



2010 COLORADO FOOTBALL / SPRING GAME NOTES

April 10, 2010 (Folsom Field, 1:30 p.m.)

Quickly Today marks the third and final major scrimmage of the spring, as CU has scrimmaged on March 18 and April 2 prior to today; combined stats from both attached (the April 2 affair was more situational which is reflected in the stats) ... The Buffs have also scrimmaged regularly at times during most of the practices, especially dealing with the red zone and situational scrimmages ... Spring practice was again split before and after spring break for the fifth time in six years, with seven practices prior to the March 22-26 break and eight, including today, after; drills started on Saturday, March 6, the earliest known start in school history ... CU coach **Dan Hawkins** is wrapping up his fifth spring practice session; he indicated that captains would not be selected until the fall ... There are about 125 football alumni in town rekindling friendships and taking part in the annual favorite events (Friday golf, evening reception, Saturday breakfast, etc.). **Solomon Wilcots** was the featured alumni speaker at this morning's breakfast.

Format The format today will be close to that of a regular game, with the following exceptions: there will be no kickoffs/returns, the ball will be spotted at either the 20- or 35-yard line after scores (at the 35 if the receiving team is behind); there will be live punts, rushing the punter allowed, but no returns—the ball will be dead at the spot the ball is caught or downed; no rushing allowed on field goals; quarterbacks are live and a 25/40 second play clock. If the game is tied at the end of four (10-minute) quarters, there will be overtime. Halftime will be 20 minutes.

Late Number Change One last minute number change: **TE Joe Fleming** will wear No. **45** today for the Gold team (instead of No. 42).

Media Guide Update The NCAA will decide at its April meetings this Monday or Tuesday the fate of media guides. They are looking at two proposals, one to eliminate them altogether, and two, to allow the printing of guides but they cannot be mailed to recruits or used in any recruiting activity. The Pac-10 is pushing the first, the SEC the second. CU is pulling for the SEC proposal for printed guides to be allowed.

➤ **Post-Spring Surgeries** Knock on wood, only **PK Aric Goodman** is looking at surgery to heal a chronic hip malady.

Head Coach Dan Hawkins **Dan Hawkins** has completed four seasons as head coach of the University of Colorado football program, and his ninth overall as a FBS/Division I-A head coach and 15th as a collegiate head coach. He owns a **16-33** record at Colorado, along with a **69-44** record in the Division I-A ranks (53-11 at Boise State) and an overall career mark of **108-56-111** including five years at NAIA Willamette (Ore.) College. In his final year at Willamette (1997), his team posted a 13-1 record, falling in the NAIA Championship game, before he moved on to Boise State where he was assistant head coach under Dirk Koetter for three seasons. At BSU, he coached the tight ends and special teams while coordinating recruiting; when Koetter left BSU for Arizona State after the 2000 season, Hawkins was promoted to head coach. He took the Broncos to four bowl games in five years, with his 2004 team compiling an 11-0 regular season mark and ascending to No. 10 in the national polls; in the most anticipated non-BCS bowl game to date, Boise State dropped a thriller to No. 7 Louisville, 44-40. In the modern history of Division I-A football, only three coaches won more games in their first five seasons than Hawkins (53, bested by Bob Pruett, Marshall; Bob Stoops, Oklahoma; and Pete Carroll, USC). **Hawk's Handiwork:**

Wireless & Ethernet Info Several stadiums have had wireless issues within the recent year; Invesco Field at Mile High did away with it all together. At Folsom Field, some problems have been traced to iPod and other electronic use in the stands, which have caused users to be kicked off the system. To help battle these issues, CU Information Technology has installed a new wireless network (or SSID) strictly for the **Fred Casotti Press Box**. Media should select the wireless network **PBNET** and follow the instructions below. Returning media should disconnect from **UCB WIRELESS** and connect to **PBNET**. Additionally, there are several Ethernet connections along the first row, with a connection box complete with cords every three or four seats. There is one thing all should be aware of: you will be going through the CU system to access the Internet, so you will need to have the latest virus protection software and all windows updates should be installed to protect both our system and your laptops (otherwise, you may not attain access).

Instructions are provided below, at the locales, we also have ITS personnel on hand; the access codes for this season (**2009-10**) are: **Login**—confatha / **Password**— NVgERcFS

Spring Game Attendance The last two seasons, former head coach **Bill McCartney** spearheaded the challenge at CU's annual recruiting luncheon in Denver to help fill Folsom Field for the spring game. The challenge worked to the point where CU had its all-time spring record of 17,800 in 2008 and its third largest (11,700) last year, which competed with the third game of the Denver Nuggets-New Orleans Hornets playoff series as well as the first day of the NFL Draft. There are no such conflicts today, but since admittance to the game is free and there is no hard ticket, CU officials are never really sure what to expect. Below are the top six CU spring game crowds in the school's history (#—first team Varsity and Alumni were on the same team and wore black jerseys):

In Hawk's first fours, the spring game has attracted 41,700 spectators (10,425 per), including **6,400** in 2006 (cloudy skies, temperature in the low 50s, very windy) and **5,800** in 2007 (perfect weather, 60 degrees, clear skies, just a bit windy at times). The 2008 crowd of **17,800** gathered on a sunny, 77 degree afternoon, while '09 crowd attended despite 40-degree temperatures and a light drizzle much of the day.

2010 COLORADO FOOTBALL LETTERMAN ANALYSIS

Colorado has 55 lettermen returning for 2010, including 28 on offense, 26 on defense and one specialist; the Buffs lost 20 lettermen off the 2009 squad (eight offense, nine defense, three specialists) plus two more on defense from 2008. CU returns 16 starters from last season (9 offense, 7 defense) and loses six (2 offense, 4 defense); several positions had multiple personnel shuttle in and out, so these numbers aren't truly reflective of the experience returning. The 2009 starters are listed in bold, and (*) denotes letters earned primarily on special teams. The breakdown:
