STARTERS: In the history of the Coors Events Center (1979-80), the Buffs have now defeated nine top 10 ranked teams (AP poll) in the building's history. With the Buffs 71-58 win over No. 9 Arizona, three of those nine wins have been come under Tad Boyle. The Buffs defeated No. 5 Texas and No. 8 Missouri in 2010-11.

- The Buffs have defeated two or more ranked teams eight times in the history of the AP poll, and three of those eight streaks have come under Tad Boyle. The longest streak is three games, accomplished twice, first spanning two seasons from December 12, 1960 to January 6, 1962; and then again in the 1991-92 season from February 5-19.

- Only four times have the Buffs defeated three or more ranked teams in the same season, with two of those four seasons coming under Tad Boyle in the last three years. The Buffs defeated four ranked teams in both 2002-03 and then again in 2010-11, and have three such wins in 1991-92 and this season.

- The Buffs have now defeated 52 ranked teams (AP poll) in its history dating back to 1949-50. Tad Boyle now has eight wins over ranked teams.

THE GRIND: Since college basketball expanded schedules to encompass 25 or more games, game numbers 18 through 24 haven't always been that kind to Colorado. In fact, on only seven occasions have the Buffs won as many as five games in that particular seven-game stretch. CU's 71-58 win over No. 9 Arizona gave Tad Boyle's Buffaloes a 6-1 mark in games 18-24 for the 2012-13 season, accomplished just two previous times in CU history, during the 1954-55 and 1961-62 seasons. On four other occasions, the Buffs went 5-2 in the 18-24 window (1962-63, 1966-67, 2003-04 and 2011-

12); CU won game No. 25 in all six previous seasons to move to 7-1 or 6-2 in the 18-to-25 game block, but lost game No. 26 in the four seasons that had that many games ('62, '63, '04 and '12).

• The Buffs are now 3-2 against ranked teams this season. Since 1961-62, the Buffs have not had a winning record against ranked teams in the same season. The 2002-03 Buffs were 4-4 (.500) against ranked teams. Also, in 1960-61, CU was 2-0 and in 1961-62, the Buffs won their only match up against a ranked team. Finally, the 1963-64 Buffs were 1-1 against ranked teams.

LEADER ON THE GLASS: Andre Roberson has eight games this season with at least 10 rebounds, two steals and two blocks in the same game. That total is twice as many as any other player in college this season and even more impressively, that total also matches the most in the NBA this season in half the number of games played. Roberson's eight such instances in 23 games matches Josh Smith (Atlanta Hawks), who has played 46 games while Joakim Noah (Chicago Bulls) has six in 46 games. No other NBA player has more than four, and those with four include the likes of Dwight Howard and Tim Duncan.

CLOSER TO 1,000 REBOUNDS: With 13 rebounds against Arizona Thursday night, Andre Roberson has 978 rebounds heading into tonight's game. He moved past Cliff Meely, (1968-71, 971) for second place on the all-time rebounding list. Roberson needs 77 rebounds to break Stephane Pelle (pay-lay) to become CU's all-time leader on the glass (1999-2003, 1,054).

SINGLE-DIGIT TURNOVERS: It's rare, however at Oregon State, the Buffs committed only nine of them. It's the second time CU committed single-digit turnovers this season, the other, only seven in the home win over Colorado State (Dec. 5).

CONFERENCE ROAD WARRIORS ... Colorado has won two straight conference games on the road; while not the loftiest of achievements, it hasn't been common at CU. Tad Boyle's teams have won two straight Pac-12 road games twice, something the Buffaloes managed only four times in the 15 years as a member of the Big 12. And in the 49 seasons Colorado was in the Big 7/Big 8 (1948-96), it won two straight league road games a grand total of 13 times.

Three Straight: Colorado last won three straight conference road games from Jan. 20-Feb. 10 2001 (at Texas Tech, Nebraska and Kansas State). The Buffs won three straight twice in the Big 12 and six times in the Big 7/Big 8.

Three of Four: CU has won three of its last four Pac-12 road games, the second time it has done that under Boyle. It did it twice in in the Big 12.

Four Straight: Colorado last won four straight conference road games in 1996-97 (at Missouri, Texas Tech, Baylor and Kansas State). It won four straight twice in the Big 7/Big 8 (1961-62, the last time it won as many as five in a row, and in 1963-64).

Four of Five: CU has won as many as four of five league road games just four times: 1996-97, 1963-64, 1961-62 (five in a row with a loss on either end) and 1954-55.

Five of Six: CU has done this just twice: in 1954-55 and 1961-62.

HOME COURT: Colorado is 10-1 at home this season and 42-5 (.894) at the Coors Events Center under the Boyle coaching staff • CU has played in front of 10,000 fans in attendance nine of 11 home games (largest crowd a school record vs. Colorado State: 11,708; smallest vs. Texas Southern: 8,325).

- 11,708 against CSU was the most attended game - men's or women's at the CEC.

- 14 sellouts (2012-13: 5; 2010-11: 5; 2011-12: 4). CU is 12-2 in those games.

- Nine of 11 home games have exceeded 10,000 fans.

- CU sold out the home/season opener with 10,611 in attendance. It was also the largest non-conference home crowd (essentially in school history) to see a season/home opener.

- CU's home win over California (70-57) on Senior Day (Feb. 26, 2012) was the 500th game at the Coors Events Center.

- Two conference attendance seasons under Boyle: 9,809 (2010-11) and 9,160 (2011-12), first time 9k in back-to-back seasons.

- The men's basketball team is 355-156 (.695) at the Events Center in 35 seasons.

- According to *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, CU went from 4,637 fans in 2009 to 7,804 in 2012 for a 68 percent increase. The 68 percent makes CU the biggest gainers in attendance and a No. 1 ranking. Among the top 10 schools listed, CU is the only Pac-12 school that improved in attendance, while five Pac-12 schools decreased in attendance.

- In 2011-12, CU set a school-record for conference total attendance (82,442) breaking the 2010-11 total of 78,472.

- CU set a school-record for average attendance (7,804), breaking the 2010-11 total of 7,014.

AGAINST NO. 9/9 ARIZONA:

XAVIER JOHNSON (19 PTS, 9 REB) The true freshman from Los Angeles (Mater Dei) had a career-high 19 points, eclipsing the 18 he scored in CU's last home game against Cal; in his last three home games he is averaging 16.0 points on 19-of-27 FG shooting. He matched his first half career best for scoring with 12 points (on 5-7 FG/2-3 FT), his second most for any half, and tied for his second most boards in a either half (5).

ANDRE ROBERSON (7 PTS, 13 REB, 2 STL) With 13 rebounds, he now has 978 career rebounds (280 this season); he moved into second place all-time, passing Cliff Meely (971 from 1968-71). He now trails only Stephane Pelle (1,054 from 1999-2003). The 280 boards are the 14th most in a single-season, of which he also owns the most (401 last year) and 297 in 2010-11. Meely and Shaun Vandiver (1988-91) are the only others in the top 15 three different seasons. He is now averaging 11.7 per game (280 in 24 games), tied for first nationally entering tonight.

SPENCER DINWIDDIE (21 PTS, 7 AST) He scored 20 or more points in back-to-back games for the second time in his career (had a run of three straight earlier this season); it was his sixth 20-plus point career game. He was 9-of-9 from the free throw line, the seventh time in his career he was perfect with five or more tries and the most he has attempted without a miss; for the season, he is 129-of-162 (a team-best 79.6 percent). He added a career-high seven assists as well, topping six he had on two previous occasions.

Coming off the Oregon State game where he set the record for the most points ever in a CU "Perfect Game" (24; 6-6 FG, 4-4 3Pt, 8-8 FT) he made 16 straight shots (6 FG/10 FT): he missed his last two shots at Oregon and made his first two tonight before missing a tip on an offensive rebound. He has now made **18** consecutive free throws.

SUN DEVILS UP CLOSE: After starting non-conference off successfully (11-2 record) and winning their first three Pac-12 games, Arizona State has struggled off late, losing three of its last four, and five of its last nine games. ASU lost at Utah, 60-55 on Wednesday dropping its conference road record to 2-3. Jahii Carson leads two others in double figures at 17.6 points per game (5.0 apg.), while Jordin Bachynski continues to be one of the top shot blockers in the nation at 3.8 a game.

HOLDING OPPONENT UNDER 50: CU has held three opponents (Oregon: 47; Washington State: 49; Fresno State: 43 points) to under 50 points in a game this season. It's the ninth time a Boyle coached CU team has allowed the opponent under 50 points. In 2011-12, Buffaloes defense held the opponent under 50 points, six times.

50-YEAR REUNION: 1961-62 & '62-'63 CU Basketball Big 8 Championship teams: Not only to both of these teams win Conference championships but they left their mark on CU Basketball history. Coached by the legendary Sox Walseth, the 1961-62 team went 11-0 at home and 13-1 in conference play. They became only the 2nd team in CU history to win 19 games, including a 10 point rally over Kansas in the final 4 minutes which clinched the Big 8 Conference title for the Buffs. The team advanced to the Midwest Regional Championship game before they lost to the defending national champions, Cincinnati.

The '62-'63 team had an almost identical season as they also finished with 19 wins and an undefeated home record which lead them to their second straight Big 8 title. The Buffs would again advance to the Midwest Regional championship before falling to familiar foe, Cincinnati.

TRENDS: Spencer Dinwiddie has led the Buffs in scoring 10 times; Askia Booker seven times (including one shared); Josh Scott five times • Andre Roberson has led the Buffs in rebounding in every game except twice this season, both other times were Xavier Johnson • Dinwiddie led in assists 13 times (one shared) • Roberson in steals 14 times (five shared) and blocks 17 times (six shared).

TIED #1 NATIONALLY: As of Friday, he's currently tied at 11.7 per game with O.D. Anosike, Siena at 11.7. Entering tonight's game, Dre's career totals are 10.0 rpg., 9.4 ppg., 1.5 spg., 1.5 bpk. **Pac-12 HALL OF FAME:** The Pac-12 Conference will honor 11 former student-athletes and one former coach with their induction into the Pac-12 Men's Basketball Hall of Honor. 300 POINTS... AGAIN: Last season, Spencer Dinwiddie (360 pts.) and Askia Booker (317 pts.) became CU's most potent freshman duo ever establishing a school record 677 points. This year, the two have already surpassed 300 points each (684). Dinwiddie (361, 15.0 ppg.) and Booker (323, 13.5 ppg.). They're also one-two in assists and 3-pointers made.

ONE-TWO BACKCOURT: CU sophomores Askia Booker and Spencer Dinwiddie are one of the best guard tandems nationally, ranking third out of five sophomore backcourts in leading their respective teams in points per game. With a combined 28.5 points per game, they are the only combo guard duo from the list leading their team in scoring, assists and three-pointers made.

Cliff Meely (2), Jamahl Mosley (2) • Roberson is the first CU player to grab that many multiple times since Mosley accomplished it twice during the 2000-2001 season (vs. Missouri, vs. Baylor at Kansas City). Prior to Mosley, it hadn't happened since Meely did it in during the 1969-70 and 1970-71 seasons. Roberson and Mosley are the only two players to accomplish the feat in the past 43 years.

FIVE PLAYERS IN DOUBLE FIGURES:

Against Stanford (Jan. 24), all five CU starters scored over 10 points for the first time since Jan. 5, 2009 in a 70-67 loss at SMU. In that game against the Mustangs, CU starters scored 62 of 67 points. Against Stanford, the Buffs accounted for 60 of the team's 75 points.

10+ PPG.: In each season under Coach Boyle, the Buffs have had four players average in double figures. This year, Spencer Dinwiddie (15.0), Askia Booker (13.5), Josh Scott (11.8) and Andre Roberson (10.4). Last year, Carlon Brown, Andre Roberson, Austin Dufault, and Nate Tomlinson ended the season averaging 10 or more a game; and in 2010-11, Alec Burks, Cory Higgins, Levi Knutson and Marcus Relphorde averaged over 10 a game.

CLEANING GLASS: For the first time in his career, Askia Booker led the Buffs in rebounds with seven, tying Andre Roberson for the team-high at Washington State. It's only the third time someone else this season has led CU on the glass. Against Texas Southern, Roberson tied with Josh Scott (w/ 12); in the season opener against Wofford, freshman Xavier Johnson led everyone with eight. Even though he shared team honors twice, Roberson has the Buffs in rebounding in each game with the exception of one game (19 times w/ two shared). Roberson's longest streak is 19-straight, the last 19 games of last season.

NATIONALLY RANKED: 2 WEEKS: The Buffs were ranked nationally for two weeks coming in at No. 23 in the Associated Press poll (Nov. 19-25) and No. 19 in both polls (Nov. 26-Dec. 2). The No. 23 ranking was the first time the program has been ranked in a major poll since earning back-to-back No. 25 rankings in the Coaches Poll during the 2005-06 season. In the AP poll, it is the first ranking since appearing at No. 24 in the final poll of the 1996-97 season, when Chauncey Billups led the Buffs to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

FAST STARTS: Colorado got off to tremendous starts in both games on this trip to Arizona; Back on Jan. 3 against Arizona, CU led 21-7 with just under nine minutes left in the first half, and in Tempe (Jan. 6) against Arizona State, CU led 20-7 with nine minutes left in the opening stanza; combined, that's 41-14 out of the gate in the Grand Canyon state.

CU vs. Pac-12: CU has a winning record against most of the conference: 6-3-2 in its history. The Buffs hold winning records in the all-time series against Arizona (11-7), Arizona State (4-3), California (11-10), Oregon (6-3), Oregon State (8-3), USC (4-3), Utah (23-15), and Washington State (3-1). They trail with losing records against UCLA (2-6), Washington (7-8), and Stanford (4-9).

SHARING THE BALL: CU recorded 39 assists in its last two non-conference games (Hartford, Northern Arizona), the best two-game total since 23 assists in each game against The Citadel & Longwood (2010-11), Coach Boyle's first season at CU.

Roberson's improvement enabled the Buffaloes to win the Pac-12 tournament and reach the NCAA tournament for the first time in nine years. While Colorado lost three starters, it is bringing back its three most talented players in Roberson, 6-5 sophomore guard Spencer Dinwiddie and 6-1 sophomore

guard Askia Booker. "We'll be more talented, but not as experienced," Boyle said. Six freshmen have also entered the program, most notably Josh Scott, a 6-10 forward from Colorado Springs who Boyle said "can really score it"; and Xavier Johnson, a 6-7 forward who played at Mater Dei High in southern California. Looking ahead, one of the main questions that needs to be answered is whether Roberson can provide leadership that is commensurate with his talent. We've been talking to him this summer about doing that." If Roberson can find his voice, then the Buffaloes will be ready to make some noise in the much-improved Pac-12.

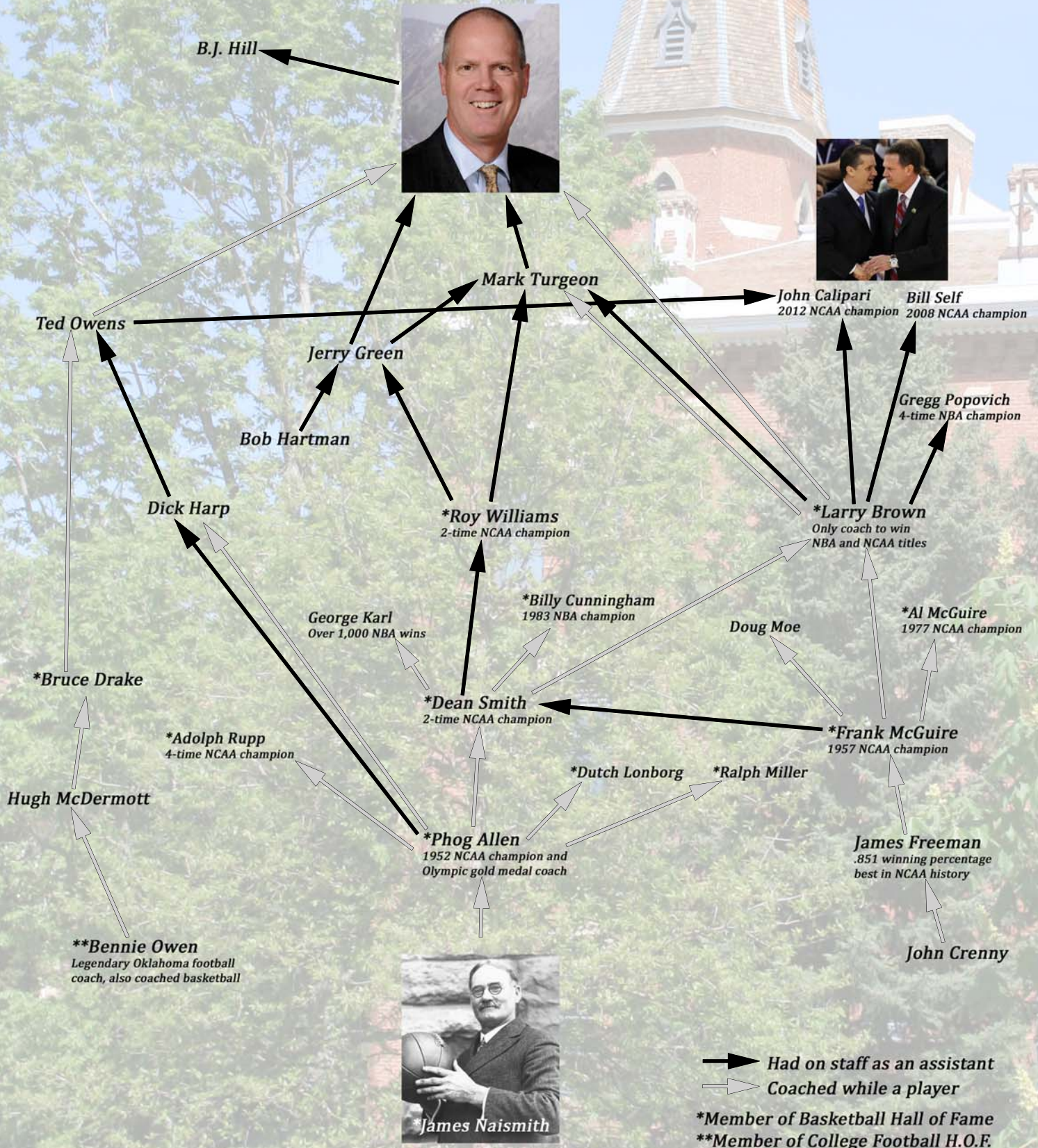

- Ranked second (trailing only Kansas' Thomas Robinson, a consensus All-America selection) in defensive rebound percentage (29.6 percent) as calculated by Ken Pomeroy (kenpom.com). Defensive rebound percentage is the percentage of possible defensive rebounds a player gets.

2011-12 (SOPHOMORE)

- Set the CU single-season rebounding record (401) breaking 58-year old mark previously set by Burdette Haldorson (1954-55).
- Set the single-season defensive rebounding record (290) breaking the 225 by Shaun Vandiver (1989-90), 23 years ago.
- Shattered sophomore season record for most rebounds (401) topping old mark of 337 (Cliff Meely in 1968-69, 44 years ago).
- First CU player to average a double-double for the entire season (11.6 ppg., 11.1 rpg.) since Stephane Pelle (2001-02; 12.8 ppg., 10.8 rpg.).
- His 11.1 rpg. was the highest since Shaun Vandiver hauled in 11.2 per in 1989-90.
- 12th player in school history to lead the team in rebounding in back-to-back seasons, but only the second since 1994 (joining Stephane Pelle in 2001-02, 2002-03).

- 67 blocked shots, the most in a season since David Harrison had 85 in 2003-04.

PAC-12 (ALL GAMES)

- Tied for first in blocked shots per game (1.9).
- Only player to average a double-double among all players in the Pac-12 (all games & conference-only games).

PAC-12 (CONFERENCE ONLY)

- First in rebounding (10.9 rpg.), first in blocked shots (2.3 bpg.), first in defensive rebounds (8.2), second in offensive rebounds (2.8).
- Averaged more defensive rebounds per game (8.1) in all games than any other player in the Pac-12 averaged total rebounds per game.
- Seven blocks against Oregon (Feb. 4) is the second highest for the season in the conference, and the most by a CU player since David Harrison had seven on Feb. 18, 2004 vs. Texas Tech. Of his 67 blocks on the season, 37 have resulted in a defensive rebound for CU (55.2 percent).
- Helped CU rank first in defensive rebounds (25.9 rpg.); first in defensive rebounding percentage (.731).
