NCAA Fayetteville Regional Notes



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ON THE RANGE...

The **116th Annual NCAA Golf Championships** begin this week with 81 schools competing in six regionals around the country, with the **University of Colorado** one of 14 schools competing in the 25th Annual NCAA Central (Fayetteville) Regional Golf Championships in Fayetteville, Ark., (the University of Arkansas is the host school)... It's the first trip for Colorado to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2009; the Buffaloes have now been invited in 17 of the 25 years of the regional format... CU is one of 10 Pac-12 Conference schools that earned a trip to the postseason ... The top five teams out of 14 competing will advance to the NCAA Finals, set for May 28-June 2 in Atlanta, Ga. (Georgia Tech will host at the Capital City Club, Crabapple Course) ... Five teams will also advance to the finals out of five other regionals being held in Tallahassee, Baton Rouge, Columbus, Tempe and Pullman ... the top two individuals not associated with the five teams that qualify will also advance ... CU is the No. 10 seed and will tee off at 8:10 a.m. (MDT) on Thursday off No. 10, with the Buffs paired with Indiana (No. 11 seed) and UNC-Wilmington (No. 12)... The field will be re-paired according to score after the first and second rounds, with all tee times between 8:20 and 10:20 a.m. for the second round (Friday) and between 7:50 and 9:50 a.m. for the final round (Saturday). The Buffs' practice round is set for 7:30 a.m. Wednesday (off No. 10).

THE SITE

The Blessings Golf Club in Fayetteville, Ark., in the northwest corner of the state is the host of the NCAA Central/Fayetteville Regional. BGC has a 7,251-yard, par-72 layout (37-35 configuration) that was designed by Robert Trent Jones, Jr., and was created and funded by Tyson Foods CEO John Tyson. It opened in 2004, and its rating (79.1) and slope (153) makes it one of the most difficult courses in the U.S. **Notable:** Blessings features three par-5 holes on the front nine and three par-3s on the back nine; its topography is characterized by hilly terrain creating numerous sidehill lies, dramatic elevation changes, forced carries over ravines and valleys, and large, undulating Bent grass greens, with Clear Creek in play on several holes. The fairways/roughs are Zoysia.

THE EVENT

This is the 25th year that the NCAA is holding regionals, the fifth where the format calls for six events from the previous three in order to stock the 30-team field at the NCAA Championship Finals. There are 13 or 14 teams at each site, with the top five to advance out of each. Out of the regional format, the Buffaloes have advanced to the NCAA Finals on four occasions, all four times with some style. In **1989**, the inaugural year for regional activity, CU finished third at Stonebridge Country Club outside of Dallas. Oklahoma and Oklahoma State tied for team honors with an 880 score, followed by the Buffs at 902. In **1994**, the Buffs placed second with an 853 score, just two strokes back of regional champion Texas, at Oklahoma City Golf & Country Club. In **1999**, at Ohio State University's Scarlet Course, the Buffs rallied from 18th place and eight shots back after 36 holes to force a playoff with Kent State, winning the battle on the first extra hole and thus advancing to the national finals. It remains the second largest comeback in regional history. In **2002** in Little Rock, CU was 11th after day one and 13th after day two, but rallied to post the seventh best score in a final round despite tough winds, finishing in the 10th and final spot with an 886 team score, edging two teams by one stroke—former Big 12 rivals Kansas and Oklahoma.



THE CENTRAL/FAYETTEVILLE REGIONAL FIELD

The field is comprised of 75 golfers, 14 five-man teams, plus five individuals; Colorado will be reunited with former District 5 rivals Oklahoma State and Tulsa, with OSU and Texas being former Big 12 rivals. Here is the field listed by seed, with CU's record against team in parenthesis—the Buffs are **5-3** overall against teams competing (minus-36 in stroke differential):

THE RANKINGS

There are three men's collegiate golf rankings: one poll, conducted by the GCAA by head coaches, and two that are computer generated (*Golfweek* and *GolfStat*). The Central/Fayetteville Regional features five top 25 schools, eight top 50 teams, with just two outside the top 75; no conference has more than two schools in the event. THE COLORADO ROSTER

The quintet representing Colorado in the NCAA's have earned 12 letters between them, about the average of the last six CU teams that have qualified for the NCAA's. This group has two players with NCAA experience (the '04 had the fewest, with one), but only one has come in a CU uniform when **Derek Fribbs** played as an individual last year; **Johnny Hayes** went with Towson back in 2010 (he shot a second round 69). The last Colorado team to advance to the NCAA Finals, the 2002 squad, had a combined 17 letters with 12 previous NCAA regional or finals tournaments among them. The 2013 Buffalo five:

- Five CU players have played in four NCAA Championships: **Rick Cramer** (1979-82), **Bob Kalinowski** (1991-94), **Matt Zions** (1999-2002), **Kane Webber** (2000-04) and **Derek Tolan** (2006-09).
- The Buffs have taken two freshmen to the NCAA's three times, twice with two true frosh: **Shawn Wills** and **Matt Zions** (1999) and **Kevin Kring** and **Johnny Widmer** (2009). **Stephen Carroll**, a redshirt frosh, and **Kane Webber** (true) played in 2000.

SEASON CAPSULE

The 2012-13 **University of Colorado** men's golf team has experienced a peak-and-valley kind of season, experiencing quality highs with wins in the Air Force Invitational (fall) and the Bandon Dunes Championship (spring), marking the first time a CU team has won major tournaments in the fall and spring in the same season. Lows were mainly confined to a pair of last place finishes, in last October's Pac-12 Fall Preview and in February's Prestige At PGA West, along with a disappointing final day in the Pac-12 Championship meet.

Coach **Roy Edwards** travel squad has consisted of the same four players for all 12 tournaments: seniors **Jason Burstyn**, the team's stroke average leader (72.8) and **Derek Fribbs** (73.2), sophomore **David Oraee** (73.9) and true freshman **Philip Juel-Berg** (73.8). Senior **Beau Schoolcraft** had played in all five fall events but appeared in just one in the spring, and the duel for the fifth-man in recent weeks came down to junior **Johnny Hayes** and redshirt frosh **Drew Trujillo**.

Burstyn won the first two competitions of the year, the Ballyneal Challenge and the Air Force meet; he and Fribbs lead the team with five top 20 efforts each. Burstyn has 18 rounds of par or better, including a team best 15 subpar rounds, while Juel-Berg also has 18 (11 even par efforts), while Fribbs leads the squad in rounds counting toward team scoring (34 of 36, or 94.4 percent). Overall, it's been a solid team effort, with 25 combined top 20 finishes among the team (and 30 top 25 performances).

CU set a team mark for stroke improvement from one round to the next in a five-for-four tournament, improving some 32 strokes from 306 to 274 at the Wyoming Cowboy Classic; poor weather conditions shortened that meet to 36 holes and did play a role in the opening rounds scores being so high. The 274 was the third best score in school history on a par-70 course.

The last three courses CU played in the spring were all par-70 layouts, which is what The Blessings plays to.

HEAD COACH ROY EDWARDS

Roy Edwards is now in his seventh season as head coach of the University of Colorado men's golf team, having been named to the position on July 14, 2006, following in the footsteps of the only two coaches the program had ever known over a span of six decades.

Edwards, 36, is just the third full-time men's golf coach in Buffalo history. He came to CU with an impressive pedigree, joining the Buffaloes from his alma mater, the University of Kansas, where he had served as the assistant for both the men's and women's programs for the previous four years (2002-06). He held the same position at Vanderbilt University for a year prior to returning to KU.

Edwards replaced the late Mark Simpson, who passed away from complications due to lung cancer in December 2005. Simpson had held the post since 1977, when he followed in the footsteps of his college head coach, Les Fowler. Fowler took over as player-coach in 1948 and remained on board until Simpson, his assistant, replaced him. Thus, Edwards is only the program's third full-time head coach since 1948.

Edwards is faced with the most daunting task in CU golf history: with the Buffaloes now in the Pac-12 Conference as of July 1, 2011, the Buffaloes are a member of the most prestigious men's golf conference in the nation. As many as seven schools have regularly occupied the top 30 over the last several seasons. But he is up to the challenge and the program is positioned to join the nation's elite.

It took less than three years for Edwards to put his stamp on the CU golf program, perhaps in no bigger way than completing the dream of his two predecessors. One of the few major golf programs in the nation without its own true home golf course and facilities, Edwards played an integral part in working with alum Steve Kerr in the latter's acquisition of Vista Ridge Golf Club in Erie in early 2009. The club was renamed Colorado National Golf Club and now serves as the official home for the university's men's and women's golf teams. In 2012, construction was completed on a state-of-the-art practice facility at the course that matches any in the nation.

He also initiated the Colorado Partners program, a group that has quickly grown to 100 members who contribute financially to augment the school's golf budget, and established the Colorado Golf Day which is an annual celebration and fundraiser for CU golf.

On the course, the team has enjoyed success and endured some struggles but has continually shown promise. In 2011-12, his sixth season, the Buffs stormed out of the gate to win its first two fall tournaments, their own Mark Simpson Invitational and Air Force's Miranda Invitational; the victories propelled CU to an early No. 10 national ranking. The team successfully navigated its way through its first season in the ultra-competitive Pac-12 Conference, finishing eighth in a league championship that featured eight top 30 teams. The Buffs just missed qualifying for the NCAA championships but Derek Fribbs was selected to play as an individual.

The 2009-10 and 2010-11 teams, his fourth and fifth, respectively, had their moments but did not advance to the postseason, though Justin Bardgett qualified individually in 2010. The Buffs finished ninth and 10th in their last two appearances in the Big 12 Conference meet. The disappointments only created more resolve in the program and thus the turnaround in year six.

His third Buffalo team (2008-09) sported one of the nation's dynamic duos in Patrick Grady and Derek Tolan, as each won two tournaments and combined for 14 top 10 finishes. But the team was also balanced as a whole, with 32 top 20 performances posted by seven different golfers, and recorded a 74.06 stroke average, second lowest in school history (topped only by 73.77 in 2003-04). The Buffs posted 11 top 10 finishes in major tournaments, the second-most in school history that included a record-tying seven in the top five, and highlighted by a 34-stroke win in the DU-Ron Moore and three runner-up finishes in the USF Olympic Club, Western Intercollegiate and its own CU-Stevenson Ranch Invitational.

In earning a fourth straight trip to the NCAA's, in the Big 12 Championships, the Buffs posted their best conference finish in 28 years when they took second place; it tied for the largest improvement from one season to another in Big 12 history after finishing 10th in 2008 (CU moved from 11th to 3rd from 1997 to 1998 as did Missouri on one occasion). The Buffs were in the hunt for the title until the back nine of the fourth and final round, when Oklahoma State finally was able to get some distance and eventually won by 14 shots.

His second team ('07-08), became just the third in school history to win two major tournaments in the same season, as CU won the Louisiana Classics and the Ohio State Kepler Intercollegiate. The Buffs finished 10th in the Big 12 meet, which moved to a 72-hole format for the first time, and was again invited to the NCAA's, placing 18th in the Central Regional. Junior Derek Tolan was one of two individuals to advance out of the regional into the finals, the first Buff to do so since 1993.

Edwards' first CU team (2006-07) had moderate success, and finished 11th in the Big 12 Championships; while that was disappointing, his team did something that neither Fowler's or Simpson's did, qualify for the NCAA Championships (though in fairness, more teams are invited today than when they coached, but it still was an impressive accomplishment). The team placed 20th in the NCAA Central Regional.

At Kansas, he was heavily involved in recruiting and the day-to-day functions for both the men's and women's teams, managed the Jayhawks' Birdie Club and was the main contact for both golf camps. A KU graduate, he returned to his alma mater in August 2002 as the assistant coach for both the men's and women's programs and further developed all the skills necessary to one day become a head coach. He started his coaching career as a volunteer/graduate assistant in 1998, working three years in that capacity before moving on to Vanderbilt for his first full-time assistant coaching position.

He was the assistant for both the men's and women's teams at Vanderbilt from May 2001 until returning to his alma mater the following year. At Vandy, he headed the Commodore Golf Day and the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate Golf Championships, and was involved in Commodore recruiting as well as the day-to-day practice and traveling schedules. He was a part of history as both teams experienced two of the best seasons in the programs' existence the 2001-02 academic year, and had a hand in coaching a pair of first-team All-Southeastern Conference players, including Brandt Snedeker, a first-team All-American, the 2007 PGA Tour Rookie of the Year and third place finisher in the 2008 Masters.

A three-year member of the Jayhawk golf team, he lettered as a senior under legendary and long-time coach Ross Randall and earned his bachelor's of science degree in business administration from Kansas in 2000. Simultaneously while finishing his degree, he worked as a volunteer assistant coach for the men's team. His career playing highlights include being named the PGA Midwest Section Player of the Year in 1995 and the Heart of America Four-Ball champion in 1997. As a student, he was also heavily involved on KU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and held several leadership roles on campus.

Born October 14, 1976 in Kansas City, Mo., but truly a native of Hutchinson, Kan., he was a four-year letterman in golf at Hutchinson (Kan.) High School and was an Eagle Scout. His hobbies include playing golf, cooking and traveling. Edwards is married to the former Shelly Bonfantine of Albuquerque, N.M., as they wed on July 7, 2007 (07-07-07); she is a former golfer at the University of New Mexico. They are the parents of two sons, Ashton Ross (4) and Luke Leo (1).

ARKANSAS MEMORIES

Despite the fact that Boulder and Fayetteville are roughly only 650 miles apart, this will mark just the second time that a Colorado Buffalo golf team will play a tournament in the state of Arkansas. The only other was a fairly memorable occasion, when back in 2002 the Buffs appeared in the Central Regional in Little Rock. The Buffs finished 10th, the final team to qualify out of the regional for the NCAA Championship Finals, the last time the Buffs advanced beyond regional play. **Ben Portie**, who was just named head coach of the fledgling women's program at Metro State University in Denver last week, led the Buffaloes that week in 2002 with a 70-72-76—217 scorecard, which tied him for 16th. The Buffaloes went on to tie for 14th in the finals.

ASSAULT ON THE RECORD BOOK

Freshman **Philip Juel-Berg** currently has played the third most rounds by any frosh in school history (38), and is hot on the tail of **Terry Kahl** (41, 1976-77) and **Michael Imperato** (40, 2007-08). His 73.84 average currently stands third by all freshmen, just behind **Matthew Zions** 73.76 figure in 1998-99 (**Kane Webber's** 73.03 record mark in 1999-2000 is out of reach). **Derek Fribbs** is tied for the ninth most rounds played with 143, but he'll jump into fourth once he completes two this week; **Jason Burstyn** has played 131 (13th), and three will move him into 12th past **Knut Elkjord** (133). The team's 74.19 stroke average is fifth-best in school annals, behind 74.10 in 2001-02 and ahead of 74.41 in 1999-2000.

JUEL-BERG AMONG TOP PAC-12 FRESHMEN

Philip Juel-Berg, a true freshman, is among the top freshmen in the conference, owning the ninth best average (73.84) for those who have played at least 24 rounds (eight events); he's sixth for those who have teed it up for 30 or more rounds. The top Pac-12 frosh:

THIS-N-THAT...

- Colorado has two wins this season, but for the first time in its history, has won meets in both the fall and spring seasons; CU's had many seasons with two tournament wins, but had always taken place in the same semester.
- In three tournaments, the Buffaloes have recorded the best team score in the final round (275, or -13, in the Simpson-CU Invitational; 292, or +4, at Cal-Irvine's Anteater Invitational; and 274, or -6, in the Wyoming Cowboy Classic).
- The team's 74.19 stroke average for the season has this year's team flirting to become just the third to have a sub-74 average for the season; the 2011-12 team had a 73.78 final average, just .01 off the record set by the 2003-04 team (73.77).
- The Buffaloes have 25 rounds in the 60s this season (and 49 subpar rounds overall), surpassing last year's totals of 20 and 45, respectively. Seven different players have shot scores in the 60s, while eight have subpar scores.
- CU has not advanced to the NCAA Finals the last five times it qualified for regional play, the second time that has happened; CU went four straight regionals (1990-93) without advancing.

U.S. OPEN LOCAL QUALIFYING

Several Buffaloes participated in U.S. Open Local Qualifying this past Monday at various sites around the country. At The Heritage at Westmoor in Westminster, **Drew Trujillo** finished second with a 33-38—71 effort to advance to Sectional Qualifying, while **Johnny Hayes** carded a 72 (34-38) and is the second alternate; **Jason Burstyn** did not advance, turning in a 37-38—75 scorecard. At Collindale GC in Fort Collins, a 68 or better was needed and no current Buffalo shot that well, though former CUer **Tom Gempel** (34-34—68) is the second alternate; **David Oraee** shot 37-35—72, assistant coach **Jon Levy** fashioned a 38-35—73, **Derek Fribbs** shot 38-38—76 and **Beau Schoolcraft** a 39-37—76. In Genoa, Nev., **Kraig McLeod** shot a 69 to continue on, and **Ross Thornton** will participate this Wednesday in Raymore, Mo., outside of Kansas City. Former Buffaloes **Derek Tolan** (1-under 69) and **Steve Irwin** (same) advanced to sectionals from the qualifying event at the Broadmoor GC in Colorado Springs on May 6.

THE "DID YOU KNOW?" FACT

Colorado, Ohio State, Stanford and Wake Forest have produced the most U.S. Open champions with four. CU's **Hale Irwin** has won three (1974, 1979, 1990) and **Steve Jones** one (1996). Ohio State's **Jack Nicklaus** claimed four by himself, while Stanford has had **Tiger Woods** win three and **Tom Watson** one; Wake Forest has had three players do it.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A STROKE MAKES

History has shown time and time again that a single stroke can mean the difference between advancing to the NCAA Finals and having a season end early. The last eight Central regionals CU participated in that featured 27 teams all came down to a playoff or one stroke separating the 10 teams that qualified and the 11th that was left on the outside looking in. Overall, on six occasions, there was a tie for the last qualifying spot, with one stroke the difference seven times and two strokes three times. Only three years was the margin between qualifying and going home been more than two shots, in 1992 (7), in 1998 (3) and in 2000 (4). A closer look at the Central Regional history (1989-2008), where CU participated when it made it to the postseason:

QUOTING ROY EDWARDS**General**

"We really haven't practiced since the Pac-12 Championship. That is by design. These guys are students first and they had their semester projects and finals until (last) Thursday. So they were all in with those responsibilities. Now they can clearly and fully focus on the task at hand. We are excited to be going to The Patriot Golf Club (Tuesday for a practice round) with the help of Dan Rooney of the Folds of Honor Foundation. Dan and I were college teammates and he is excited to have us to The Patriot."

On The Team's Frame Of Mind After A Disappointing Finish (10th) At Pac-12's

"We're absolutely hungry to get back out there. We had a really odd weather month leading up to the Pac-12 championships and couldn't get in the kind of practice we needed, yet we were still in decent position for an upper division finish. So we're excited, they're done with finals and end of year projects, and most got a solid competition round in for U.S. Open Local Qualifying to get the rust off. They're anxious to get out there and prove that the final round (at Pac-12's) was a blip on the season."

On Jason Burstyn's Pac-12 Troubles And His Ability To Bounce Back

"He was a little off, and he's no different than most in that he needs to keep learning to adapt to different situations. He normally does that, and in this case, I think he's ready to move on. History shows that the few times he has played poorly, he's bounced back to play really well. I don't think it will be any different this week."

On What Colorado Needs To Do This Week

"We have to minimize our mistakes, the focus has to be on being as smart as possible. We haven't seen the course yet, but I understand it's very difficult. It's an event where you don't care if you finish first or fifth. We need to be patient, make good decisions and overall manage our individual games. When we've done that, we've played our best, and if we can do that here, we have a great shot at advancing to the Finals."

On CU's Chances At Regionals

"We are at a good site. The good thing about this event is that if we are disciplined in our decisions at all times we have a great chance to advance to the Finals. The five teams who make the least number of controllable mistakes will advance. This has more to do about us doing our job than anything else."

THE SCHEDULE & SEASON AT-A-GLANCE

Colorado has played in 12 tournaments this year; five of which are currently ranked between the 10th and the 28th toughest out of 270 meets to date according to *Golfweek*. The toughest was the 10th-ranked Amer Ari Invitational to open the spring season, followed by the Pac-12 Preview last October (11th), the Pac-12 Championship last month (12th) and The Prestige at PGA West (13th). All but the Pac-12 title meet were events where the usual format had four scorers out of five players counted toward the team score. Colorado is 98-72 this year against Division I competition, so the Buffs met the initial criteria for qualifying for the NCAA Championships; CU's strength of schedule played a role (36th in the NCAA) as did its two major tournament wins in earning an at-large bid into the 81-team field.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

Thirty teams will advance to the NCAA Championship Finals in the Atlanta, Ga., suburb of Woodstock, with the tournament to be played at the 7,320-yard, par-70 Capital City Club's Crabapple Course. There will be three rounds of stroke play May 28-30 (starting at 5 a.m. MDT), with the top eight teams advancing to match play from May 31-June 2 (with 8 a.m. MDT tee times); the championship match is Sunday, June 2 at 8 a.m.
