QUICKLY: CU and Baylor played their first-ever meeting March 23, 1946 back in the NCAA Tournament taking a 59-44 victory in the Western Regional third place game in Kansas City • CU has won back-to-back 24 win seasons for the first time ever (both by head coach Tad Boyle) • The 48 wins is also a two-year best.

MARCH MADNESS: During the month of March, CU is 5-2 outscoring the opponent 65.3-to-64.3 on 45.7 FG shooting (allowing oppt. 42%). Carlton Brown is averaging 19.5 ppg. on 51.8 field goal shooting. Andre Roberson is averaging 13.9 ppg. and 10.6 rpg., and is shooting 61.4 from the field • UNLV & Baylor in three days will be CU's first NCAA tournament games in the Mountain Time Zone. In fact, it is CU's first NCAA tournament game west of Stillwater, Okla.

6 vs. 11: Since the NCAA tournament expanded to 64 teams in 1985, No. 11 seeds are 37-73 (.336) against No. 6 seeds. The No. 11 seeds are 11-23 (.323) against No. 3 seeds.

FRESHMAN TAMDENS: Spencer Dinwiddie and Askia Booker are the first two CU freshmen in school history with at least 300 points in their initial season (turn to page 3 for more breakdown of the two).

ROB-ER-SON: Over the past two seasons, CU is 16-4 when Andre Roberson grabs 12+ rebounds in a game • Against UNLV, he grabbed 16 boards, the fourth time this season with at least 16 in a game (CU is 4-0). Roberson is the first CU sophomore ranking in the rebounding top-10 (ninth place 690). He's fifth nationally with 20 double-doubles (third all-time at CU). CU is 15-5 in those contests. His 25 career doubles, ranks ninth all-time.

FIVE-STRAIGHT: CU has won five straight games the first time this late in the season. Back in 1962-63 from Feb. 23-Mar. 15 CU won five in a row, then lost to Cincinnati in the NCAA Tournament.

FOUR IN FOUR: CU became the first team to win four games in Pac-12 Conference Tournament history, and just the ninth team from the "big six" conferences to do so since 1952. Here is a look at those other eight and how they fared in the NAAs:

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT MOP: Carlton Brown was named the Pac-12 Tournament's Most Outstanding Player after averaging 15.8 points per game on 25-of-50 (50.0 percent) shooting in CU's four wins in four days. Brown also averaged 4.8 rebounds per game and had nine steals in Los Angeles.

• Against California in the semifinals, Brown had a breakaway windmill dunk that served as an exclamation point in the final minute of CU's victory. The play was No. 4 on SportsCenter's Top Ten plays of the day. Brown also had a highlight reel dunk in the final minute of the title game against Arizona, CU's final bucket of the game in a two-point victory which also snapped a streak of 8:19 without a field goal for the Buffs.

• Brown has played in the Big Dance before as while he was playing for Utah in 2009, he was a member of a No. 5 seed that lost 84-71 to Arizona in the first round (he exacted a personal measure of revenge on the Wildcats when the Buffs defeated them in the Pac-12 title game). Brown scored seven points on 3-of-8 shooting and had six assists and four rebounds in 27 minutes of action. Jeremy Adams was a member of Texas A&M's 2010 NCAA tournament team that advanced to the Round of 32, but did not play as he was redshirting that season.

ROBERSON LEAVING HIS MARK

• Against Utah in the Pac-12 Tournament, Andre Roberson surpassed the legendary Burdette Haldorson for most rebounds in a single season in CU history. Haldorson held the mark for 57 years, set during the Buffs' last trip to the Final Four:

• When Roberson is on the court, **20.7 percent** of all defensive possessions end because of Roberson's efforts (through either defensive rebound, block that results in a defensive rebound for CU, or steal). For a measure of comparison, the identical formula was used to calculate defensive possessions brought to a stop by Kentucky's Anthony Davis, widely regarded as the nation's best defensive player. Davis brings 21.5 percent of UK's defensive possessions to an end when he is on the floor, ahead but comparable to Roberson:

(Notes: Data for Davis' blocks that change possession come from SI.com's Luke Winn and his "Anthony Davis Swatmap" in his Feb. 16 Power Rankings—percentage of blocks UK gained possession on projected forward to account for games since Feb. 16. Also, blocks by Roberson/Davis that were then rebounded by Roberson/Davis are double counted—as both a defensive rebound and a block resulting in a defensive rebound—in these percentages.)

• Roberson (first in Pac-12 in blocks, 12th in steals) is one of just two players, along with Washington's Terrence Ross, to be ranked in the top 12 in the conference in both blocks and steals for all games. His combined blocks and steals per game rank best in the conference in both Pac-12 games and overall:

• Roberson averaged more **defensive** rebounds per game (7.9) in all games than any other player in the Pac-12 averaged total rebounds per game.

• Roberson **ranks second in the nation** (trailing only Kansas' Thomas Robinson, a favorite for national player of the year honors) in defensive rebound percentage (29.9 percent) as calculated by Ken Pomeroy (kenpom.com). Defensive rebound percentage is the percentage of possible defensive rebounds a player gets.

• Roberson **ranks fifth nationally** (through games of Mar. 11) in rebounds per game with 11.2. Roberson trails the national leader (Siena's O.D. Anosike) by 1.4 rebounds per game, as he seeks to become the first Buff since 1982-83 (Jay Humphries in steals and Rob Gonzalez in free throw percentage) to lead the NCAA in a category. The highest finish for a CU player in rebounding was Alex Stivrins who finished sixth in the nation with an 11.7 average in the 1984-85 season.

• Roberson **led the conference** in blocked shots per game with 2.4 per conference game. His seven block performance against Oregon is the second highest for the season in the conference and the most by a CU player since David Harrison had seven on Feb. 18, 2004 vs. Texas Tech. Of his 64 blocks on the season, 35 have resulted in a defensive rebound for CU (54.7 percent).

• Roberson is 54th nationally with 1.9 blocks per game on the season, with that amount ranking 13th among players in the NCAA tournament.

- Spencer Dinwiddie ranks third among Pac-12 freshmen by averaging 10.2 points per game on the season. In addition, he ranks first among conference frosh (fourth overall) in free throw percentage (113-of-136, 83.1 percent) and three-point percentage (fourth overall; 41-of-94, 43.6 percent). In fact, Dinwiddie and Booker ranked first and second among Pac-12 freshmen in free throw percentage as Booker is 12th overall in the league, shooting 72-of-94, 76.6 percent from the line.

- Dinwiddie is the only Pac-12 freshman (and one of just four Pac-12 qualified players overall) to be shooting over 40 percent from the field, over 40 percent from beyond the three-point arc, and over 80 percent from the free throw line.

- Askia Booker has scored in double-digits 14 times this season with CU going 11-3 in those games.

- Nate Tomlinson ranked third in the Pac-12 in conference games in assist/turnover ratio in conference games at 2.2. For all games, he is sixth in the conference and 85th in the nation at 2.0 assists to turnovers. Among players in the NCAA tournament, Tomlinson ranks 36th in the category.

- Tomlinson only scored in double-digits once in the 2010-11 season, but has done so on eight occasions this season with CU going 6-2 in those games. Tomlinson has 22 games with 10+ points in his career.

- Of Tomlinson's 106 assists on the season, the beneficiaries are distributed as follows:

- Last season Roberson became just the third CU player to lead the team in rebounds, blocks, and steals in the same season, and he is duplicating that feat this season. In addition to his 11.1 boards per game, Roberson leads the team with 64 blocks and 41 steals. He would join Chauncey Billups and Matt Bullard as the only Buffs to lead the team in three categories (out of points, rebounds, assists, blocks, steals) in both his freshman and sophomore seasons.

- Through the first 72 games of Roberson's career, he is averaging 9.4 rebounds per game, ranking sixth highest per game in CU history. However, Roberson is averaging 14.5 rebounds per 40 minutes played which ranks best among all CU players since minutes began being recorded in 1978-79. The previous high is Stephane Pelle (1999-2003)

Tad Boyle Exceeding Expectations

- Colorado was picked to finish in a tie for 10th in the preseason Pac-12 poll. The Buffs ended the season tied for fifth place in the conference with their leap of five spots the largest in the Pac-12. Among the "big six" conferences, it is tied for the fifth largest improvement over preseason expectations and is the second largest outside of the 16-team Big East (through end of regular season):

- The Buffs have four players (Carlton Brown, Andre Roberson, Austin Dufault, Spencer Dinwiddie) averaging over 10.0 points per game this season with no player averaging more than 13.0 points. CU is the only team in the tournament to have such scoring balance to claim this. In addition, Askia Booker is averaging 8.9 points per game for the season.

- CU ranks 44th nationally and second among Pac-12 schools (through games of Mar. 11) in defensive field goal percentage by limiting opponents to 40.6 percent shooting from the field. In CU's 24 wins this season opponents are shooting just 36.7 percent, as opposed to 48.7 percent in the Buffs' 11 losses.

- When posting a better shooting percentage than their opponent, CU is **23-1** this season (lone loss coming at Oregon). Additionally, the Buffs are 16-2 this season when outrebounding the opposition. CU ranks 71st nationally (through games of Mar. 11) with a rebounding margin of +3.1 boards per game.

- CU is 12-3 this season when a player scores 10-or-more points off the bench (13 times by Askia Booker, once by both Booker and Jeremy Adams, once by Sabatino Chen).

Highest Scoring Freshman Duos

- Spencer Dinwiddie (10.2 points per game) and Askia Booker (8.7) have become the highest scoring freshman duo in CU history. Here is how the pair of California freshmen compares to other rookie duos at CU:

ROBERSON ON FIRE: Sophomore Andre Roberson shot 66.7 percent during the tournament (20-of-30). Roberson made 11 straight field goal attempts dating back to the game winning put back against Oregon in the quarterfinals. His streak ties for the third longest, and just one off the school record of 12 held by teammates House Guest and Shaun Vandiver one year apart. Roberson's 11 straight are the most on the road or at a neutral site. His 6-of-6 performance from the field against Cal, which included two 3-pointers, was a career-best percentage wise.

REBOUND REVERSAL: Colorado was outrebounded in its first three tournament games and held a minus 7.7 margin. Arizona was a plus 5.5 in its two games. In the championship game Colorado enjoyed a 37-29 edge on the boards. CU improved to 16-2 when outrebounding its opponent.

QUICK GAMERS: Spencer Dinwiddie made his first four three 3-point shots, including three in the first half, after going just 1-of-7 in the previous three tournament games... Colorado led at all four halftimes of the tournament, all by two points or less: 25-23 vs. Utah, 34-33 vs. Oregon, 28-27 vs. California and 30-28 vs. Arizona. The Buffaloes improve to 17-3 this year leading at half, 13-2 against Pac-12 opponents... Colorado scored only three points in the final 9:09 and was scoreless for a span of 8:46 where the score went from 50-38 to 51-45. CU missed seven shots in that span and the only point was an Andre Roberson free throw.

BUFFS IN THE NBA: For the first time since the 1992-93 season (Matt Bullard, Jay Humphries, Alex Stivrins), CU currently has three players on NBA rosters. Both Chauncey Billups and Alec Burks have recorded their season-highs in points playing back in Colorado at the Pepsi Center. Here is a look at how they are faring (through games of Mar. 11):

Chauncey Billups, Los Angeles Clippers

Billups was averaging 14.9 points and 4.0 assists per game in 20 outings for the Clippers before suffering a season-ending Achilles injury on Feb. 6 at Orlando. Billups scored a season-high 32 points in his return to Denver on Jan. 29, as he led L.A. to a 109-105 win over the Nuggets. On Jan. 22, he dished out 14 assists in the Clippers' win over Toronto; his highest total in a game since having 14 as a member of the Denver Nuggets on Dec. 2, 2008. On Jan. 18, "Mr. Big Shot" hit a three-pointer with 1.0 on the clock to give L.A. a 91-89 victory over Dallas.

Alec Burks, Utah Jazz

Burks is averaging 6.0 points in 12.8 minutes per game and has played in 35 of Utah's 40 games in his rookie season. On Feb. 28 he scored 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting and had three assists at Sacramento. He has scored in double-digits eight times (including three straight games from Jan. 15-Jan. 19) and set a career-high with 15 points (all coming in the fourth quarter) at Denver on Dec. 28.

Cory Higgins, Charlotte Bobcats

Higgins has played in 24 of the Bobcats' 39 games. He had a pair of 8-point performances in back-to-back games on Feb. 10 and 11. He scored a career-high 13 points at Washington on Jan. 25. Higgins notched consecutive double-digit scoring games on Jan. 21 and 22, scoring 10 points apiece against Chicago and New Jersey. Higgins is averaging 4.0 points and 11.4 minutes per game in his 24 appearances.

THIS & THAT: Two players from Boulder-area high schools have played at UNLV before careers in the NBA; Louis Amundson from Monarch High School (at UNLV from 2001-06) and Glen Gondrezick from Boulder High School (at UNLV from 1973-77).

THE FIVE-GAME RUN (PAC-12 TOURNAMENT + NCAA) / HIDDEN STAT

If it seems like Colorado has led most of the time in its five-game winning run this March, the numbers back it up. In the four Pac-12 Tournament games in Los Angeles and the NCAA second round in Albuquerque, the Buffaloes have led **80.7** percent of the time in the five games combined, with the games collectively tied just **6.8** percent; conversely, CU has trailed for only **12.5** of the time the entire five days. - In the 200 minutes in the five games, the scoring margin has been double figures for only **32:44** (all by CU, with the Buffs' large lead being 20 vs. UNLV); the Buffs largest deficit in the entire five-game run has been seven, and that was just on two occasions (and early both times: 11-4 to Utah, 13-6 to Oregon).
- CU's largest second half deficit has been just 3 points, on three occasions (62-59 to Oregon; 31-28 and 33-30 to California). CU has trailed for only 6:36 in the second half (and tied for 4:02; thus otherwise has led for **89:22** after intermission, or 89 percent of the time). UNLV never led, and the only tie was 0-0.

QUICKLY Colorado sold out its entire ticket allotment (just under 500, including 110 to students who bussed down from Boulder at 6 a.m.); all told, an estimated **2,500** CU fans were in attendance at "The Pit" ... Colorado is now **10-12** all-time in NCAA Tournament games; this was the first one of the 22 in either the Mountain or Pacific time zones ... The game was the last of the 16 in the second round to tip off (**8:34 p.m. MDT**) ... Colorado advanced to the second round (now third round) last in 1996-97, after pounding Indiana 80-62 (and ruining the intended second round match-up between Bob Knight and Dean Smith) ...

Colorado is now **24-11** on the season, matching the school record for wins in a season (CU was 24-14 last year) ... Under coach Tad Boyle, the Buffs are **10-2** in postseason play (6-1 in conference tournaments, 1-0 in the NCAA, 3-1 in the N.I.T.); that's the most wins by any CU coach in the postseason (old record: 8, Ricardo Patton) ...

This is the first time CU has won five straight games in succession away from Boulder, and the first time since the 1996-97 season that it has won five games in a row at any point during the season outside of the confines of the Coors Events Center.

Colorado, **14-2** at home this year, climbed to **10-9** outside of Boulder with tonight's win/loss ... This is the first time Colorado has won five straight games in the month of March (previously done four times: 1918-19, 1919-20, 2002-03, 2011-12) ... The **35** games played this year are second only to the 38 played during 2010-11 ... Pac-12 Commissioner **Larry Scott** was in attendance at the game, with two other commissioners based in Colorado (**Craig Thompson**, Mountain West and **Chuck Neinas**, interim-Big 12 who lives in Boulder) ...

Colorado's **27** first half rebounds tied for its most in a half this season (27 at USC, Jan. 26); **Andre Roberson** had nine ... Colorado's bench outscored UNLV's 13-6 in the first half (12-1 at one point, 19-16 for the game) ... UNLV shot a dismal 23-of-71, or 32.4 percent; that is the fourth worst by a CU opponent this year, and the worst by a team with a winning record ... It was the sixth time a CU foe shot 35.0 or lower ...

SERIES UNLV now leads the series by a **4-2** count, as this was the first meeting since Dec. 22, 1981, when the Buffs won 65-59 in Las Vegas to win the Rebel Classic. The Buffs are now **152-96** against the current members of the Mountain West.

VS. BAYLOR Colorado leads the series 15-9, including 4-1 on neutral courts; they have split the last 10 games. BU won the last outing, 70-66, in Waco on Jan. 29, 2011.

6 VS. 11'S Since the NCAA tournament expanded to 64 teams in 1985, No. 11 seeds are now **37-73** (.336) against No. 6 seeds; that includes tonight's result, and #6 Murray State's 58-41 win over #11 Colorado State earlier today (West Regional). No. 11 seeds are 11-23 against No. 3 seeds (Baylor in the #3 here).

TIME SPENT IN THE LEAD One of the reasons Colorado made its four-game run in the Pac-12 tournament was that it rarely played from behind (the Buffs led for 122 of 160 minutes, and were tied for 13 of the other 38). Tonight, CU led the entire game after scoring on its first possession (39:28); the only tie was 0-0.

FROSH IMPACT CU's freshman duo of **F Spencer Dinwiddie** and **G Askia Booker** added to their designation of the highest scoring frosh pair in CU history. Dinwiddie (**357** points) and Booker (**302**) have combined for **659** total points, well outdistancing all other rookie twosomes (the only two with 250-plus points).

TAKING GOOD CARE OF THE BALL Colorado averaged just 12.7 turnovers per game coming into tonight, but just 9.3 over the last

eight games (including six in single digits), with only 34 in the entire Pac-12 tournament (8.3 per). Tonight, CU did not commit a turnover in the first 6 minutes, but eventually went on to have a season-high 23 (old high was 20 against Texas Southern).

F ANDRE ROBERSON (12 PTS/16 REB/2 BLK) Roberson's 16 rebounds gives him **393** for the season, already the most in a single season in school history; that's an **11.2** per game average. He is the 12th player in school history to lead the team in rebounding in back-to-back seasons, but only the second since 1994 (joining **F Stephane Pelle** in ('01-02/'02-03). His 11.2 per game average is currently the highest since **C Shaun Vandiver** hauled in 11.2 per in 1989-90 (**F Alex Stivrins** hauled in 11.7 per in 1984-85).

—The top rebounders today in the NCAA were from the state of Colorado: **Pierce Hornung** had 17 in CSU's loss to Murray State, and Marquette's **Joe Crowder** matched Roberson with 16 in its win over BYU.

—This was his **20th** double-double of the season, tied for the third most in a single season in CU history (with Cliff Meely, '68-69); he trails the 21 by **C Burdette Haldorson** ('54-55) and Vandiver ('89-90); it was the **25th** of his career, tied for ninth most all-time at CU. —His **66** blocked shots are the most in a season since **C David Harrison** had 85 in 2003-04.

F AUSTIN DUFAULT (14 PTS/5 REB/1 AST) He now has **1,062** points and **527** rebounds as a Buffalo, the 19th player in CU history in the 1,000 point/500 rebound club for a career.

G ASKIA BOOKER (16 PTS/2 AST) He scored all 12 of his first half points in the second part of the first half, including 10 in a 12-4 CU run after UNLV had pulled to within 19-15. It was his third 10+ point scoring first half this year. Colorado is **11-3** when he scores in double figures.

G NATE TOMLINSON (2 PTS/2 AST/0 STL) Tomlinson now has **108** assists this season and **405** for his career (tied for sixth all-time with Donnie Boyce); he is the seventh player at Colorado to record 400 assists (all of whom also have 100 steals). He is 13th with **111** career steals.
