**STARTERS:** CU is looking for its best start to the season since 1994-95 when they began 9-2 (15-13 that season) • CU is 36-4 at home (.900) under the Boyle coaching staff • CU has been idle for nine days in between games with final exams • CU is 13-3 in its last 16 games dating back to the Pac-12 Tournament • Andre Roberson is third nationally in rebounding (12.3), the same place he finished last year.

**UP NEXT:** The Buffaloes will be idle for eight days after NAU when they host the Hartford Hawks (Sat., Dec. 29, Boulder). CU leads 1-0 (at Boulder): Jan. 2, 1985, 81-67. Coach Boyle: first meeting against the Hawks. Hartford is 6-5 with a home game against Marist (Dec. 22).

**TWEET:** "Nobody has a home court advantage like CU does. We have the altitude, the attitude (we have a Chip on our shoulders) and the C-Unit." - A CU fan following men's basketball on twitter

**20 REBOUNDS/Pac-12 POW:** Andre Roberson scored a game-high 17 points with a career-best 20 rebounds, his fifth double-double in CU's road win at Fresno State, 50-43. For his efforts, he was named Pac-12 Player of the Week, the second CU men's player to earn conference weekly honors this season.

- Shot 7-of-12 from the field (.583) with three assists, one steal in 38 minutes. Roberson grabbed 10 rebounds in each half becoming the first CU player to have that many in more than a decade (Stephane Pelle, 21 vs. Stetson, Nov. 24, 2002).

- 20 rebounds is the most by a Pac-12 player this season, most in four years since Arizona's Jordan Hill, 22 vs. UAB, Nov. 18, 2008.

- 17th 20-rebound performance in CU history and tied for the fourth-most in a game away from home.

- first 20-rebound performance in a CU road game in almost 52 years, since Roger Voss, 27 at Missouri, Feb. 4, 1961, and most away from home since Jamahl Mosley, 20 vs. Baylor in Kansas City on March 8, 2001.

**800 POINTS/800 REBOUNDS CLUB:** With 796 career points, Andre Roberson needs four points to reach 800. With already 821 career rebounds, he will join four other CU players who have reached both plateaus (Stephane Pelle, Cliff Meely, Shaun Vandiver, Jim Davis).

**800+ REBOUNDS:** Andre Roberson is only the fourth Colorado player ever to record over 800 career rebounds. With 821 rebounds in only 84 games played, he's 233 from the school record of 1,054 set by Stephane Pelle (1999-2003). Roberson already owns the freshman (297) and sophomore (401) single-season records.

**CONFERENCE LEADERS:** Entering Monday's games in the Pac-12, Andre Roberson is the lone player ranked among his fellow conference peers in four categories. Roberson is first in double-doubles (5); first in rebounding (821) with Solomon Hill (Sr., Arizona) in second with 625 boards; in steals, Roberson (119) leads Joe Burton (Sr., Oregon State) who has 102; and in blocked shots, Roberson is tied with senior Jason Washburn of Utah with 121.

**20-POINT SCORERS:** This season, CU has had three players scoring 20 or more points in a game (Dinwiddie - 3; Booker - 1; Scott - 1). Last season in a school record 36 games played, the Buffs managed only two players over 20-points in a game (Andre Roberson - 3; Carlon Brown - 3).

**HOLDING DEFENSE UNDER 50:** CU held Fresno State to 43 points in its seven-point win on Dec. 12 at the Save Mart Center. It's the first time this season and seventh time a Boyle coached CU team has allowed the opponent under 50 points. In 2011-12, Buffaloes defense held the opponent under 50 points, six times.

**CU vs. MW:** CU went 3-1 against the Mountain West Conference this season (wins: Air Force, Colorado State, Fresno State. Loss: at Wyoming). Last season, the Buffs went 2-2 and 1-0 in 2010-11. Overall, Boyle teams are 6-3.

**THREE ROAD GAMES/ONE HOME:** CU went 2-2 in a grueling slate that only six other schools among the six BCS Conferences have played this non-conference season. The Buffs played three of four true road games during the non-conference season. The others were Utah, Alabama, DePaul, LSU, Miami, Villanova). LSU is the only school playing three straight road non-conference games.

**3-POINT ARC:** Over the last 16 years, sophomore Spencer Dinwiddie has the best three-point field goal percentage of players being 6'6" or taller. Here's the list of the top-11 players since 1996 with a minimum of 80 attempts. Dinwiddie's one year percentage ranked him fifth in the Pac-12 (all games played). Here are the top-seven.

- Charleston Classic MVP: 19.3 ppg., 3.0 apg., 2.7 sts., 2.3 rpg., 51.1 FG% (24-of-47) made seven 3-pointers over the three games, and led all scorers in all three games.

- Career-high 29 points in win over Colorado State (Dec. 5), tied personal-best 8 FGs made and tying a best five 3-pointers.
- Scored 24 points with personal best 16-of-18 free throws in double OT win over Texas Southern. (Nov. 27).
- Another 24-point effort at Wyoming (Dec. 1).
- Played a team-high 43 minutes, converting a personal high 16-of-18 free throws against Texas Southern.
- Averaged 24 points, 4.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists with one block and one steal during Colorado's 1-1 week in which the nationally ranked Buffaloes defeated Texas Southern at home in double-OT, 85-80, then lost at Wyoming, 76-69.

- Led the Buffs in scoring, twice, 19 points at No. 9 Kansas and career-high 20 points against Air Force (Nov. 25).
- Recorded his first career double-double with 18 pts., 12 rbs. against Texas Southern (Nov. 27).
- Season-best nine FGs made and 15 attempts at KU.
- Six FGs made against AFA and Texas Southern.
- Started all 10 games and netted 11+ points in seven of 10 games.
- Four home games, second on team with 14 points a game.
- Second in rebounding (5.4) and third in scoring (12.8).
- Minimum 70 shots, second in FG percentage (.488).

### **#2 Xavier Johnson**

#### **Forward • 6-6 • 220 • Fr. • Los Angeles, Calif.**

- Led team in rebounding once (Wofford) with eight.
- Season-best 15 points against Dayton.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** The Boyle coaching staff is an impressive 36-4 (.900) at the Coors Events Center in their first 40 games in Boulder. The 32 victories over the last two seasons were the best two-year span in school history.

- CU has sold out three of four games during 2012-13 (Colorado State, 11,708; Wofford, 10,611; Air Force, 10,607).

- 11,708 against CSU was the most attended game - men's or women's at the CEC.

- 12 sellouts (2012-13: 3; 2010-11: 5; 2011-12: 4). CU is 10-2 in those games.

- CU sold out the home/season opener with 10,611 in attendance. It was also the largest non-conference home crowd (essentially in school history) to see a season/home opener.

- CU's home win over California (70-57) on Senior Day (Feb. 26, 2012) was the 500th game at the Coors Events Center.

- Two conference attendance seasons under Boyle: 9,809 (2010-11) and 9,160 (2011-12), first time 9k in back-to-back seasons.

- The men's basketball team is 349-155 (.693) at the Events Center in 35 seasons.

- According to *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, CU went from 4,637 fans in 2009 to 7,804 in 2012 for a 68 percent increase. The 68 percent makes CU the biggest gainers in attendance and a No. 1 ranking. Among the top 10 schools listed, CU is the only Pac-12 school that improved in attendance, while five Pac-12 schools decreased in attendance.

- In 2011-12, CU set a school-record for conference total attendance (82,442) breaking the 2010-11 total of 78,472.

- CU set a school-record for average attendance (7,804), breaking the 2010-11 total of 7,014.

**NATIONAL RANKINGS:** CU loss at Wyoming (Dec. 1) pushed the Buffs out of the AP and USA Today polls. CU was No. 19 (Nov. 26-Dec. 2) in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll, the highest among the top-20 since Mar. 4, 1997, when they were No. 18 • CU was also ranked in the AP Top-25 at No. 23 (Nov. 19-25).

**TAKING CARE OF BALL:** CU committed only seven turnovers in its home win over Colorado State. It's the 12th time under the Boyle-watch the Buffs committed seven or less turnovers in a game (9-3). Ironically, CU committed seven turnovers two years ago in its 90-83 (ot) win in Boulder against CSU. At Kansas AND Fresno State, the Buffs committed a season-high 18 times.

**BUFFALO CHIPS:** MBB season ticket sales have increased to over 6,600 season tickets (as of Dec. 12), an increase of 60% over last season (previous record set last season was 3,941) • CU started this season 6-0 for the first time since 1989-90 (finished 12-18). The six wins were the most ever in the month of November • In his three years at CU, Boyle is 13-4 in December (11-1 at home; 1-1 on neutral courts; 1-2 on the road. In November, he is 13-6 and 8-0 at home.

**SOPHOMORE COMBO:** Last season, Spencer Dinwiddie (360 pts.) and Askia Booker (317 pts.) became CU's most potent freshman duo ever establishing a school record 677 points. This year, the two already have a combined 289 points and are 1-2 leading the Buffs in scoring (Dinwiddie: 14.7 ppg.; Booker: 14.2 ppg.).

**20+ POINT SCORER:** Spencer Dinwiddie became first CU player to net three-straight 20-point efforts since Alec Burks (five in a row) did it the last five games of the 2010-11 season. Dinwiddie scored a career-high 29 points against Colorado State, 24 points each at Wyoming and Texas Southern. Dinwiddie averaged 25.7 ppg., 52.8 FG% (19-of-26), 50 3Pt% (11-of-22), and 82.4 FT% (28-of-34) over his last three games.

**Vital stats/storylines:** Averaged 21.8 points, 7.0 rebounds, 6.0 assists and 0.8 blocks during his junior season • Hopkins can shoot, going 60 percent from the field as a junior, including 37 percent from beyond the arc and 57 percent from the free throw line • Scored 20 or more points 16 times last season and led his state's Section II in points, steals and assists in a 22-7 season that saw Basha advance to the second round of the AIA Division I playoffs • Rated a four-star prospect by Rivals.com, the 29th best shooting guard and the nation's 109th best prospect overall • Other western schools pursuing him included Washington State, Oregon State, Arizona State, New Mexico, Boise State, Colorado State, USC and UTEP • Played AAU ball last spring and summer for the Compton Magic.

**CU scouting report:** A multi-purpose guard who can play the point, the two spot and the wing • Passes, dribbles and shoots at a high level • Strong chance he will be Arizona's player-of-the-year this season as a high school senior.

**Boyle's take:** "There's not a lot of things he can't do on the basketball court. He's an elite level athlete with a good frame who can run and jump. He's certainly one of the top players in the state if not the top player in the state, in our opinion. Arizona State was heavily after him as well as other Pac-12 schools."

**Hopkins' take:** "I feel like I fit in with the team and I love the campus • I just like the school in general."

**TRE'SHAUN FLETCHER**

Position: Wing • Height: 6-6 Weight: 195  
 High School: Lincoln (Tacoma, Wash.)

**Vital stats/storylines:** In his junior season, was named MVP of the Narrows League, as well as first team all-are and second-team all-state • Averaged 18 points, 11 rebounds and five assists in Lincoln's 18-8 season • Rivals.com rated him a three-star prospect • Scholarship offers came from Arizona State, Washington State, UCLA, Boise State, Cal Poly, Gonzaga, Oregon State and Santa Clara • Played AAU ball with the Northwest Panthers, whose coach, Gary Ward, called Fletcher "a legitimate 6-foot-6 with a 6-foot-9 wingspan • Multi-skilled, played some one, some two and some three (positions). Ward also described Fletcher as "crafty" and "sometimes a little too unselfish, he is a really good player."

**CU scouting report:** Lefthander with a great skill package • More of a true wing • Handles ball well and shoots well.

**Boyle's take:** "He's really a good passer for his position. He's long, athletic, runs the floor well and is great in transition. We think he'll fit in very well with what we're looking to do here. Bottom line is, he can do a lot different things to help you win."

**Fletcher's take:** "I feel like Colorado is a good fit for me. I love the coaches, the players and the system. I feel like I am a very versatile player. I can guard positions one through three, I can shoot it, I can dribble it and I can pass it. I think colleges like my length, too. I can get in and bang with the fours and fives, too. I just need to put on a little bit more muscle and get my dribbling better and I will be set."

**DUSTIN THOMAS**

Position: Combo forward • Height: 6-7 Weight: 210  
 High School: Pleasant Grove (Texarkana, Texas)

**Vital stats/storylines:** Pleasant Grove won 29 games last season, with Thomas a big reason for the success • He was 3A Region II District 15 MVP after averaging 20 points, 14 rebounds, five assists and five steals • Made an astounding 48 percent of his three-point attempts • Rivals.com ranks him as a three-star prospect • Schools offering him a scholarship included Oklahoma, Texas-Arlington and Lehigh, with interest being shown by Kansas State, Texas, SMU and Tulsa • Pleasant Grove coach Billy Brewer said Thomas is very comfortable shooting from behind the arc: "Three-point range is pretty easy for him. We run a motion offense and we are going to run until they get the ball in his hands • Dustin can also dribble penetrate and he can go in the post. He can do whatever he wants to do so we try to get the ball in his hands."

**CU scouting report:** At 6-7, probably not as explosive or as athletic as Andre Roberson, but shoots the ball extremely well from the perimeter and can put the ball on the floor • Can play inside and out • Plays with extraordinary energy and can rebound.

**Boyle's take:** "The thing that makes Dustin special is his love for the game, his motor. And shooting, he can really stroke it. But what sets him apart is his love for the game. Every time I talk to him he's going to the gym or on his way back. There's not a day that goes by that he's not trying to get better as a basketball player. I think if anything we've got to kind of tone him down a little; he loves the game and his desire to be great is unquestionable."

**Thomas' take:** "Going up there (to visit Boulder), I didn't know what to expect. Everything about Colorado was perfect. It is like a big family out there. At first, I didn't even think Colorado would have been where I would choose to go. But once I got out there, it completely turned my impression about it. I loved everything about it. The players made me feel like family. The coaching staff was just real up front and I trust them • They won the Pac-12 last year and you can tell the fans really show them a lot of love. It is just real fun to be around it and I wanted to be a part of that."

**ANDRE & ARIELLE:** The Roberson's are the only brother/sister tandem on the 2012-13 basketball rosters from the same school in the Pac-12 Conference. They're one of five brother/sister tandems on 2012-2013 basketball rosters in Division I. The Big Ten has two tandems, followed by one each in the ACC, Mountain West and the Pac-12 Conferences. CU has another brother/sister pair on the ski team with freshmen Maria and Gustav Nordstrom from Sweden.

**DID YOU KNOW?** CU is 6-2-3 against Pac-12 opponents in its history. The Buffs hold winning records in the all-time series against Arizona (10-6), Arizona State (4-2), Oregon (5-3), Oregon State (7-3), Utah (23-15), and Washington State (2-1). They're tied with California (10-10), USC (3-3) and Washington (7-7). CU has losing records against UCLA (1-5) and Stanford (3-9).

**BUFFS IN THE NBA:** For the first time ever, four former CU basketball players are on opening day NBA rosters in 2012. Chauncey Billups (Clippers), Alec Burks (Jazz), Cory Higgins (Bobcats) and Chris Copeland (Knicks). Copeland played at CU from 2002-06. Last year, Billups, Burks and Higgins were the first CU trio since the 1992-93 season when Matt Bullard, Jay Humphries, Alex Stivrins were on NBA rosters.

**CENTENNIAL STATE:** There are six freshmen on the 2012-13 roster, three of them from the Centennial State. The class is believed to be the best men's basketball class ever formed at CU • ESPN has ranked the class No. 22 • The six freshmen are the third most on any CU roster at one time.

**CALIFORNIA + CU = BUFFS:** The CU men's basketball team have five student-athletes from the state of Colorado and four from California, the most ever on a CU men's basketball roster from those two states combined since 1982-83. The five Colorado players match the most on a roster at one time since the 1992-93 season.

**CU/EUROPEAN TRIP:** For the second time in its history, the CU men's basketball team traveled to Europe and played a five-game exhibition tour (August 13-22) going 2-3. The Buffs played twice in Paris; twice in Belgium and once in Holland. The last time CU took an international trip was May 20-30, 1997 when then-CU head coach Ricardo Patton went 2-2 against teams from England and Germany. In September of 2006, Patton took his team to Vancouver, British Columbia for three games (3-0 record). Later that season, CU went 20-10 and lost in the first round of the NIT.

**WHY CU AND NOT UC?** A question often asked of many former Big Eight schools: Why is it the University of Colorado, but the moniker is CU and not UC? (The same applies at Kansas—KU, Missouri—MU, Nebraska—NU and Oklahoma—OU). "Mid-western casualness," said CU historian, the late Fred Casotti. It has always been this way at Colorado, for whatever reason, and at the other four—but seemingly nowhere else in the USA (except for Tulsa, but its midwest, too). In the 1950s, there was a concerted effort to eliminate the use of "CU" on the Boulder campus, both as a symbol and in speech, but Casotti said that no one would buy into it. "Nobody would change," he said. "It's easier to say than U of C, UC sounds like slang or something (as in 'you see'), and it was traditional. By trying to eliminate it, they reinforced it."

"Tad Boyle, Colorado. The Buffaloes' prospects begin with the best-kept secret in college basketball: Andre Roberson, a 6-7 jumping jack who was the nation's third-leading rebounder last season (11.1 per game) while leading the Pac-12 in blocks (1.9). Roberson's improvement enabled the Buffaloes to win the Pac-12 tournament and reach the NCAA tournament for the first time in nine years. While Colorado lost three starters, it is bringing back its three most talented players in Roberson, 6-5 sophomore guard Spencer Dinwiddie and 6-1 sophomore

guard Askia Booker. "We'll be more talented, but not as experienced," Boyle said. Six freshmen have also entered the program, most notably Josh Scott, a 6-10 forward from Colorado Springs who Boyle said "can really score it"; and Xavier Johnson, a 6-7 forward who played at Mater Dei High in southern California. Looking ahead, one of the main questions that needs to be answered is whether Roberson can provide leadership that is commensurate with his talent. "You always want your best player to do that," Boyle said. "In the past he has led by example, but he's not the most vocal person in the world. We've been talking to him this summer about doing that." If Roberson can find his voice, then the Buffaloes will be ready to make some noise in the much-improved Pac-12.

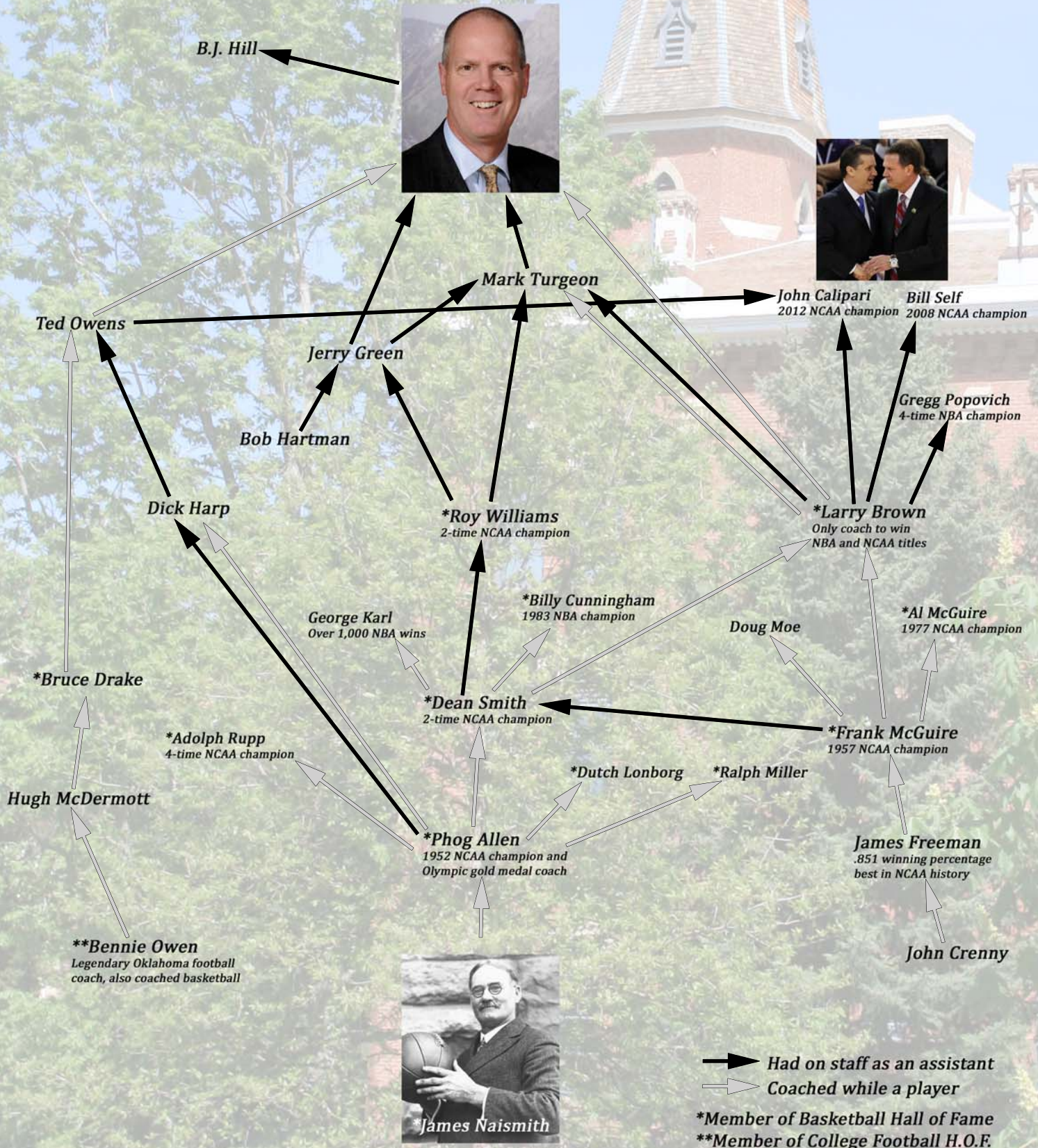

The shortest route tracing Boyle back to the game's inventor is only four generations (going either from Larry Brown to Dean Smith to Phog Allen to Naismith, or from Ted Owens to Dick Harp to Allen to Naismith). Boyle is a direct descendant of seven members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame as well as a charter member of the College Football Hall of Fame.
