the Pac-12 Tournament last season.

2011-12: 6-3, 1-2 in Puerto Rico, 4-0 Pac-12 Tournament, 1-1 NCAA.

SKI ON FIRE: Askia Booker has led CU in scoring three of five games • Netted 15+ points five straight games, averaging at least two treys a game • Scored a career-high 23 points against Murray State on 10-of-18 shooting

from the field – also career highs; first 20-point scorer this season for CU • Named the Charleston Classic Most Valuable Player, averaged 19.3 points with 3.0 assists, 2.7 steals, and 2.3 rebounds per game, also shot 51.1 percent from the field (24-of-47) and made seven 3-pointers over the three games. Had a

career-best four steals against Murray State and five assists vs. Air Force.

WATCH LISTS: Andre Roberson has been named to a pair of top-50 watch lists for the 2012-13 season: the John R. Wooden Award Preseason list by The Los Angeles Athletic Club and the Naismith 50-player watch list by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Men's College Player of the Year presented by AT&T will be awarded on April 7, 2013 in Atlanta. Roberson is one of two CU basketball players in the last three years named to the prestigious Wooden Top-50 watch list. Former Buff standout Alec Burks was named to the Top-50 watch list in 2010-11 and later made the final top-20.

HOME OPENER SELLOUT: For the first time at the Coors Events Center (since the 1979-80 season), CU sold out the home/season opener with 10,611 in attendance. It was also the largest non-conference home crowd (essentially in school history) to see a season/home opener. The 10,611 crowd was the third largest at CU of all non-conference home games.

UPSET SPECIAL: CU played two nationally ranked teams a year ago, beating No. 23/25 UNLV, 68-64 (March 17, 2012) at the 2012 NCAA Tournament in Albuquerque, N.M. Last Friday, CU knocked off No. 16/17 Baylor in the semifinals of the Charleston Classic. It was also CU's first regular season win over a ranked non-conference team since defeating Long Beach State, 73-71 on Dec. 5, 1973 (29 years ago). Last March in the NCAA Tournament, the Buffs defeated No. 23 UNLV.

CHARLESTON RECAP: Andre Roberson scored a season-best 16 points, his first game this over 10 points and third straight game he has led the team in rebounding (61st career) • Spencer Dinwiddie made a career-high 10 made and 11 attempted free

3-POINT ARC: Over the last 16 years, sophomore Spencer Dinwiddie has the best three-point field goal percentage of players being 6'5" or taller. Roberson's improvement enabled the Buffaloes to win the Pac-12 tournament and reach the NCAA tournament for the first time in nine years. While Colorado lost three starters, it is bringing back its three most talented players in Roberson, 6-5 sophomore guard Spencer Dinwiddie and 6-1 sophomore

guard Askia Booker. "We'll be more talented, but not as experienced," Boyle said. 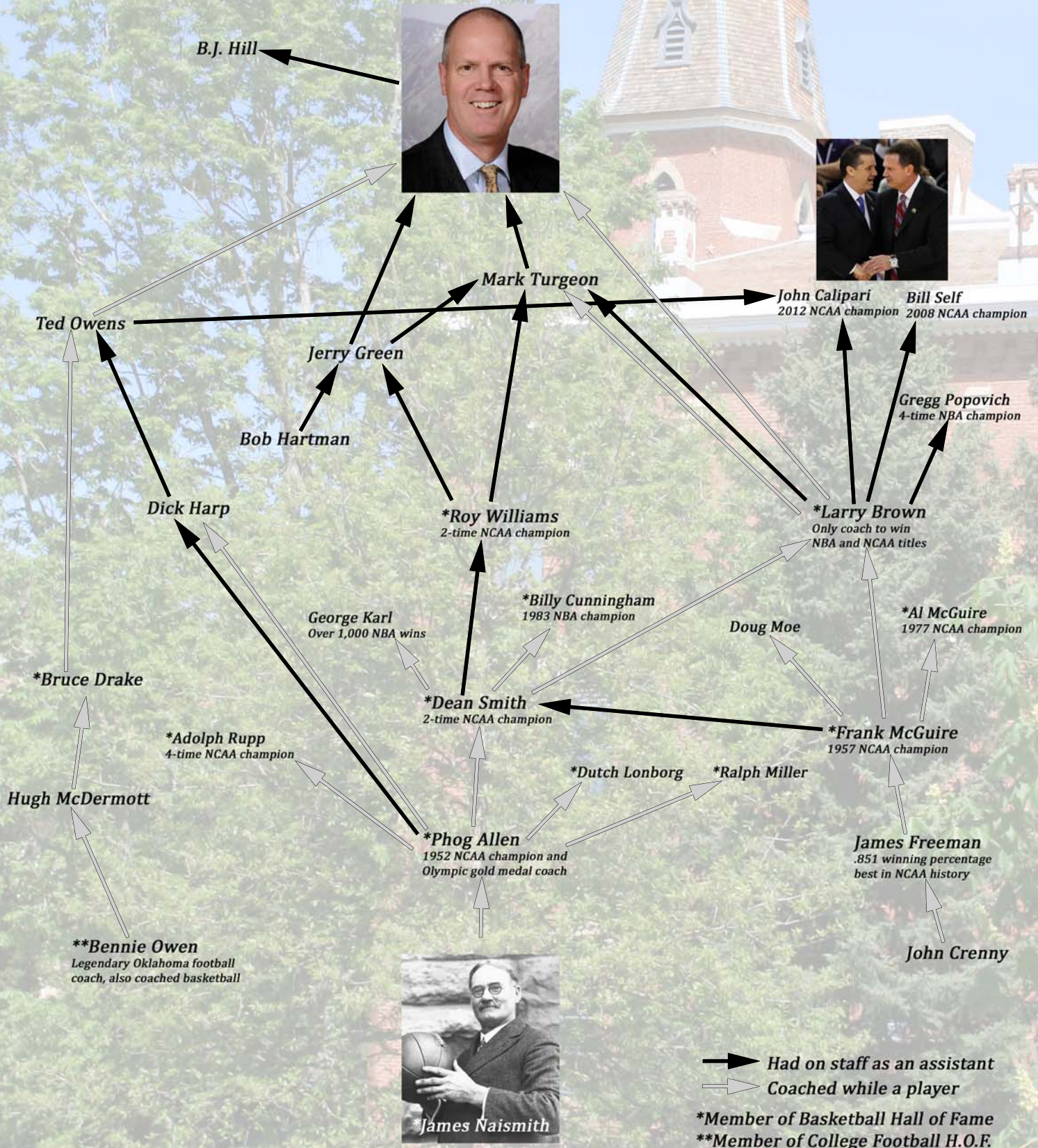

Below is a diagram of all the head coaches that Boyle played for or coached under at the college level, and all the mentors those coaches played for or coached under, etc. going all the way back to Dr. James Naismith. The shortest route tracing Boyle back to the game's inventor is only four generations (going either from Larry Brown to Dean Smith to Phog Allen to Naismith, or from Ted Owens to Dick Harp to Allen to Naismith). Boyle is a direct descendant of seven members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame as well as a charter member of the College Football Hall of Fame.
