QUICKLY: Colorado enters the week with a pair of regular season home games (No. 7/7 Arizona on Thursday and Arizona State on Sunday) • Since the 3 overtime win at USC, the Buffaloes have lost five of their last six games (0-4 road, 1-2 home) • CU is 0-3 this season against the nation's Top 25 and 0-2 against the Top 10 • Under Boyle, CU has defeated at least one nationally ranked team every year while the head coach in Boulder.

THREE MORE BLOCKS: Josh Scott is on the verge of a select few in school history as the fifth CU player in school history with over 1,000 points and 600 rebounds, and 100 blocks. Scott enters Thursday's game with 1,038 pts, 612 rebounds and 97 blocks. He will join Donnie Boyce, Cliff Meely, David Harrison, and Andre Roberson.

CU-BOYLE TOP-10 WINS: An upset of the No. 7 ranked Wildcats will be the highest win over a nationally ranked program since beating No. 6 Kansas last year, 75-72 (Askia Booker 30-footer at the buzzer). Under Boyle, the Buffs have also defeated No. 3 Texas (Feb. 26, 2011), No. 8 Missouri (Jan. 8, 2011), No. 9 Arizona (Feb. 14, 2013) and No. 10 Oregon (Jan. 5, 2014) at the Coors Events Center (see page 2, left column).

A WIN THURSDAY MEANS: The 11th win at home • Breaks a two-game losing skid • First win over a nationally ranked opponent in four games this season • Breaking a five-game skid to Arizona and first win over the 'Cats since Feb. 14, 2013 when Arizona was No. 9 • 71st home win in 84 games over the last five years.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Senior guard Askia Booker is slowly climbing up a number of career lists during his four years in Boulder. On Thursday, Booker will tie fellow 2011-12 NCAA Tournament teammate Nate Tomlinson for third all-time in career games played (129). Booker only trails Austin Dufault (136) and Cory Higgins (132).

ABDUL-JABBAR CENTER OF THE YEAR AWARD: Since being named to the Top 15 watch list, Josh Scott is holding steady in his last five games with a 9.6 points and 9.0 rebounds average. His average on the glass and blocks (7) are a team high. At Oregon, he tallied his fourth double-double of the season (19th career) with 10 points and a career-best 17 rebounds.

Pac-12 LEADERS: Colorado leads the conference in rebounding offense (37.5), Arizona is second (36.8) • CU is tops in offensive rebounds (12.1) • Askia Booker is third in scoring (18.7), Wesley Gordon is third in rebounding (8.8) and blocks (1.8), and first in offensive rebounding (3.3).

SCOUTING ARIZONA: The Wildcats have won four straight games, and 10 of 11 since defeating Colorado back in Tucson on Jan. 15. Not only do the 'Cats lead the conference with a 12-2 record, their the top scoring team (74.9 ppg.), lead in scoring margin (+17.6), FG% (.481), rebounding defense (26.6) and board margin (+10.2). T.J. McConnell leads the conference-only assists stats category (5.7).

TONIGHT'S POSTER: Is junior Xavier Johnson and the CU Spirit Squad. As for XJ, he's third in scoring on the Buffs at 11.1 ppg and 5.9 rpg. He's coming off a near double-double at Oregon State with 12 points and nine rebounds. In six career games against UA, XJ is averaging 13.3 ppg. 5.0 rpg. and shooting a 47.2 field goal percentage.

MISCELLANEOUS STATS: Josh Scott leads Jaron Hopkins, 16 to 14 in CU dunks. Overall, CU has 66. In the charges taken category, the Buffs have 39 with Dustin Thomas leading with 10, followed by Josh Scott with nine.

CU & 75 POINTS: Colorado has 23 wins for the most consecutive games when scoring 75 or more points (all games played). Utah is second with 19 victories. CU's streak dates back Jan. 24, 2013.

DID YOU KNOW?: Josh Scott is the 16th player in CU history with 1,000 points (1,038) and 600 rebounds (612).

BLOCK PARTY: Wesley Gordon (38) and Josh Scott (33) are the first CU teammates to have 30+ blocks in back-to-back seasons since blocked shots were kept as a statistic in a season (1977-78; 38 years). Last year: Gordon: 41, Scott: 40.

SKI WATCH: Askia Booker is one of eight players in school history with over 1,600 career points (1,634) and one of three players in school history to have over 3,600 minutes with at least 1600 points, 400 rebounds, 300 assists, 140 steals.

CU AT OREGON STATE: A scenario the Colorado Buffaloes became all too familiar with on at Oregon repeated itself here Saturday night. This one didn't end well for the Buffs either. Cutting a 22-point half-time deficit to eight points with 3:44 to play, CU once again short in a 72-58 Pac-

12 loss to Oregon State. With the exception of the worst first half of CU's Tad Boyle era, Saturday night was a not so instant replay of the game the Buffs lost four nights earlier. In that one, they trimmed a 20-point second-half deficit to five points before falling 73-60 to the Ducks.

But in this one, the Buffs probably had no business being within eight points of the Beavers that late in the game. In addition to committing a season-high 22 turnovers that cost them 28 points, the Buffs again shot dismally, finishing at 35 percent (18-of-52) from the field. CU shot 35.5 percent from the field (22-of-62) Wednesday night at Oregon, and for five games now have not been above 37 percent.

Neither did the Buffs defend particularly well. Oregon State shot 49 percent from the field and had three players in double figures, led by Gary Payton II with 24 points. And the 6-2 guard was pretty close to a one-man wrecking crew, blocking a school single-game record seven shots, making four steals and collecting five rebounds.

CU AT OREGON RECAP: Another night of frigid shooting and overall inconsistency brought another night of frustration for the Colorado. Cutting a 20-point second-half deficit to five with 4:10 remaining, CU scored only two more points and lost 73-60 at Oregon. A 24-4 Oregon run midway through the first half put CU behind 39-22 at halftime and the Buffs never caught up. The Ducks (19-8, 9-5) had lost four straight to the Buffs, who dropped to 1-8 on the road, with the eight losses the most since nine in the 2010-11 season. CU, which has lost four of its last five games, shot 35.5 percent from the field (22-of-62) Wednesday night.

In their last four games the Buffs have not been above 37 percent. CU was led by Askia Booker's 20 points - 10 of his total coming on free throws (10-of-12) as he went 5-for-17 from the field. Wes Gordon added 14 and Scott had 10 points and a career-best 17 rebounds for his fourth double-double of the season and 19th of his career. Oregon had four players in double figures, topped by Joseph Young's 23 points

SOX WALSETH COURT: The Coors Events Center basketball floor is named after legendary Colorado basketball coach Sox Walseth in 1996. He is CU's all-time leader in men's basketball victories with 261, then added another 77 victories coaching the CU women from 1980-83, including an impressive 43-0 at home. Walseth is the first at CU and only a few to coach both the men's and women's basketball teams at the same school. With the men, CU won three Big Eight titles and was named conference coach of the year five times (4-Big Eight; 1-Big Seven). He coached 20 different CU teams from 1957-1976. Walseth was inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 1998 and the CU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002.

FREE THROWS & BOOKER: Askia Booker is on the verge of cracking the CU Top 10 in all-time FT percentage (.783). Over his four year career, CU is 15-12 overall when Booker fails to make it to the free throw line. In three of the four games this season where Booker failed to attempt a free throw, the Buffs have lost (at ASU: 6 pts; vs. GW: 3 pts.; UW: 2 pts.). In career games decided by three points or less, the Buffs are 3-4 when Booker fails to go to the charity stripe.

RECORD BOOK: Askia Booker has not fouled out in a game since midway through his sophomore year at Washington (Jan. 16, 2013). Since then he has played in 76 games and 2,302 minutes. CU's Newest Hoops Recruit Adds Different Perspective

BOULDER – The newest member of Colorado men's basketball's 2015 recruiting class, 6-year-old Cason Turkaly, sat in the Buffs' media room flanked by his parents and his coach, with all of his teammates in attendance.

"Cason, we've had our eye on you for six or eight weeks now," coach Tad Boyle said. "We love everything that you bring to the table. You're a terrific young man and we know you love basketball. We think you're going to fit in with this Buffalo family."

Cason picked up a pen, put his signature on the dotted line of a National Letter of Intent and made it official, even though he'd been part of the family from the start.

"It means that I'm a part of the team," Cason said. "It feels great!"

Boyle presented Cason with a No. 6 jersey with his name on it. From the back of the room came a whoop from Cason's favorite player, "big tall Josh" Scott.

Colorado drafted Cason through its partnership with Team IMPACT, a nonprofit that improves the lives of children with life-threatening and chronic illnesses by placing them with teams.

"We jumped at the opportunity," CU Director of Operations Bill Cartun said. "It's something we really wanted to take part in because we think that we can make an impact on his life. He's made an impact in our lives as well."

Cason was diagnosed with Schwachman-Diamond Syndrome (SDS) when he was two years old. SDS is a rare genetic disorder that causes bone marrow deficiencies, digestive issues and immune deficiencies. There is also a high rate of leukemia associated with SDS.

"Part of my mission as a parent is to educate the wider public about it," Cason's mom, Jen, said. "I'm going to ask you guys to spread the word in the greater community."

Cason's parents searched for the first two years of his life for a diagnosis for the digestive issues and lack of growth that no doctor could suitably treat. With the diagnosis came certainty and fear. Cason has blood work done every six weeks and sees specialists four times a year. He has an annual bone marrow aspiration to test for leukemia.

"It was that blessing and a curse thing," Jen Turkaly said. "Those are some scary things to learn about."

But last year Cason went an entire school year without an inpatient hospital stay for the first time. He munches on mac and cheese, bologna and chocolate ice cream. He skis and plays basketball and soccer. He builds Legos, dresses up as superheroes and sword fights with his dad, Eddie.

"We learned to appreciate that little smile and his little bounce," Jen said. "Every healthy day that we have we are thankful for. We want you guys (Buffs players) to be appreciative of that, too. As you get up out of bed in the morning and you're healthy and you're happy and get to go to class and play basketball and do the things that you get to do, being a part of Cason's life, we want you to be appreciative of that."

When the press conference ended, Cason's new family left for practice with bounces in their steps. Boyle beamed as he got up from the media table.

"It lends great perspective to our lives," he said.

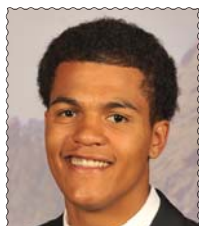

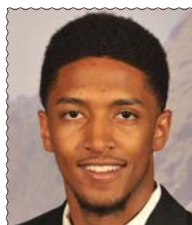
