QUICKLY: The 2013-2014 season marks the sixth time CU is playing Air Force, Colorado State and Wyoming in the same season • CU has never defeated all three Front Range schools in the same season • CU has won seven straight games, the longest winning streak since 2005-06 when the Buffaloes won nine in a row • Entering Tuesday's Pac-12 play, CU, Arizona, UCLA, Oregon all have seven-game winning streaks.

CU/CSU: In the last 10 games against the Rams, CU leads 6-4 • Buffs are 2-3 at Moby Arena with a pair of one-point losses (Nov. 30, 2011: 65-64; Nov. 21, 2005: 83-82) • Average margin of three defeats at Moby is 5.6 points • Under Coach Boyle, CU is 2-1 • CU has not won at Moby Arena since Dec. 22, 2007.

WHAT A CU WIN MEANS TODAY: With a win today, CU will have won eight-straight games, its longest since 2005-06 (nine straight, 10-1 to start the season in non-conference play) • Coach Boyle will rank in fourth place on the school's all-time wins list with 77 victories (39 losses). Up next is Frosty Cox with 147 wins • CU improves against CSU with its 88th win in the series; 36th win in Fort Collins, and first win at Moby since Dec. 22, 2007.

SUCCESSFUL MONTH OF NOVEMBER: In the last four seasons under Coach Boyle, CU closed November with a 20-7 record (.741) at home, away, neutral court games • CU went 7-1 this season and 6-0 last year during November.

BUFF MISCELLANEOUS: Coach Boyle's winning percentage (.661) is the best of any CU head coach in men's hoops history (min. 2 years) • Against Air Force, Spencer Dinwiddie did not attempt a free throw for the first time since his freshman year (vs. Baylor, Mar. 29, 2012, NCAA Tournament) • CU is 7-0 this season when outrebounding the opponent; 61-10 in that category in the Boyle era; 4-0 when grabbing between 40-49 rebounds (25-5 in four years) • The 24-point win at AFA matched the largest win by a Boyle-coached CU team on the road (other: at Southern Cal, 74-50, Jan. 26, 2012) • Xavier Talton matched a career-best four assists at AFA • Jaron Hopkins made a season-high three, 3-pointers • Josh Scott notched his third double-double of the season (fifth career) with 16 points, 13 rebounds at AFA.

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK - ALL AT HOME:

The Buffaloes won all six of their home games over a two-week span out-scoring the opponent 81.2-to-65.5; shooting 49.3 FG% to the opponents 40.8%; Out-rebounding their opponents: 39.8-to-27.3 • Three of the six games were single digit wins (5 pts vs. Wyoming; 8 pts: UC Santa Barbara; 8 pts: Harvard) • Four players averaged 11 or more points: Spencer Dinwiddie (15.5 ppg.), Josh Scott (12.2 ppg), Xavier Johnson (11.3), Askia Booker (11.3) with Wesley Gordon (8.7) • The six home games in November was the most ever played during the month and the eight games overall (6 at home, 1 away, 1 neutral) are also the most in school history during the month of November.

COORS EVENTS CENTER: In the last four seasons, CU is an impressive 50-7 at home (.877) under the Boyle coaching staff and 14-0 at home in November games • Home attendance has not seen a 10,000+ game so far (last year 12 of 15 games were 10K or more), that should change this Saturday against Kansas.

INDIVIDUAL TRENDS: Spencer Dinwiddie has the highest point total this season, 24 points vs. UCSB (Nov. 21) • Three players are making over 50 percent of their shots: Xavier Johnson (.605), Josh Scott (.552) • Tre'Shaun Fletcher hasn't taken as many shots as the other three, but still making 55.0 FG% • In two starts in place of Xavier Johnson, Jaron Hopkins is averaging 11 ppg., 4.5 rpg., 2.0 apg., 8-of-14 FG: 57.1% • Four of the five CU freshmen (including RS-Wesley Gordon) have netted at least 10+ points in one game this season, except Tre'Shaun Fletcher (season-high 9 points).

TEAM NOTES: CU is 7-0 out-rebounding the opponent this season and 61-10 in that category in the coach Boyle era • CU is 43-10 under Boyle when four or more players score double-digits in a game, 5-0 this season • Boyle-CU teams are 10-5 in single-digit turnover games • CU has made at least one three-pointer in 374-straight games (dating back to Jan. 19, 2002).

CAREER WATCH: Spencer Dinwiddie is closing-in on becoming the 30th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau. He's No. 32 with 975 points. He's also tied for third all-time in free throw percentage (.825). Askia Booker is the only player on the all-time lists. See the next page, right column for the latest numbers.

ATTENDANCE: CU's season finale crowd of 10,105 was the 12th crowd over 10,000 this year and 14th over 9,000, both school bests. The total for the 15 home games was 155,884, the highest gross total in school history; the 10,392 average works to 94 percent of capacity (11,064) of the Coors Events Center this season and finishes second in the Pac-12 this season to Arizona (14,131). Under Tad Boyle, the Buffs have now enjoyed the best three consecutive years in attendance numbers ever (421,028, an 8,255 average for 51 games; no previous coach averaged over 6,500 for a three-year run). WOODEN WATCH LIST: For the second straight year, junior guard Spencer Dinwiddie was named to the preseason Top 50 candidates for the John R. Wooden Award. The 50 student-athletes were chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts. Dinwiddie was a Pac-12 Conference first team selection a year ago, in addition to playing with Team USA at the World University Games this past summer. He is one of six players from the Pac-12 and one of 10 juniors selected as the early front-runners for the sport's most prestigious honor.

90+ A GAME: CU has scored over the 90-point plateau three times this season, the most since scoring 90, seven times in 2010-11 (6-1 in those games).

CARDIAC BUFFS: Under Tad Boyle (115 games), the Buffs have had more than their fair share of close games: try one-fifth of them. In games decided by three points or less in the Boyle Era, CU is 13-7 (4-3 in one-point games, 7-1 in two-point games and 2-3 in three-point games ... and 10-4 against league opponents, 6-3 vs. Pac-12, 4-1 vs. Big 12). And there were three overtime games that were decided by four or more points, so that means 23 games ended after regulation with the margin between 0 and 3 points.

SOLD OUT: For the first time ever, men's basketball tickets at the Coors Events Center are sold out for the 2013-2014 season (all 18 home games). There will be a limited number of single game tickets based on availability (ranging from \$50-\$65). Individual game tickets for all games are available, except for Kansas, Arizona, UCLA and Oregon, which are sold out. Of the 11,064 seating capacity of the Events Center 7,160 seats are used for season tickets.

Pac-12 MEDIA VOTE: The Buffaloes were selected third in the preseason media vote. It's the highest pre-season placing for CU since 2003-04 when the Big 12 media predicted CU sixth. The Buffs finished one vote behind UCLA for second place with Arizona at the top. The predicted winner has not won the league the past three years and four of the past five years.

KEARNEY JOINS CU STAFF: Sean Kearney joins the CU men's basketball staff as the Director of Player Development. He replaces Tom Abatemarco, who resigned in June to become an assistant coach at Loyola Marymount.

Kearney brings 26 years coaching experience to CU and was the University of Notre Dame Associate Head Coach from 2000 through 2009 under head coach Mike Brey. With the Irish, Kearney was part of nine post-season teams, including five NCAA Tournaments (Sweet 16 in 2003) and four NIT berths.

At Notre Dame, Kearney coached at least one player in his nine seasons that were named to the Big East All-Conference team, including a pair of conference player of year nominees, one rookie of the year, and nine first team selections.

"Sean is going to be a great addition to our staff," Boyle said. "Sean brings a lot of experience as an assistant and head coach, and has a great perspective. He's going to be a great-sounding board for me based on all the years of his experience he has in the game."

After Notre Dame, Kearney was the men's basketball head coach for one year at the College of the Holy Cross (2009-2010).

Prior to Notre Dame, Kearney spent nine years (1991-2000) at the University of Delaware where he helped the Blue Hens to four NCAA Tournament appearances and winners of the America East Conference four times. He was also an assistant coach at Northwestern (1988-1991) and as a volunteer assistant at Providence College (1986-87) with then-head coach Rick Pitino. The Friars advanced to the NCAA Final Four that season after winning the Southeast Regional.

Although not on the coaching sideline over the last three years (2010-13), Kearney was not far from the game, working as a color analyst for Irish radio broadcasts, in addition to Big East and Big Ten games with ESPN during the 2012-13 season. During October and November months, Kearney traveled throughout the country attending early season basketball practices at numerous college campuses.

"I have a great respect for what Coach Boyle and his staff has done in the three short years here in Boulder," Kearney said. "The achievements they already have, is remarkable, not only have they done it with coaching, but they also have done it with recruiting, and I think the sky is the limit right now with this group."

"I'm thrilled to be a part of that and hopefully have a positive impact myself. Certainly there's no need to re-invent the wheel around here, but if I can help a little bit, I'm anxious to do that in any area that Coach Boyle or his staff needs me to help in."

whose rating could rise after his senior season • Miller is from the Kansas City area and played on the same AAU team (Kansas City Run GMC) as fellow CU signee Collier • Took official visits to Arizona State, Marquette and Iowa, but committed to CU over Marquette on Oct. 19 • Eric Bossi, Rivals.com's national basketball recruiting analyst, said Miller "can be a rugged rebounder and explosive finisher around the rim capable of playing through contact. (He) can also step out and make 12-to-15 foot jumpers with pretty good regularity ... and he's physically ready to play in the Pac-12."

CU scouting report: Big, wide-bodied player who is physically ready to compete at the next level • Roster is well-stocked with runners, jumpers and finesse-type players – and Miller also can play with finesse, but he's best as an enforcer type • Good hands, long arms make him a capable shot blocker; plays bigger than 6-8 • What makes him special is his big body, his ability to use to his advantage on defense and his ability to lower his center of gravity, making him difficult to move.

Boyle's take: "Tory gives us a wide presence that we haven't had since I've been here. He's a skilled player and very competitive. With his body type and strength, he can finish down low with contact. He doesn't look like he would be a good jumper, but he is. Plus, he's 19 years old now and will bring an age and maturity level to us that's a little further along than you'd find in a typical freshman. He's got all the physical tools necessary to be a very good Pac-12 player and he understands what it means to be successful."

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AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

• The Buffs have defeated two or more ranked teams eight times in the history of the AP poll, and three of those eight streaks have come under Tad Boyle. The longest streak is three games, accomplished twice, first spanning two seasons from December 12, 1960 to January 6, 1962; and then again in the 1991-92 season from February 5-19.

• Only four times have the Buffs defeated three or more ranked teams in the same season, with two of those four seasons coming under Tad Boyle in the last three years. The Buffs defeated four ranked teams in 2012-13, 2010-11, and 2002-03, and have three such wins in 1991-92.

• The Buffs have defeated 53 ranked teams (AP poll) in its history dating back to 1949-50. Tad Boyle now has nine wins over ranked teams.

• In the history of the Coors Events Center (1979-80), the Buffs have defeated nine top 10 ranked teams (AP poll) in the building's history. With the Buffs 71-58 win over No. 9 Arizona, three of those nine wins have been come under Tad Boyle. The Buffs defeated No. 5 Texas and No. 8 Missouri in 2010-11.

sons (Cliff Meely years), CU finished that consistent among the top-five in three-consecutive seasons (1968-69: 1st; 1969-70: t-3rd; 1970-71: t-5th).

CU RADIO: Joining 10-year KOA sports director and play-by-play caller Mark Johnson on CU men's basketball broadcasts during the 2013-14 season will be former CU great Scott Wilke. Wilke played for the Buffaloes from 1984-88 and is one of 30 players in school history to score over 1,000 points (he's 11th overall with 1,366). He still ranks in a number of categories in the CU record book. Entering the 2013-2014 season, Wilke is ninth in field goals made (527) and field goal percentage (.536); 18th in minutes played (2,564); 20th in rebounding (576); t-24th in career games started (65); 24th in games played (110); and 38th in assists (153).

CONFERENCE ROAD WARRIORS ... Colorado has won three straight conference games on the road, a first since 2000-01; while not the loftiest of achievements, it hasn't been common at CU. Tad Boyle's teams have won two straight Pac-12 road games twice, something the Buffaloes managed only four times in the 15 years as a member of the Big 12. And in the 49 seasons Colorado was in the Big 7/Big 8 (1948-96), it won two straight league road games a grand total of 13 times.

Three Straight: Colorado last won three straight conference road games (Feb. 7-27, 2013 (at Oregon, at Oregon State, at Stanford); and from Jan. 20-Feb. 10 2001 (at Texas Tech, Nebraska and Kansas State). The Buffs won three straight twice in the Big 12 and six times in the Big 7/Big 8.

Three of Four: CU has won three of its last four Pac-12 road games, the fourth time it has done that under Boyle. It did it twice in the Big 12.

Four Straight: Colorado last won four straight conference road games in 1996-97 (at Missouri, Texas Tech, Baylor and Kansas State). It won four straight twice in the Big 7/Big 8 (1961-62, the last time it won as many as five in a row, and in 1963-64).

Four of Five: CU has won as many as four of five league road games just four times: 1996-97, 1963-64, 1961-62 (five in a row with a loss on either end) and 1954-55.

Five of Six: CU has done this just twice: in 1954-55 and 1961-62.
