QUICKLY: Colorado enters the CBI quarterfinal round after an 87-78 home win over Gardner-Webb last Wednesday with five players in double figures, led by junior forward Josh Scott's 22nd career double-double (23 pts, 15 rebs) • CU will play its 34th game of the season, fourth most games in a season in school history.

QUICKLY PART II: The Buffs are without Askia Booker (personal decision not to play) and Dustin Thomas (transferring) • Josh Scott needs four rebounds (680) for 10th place on CU's all-time rebounding list tying the great Scott Wedman (1971-74) • Xavier Johnson (985 pts) is 15 points from the 1,000-point plateau and becoming the 33rd player in school history to reach that feat.

CU AT SEATTLE: Seattle University will have a free live video stream of Monday's CBI game which can be accessed at buffs.me/18P37TK • The game will also be on AM 850 KOA with a live stream link on CUBuffs.com

LAST GAME: Colorado defeated Gardner-Webb in the CBI first round, 87-78 with Josh Scott recording his 22nd career double-double (23 pts., 15 rebs.). It was his team-best seventh double-double this season. Scott also set a CBI record with a career-high nine offensive rebounds and his 15 boards was the eighth most in the 8-year history of the tournament. The Buffs 19 offensive rebounds was the third most as well. CU also made a season-high 38 field goals (fifth most in the CBI) and season-high 72 FG attempts (fifth most in the CBI). Tory Miller and Eli Stalzer scored a career-high 12 and 11 points, respectively.

A WIN MONDAY MEANS: Evening the season record to 17-17 and a berth in the CBI semifinals • Evening the all-time series with Seattle at 1-1 • Third road win on the season • Coach Boyle winning his 16th post-season CU game, improving his school-record best for wins and winning percentage (.667) • Fifth victory in the last seven games.

LAST 5 GAMES: CU is 3-2 over its last five games and shooting 49.4 percent from the field • CU holds a 40-to-28.8 advantage on the boards • Averaging 81 points per game • Josh Scott leads in scoring 21.6 ppg, 11.2 rpg, and is shooting 64.2 FG% with six steals and five blocks.

SEASON TICKETS: For the second straight year, the men's basketball program sold out its season tickets allotment. Of the other 11 Pac-12 schools, only Arizona has accomplished this feat.

BOOKER/BILLUPS: Askia Booker led CU in points, assists and steals, something no Colorado player has done since Chauncey Billups (steals became an official NCAA statistic in 1985-86).

4-YEAR BESTS: In the history of the men's basketball program, Ben Mills, a May 2014 graduate is the all-time leader in wins of four-year student-athletes. That's the first four years of the Tad Boyle era in Boulder. Senior Askia Booker finished second with 82 wins over his four year career.

43 POINTS: Askia Booker scored the most points by a Buff since Donnie Boyce had 46 points in a losing effort at Oklahoma State (Mar. 5, 1994; 83-68). Booker had 43 in triple-overtime at USC (Jan. 29). Booker also set career highs in FGM (13), FTA (23), FTA (15), minutes played (51). Booker also scored 30 at Arizona (Jan. 15).

• 43 points is tied for third in Division I.

50 FG%: After a span of shooting 38.5 FG% or worse in seven straight games (Jan. 31-Feb. 26), CU has shot above 44.6 percent in its last six games, three of last four games over 50 percent • CU has shot over 50 percent 10 times this season (9-1, lone loss at WSU, ot).

SCOUTING SEATTLE: The Redhawks are 17-15 on the season and hail from the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). Seattle lost in the conference finals to New Mexico State, 80-61 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on March 14. The CBI is Seattle's first-ever D-I postseason berth in the 1969 NCAA Tournament, and the 17-15 mark is the program's first winning season since 2009-10.

Seattle defeated Pepperdine at home in the CBI first round last Wednesday, 62-45. Isiah Umipig led all scorers with 24 points with seven rebounds and three assists. Jarell Flora added 20 points and William Powell grabbed 10 rebounds.

ONLY 3: With the return of Josh Scott to the latter half of the 2014-15 season, his career stats have moved him into elite company among the school annals. Of the four categories of points, rebounds, blocks and steals, Scott is one of three players in school history over 1,000 points, 600 rebounds, 100 blocks, 60 or more steals (steals became a stat in 1985-86).

Donnie Boyce (1991-95): 1,995 points, 644 rebounds, 114 blocks, 245 steals

Andre Roberson (2010-13): 1,012 pts, 1045 rebs, 150 blocks, 164 steals

Josh Scott (2012-present): 1,169 points, 680 rebounds, 109 blocks, 61 steals.

HOMECOMING: Tre'Shaun Fletcher returns to his home state of Washington for the second time this season. Back on March 5, CU defeated Washington at Alaska Airlines Arena, 64-47. Fletcher scored eight points and added five rebounds in 23 minutes. At WSU, Fletcher added six points and five rebounds three days later in Pullman, in CU's 96-91 overtime loss to the Cougars.

COMMON OPPONENT: Seattle played the Washington Huskies at home back on November 21 and lost 63-48. CU split with UW winning on the road, 64-47 (March 5) and losing at home (Jan. 22), 52-50.

MISSING FROM LINEUP: Leading scorer senior guard Askia Booker averaged a team-best 17.2 points per game and 30.2 minutes has decided not to play in the CBI. He also led the Buffs in field goals (173), 3-pointers (55), free throws made (131) and attempts (157), assists (99) and steals (44). CU will also be without

CENTURY MARK: CU has nine players on the roster to have scored over 100 points this season. That matches the 2005-06 team.

40+ REBOUNDS: CU has grabbed 40 or more rebounds in 16 games this season (10-6 record), the most since 2005-06, when that team did it 17 times (15-2).

DUNKS/CHARGES TAKEN: Of the 92 dunks the CU team has this season, Josh Scott leads with 27 despite missing eight games. Of the 44 team charges taken, Josh Scott also leads the team with 12.

sophomore forward Dustin Thomas (4.4 ppg., 2.5 rpg), who has decided to transfer.

SHOT CLOCK: The College Basketball Invitational, now in its eighth year, will utilize a 30-second shot clock in an effort to assist the NCAA in its research on pace of play and scoring. Normally, it's 35 seconds.

Pac-12 TOURNAMENT REVIEW: CU is coming off a 93-85 quarterfinal loss to Oregon at the Pac-12 Tournament at the MGM Grand Garden Arena in Las Vegas, last Thursday. The Buffaloes finished tied for eighth in the Pac-12 Conference with a 7-11 record and were seeded No. 10 due to tie-breakers. CU upset No. 7 Oregon State in the first round, 78-71 last Wednesday.

Pac-12 POST-SEASON: CU is one of seven schools in the conference playing in post-season tournaments. Arizona, Oregon, Utah, and UCLA earned NCAA Tournament berths; Arizona State and Stanford received bids to the NIT; Colorado to the CBI.

COLORADO, IOWA STATE TO PLAY NOV. 13 AT SANFORD PENTAGON

SIoux FALLS, S.D. – Colorado and Iowa State will play at the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls, S.D. on Nov. 13 at 7 p.m. on Heritage Court.

Tickets are on sale Monday at ticketmaster.com and the Pentagon box office.

Colorado has accepted a bid to play in the College Basketball Invitational and is 16-17 overall and went 7-11 in Pac-12 play. The Buffaloes entered the Pac-12 Tournament as the 10th seed.

Iowa State was selected for its fourth-straight NCAA tournament as the No. 3 seed in the South Region. The Cyclones won its second-straight Big 12 Tournament title Saturday evening, defeating top-seeded Kansas in the championship game. Iowa State finished second in the Big 12 regular-season standings at 12-6.

"It's a hell of an opportunity to open up a season against (a team) that might be preseason top 5 next year," CU head coach Tad Boyle said. "Fred Hoiberg is a heck of a coach, a good friend of mine. I don't like playing good friends, but it was an opportunity for a neutral site game in South Dakota at a nice venue, and I heard the arena there is very, very nice. It was built for events like this."

"I think it's the third or fourth year they've been doing it. We were almost in it last year, but things didn't work out. This year it did. Top 5 team on a neutral site to open up a season, we're going to be tested early."

Iowa State and Colorado have played 147 times; the Cyclones lead the series 77-70. The two teams last played in 2011 when Colorado was a member of the Big 12.

The Pentagon's resume of major Division I games is quickly growing. In 2013-14, the venue hosted Wisconsin and St. John's. Wichita State and Memphis played on Heritage Court last season. Additionally, South Dakota and South Dakota State squared off with UNLV and Florida Gulf Coast, respectively, last season.

About the Sanford Pentagon

The cornerstone of the Sanford Sports Complex in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, is the Sanford Pentagon, a 160,000-square-foot, five-sided facility featuring nine basketball courts, including the 1950s/1960s-inspired Heritage Court. BOARD GAMES: Wesley Gordon grabbed a two-game conference total of 31 rebounds (15.5 rpg) against Washington (17) and Washington State (14) at the end of January. It's the second-most conference total by a CU player in 11 years when Lamar Harris (32) in 2003-04. The most recent player to accomplish was Andre Roberson with 31 rebounds in back-to-back games in 2012-13 (20 at Fresno St.; 11 at Kansas).

PAC-12 CONFERENCE HALL OF HONOR:

The Pac-12 honored 12 former student-athletes with their induction into the Pac-12 Men's Basketball Hall of Honor on Saturday, March 14, during a ceremony prior to the championship game at the 2015 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament held at the MGM Grand Garden Arena in Las Vegas, Nev. The inductees were also recognized at halftime of the championship game.

The individuals to be inducted are: Fred Snowden (Arizona), Ron Riley (Arizona State), Sean Lampley (California), Jim Davis (Colorado), Anthony Taylor (Oregon), Jim Jarvis (Oregon State), Casey Jacobsen (Stanford), Dave Meyers (UCLA), Alex Hannum (USC), Danny Vranes (Utah), Jon Brockman (Washington) and Bennie Seltzer (Washington State).

Davis was a three-year letterman under the legendary Sox Walseth. Davis was a two-time first-team All-Big 8 honoree in his career with the Buffs. He scored 1,110 career points, which still ranks 25th on CU's all-time list, averaging 14.4 points and 11.2 rebounds per game with a .489 shooting percentage. Davis led the Buffs to a 53-24 record in his three years in Boulder, winning two Big 8 titles and earning two berths to the NCAA Tournament.

He is also one of the few players in school history to average a double-double for two-consecutive seasons, with 13.8 points and 12.7 rebounds per game as a junior followed by 18.5 points and 12.7 rebounds per game in his senior season. At the time of his graduation, Davis was CU's all-time leading rebounder and third all-time scorer.

Davis was a fourth-round selection by the Detroit Pistons in the 1964 NBA Draft, and eventually signed as a free agent with the St. Louis Hawks in 1967. He played eight seasons in all, scoring a total of 3,997 points in his career. "Spider" as he was known by his teammates was part of the 10th class of the University of Colorado Athletic Hall of Fame last October.

A four-year letterwinner and three-year starter in the Buffaloes lineup, Booker has steadily moved up the career rankings in a number of categories. With 82 career victories, a member of a handful of All-Tournament teams, and a Pac-12 Tournament Championship to his résumé, Booker has etched his name in the annals of the CU Record Book.

One of the most memorable shots in CU basketball history was Booker's 30-footer as time expired to upset No. 6 Kansas, 75-72, December 7, 2013 at the Coors Events Center. Most notably, Booker is one of eight players in school history with over 1,600 career points.

He's one of three players in school history to play over 3,600 minutes, score 1600 points with 400 rebounds, 300 assists, 140 steals. Booker will graduate in May with a degree in communication.

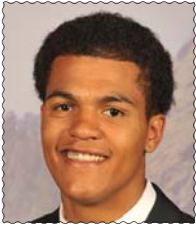

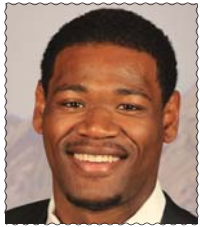
