## NCAA Championships

### Quickly...

The 2012 NCAA Championships are here and the Buffs are crashing the party for the first time in program history. On the strength of a final round 9-under par 279, the Buffs went from a tie for ninth to finish fourth place at the NCAA West Regional May 10-12 at CU's Colorado National Golf Club. CU enters the championship as the No. 4 seed from the West Region after entering the regional as the No. 4 seed.

### Regional Recap...

The Buffs qualified for the NCAA Championships for the first time in school history in dramatic fashion, carding a 9-under par 279 and having all five players go under par for the first time in CU history to move from below the cut in a tie for ninth to finish fourth and just four strokes behind co-champions UCLA and LSU. CU's 9-under 279 was tied for the lowest team score in both the round (along with Pepperdine) and the entire field. The Buffs and Waves not only put up the best score in the West Regional, but the best team score in any of the three regional's in any round by three strokes as the two rounds were the only two out of the 216 team rounds that broke 280.

If there was one area of improvement for the Buffs in their final round, it was on the four Par 5 holes. As a team, the Buffs shot 8-over par on Day 1, 5-over on Day 2 and then scorched the Par-5 holes on the final day shooting 10-under par.

### CU vs. The Field...

The Buffaloes have played 19 of the 23 other teams at the NCAA Championships a total of 45 times and hold a 22-23 record (.489) record against the field. Of the four teams the Buffs have not faced, two are from the ACC with Virginia and N.C. State (the only other team making their NCAA Championship debut), along with Texas from the Big 12 and Purdue from the Big Ten. CU holds a 4-0 record over Stanford and 3-0 over Oklahoma while the top-ranked UCLA is 5-0 against CU, although the last two outings the Bruins are a combined seven strokes up on CU this post-season, and CU is 0-4 against Arizona State. ## Head Coach Anne Kelly • Coach of the Year Candidate

It's no coincidence that Colorado's climb as one of the top programs in the nation has coincided with the hiring of Anne Kelly as its second head coach in 1997.

In her 15th season as head coach of the Colorado women's golf team, Kelly and the Buffs took the challenge of entering the nation's toughest conference head-on, as the Buffs have made national waves in the first year of the newly expanded Pac-12 Conference and Kelly should be a leading candidate for both Pac-12 and national Coach of the Year honors, earning the program's first ever top 10 ranking and first trip to the NCAA Championships.

Kelly returned to her native Colorado from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, where she filled head coaching duties for one-and-a-half years. Prior to her work at UNC Greensboro, she spent five years from 1991-96 as a teaching professional at Silverbell Golf Course in Tucson, Ariz., where she earned PGA Class A status, a position which followed a six-year stint from 1984-90 on the LPGA Tour.

During her six seasons on the women's tour, Kelly won a Women's Professional Golf Tour event in Phoenix in 1991. She fired a career low round of 69 at the 1989 McDonald's Championship and her career best finishes included several top-20 finishes. Her professional career culminated in a career low scoring average of 74.63 in 1990.

Kelly sparkled as a collegiate golfer, earning four letters for head coach Fred Warren and the Texas Christian University women's golf team. She was a member of the Horned Frogs' 1983 NCAA Championship team, and, all told, won 25 tournament team titles during her four-year career from 1979-83. She was named the team's most valuable player in 1980 and won TCU's Dutch Meyer Award, which recognizes the school's outstanding student-athletes, in 1983. She also tied for top individual honors in the San Jose State Lady Spartan Classic in 1982. Her 1983 NCAA Championship team was inducted into the TCU Hall of Fame in October 2000.

"I love coaching because it allows me to combine my competitive experience and professional golf experience into one job," Kelly says. "All of my different experiences in golf help me to assist team members in whatever situation they might encounter."

At UNC Greensboro, Kelly was named the 1997 Big South Conference Coach of the Year after the team won two tournaments. She coached UNCG's Becky Morgan to five individual tournament titles and second-team All-America standing on the year and, under Kelly's tutelage, Morgan finished 10th individually at the 1997 NCAA Championships and also earned GTE Academic All-America honors. Morgan is now in her fifth year as an LPGA and European tour member.

Since Kelly's arrival in 1997, the team has shown steady improvement and progress every year, culminating with the best season in program history last year. She has coached the Buffs to six tournament wins and 28 second or third place finishes. Last season, the Buffs finished in the top five in all 10 regular season events with two victories, one runner up and one third place finish.

The program took a big step forward with its first appearance in the NCAA Regionals in 2009 after several seasons of being right on the edge of selection. The Buffs made their second ever appearance in 2011 and will host the NCAA West Regional at Colorado National Golf Course this coming season.

The program has seen individual players excel both on the course and in the classroom.

The Buffs have had 26 players earn 53 Academic All-Big 12 honors during Kelly's tenure and the Buffs time in that league, and seven Buffs have been named to the prestigious NGCA All-America Scholars team, including for the first time two players in 2011 with Taylor Doyle and Jessica Wallace. Former Buff Maria Persson-Gulda was named to that team three times and was also honored with an NCAA postgraduate scholarship. She was honored as CU's top female student athlete academically in 2006, an honor that current Buff Jamie Befort has racked up twice. Additionally, an astonishing 47 CU players have earned mention on the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll (3.0 GPA or higher in a semester) a total of 205 times in Kelly's tenure.

Erin Kerr was the first Buff to qualify for a NCAA Regional post season bid in 2001 and that was followed up with another invitation in 2002. Hannah Hoch became a two time tournament winner in 2004-05 and broke many school records. She also became the first player in Buff history to be named All Big 12 second team that year as well. Last season, Emily Talley and Jessica Wallace were both named first-team All-Big 12, the first two players to earn that honor, and each were named twice as the Big 12 Golfer of the Month over the past two seasons. Wallace won CU's only Big 12 individual honor, named the Newcomer of the Year last season, as well.

Born May 15, 1961, in Aspen, Colo., Kelly graduated from TCU in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in business communications. She prepped at Santa Rita High School in Tucson, Ariz.

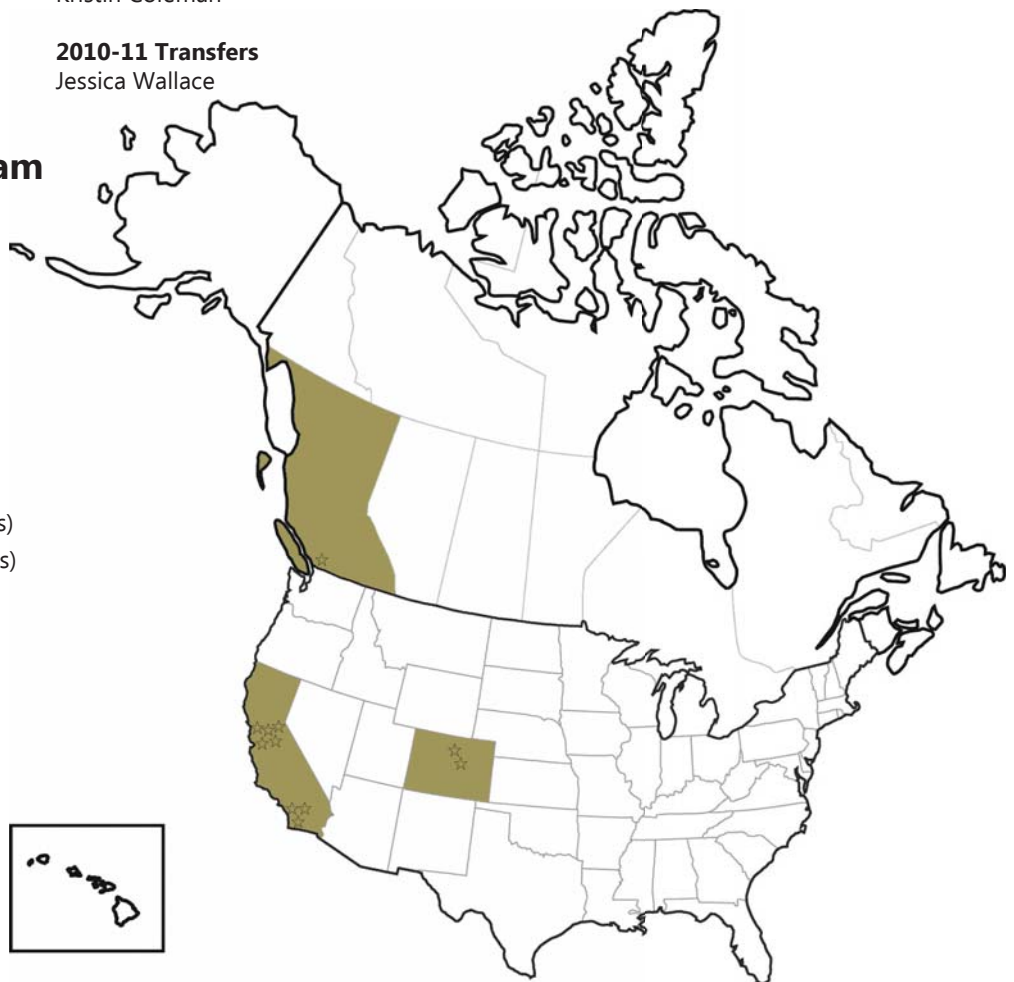

## Talley Closing Out Record Setting Career

Senior Emily Talley is the only one on the traveling roster that has played more than two seasons in Boulder, and thus she has put her mark, and then some, on the CU record book. She began breaking CU career records early in her junior campaign and now owns a majority of them, some by very impressive numbers.

In all Talley owns 34 CU records, including 16 career records, four season records, eight tournament records and six round records.

## Jenny Coleman Records First Top 10 NCAA Regional Finish

Sophomore Jenny Coleman, on the strength of a final round 3-under par 69 at the NCAA West Regional, became the first CU player to earn a top 10 performance in an NCAA event, tying for 10th with a 54-hole score of 2-over par 218 at Colorado National Golf Club May 10-12.

## Current Buffs Re-Writing Stroke Marks

The Buffs current quintet is putting an absolute assault on the CU record book, and there is no more apparent proof of that than by looking at CU's season stroke average mark. The Buffs current five players own 10 of the top 15 marks in school history. This season, the Buffs have four of the top eight marks in school history and the current squad is responsible for seven of those eight marks:

As a team, this squad is pushing going un-

der the 75.0 mark for stroke average for the first time, with a mark of 75.11 thus far, the best mark in school history by 1.2 strokes per round (76.31 last season).

## Spring Improvement

For just the third time in CU coach Anne Kelly's 15 seasons, the Buffs have performed better during the spring season compared to the previous fall. This spring, CU has submerged below the 75.0 stroke average mark for the first time in school history in either the spring or fall with a current mark of 74.86. The previous best was this team's fall mark of 75.52.

This team has shown an improvement of .66 strokes per round over the fall. The only other two seasons where the Buffs improved in the spring were the 2006-07 (+.69; 77.74 to 77.05) and 2005-06 seasons (1.73; 79.29 to 77.56). CU also had improvement in the 1994-95 (92.60 to 87.46) and 1996-97 (84.69 to 84.23), just before Kelly took over in the 1997-98 season.

## Record Book Assault

There are currently 85 individual records in the CU record book, and the current team has an outright grasp on 57 of them (67.1 percent) with another 16 records where an active member of the team is tied for the best mark in CU history, meaning the current players own or are tied for 73 of the 85 records (85.9 percent). Two of the other 12 records should be broken by current members of the team during the NCAA Championships and a handful others shifting from the tied with to outright own column.

## Team Marks Falling

As stated above, this team's shattering the stroke average mark for a season and spring after setting the new fall mark last semester. In the fall, CU shot a collective 75.52, breaking the previous record by .32 strokes per round. But in the spring when the Buffs have caught fire, CU is shooting a 74.86 average, the first time in either fall or spring the Buffs have submerged below the 75.00 mark. CU's 74.86 spring stroke average is almost two strokes better than any other spring in CU history. Last year's squad set the standard with an average of 76.71, meaning this squad is on pace to break the record by 1.85 strokes per round.

The Buffs have also set the best team score in both a round and through 36 holes this year, shooting an 11-under par 277 in the first

round of the Clover Cup en route to a 31-stroke victory. CU's 558 through two rounds is four strokes better than any other score in CU history and it was only bad weather that stopped the Buffs from setting the 54-hole mark, as the 855 was three strokes behind the current record of 855 set in the Ptarmigan in 2008.

## Best Stroke Improvement

The record for best stroke improvement is usually reserved for when teams completely blew up the previous round and then came back to earth the next. CU's record for a team stroke improvement from one round to the next is 34 strokes, accomplished at the 2000 Big 12 Championships when CU shot a 346 in the first round and then a 312 in the second.

However, as a testament to how low this team can go, in the past two tournaments this postseason, the current squad appears on the top 10 list twice. At the Pac-12 Championships, the Buffs shot a 308 in the first round and then shot a 4-under par 284 in the second round, a 24 stroke improvement.

In order to qualify for the NCAA Championships, the Buffs shot the second best team total in CU history with a 9-under par 279 in the final round of the NCAA West Regional, improving by 22 strokes over the Buffs' second round total of 301. The 24 strokes is tied for the sixth best turnaround in CU history while the 22 strokes is tied for the 10th best improvement.

## Dropping A Subpar

For the first time in CU history, the Buffs had to drop a subpar round in the final round of the 2012 NCAA West Regional, as the Buffs collectively shot a 10-under par to post a team score of 9-under par 279 and improve from below the cut in a tie for ninth place to finish fourth and qualify for NAAs.

Not only was that the first time CU had five players under par, it was also the first time as many as four players went below even in the same round. Five times previously, a CU team has had three players under par in the same round, including twice previously this season. Only three times previously, two instances happening this season, have the Buffs counted no above par scores. At the Clover Cup in the second round, CU had three Buffs under par and their fourth shot even par, a feat that had only previously happened at the 2008 Ptarmigan Ram Fall Classic in the second round. Also this year at the Pac-12 Championships, CU had two players under par and two more at even par.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. – The University of Colorado women's golf team shot the third-best final round in the field Monday and improved from eighth to finish sixth at the 32nd Branch Law Firm Dick McGuire Invitational, held here at the UNM Championship Course.

The Buffaloes shot an 8-over par 292 to leapfrog Iowa State and Pepperdine and finish sixth. The Buffs completed the 54-hole event at 22-over par 898 and moved up a total of 10 spots in the final two rounds after struggling in the first round Sunday on the 6,187-yard, par 73 layout. ## Edean Ihlanfeldt Invite

SAMMAMISH, Wash.—The No. 17 University of Colorado women's golf team won the seventh event in school history Wednesday, taking home a two-stroke win at the 2011 Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational. The Buffs shot the best team round of the day, a 13-over par 301 to finish the 54-hole event at 32-over par 896.

"I'm really proud of this team," CU coach Anne Kelly said. "Jenny and Alex really helped us out today with great final rounds, but it was an all-round team effort. Each win is different and they're all great, but to win this event at a Pac-12 site with half of the teams from the Pac-12, it's a big deal."

Although it was not a dual meet, it is the first victory for the Buffaloes in any sport in a Pac-12-dominated field since the school joined the league. The men's golf team has won two events this fall, topping Utah in both of them. In this 12-team field hosted by the University of Washington, six teams were from the Pac-12. It was held at the on the 6,003-yard, par 72 Sahalee Country Club course just east of Seattle.

"It was really exciting," senior Emily Talley said. "I was the first one in, so I was able to watch it all unfold. We were all watching the live scoring, which is unofficial so you never know, but I felt like we all finished the last couple of holes strong and a couple of the other teams didn't. Oregon really made a strong push, if felt like they had a bunch of birdies at the end, so it was just exciting."

Four of the six Pac-12 teams in the field were battling it out throughout the final round, as the Buffs edged No. 34 Oregon (second, 34-over par 898) while No. 21 Washington and No. 16 California tied for third at 36-over par 900. Oregon State finished fifth at 56-over par 920. The Pac-12 took home the top five spots as six of the 12 teams in the field are from the league.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn.—The No. 24 University of Colorado women's golf team wrapped up the fall portion of its 2011-12 season here Sunday as the Buffaloes shot a 15-over par 303 and fell six spots to finish 14th in Mercedes-Benz SEC/Pac-12 Challenge at 35-over par 899.

The Buffaloes still finished ahead of three teams ranked higher than their own No. 24 ranking, including No. 4 LSU, No. 20 California and No. 23 Kentucky. Only two lower ranked teams finished higher than the Buffaloes and one of them was host and No. 27 Tennessee (tied for fourth) and No. 36 Mississippi, who finished one stroke ahead of the Buffs at 34-over par 898.

"Overall, I think the biggest thing is that it was a great experience for us, both good and bad," CU head coach Anne Kelly said. "If we can walk away from this learning to make some better decisions on the golf course, in the long run it will pay off for us. It's probably the best field we've ever played and you have to get your feet wet. We did learn that when we play well, we can play with anybody, but these other top teams just didn't make as many mistakes as we did and that's the difference."

TUCSON, Ariz.—The No. 23 University of Colorado women's golf team finished its first event of the spring by finishing fourth at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational, held here at the Vistoso Golf Club. The Buffs shot a final round 22-over par 310 to finish 41-over par 905.

Host and No. 22 Arizona cruised to a victory by shooting a 4-over par 292 to finish 13-under par 851 for the event. The Wildcats won the event by 12 strokes, topping No. 1 UCLA, who had the best final round at 3-over par 291 to finish 1-under par 863 through three rounds. No. 8 Arizona State finished third at 20-over par 884 after a final round 9-over par 297.

The Buffs struggled closing out their round but remained ahead of Oregon State, who shot 11-over par 299 and finished three strokes behind the Buffs at 44-over par 908 in fifth place. Otherwise, the Buffs round of 22-over par was tied for the fourth best round in the field despite playing the final four holes at 12-over par as a team.

"We had to have a great day to move up the standings and our goal was to come in and play a solid round," CU coach Anne Kelly said. "It's disappointing that we didn't do that. You have to learn from days like this and move on. We need to finish strong and not make as many mistakes. If you have a day like this early in the spring, hopefully you can learn from it and it will be beneficial down the stretch."

PALOS VERDES, Calif.—The No. 23 University of Colorado women's golf team survived some tough conditions to finish seventh here Wednesday at the 2012 Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge. After shooting a 20-over par 304 in the final round, the Buffs finish the 54-hole event at 50-over par 902.

Top ranked UCLA won the event by 12 strokes with a 54-hole total of 18-over par 870. No. 4 Southern California took second at 30-over par 882, while No. 34 Pepperdine finished third at 35-over par 887. With No. 8 Arizona State finishing fourth at 39-over par 891, which gave the Pac-12 three of the top four teams. No. 18 Duke rounded out the top five at 45-over par with host and No. 12 Ohio State finishing one stroke ahead of the Buffaloes in sixth place at 49-over par 901, giving the Pac-12 four of the top seven teams.

"There are a lot of good signs with this team," CU coach Anne Kelly said. "There are a lot of good, quality shots being executed. We still need to get rid of the big numbers, double bogeys and higher, and in general we can all putt a little better. But these two tournaments the past 10 days were a great start to our spring."

CU's seventh place finish out of the 15 teams in attendance is even more impressive given the strength of the tournament. It was announced at the awards ceremony that Golfweek will rank this as the highest quality field of any tournament in the country this season (fall and spring). Of the 15 teams in the field, all were ranked in the top 43 nationally with three top 10 and seven top 20 teams. The Buffs in seventh finished ahead of three teams ranked higher than they are and behind just one ranked lower.

NEW ORLEANS, La.—Sophomore Alex Stewart fired a 5-under par 67 to capture medalist honors and the No. 17 University of Colorado women's golf team surged to finish in second place at the 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate Golf Championships here Tuesday at the English Turn Golf and Country Club.

The Buffaloes fired a final round 2-over par 290, the third best team round of the day, to finish the 54-hole event at 16-over par 880, three strokes behind No. 13 Duke, which won with a 13-over par 877 after a final round even par 288. Both Duke and Colorado passed No. 4 Southern California in the final round. The Trojans were the leaders after the first two rounds and finished at 17-over par 881. No. 2 Alabama shot a 3-under par 285, to move up to fourth with a 20-over par 884 while No. 19 Baylor rounded out the top five at 23-over par 887.

"Don't get me wrong, you always want to win," CU head coach Anne Kelly said. "But this is one of, if not the, top performance in the history of our program. We were just a few shots short. We played extremely well and we're getting better every time out. It's a credit to the girls on this team, the work and commitment they're making to this program is outstanding and paying off right now."

The Buffs second place performance is that much more impressive given the fact that Golfweek ranked this field as the fourth toughest in Division I this season. The Buffs were one of nine top 20 teams in the field and after it all played out, the Buffs topped three of the top four teams in the country in No. 2 Alabama, No. 3 Auburn and No. 4 Southern California.

MESA, Ariz.—With three weather delays including one because of hail, the No. 15 University of Colorado women's golf team kept its composure and put the wraps on the most dominating performance in school history Sunday here at the 2012 Clover Cup. The Buffs finished with the top three players on the leader board and shot a final round 9-over par 297 to win by 31 strokes.

"The weather was miserable," Kelly said. "It was in the 40s all day, the wind chill had to be much lower than that, and it was raining and breezy all day. We had three delays. It was just a long day. But it was definitely a good day, too."

For the first time in school history, the Buffs finished 1-2-3 in the final individual standings with senior Jess Wallace edging out sophomore Alex Stewart and senior Emily Talley for medalist honors. Sophomore Jenny Coleman gave the Buffs four of the top six in the final standings while the biggest move of the day was from sophomore Kristin Coleman, who moved up from 32nd and finished just one stroke short of a top 20 finish.

"My only stress today was that I wanted all of them to win," Kelly said. "I wanted them all to tie for first."

The Buffs shot a final round 9-over par 297 to finish the event at 9-under par 855. No. 26 Oklahoma was second at 22-over par 886 after a final round 17-over 305. No. 35 Tulsa shot a final round 18-over 306 to finish at 28-over 892 while No. 28 Texas Tech (40-over 904) edged out host Notre Dame (41-over 905) for fourth place by one stroke.

**Anuenue Spring Break****Feb. 26-28, 2012**

MAUI, Hawai'i—The No. 11 University of Colorado women's golf team recorded more history Tuesday by winning the 2012 Anuenue Spring Break Challenge, hosted by the University of Hawai'i here at The Bay Course at Kapalua. For the first time in program history, the Buffs have won back-to-back events.

The Buffs hung on to defeat No. 15 California by two strokes and No. 13 Tennessee by three strokes with some tense moments down the stretch on the par 72, 6,022-yard course. The Bears and Vols both shot final round scores of 12-over par 300, one stroke better than the Buffs final round 13-over par 301. CU finished the event at 25-over par 889 with Cal (27-over 891) and Tennessee (28-over 892) right on its heels. No. 36 Mississippi finished fourth at 38-over par 902 with Texas-San Antonio rounding out the top five at 49-over par 913.

"It was pretty tight but we pulled it out," CU head coach Anne Kelly said. "It was an exciting day for sure. It was very windy today; even more so than yesterday, and the scores went up overall. The greens dried out a little faster today and the hole locations were a little tougher."

Colorado also won the 2012 Clover Cup earlier this month and now have a string of three events finishing in the top two, easily the best run during the spring in program history and arguably overall. To start the 2010-11 season, the Buffs had two wins, one second and one third place finish over the first four events of the season. Prior to this season, the Buffs best spring run was last season when they opened the spring with five consecutive top five finishes. Unlike the Clover Cup which the Buffs won by a school record 31 strokes, Tuesday's 2-stroke victory was much more in doubt headed into the final round.

**Pac-12 Championships****April 27-29, 2012**

PULLMAN, Wash.—The No. 11 University of Colorado women's golf team battled strong but lost a couple of strokes near the end of its round and fell from second to finish sixth at the 2012 Pac-12 Championships. The Buffs, who were one stroke out of the lead about two-thirds of the way through the round, hit brief rough spot that cost them six strokes as they finished seven strokes behind champion California here Sunday at the Palouse Ridge Golf Course.

The top six teams Sunday, all of which are ranked in the top 17 nationally, put on a show in the final round, as at times in the final round, just four strokes separated those six teams. The Buffs got off to a bit of a slow start as a team but fought back to within one stroke of the Bears through 13 holes. Over a couple-hole stretch, the Buffs lost six strokes and found themselves in sixth place.

The Bears, ranked No. 13 nationally, claimed the championship after a final round 4-over par 292 to finish at 17-over par 881, just one stroke ahead of No. 3 Southern California, who rallied with a final round 1-under par 287 to finish 18-over 882. No. 17 Arizona made the most noise in the final round, shooting a women's collegiate course record 7-under par 281 to finish at 20-over par 884 with No. 1 UCLA taking fourth place after a 3-over 291 to finish 21-over par 885. No. 5 Arizona State edged the Buffs by a stroke, finishing at 23-over par 887 after a 2-over 290 in the final round.

"We didn't get off to a great start," CU coach Anne Kelly said. "But we fought really hard and were we right in there through about 13. Then No. 14 was a little rough and 15 ate our lunch. We ended up sixth, but it was really tight, it was a dog fight. There are great teams here and everybody fought tough."

## NCAA West Regional

May 10-12, 2012

ERIE, Colo.—The No. 10 University of Colorado women's golf team turned in the best performance in school history, recording a 9-under par 279 to move from a tie for ninth to finish fourth here at the 2012 NCAA West Regional, qualifying for the NCAA Championships for the first time.

CU hosted the regional at Colorado National Golf Club and the Buffs performance was key given the fact that only eight teams advance to the NCAA Championships, which will be held May 22-25, at The Legends Course in Franklin, Tenn., meaning the Buffs began the day below the cut.

The Buffaloes 9-under par 279 performance is tied for the second best team round in school history and all five CU players were under par for the first time in school history. It's a new postseason team record by five strokes, topping a 4-under par 284 this same team shot at the Pac-12 Championships on April 28, and it's 19 strokes better than CU's postseason record headed into this season.

Top-ranked and seeded UCLA and No. 2 seed and No. 7 ranked LSU were deemed co-champions with 9-over par totals of 873, but this is the only tournament each year where being eighth is just as good as being first, and that is the only place a tiebreaker to determine top seeding for the NCAA Championships. UCLA won the tiebreaker based on their top regional seed.

No. 7 seed and No. 19 ranked Pepperdine matched CU's best team score of 9-under par 279 to finish at 11-over par 875 and in third place, two strokes ahead of the Buffs total of 13-over par 877. No. 6 seed and 17th-ranked Baylor and No. 14 seed and 40th-ranked Stanford tied for fifth, both tied at 15-over par 879. Stanford was the leader after both the first and second round. No. 3 seed and sixth-ranked North Carolina finished seventh at 16-over par 880 and No. 9 seed and 26th ranked Oklahoma took the final seed, finishing at 26-over par 890.

It became evident after the conclusion of the morning wave that the top seven teams were fairly safe to advance. Oklahoma was in the afternoon wave and prevailed from a group of four or five that began the day looking to stay below 29-over par, which is where both Texas Tech and California finished after the morning wave. The Sooners shot a 1-over par 289, the best score of the afternoon wave and fifth-best score of the round, to advance.

Senior Emily Talley led the way for the Buffaloes with a 4-under par 68, the best postseason round in CU history, bettering her 69 she shot in the second round of the Pac-12 Championships. Sophomore Jenny Coleman matched that 69 in the final round, marking just the third time in CU history two players recorded rounds in the 60s, with the other two such instances happening at the Clover Cup in March.

Talley finished her round with six birdies and two bogeys in her round to hit 4-under. She had a stretch making the turn where she had four birdies in six holes to go to 5-under. Kristin Coleman had three birdies and a pair of bogeys for her 1-under round.

Talley's 68 is the fourth-best of her career and her third round in the 60s this season and seventh of her career. Her three rounds in the 60s this season matches a CU record she already shared. Talley finished at 4-over par 220 and was tied for 16th individually. She matched sophomore Kristin Coleman at 4-over 220, who became the 10th CU player to have two sub-par rounds in a tournament. Kristin Coleman shot a 1-under par 71 in both the first and third rounds.

Jenny Coleman's 69 matched her career best round and is her second round in the 60s this season. She finished at 3-over par 219 and tied for 10th place, giving her the fifth top 10 performance of the season. She finished her round with an eagle, five birdies and four bogeys. She eagled the 615-yard, Par 5 No. 15, turning in one of six eagles by the field in the tournament but the only one on No. 15.

Senior Jess Wallace shot 1-under par 71 and tied for 26th with a three round total of 5-over par 221. She recorded her 14th career subpar round, moving her into sole possession of second place in the CU record book. Book Alex Stewart rebounded from having to with drawl in the second round to post a 1-under par she had three birdies and two bogeys in her round.

**CU In The Postseason...**

After qualifying for the NCAA Regional three of the past four years, the Buffs advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time this season, thus comprising the best postseason run in school history. And the Buffs haven't just been satisfied with qualifying and advancing this postseason. After the closest Pac-12 Championships on record, in which the Buffs finished sixth but just seven strokes behind the champion (previous closest margin for the top six teams was 17 strokes). The Buffs were as close as one stroke behind the leader two-thirds of the way through the final round. Then at the NCAA Championships after the first two rounds in which slipped briefly below the qualification line after the second round, CU put the pedal to the medal and had all five players under par in the final round for the first time in CU history and jumped from a tie for ninth into sole possession of fourth place. The Buffs were actually 12-under par as a team at one point and found themselves just one shot out of the lead with just a hole or two remaining before taking a collective breath on the No. 18, which three Buffs bogeyed but didn't really care.

**Pressure Filled Regional...**

CU was under an abnormal amount of pressure in the final round. Not only were the Buffs hosting, the players were playing with larger than normal galleries following them and a media gaggle of four or five members all three rounds. Add the pressure of never having qualified, and that all makes the Buffs 9-under performance that much more impres-

sive.

**Pac-12 Recap...**

In the closest women's Pac-12 Championship in the league's storied history, the Buffs fell just six strokes in the final round and slipped from one stroke out of the lead in second place to finish sixth. Cal ended up beating USC by just one stroke, the closest in league history (881-882), with Arizona just two back at 884 in third, UCLA (885) fourth, Arizona State (887) and the Buffs (888) all within seven strokes. At one point near the end of the final round, all six teams were with just four strokes.

The previous closest margin between the top six teams at the Pac-10 championship was 18 strokes in 2001, when Arizona beat Stanford by three (873-876) and Arizona State (883), USC (886), Washington (890) and Cal (891) were all in the mix.

**Talley Gets Her Third...**

Senior Emily Talley became the first player in CU history to play in the NCAA Regional three times and there was some controversy as to why she was not selected as an individual the other season, not to mention why the Buffs as a team weren't selected in 2010.

Additionally, sophomores Jenny and Kristin Coleman and senior Jess Wallace both match former CU player Erin Kerr with two appearances in a Regional, as Kerr made is as an individual in both 2002 and '04.
